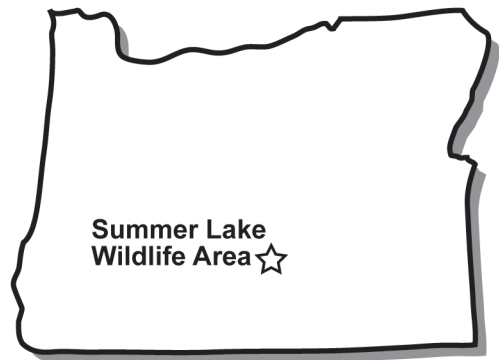
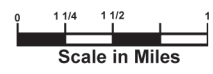


Summer Lake Wildlife Area

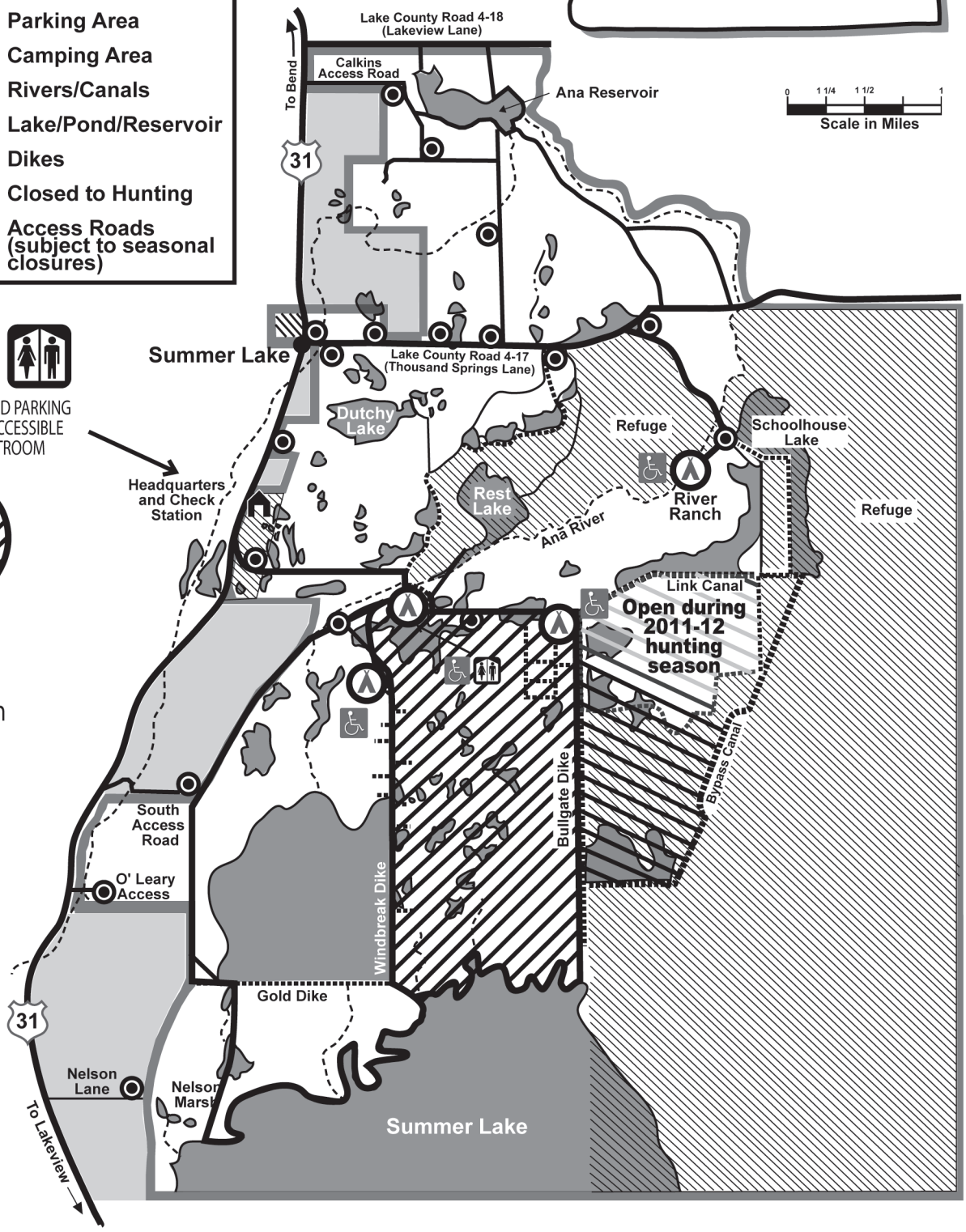

ADMINISTRATIVE RULES

SUMMER LAKE WILDLIFE AREA

The area is open to wildlife-oriented public use compatible with the objectives contained in the Summer Lake Wildlife Area Long Range Plan unless otherwise excluded or restricted by the following rules:

- (1) Portions of wildlife areas may be posted and closed to all entry. Entering an area posted "closed to entry" is prohibited except by special permit.
- (2) Entering any portion of the wildlife area south of Thousand Springs Lane (Lake Co. Rd. 4-17), except the Foster Place unit and open roads and campgrounds, seven days prior to 4 a.m. on the opening day of general waterfowl hunting season is prohibited.
- (3) Leaving garbage and litter on the area is prohibited.
- (4) Posted Refuges and Safety Zones are closed to hunting and shooting.
- (5) Posted Refuges are closed to all entry during authorized game bird and game mammal hunting seasons, except to retrieve lawfully taken wildlife, or by special permit.
- (6) Discharging firearms is prohibited except as authorized during game bird and game mammal hunting seasons, or by special permit.
- (7) Motor vehicles and other motor driven modes of transportation are prohibited except on parking areas and open roads or by special permit.
- (8) Operating boats with gas-powered motors is prohibited (electric trolling-type motors are permissible).
- (9) Camping or leaving vehicles unattended is prohibited except on areas designated for that use, and may not exceed 14 days per stay, except by special permit.
- (10) Running or training of dogs is prohibited except by special permit.
- (11) A special permit is required to remove firewood, cut trees, dig or remove artifacts or archaeological specimens, minerals, sand, gravel, rock, or any other article, product or material found on the area except fish and wildlife taken as permitted by law.
- (12) No person shall display behavior which unreasonably deters, distracts or hinders others in the peaceable enjoyment of the area.
- (13) Any person may be evicted from the wildlife area for violation of any department rules and regulations or when continued presence of that person could cause a threat to the rights and safety of others or property.
- (14) No person, commercial vendor or company shall dispense or sell material, goods or items on the area, except by special permit.
- (15) No person shall leave decoys set out overnight (8 p.m. to 4 a.m.).
- (16) No person shall possess or use any shot other than federally-approved nontoxic shot for all game bird hunting.
- (17) No person shall hunt big game with centerfire rifles and handguns.
- (18) No person shall hunt big game with firearms east of Hwy 31 during any pheasant, quail, or waterfowl seasons.
- (19) Hunters must obtain a daily hunting permit and check out at the end of the day. Hunting permits and area maps are available at the headquarters, 1.3 miles south of the town of Summer Lake. Phone: (541) 943-3152.
