



Ocean Salmon Management Program

Preliminary 2009 Oregon Ocean Recreational Salmon Seasons:

Selective Coho Salmon Fishery Estimates for the Area from Cape Falcon to the Oregon/California Border

Season: Open seven days per week from June 20 through earlier of August 31 or coho quota of 110,000 adipose fin-clipped coho.

Regulations: Open for all salmon except **closed to retention of chinook** (note: chinook greater than 24" in length are allowed to be retained between Humbug Mt. and the Oregon California Border from August 29-31) and all retained coho must have a healed adipose fin clip. Between Cape Falcon and Humbug Mt. the bag limit is three salmon per day, and from Humbug Mt. to the Oregon/California Border the bag limit is two salmon. Minimum size lengths of 16" for coho and 20" for steelhead. No more than two single-point, single-shank, barbless hooks may be used, and no more than one lure/bait per line.
