Dear Columbia River Commercial Fisher:

We are writing to inform you that a second round of applications are currently being accepted for participation in Columbia River commercial seine research fisheries during the 2015 fall season. Applications are available on-line at the Washington Department of Fish and Wildlife (WDFW) website ([wdfw.wa.gov/licensing/commercial/limited\\_emerging.html](http://wdfw.wa.gov/licensing/commercial/limited_emerging.html)) or see attached copy. Applications must be submitted as a hardcopy via mail delivery (USPS, FedEx, UPS), or via FAX or via email. Applications must be received by midnight August 15, 2015 to be included in the drawing. If the remaining 2015 permits are not allocated in this second draw, they will be issued on a "first come basis" thereafter as additional applications are received. This application process provides an additional opportunity for those interested in participating in commercial fisheries using beach or purse seine gears on the Columbia River this fall. As you know, the states of Oregon and Washington have adopted policies that provide for a transition in Columbia River commercial fisheries which, over time, would favor gear types that facilitate mark-selective or live-capture fisheries. To inform this transition and continue investigations into selective gear types, commercial fisheries using beach and purse seines are planned for the 2015 fall season.

The 2015 seine fisheries will be limited entry. Permits will be randomly awarded (by gear type) to qualified individuals. Qualified individuals include those persons who possess or operate under a current Columbia River commercial salmon license and can demonstrate (through fish tickets) that salmon landings have occurred from the mainstem Columbia River or Select Area fisheries within the past two calendar years (2013-2014).

In June 2015, a total of six permits were awarded. At this time there are two beach permits and two purse seine permits available. WDFW will be administering the second random drawing related to this fishery. Qualified individuals that apply will be selected at random to receive an experimental fishery permit specific to gear type. Fishers who have already received a 2015 seine permit may reapply for up to one additional permit. The drawing for permits will occur soon after the application deadline and successful applicants will be notified immediately. If an individual is drawn for a permit, the applicant must respond within seven (7) business days of being notified to accept the permit and pay any fees due.

Washington residents that are drawn will need an Emerging Fishery license (\$290 fee) and an experimental fishery permit (no fee), both issued by WDFW upon receipt of payment. Oregon residents that are drawn will need an experimental gear permit (\$32 fee) issued by Oregon Department of Fish and Wildlife (ODFW) upon receipt of payment. Experimental fishery/gear permits are not transferable between persons. The permit holder must be present and in possession of a valid permit during seine fishing operations.

. All seine fishing operations will be expected to have a Department observer present. **The permits currently available will be issued for Zone 2 and/or Zone 3 only.** . One of the goals of this fishery will be to collect data from areas where little or no data was collected in 2014. The research fishery in 2014 collected sufficient data in Zone 1 and Zone 4.

Seine fisheries will be mark-selective for both Chinook and Coho. In order to reduce risk of exceeding ESA impacts allocated for this fishery, individual permits will be allocated catch shares which are expected to be:

	<u>Beach</u>	<u>Purse</u>
Adult Chinook:	400	650
Adult Coho:	150	200
Steelhead:	180	150

Sale of jacks (Chinook and Coho) will be allowed and do not count towards the permit IFQ.

The fishery is expected to focus on the first two weeks of September but the actual fishing period(s) will be adopted by the Columbia River Compact. Beyond the value of the landed catch, no additional financial reimbursement will be provided for participating in this fishery.

Enclosed is an application for your convenience. A copy of the emergency rule filed in Washington for an emerging fishery describing the qualifications of applicants, permit drawing process, gear description, and potential regulations will be available on WDFW's website.
