



2025 Oregon Ocean Recreational Salmon Seasons

Statewide Regulations

- Anglers fishing for salmon and all anglers fishing from boats with a salmon on board are limited to no more than 2 single point barbless hooks per line, and no more than one line per angler. Salmon may only be taken with the gear described above.
- It is unlawful to fish for or take and retain any legal species while possessing on board any species not allowed to be taken in that area at that time.
- Minimum lengths: Chinook = 22" N. of Cape Falcon, and 24" S. of Cape Falcon; coho = 16"; steelhead = 20"; and no min. length for pink, chum, or sockeye salmon in ocean fishery.
- Refer to the "2025 Oregon Sportfishing Regulations" booklet for descriptions of special marine management areas including closed areas and additional restrictions.

Leadbetter Point, WA to Cape Falcon, OR

June 25 through the earlier of September 30 or 49,860 fin-clipped coho subarea quota, with a 16,600 Chinook subarea guideline. Open seven days per week. Open for all salmon, all coho must have a healed adipose fin clip. Two salmon per day, but no more than one Chinook. Possession of salmon onboard a vessel is prohibited in the area prior to June 25 when the subarea is closed to salmon retention.

Notes: Closed within the Columbia Control Zone.

Cape Falcon to Humbug Mountain

All Salmon Except Coho Season—Cape Falcon to Humbug Mountain:

March 15 - June 6. Open seven days per week. Open for all salmon except coho, two salmon per day.

Mark-Selective Coho (fin-clipped) Season - Cape Falcon to OR/CA border:

June 7 through the earlier of August 24 or 44,000 fin-clipped coho quota. Two salmon per day. When Chinook retention is allowed, no more than one Chinook. All retained coho must have a healed adipose fin-clip.

Cape Falcon to Humbug Mountain:

June 7 - July 15, Chinook retention allowed (no more than one daily)

July 16 - August 24 (or quota), no Chinook retention

Non-Mark Selective Coho Season (all salmon) - Cape Falcon to Humbug Mountain

Open September 1 through the earlier of September 30 or 30,000 non-mark-selective coho quota. Open days may be modified in-season. Open seven days per week. All salmon, two salmon per day, but no more than one Chinook.

All Salmon Except Coho Season—Cape Falcon to Humbug Mountain:

The earlier of October 1 or the end of the Non-Mark Selective season through October 31. Open for all salmon except coho, one salmon per day. Open only shoreward of the 40-fathom regulatory line.

Notes:

- Within the Stonewall Bank Yelloweye Rockfish Conservation Area salmon angling is restricted to trolling on all depth halibut days.
- Chinook Season (all salmon except coho) from Cape Falcon to OR/CA border will reopen March 15, 2026 unless modified by in-season action in March 2026.

Humbug Mountain to OR/CA Border

All Salmon Except Coho Season—Humbug Mt. to OR/CA border :

May 16 - June 6; June 30 - July 15. Open seven days per week. Open for all salmon except coho, except for during the selective coho fishery. Two salmon per day.

Mark-Selective Coho (fin-clipped) Season - Cape Falcon to OR/CA border:

June 7 through the earlier of August 24 or 44,000 fin-clipped coho quota. Two salmon per day. When Chinook retention is allowed, no more than one Chinook. All retained coho must have a healed adipose fin-clip.

Humbug Mountain to OR/CA border:

June 7 - June 29, no Chinook retention

June 30 - July 15, Chinook retention allowed (no more than one daily)

July 16 - August 24 (or quota), no Chinook retention

Note: Any salmon caught within the Humbug Mt. to OR/CA border area must be landed within the State of Oregon.
