2     **Purpose and Scope**

- 3     (1) The purpose of Division 003 is to provide for management of commercial salmon fisheries off the Oregon  
 4       Coast over which the state has jurisdiction.
- 5     (2) Division 003 incorporates into Oregon Administrative Rules, by reference, the annual ocean troll salmon  
 6       specifications and management measures as adopted by the **Pacific Fishery Management Council** in its  
 7       annual **Ocean Salmon Management Measures and Impacts**, as finalized in April [2016]2017, and in addition  
 8       to the extent they are consistent with these rules, **Code of Federal Regulations (CFR), Title 50, Part 660,**  
 9       **Subpart H (61FR34572, July 2, 1996**, as amended to incorporate the standards in the **Pacific Fishery**  
 10       **Management Council referenced document**). Therefore, persons must consult the **Pacific Fishery**  
 11       **Management Council referenced document** and **Federal Regulations** in addition to Division 003 to  
 12       determine all applicable troll salmon fishing requirements. A copy of the **Pacific Fishery Management**  
 13       **Council referenced document** and the **Federal Regulations** may be obtained by contacting the **Pacific**  
 14       **Fishery Management Council** at [www.pcouncil.org](http://www.pcouncil.org) or at 7700 NE Ambassador Place, Suite 101, Portland,

- 16    (3) To the extent not preempted by Federal law, these regulations apply within the State of Oregon's Fisheries  
 17       Conservation Zone (out to fifty miles from shore).

25     **Extended Commercial Seasons**

26     In addition to the open seasons prescribed in OAR 635-003-0003 there are open seasons for Chinook salmon as  
 27     follows:

- 28     (1) Elk River Ocean Terminal Area - from ~~November 4~~**October 15-November** 30 in the area described in section  
 29     (1)(a) of this rule.

30     (a) The open area is all Pacific Ocean waters shoreward of a line drawn from Cape Blanco (42°50'20" N. Lat.)  
 31     thence SW to Black Rock (42°49'24" N. Lat. 124°35'00" W. Long.), thence SSW to Best Rock (42°47'24" N. Lat.  
 32     124°35'42" W. Long.), thence SE to 42°40'30" N. Lat. 124°29'00" W. Long., thence to shore (Humbug Mountain).

33     (b) During the season described in this section (1), it is unlawful to take Chinook salmon less than 26 inches in  
 34     total length; it is unlawful to use multipoint or barbed hooks or to fish more than four spreads per line; and it is  
 35     unlawful to have in possession or to land more than 20 Chinook per day taken in this fishery. Landings are  
 36     restricted to Port Orford.

- 37     (2) Chetco River Ocean Terminal Area - from October **9-13 and 16-31**~~[10 through the earlier of October 31]~~ or  
 38     quota of 300 Chinook in the area described in section (2)(a) of this rule:

- 39 (a) The open area is all Pacific Ocean waters inside an area south of the north shore of Twin Rocks (42°05'36" N.  
40 Lat.) to the Oregon/California border (42°00'00" N. Lat.) and seaward three nautical miles offshore;
- 41 (b) During the season described in this section (2) it is unlawful to take Chinook salmon less than 28 inches in total  
42 length; it is unlawful to use multipoint or barbed hooks, or to fish more than four spreads per line; and it is unlawful  
43 to have in possession or to land more than 5 **Chinook per day for the period October 9-13 and 10** Chinook per  
44 day **thereafter** taken in this fishery. Landings are restricted to Brookings.
- 45 (c) All vessels landing salmon caught in this season must report to ODFW within one hour of delivery or prior to  
46 transport away from the port of landing by either calling (541) 867-0300, ext. 252 or by e-mail to  
47 kmzor.trollreport@state.or.us. Notification shall include vessel name and number, number of salmon by species,  
48 port of landing, location of delivery, and estimated time of delivery.

55 **Purpose and Scope**

- 56 (1) The purpose of Division 013 is to provide for management of sport salmon fisheries off the Oregon Coast over  
57 which the State has jurisdiction.
- 58 (2) This rule incorporates by reference, the annual ocean sport salmon specifications and management measures  
59 as adopted by the **Pacific Fishery Management Council** in its annual **Ocean Salmon Management**  
60 **Measures and Impacts**, as finalized in April [2016]2017, and in addition to the extent they are consistent with  
61 these rules, **Code of Federal Regulations (CFR), Title 50, Part 660, Subparts A and H**.
- 62 (3) This rule also incorporates by reference the **Oregon Sport Fishing Regulations**.
- 63 (4) A copy of the **Pacific Fishery Management Council referenced document** and the **Federal Regulations**

- 66 (5) To the extent not preempted by Federal law, these regulations apply within the State of Oregon's Fisheries

78 **Special South Coast Seasons**

79 In addition to the open seasons prescribed in OAR 635-013-0005 there are open seasons for Chinook salmon as  
80 follows:

81 (1) Elk River Area.

82 (a) From November 1 through November 30 in all Pacific Ocean waters shoreward of a line drawn from Cape  
83 Blanco (42°50'20" N. Lat.) thence SW to Black Rock (42°49'24" N. Lat. 124°35'00" W. Long.), thence SSW to Best  
84 Rock (42°47'24" N. Lat. 124°35'42" W. Long.), thence SE to 42°40'30" N. Lat. 124°29'00" W. Long., thence to  
85 shore (Humbug Mountain);

86 (b) During the season described for the Elk River Area in section (1)(a) of this rule it is unlawful to take Chinook  
87 salmon less than 24 inches in length. Two Chinook salmon per day of which no more than one wild Chinook  
88 salmon per day and 10 wild Chinook salmon in the seasonal aggregate when combined with waters of Floras  
89 Creek/New River, Sixes River and Elk River. It is unlawful to use multipoint or barbed hooks.

90 (2) Chetco River Area.

91 (a) From ~~[October 4-8]~~ **October 7-8 and 14-15** in an area south of the north shore of Twin Rocks (42°05'36" N.  
92 Lat.) to the Oregon/California border (42°00'00" N. Lat.) and seaward three nautical miles offshore.

93 (b) During the seasons described in section (2)(a) of this rule it is unlawful to take Chinook salmon less than  
94 ~~[24]~~**28** inches in length. ~~[Two]~~**One** Chinook salmon per day ~~[of which no more than one wild Chinook salmon per~~  
95 ~~day and no more than 5 wild Chinook salmon may be retained during the October 1-3 and October 8-9 season].~~ It  
96 is unlawful to use multipoint or barbed hooks.
