Commercial Nearshore Regulations Effective July 5, 2023

This notice details two-month period limit increases for Black Rockfish, Other Nearshore Rockfish, Cabezon, and Greenling for periods 4-6 in 2023. Landings for these species management categories are running below average and allow for increases. Trip limit increases for remaining 2023 periods are underlined below. These increases will allow additional opportunity to attain a larger portion of the state harvest guidelines. ODFW will continue to track landings in-season and make additional adjustments as needed. Quillback Rockfish prohibition: Unlawful to *retain or land* Quillback Rockfish taken with any non-trawl gear for commercial purposes, regardless of permit type.

Black Rockfish Management Areas: Per-trip limits for vessels fishing in these areas are *suspended* for an additional three years (2023 – 2025).

2-Month Cumulative Trip Limits – No vessel may land more than the following amounts:

Vessels with a Black Rockfish and Blue Rockfish Permit *WITH* or *WITHOUT* a Nearshore Endorsement

- Black Rockfish
- Period 1, January-February: 1,800 pounds
- Period 2, March-April: 1,800 pounds
- Period 3, May-June: 2,400 pounds
- Period 4, July-August: 2,700 pounds – this is a 300 pound increase
- Period 5, September-October: 2,700 pounds – this is a 900 pound increase
- Period 6, November-December: 2,700 pounds – this is a 900 pound increase
- Blue & Deacon Rockfish combined: 1,500 pounds per period

Vessels with a Black Rockfish and Blue Rockfish Permit *WITHOUT* a Nearshore Endorsement

- **All other Nearshore Fish species combined:** 15 pounds per day, not to exceed 25% of total landing by weight or cumulative trip limits for permits with a Nearshore Endorsement (below).

Vessels with a Black Rockfish and Blue Rockfish Permit *WITH* a Nearshore Endorsement

- **Other Nearshore Rockfish combined:** 650 pounds per period – this is a 200 pound increase
- **Cabezon:** 2,500 pounds per period – this is a 1,000 pound increase
- **Greenling:** 2,000 pounds per period – this is an 800 pound increase

* You must have a nearshore endorsement to land more than the incidental amount of Tiger and Vermilion Rockfish. Landings of these species apply toward each fisher's federal shelf rockfish trip limit, and not toward the state trip limits or annual harvest guidelines.

Current 2023 federal trip limits for Lingcod and Canary Rockfish are listed below and reflect changes to initial federal trip limits set for 2023. Updates to federal trip limits can be viewed on the website above. It is the responsibility of each fisher to know and comply with federal trip limits that are in effect at any given time.

For the purposes of federal trip limits, only vessels with a federal Pacific Coast Groundfish Limited Entry Permit are considered Limited Entry.
