



2017 PACIFIC HALIBUT SPORT REGULATIONS

COLUMBIA RIVER SUBAREA (Leadbetter Pt., WA, to Cape Falcon)

Nearshore Season Quota = 500 lbs.
Closed for the remainder of the year. Open seven days a week effective June 7 Mondays–Wednesdays inside the 40-fathom line off of Oregon beginning May 8, 2017, through the earlier of quota or Sept. 30.

All-Depth Season Quota = 12,299 lbs.
Closed for the remainder of the year. Open for one additional day, Saturday, June 17, 2017. Open May 4, 2017, Thursday–Sunday, every week through the earlier of quota or Sept. 30.

CENTRAL COAST SUBAREA (Cape Falcon to Humbug Mt.)

Nearshore Season Adjusted Quota = 35,631 lbs.
 Re-opened September 3, seven days a week, inside the 40-fathom line, through the earlier of the adjusted quota or Oct. 31. No groundfish retention is allowed except for other flatfish species.

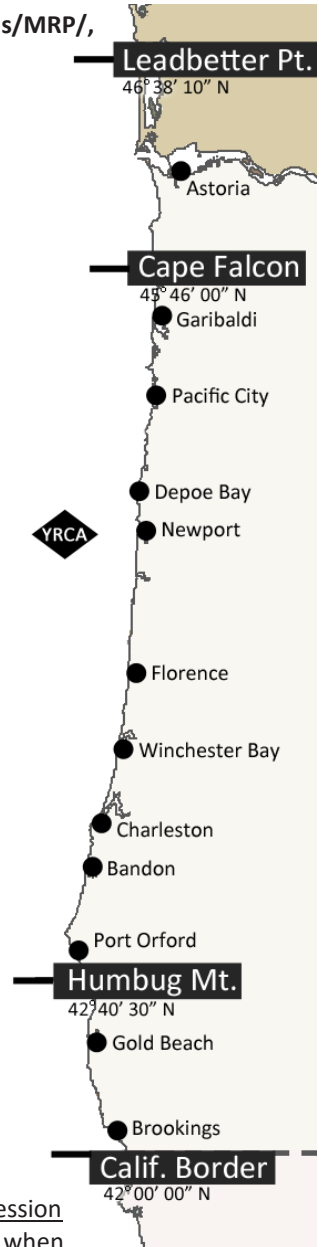
All-Depth Seasons Combined Quota (original) = 211,915 lbs.
Closed for the remainder of the year.

The Stonewall Bank YRCA (about 15 miles west of Newport) is closed to Pacific halibut fishing. Anglers on vessels possessing Pacific halibut are prohibited from fishing in the Stonewall Bank YRCA, even when targeting legal species

SOUTHERN OREGON SUBAREA (Humbug Mt. to OR/CA border)

Quota = ~~10,039~~ 6,039 lbs. revised. Open May 1, seven days per week, through the earlier of quota, or Oct. 31. **No groundfish retention is allowed except for other flatfish species.**



STATEWIDE REGULATIONS

- It is **mandatory to have a descending device** onboard the vessel when fishing for or having in possession any groundfish species or Pacific halibut, and to use the device when releasing any rockfish species when fishing outside of 30 fathoms.
- Daily bag limit: 1 Pacific halibut. Annual limit: 6. No length limit.
- Pacific halibut possession limit: 1 daily limit at sea, 3 daily limits on land
- Fathom lines and conservation areas are defined by waypoints.
- Pacific halibut seasons are managed and enforced based on port of landing. Halibut may only be landed at ports located within areas currently open to halibut retention, regardless of area of catch.
- South of Humbug Mt.: When angling for Pacific halibut outside of the 30-fm curve, only salmon (as regulations allow), sablefish (also called black cod), Pacific cod (or “true cod”; does not include lingcod), flatfish species (soles, flounders, sanddabs & turbot), tuna and most other offshore pelagic species may be in possession or landed when Pacific halibut are onboard the vessel, **effective 9/18/2017**.
- It is unlawful to fish for or take and retain any species while possessing onboard any species not allowed to be taken in that area at the time.
- Anglers are advised to consult the 2017 Oregon Sport Fishing Regulations for General (statewide), Zone, and Special Regulations prior to fishing.
