Job Description:

This position assists in performing fish culture duties to meet production goals, maintain equipment, grounds, buildings, and perform other assigned duties. The primary responsibilities of these positions are to:

- Maintain hatchery water systems in cleaning intake by cleaning debris from screens using small hand tools.
- Maintain hatchery rearing and incubation environments by cleaning and assisting technicians with minor repairs.
- Power wash, paint, repair, and maintain buildings, fishponds, and fish culture structures.
- Service gas powered vehicles and equipment, perform minor tune-ups to gas engines, wash vehicles and equipment.
- Maintain lawns, flowerbeds, shrubs, and trees.
- Answer questions from the public.
- Operate special equipment including vehicles, lawn tractors, generators, fish pumps, hydraulic lifters, gas and electric power tools, forklifts, and farm tract with attachments.
- Unloaded, store and handle fish food and ice.
- Use and maintain pond cleaning implements and mortality pickers, crowders, dip nets, and seines, predator control devices and systems, egg and fry care tools and devices.
- Set up ponds to receive fry or fish. Clean rearing ponds as prescribed by good fish culture techniques. Move and handle fish in rearing ponds as needed to: inventory, grade, mark, load, transfer, or release. Collect adults: sanitize and ready spawning area and equipment, seines, and have necessary material and supplies on hand. Record and remove scales/head. Set up and sanitize incubation area equipment to receive eggs. Shock, pick, clean up, treat, and inventory eggs. Remove eggshells and record mortalities.

Requirements:

Applicants must have a valid driver license and an acceptable driving record. ODFW will check driving records for in-state finalists. Out of state finalists will be required to present a current driving record for review.

Minimum qualifications are not established for this position. However, preference for interviews will be given to applicants with the following experience: operating pressure

washer/forklift/electronic and gas power tools, repairing and maintaining buildings, and who possess or are in pursuit of a Bachelor's degree in Fisheries or and Wildlife Science or a related biological/ecological degree. Employees must be self-motivated, and willing to perform a variety of manual labor duties.
