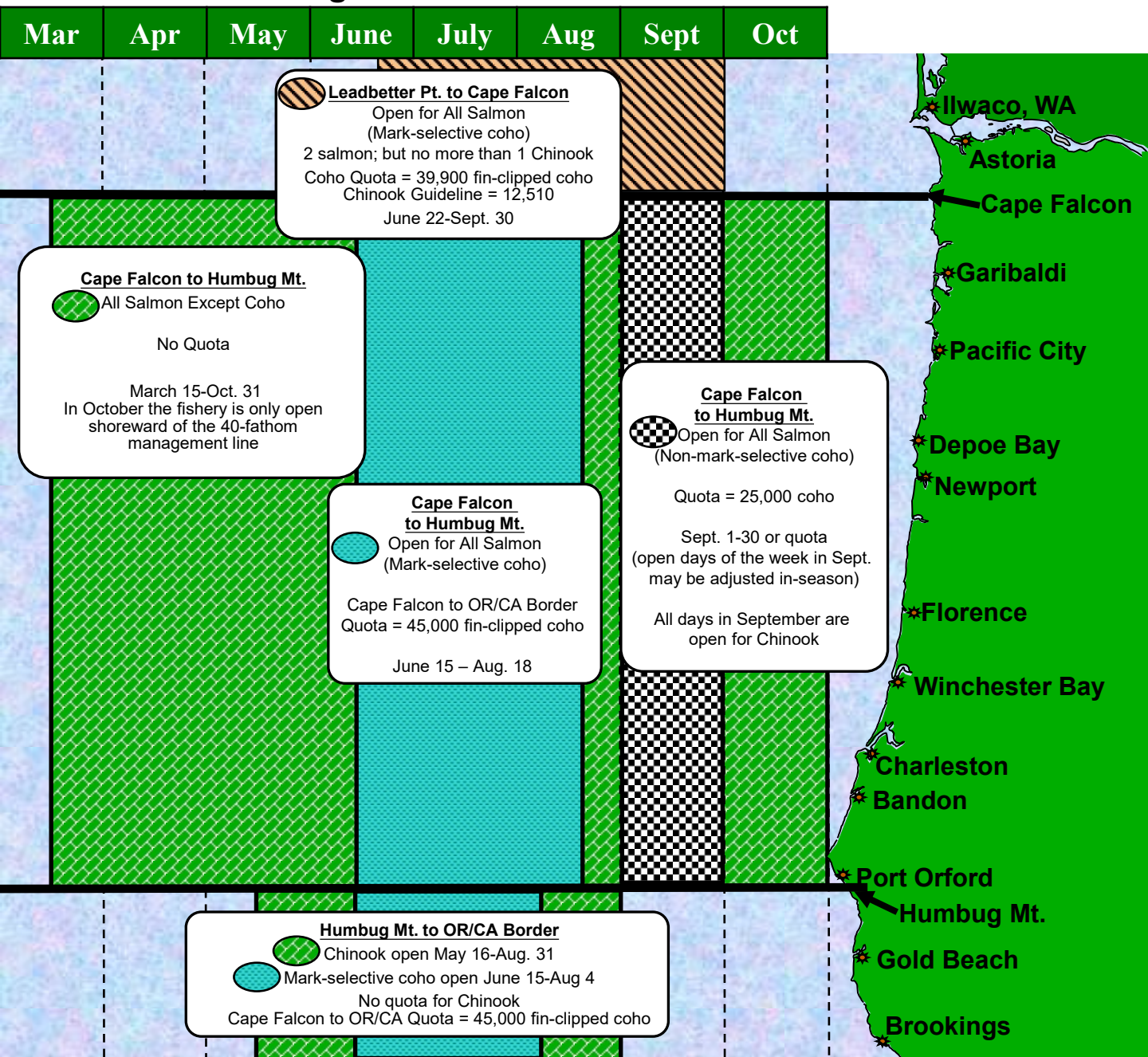


2024 Oregon Ocean Recreational Salmon Seasons

- All salmon, 2 per day only 1 may be a Chinook. All coho must have a healed adipose fin clip. Columbia River Control Zone closed to all salmon fishing.
- All salmon except coho, 2 per day.
- All salmon, 2 per day. All coho must have a healed adipose fin clip. A portion of any remaining coho quota may be rolled forward to the September non-mark selective coho season on an impact neutral basis.
- All salmon, 2 per day. Open for all salmon (no fin-clip restriction on retained coho).

- Other Regulations:
- 1) In the Stonewall Bank Yelloweye Rockfish Cons. Area, salmon fishing is limited to trolling on open "all depth halibut" days.
 - 2) No more than 2 single point barbless hooks and one line when fishing for salmon or when a salmon is on board.
 - 3) Minimum lengths: Chinook – 22" N. of Falcon and 24" S. of Falcon, coho – 16", steelhead – 20"; no size restriction for pink, chum, or sockeye salmon.
 - 4) All salmon caught between Humbug Mt. and the OR/CA Border must be landed into the State of Oregon.

Oregon Ocean Salmon Sport Seasons, 2024

Statewide Regulations:

- Anglers fishing for salmon and all anglers fishing from boats with a salmon on board are limited to no more than 2 single point barbless hooks per line, and no more than one line per angler. Salmon may only be taken with the gear described above.
- It is unlawful to fish for or take and retain any legal species while possessing on board any species not allowed to be taken in that area at that time.
- Minimum lengths: Chinook = 22" N. of Cape Falcon, and 24" S. of Cape Falcon; coho = 16"; steelhead = 20"; and no min. length for pink, chum, or sockeye salmon in ocean fishery.
- Refer to the "2024 Oregon Sportfishing Regulations" booklet for descriptions of special marine management areas including closed areas and additional restrictions.

Leadbetter Point, WA to Cape Falcon, OR

June 22 thru earlier of Sept. 30 or 39,900 fin-clipped coho quota, with a 12,510 Chinook subarea guideline. Open seven days per week. Open for all salmon, all coho must have a healed adipose fin clip. Two salmon per day, but no more than one Chinook.

Notes: Open seven days per week. Closed within the Columbia Control Zone.

Cape Falcon to Humbug Mountain

All salmon except coho season—Cape Falcon to Humbug Mt. :

March 15-October 31. Open seven days per week. Open for all salmon except coho, except for during the selective coho fishery and the non-select coho season. Two salmon per day. Beginning October 1, open only shoreward of the 40-fathom regulatory line.

Selective Coho (fin-clipped) Season - Cape Falcon to OR/CA border:

Open for All Salmon. 45,000 fin-clipped coho quota. Open seven days per week. All salmon, two salmon per day. All retained coho must have a healed adipose fin-clip.

Cape Falcon to Humbug Mountain - June 15 through earlier of August 18 or quota.

Humbug Mountain to OR/CA border - June 15 through earlier of August 4 or quota.

Non-mark-selective Coho Season (all salmon) - Cape Falcon to Humbug Mt.:

Open Sept. 1 through the earlier of September 30 or 25,000 non-mark-selective coho quota. Open days may be modified in-season. Open seven days per week. All salmon, two salmon per day.

Notes:

•Within the Stonewall Bank Yelloweye Rockfish Conservation Area salmon angling is restricted to trolling on all depth halibut days.

•Chinook Season (all salmon except coho) will reopen March 15, 2025 unless modified by in-season action in March 2025.

Humbug Mountain to OR/CA Border

All salmon except coho season—Humbug Mt. to OR/CA border :

May 16—August 31 Open seven days per week. Open for all salmon except coho, except for during the selective coho fishery. Two salmon per day.

Selective Coho (fin-clipped) Season - Cape Falcon to OR/CA border

Open for All Salmon Except Chinook. June 15 through earlier of August 4 or 45,000 fin-clipped coho quota. Open seven days per week. All salmon, two salmon per day. All retained coho must have a healed adipose fin-clip.
