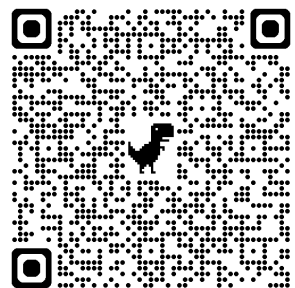

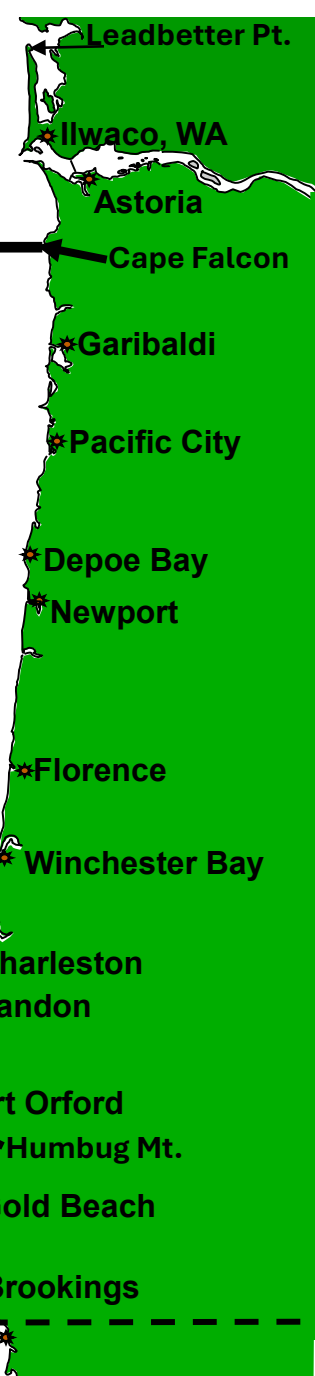
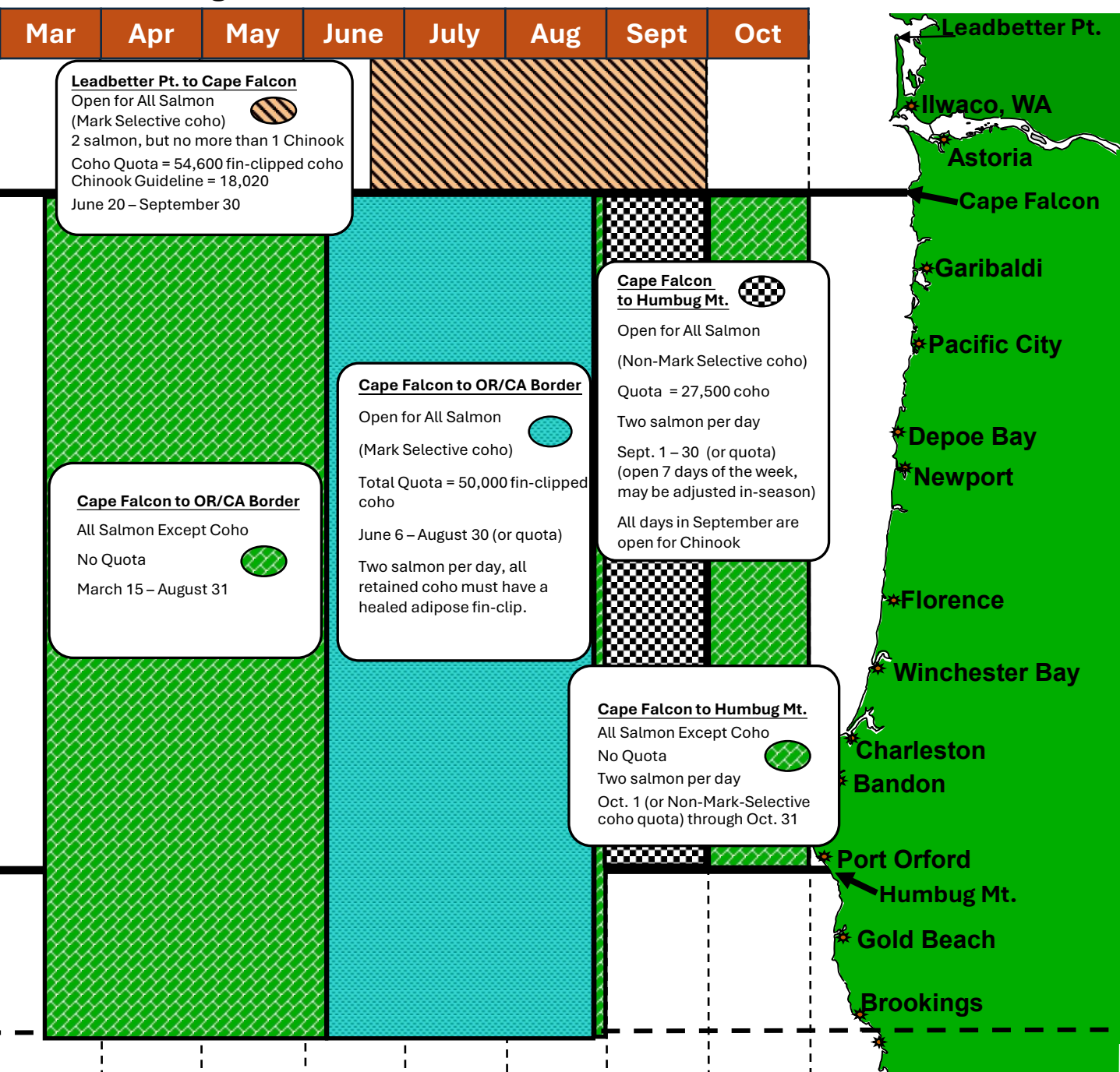

# 2026 Oregon Ocean Recreational Salmon Alternative 1 – 3/9/2026

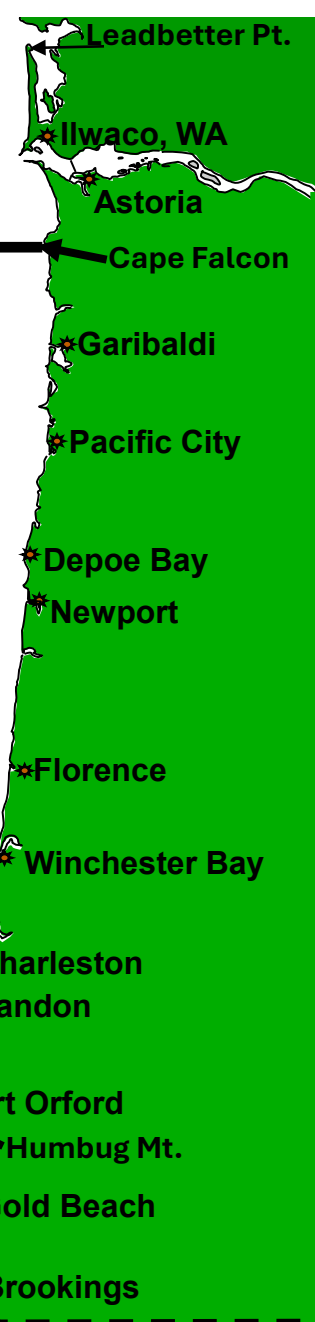
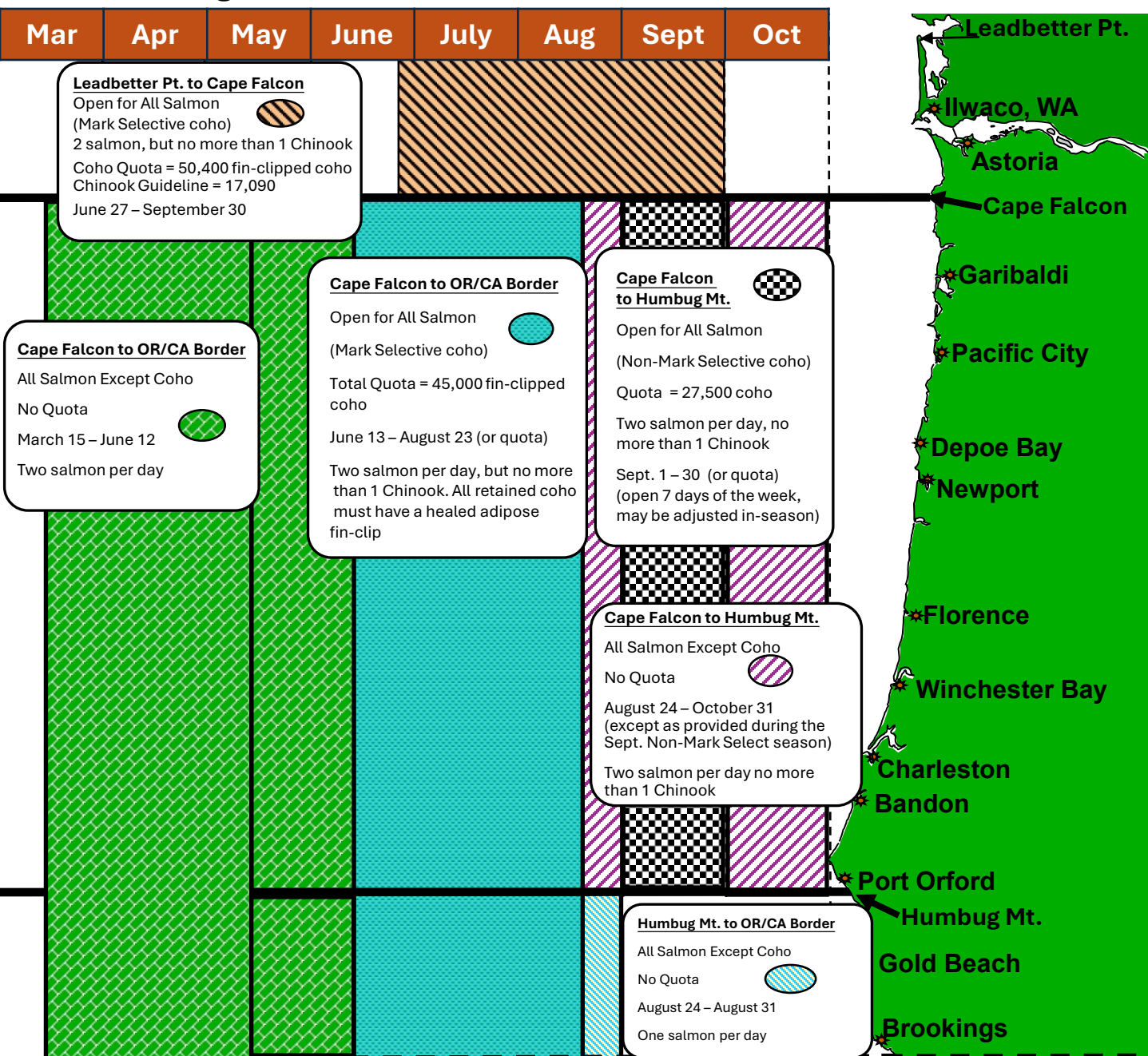


- All salmon; 2 per day, only 1 may be a Chinook. All coho must have a healed adipose fin clip.
- All salmon except coho, 2 per day.
- All salmon, 2 per day. All coho must have a healed adipose fin clip. A portion of any remaining coho quota may be rolled forward to the September non-mark selective coho season on an impact neutral basis.
- All salmon, 2 per day. Open for all salmon (no fin-clip restriction on retained coho).

Other Regulations:

- 1) In the Stonewall Bank Yelloweye Rockfish Cons. Area, salmon fishing is limited to trolling on open "all depth halibut" days.
- 2) No more than 2 single point barbless hooks and one line when fishing for salmon or when a salmon is on board.
- 3) Minimum lengths: Chinook – 22" N. of Falcon and 24" S. of Falcon, coho – 16", steelhead – 20"; no size restriction for pink, chum, or sockeye salmon.

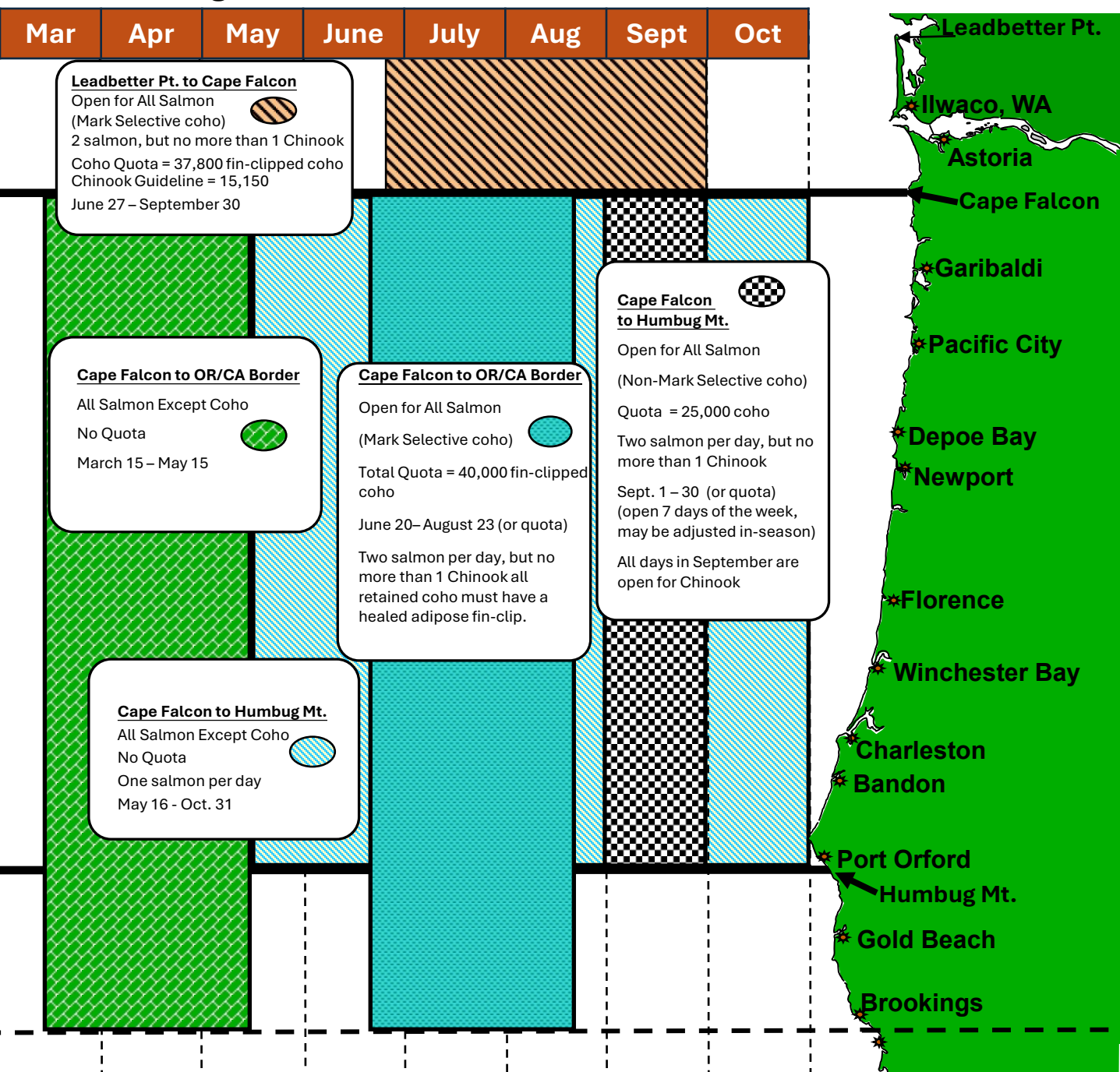


- All salmon; 2 per day, only 1 may be a Chinook. All coho must have a healed adipose fin clip.
- All salmon except coho, 2 per day.
- All salmon, 2 per day. All coho must have a healed adipose fin clip. A portion of any remaining coho quota may be rolled forward to the September non-mark selective coho season on an impact neutral basis.
- All salmon except coho, 2 per day, but no more than 1 Chinook
- All salmon, 2 per day, but no more than 1 Chinook. Open for all salmon (no fin-clip restriction on retained coho).
- All salmon except coho, 1 per day.

**Other Regulations:**

- 1) In the Stonewall Bank Yelloweye Rockfish Cons. Area, salmon fishing is limited to trolling on open “all depth halibut” days.
- 2) No more than 2 single point barbless hooks and one line when fishing for salmon or when a salmon is on board.
- 3) Minimum lengths: Chinook – 22” N. of Falcon and 24” S. of Falcon, coho – 16”, steelhead – 20”; no size restriction for pink, chum, or sockeye salmon.

# 2026 Oregon Ocean Recreational Salmon Alternative 3 – 3/9/2026



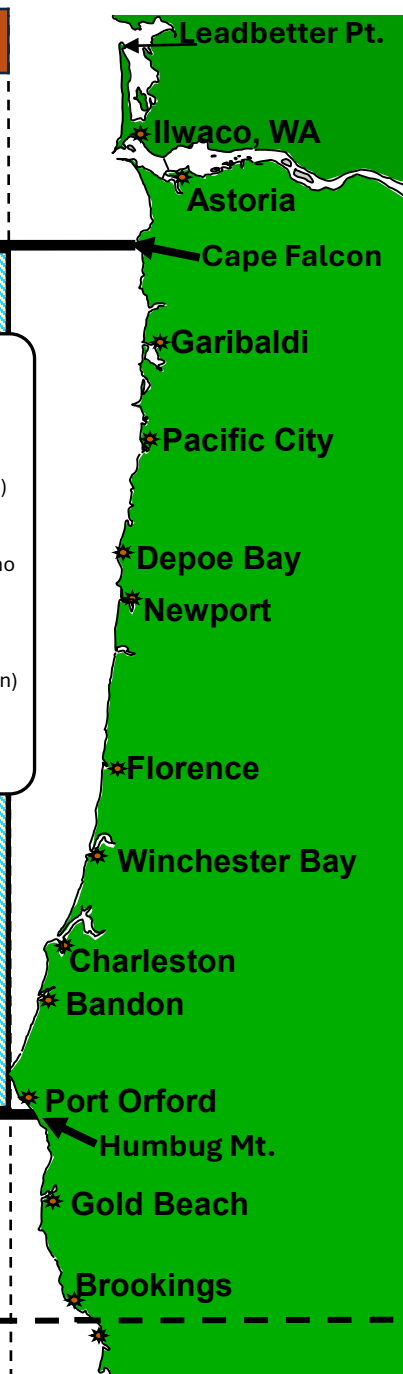
**Leadbetter Pt. to Cape Falcon**  
 Open for All Salmon (Mark Selective coho)  
 2 salmon, but no more than 1 Chinook  
 Coho Quota = 37,800 fin-clipped coho  
 Chinook Guideline = 15,150  
 June 27 – September 30

**Cape Falcon to OR/CA Border**  
 All Salmon Except Coho  
 No Quota  
 March 15 – May 15

**Cape Falcon to OR/CA Border**  
 Open for All Salmon (Mark Selective coho)  
 Total Quota = 40,000 fin-clipped coho  
 June 20 – August 23 (or quota)  
 Two salmon per day, but no more than 1 Chinook all retained coho must have a healed adipose fin-clip.

**Cape Falcon to Humbug Mt.**  
 Open for All Salmon (Non-Mark Selective coho)  
 Quota = 25,000 coho  
 Two salmon per day, but no more than 1 Chinook  
 Sept. 1 – 30 (or quota) (open 7 days of the week, may be adjusted in-season)  
 All days in September are open for Chinook

**Cape Falcon to Humbug Mt.**  
 All Salmon Except Coho  
 No Quota  
 One salmon per day  
 May 16 - Oct. 31

- All salmon except coho, 2 per day.
- All salmon except coho, 1 per day.
