Classification: Experimental Biology Aide – up to three positions

Program: Columbia River Investigations

Salary: \$2,200 – \$2,281 per month, commensurate with experience
Effective November 1, 2016, SEIU represented employees who are Public Employee Retirement System (PERS) participating members will have their base salary increased by 6.95%. Upon becoming a PERS participating member, SEIU employees pay the employee 6% contribution to PERS.

Location: Based out of **Clackamas**, Oregon
Work to be completed in the **Columbia River Basin**

Duration: Two positions April 1, 2018–June 30, 2018
One position April 1, 2018–July 31, 2018

These are estimated dates. Length of season(s) may be shortened or extended depending on project needs, funding or factors beyond the project's control.

Job Description: Employees in these positions will be involved with collecting and processing biological data for an ongoing evaluation of the Northern Pikeminnow Management Program (NPMP). The NPMP was first implemented in 1991 to reduce predation on out-migrating juvenile salmon and steelhead by northern pikeminnow. ODFW oversees tagging efforts that provide for the estimation of sport-reward fishery exploitation rates, and collects other information to assess the response of the broader predator community to pikeminnow removals. Primary duties can include: boat electrofishing, tagging fish, collecting biological samples, and recording data in selected areas throughout the lower Columbia and Snake rivers. Other duties may include laboratory work (e.g., preparation/analysis of aging structures, stomach contents, and gonad samples) and office work (e.g., data entry and verification).

These positions require frequent outdoor work, at night, often in rough water, or adverse weather conditions. **All positions are based out of Clackamas, with frequent overnight travel of up to four nights per week. However, there is also the possibility of one extended trip of up to 10 days.** Positions require a flexible work schedule that varies in

the number of hours worked on a daily basis, but not necessarily each day, or a work schedule in which the starting and stopping times vary on a daily basis, but not necessarily each day, and does not exceed 40 hours in a workweek. Work exceeding 40 hours per week requires prior approval by the supervisor. Employees travel between Clackamas and work locations in government vehicles, and stay in hotels. Per diem is paid to reimburse employees for lodging and meal expenses where necessary. No per diem is paid when working in the Clackamas/Portland metro area. Housing is NOT provided other than motels when traveling outside this area. Job duties may require lifting up to 40 lbs.

Requirements: Applicants must have a valid driver license and an acceptable driving record. The Oregon Department of Fish and Wildlife will check driving records for finalists with an Oregon Driver License. Finalists without an Oregon Driver License will be required to present a current certified complete driving record for review.

Successful applicants must either already possess an Oregon Boater Education Card, or pass a boating safety course and receive their Oregon Boater Education Card prior to the first day of work. Preferred Skills: There are no minimum qualifications for these positions; however the ability to identify freshwater and estuarine fish species, handle live fish, and accurately record field data and experience operating and towing boats up to 22 feet in length, electrofishing, using computers and GPS units and who possess or are in pursuit of a Bachelor's degree in Fisheries or Wildlife Science or a related degree in biological/ecological sciences may be given preference. Candidates must be able to work/interact effectively as part of a crew, with the public, and with personnel from other agencies.
