

Jenkins Access Area



The Jenkins Access Area is a cooperative program between a private landowner and the Oregon Department of Fish and Wildlife Access and Habitat Program to allow public hunting access on private lands and increased access to public land. The Jenkins Access Area north-east of Diamond, OR provides public hunting opportunities for deer, pronghorn, predators, quail, chukar and ground squirrels. All Oregon Department of Fish and Wildlife Regulations and Seasons apply.

Access Allowed:
August 1 – March 1

Area Regulations

- No ATVs on or off road
- Motorized vehicles only on roads mapped and posted as open access roads
- No Camping or night-time use of private land
- No Fires, be careful with cigarettes
- No Littering, pick up any trash
- Report any unlawful activities
- Respect landowners rights and needs
- **Leave all gates as you found them**

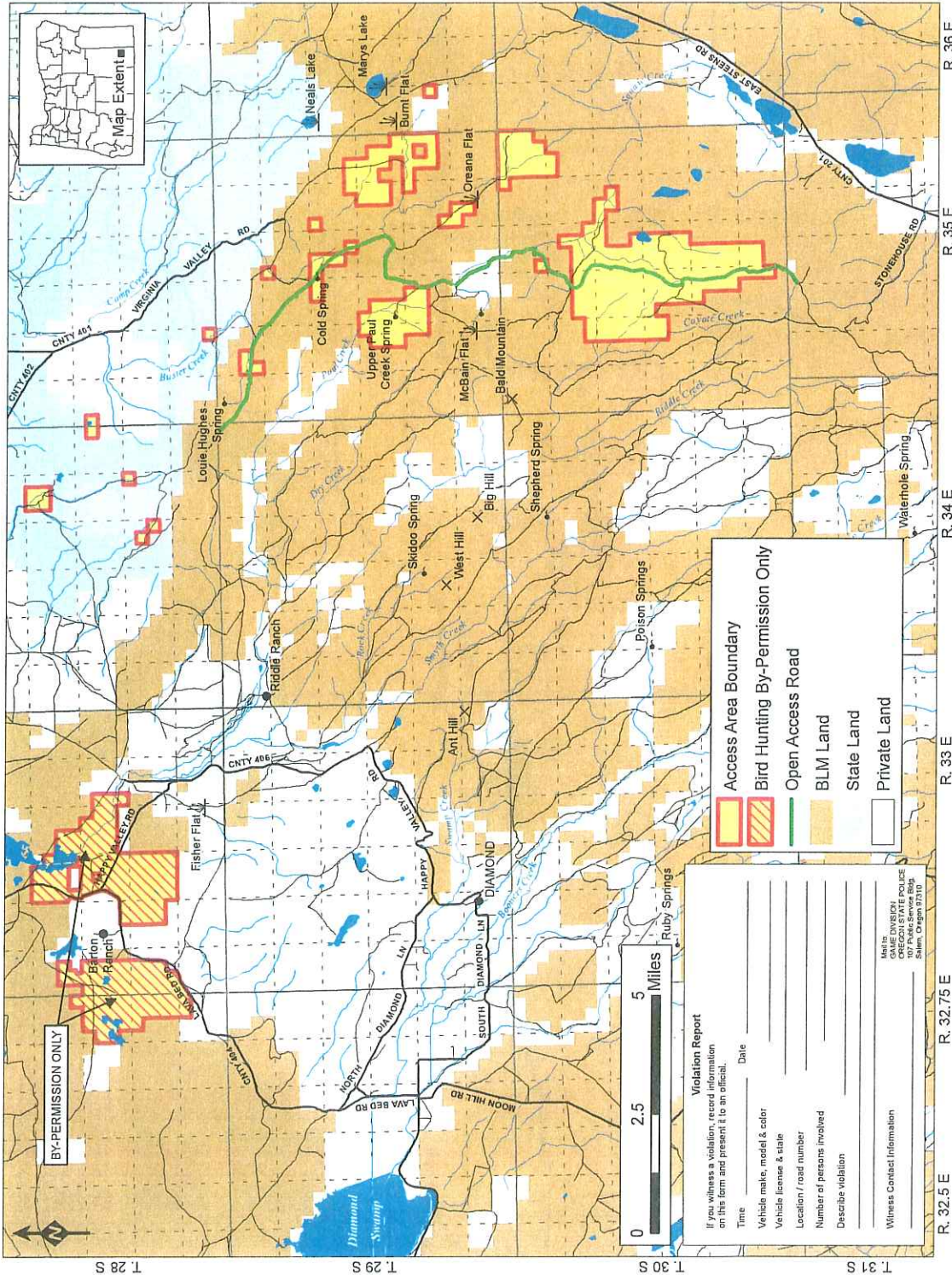
No permission is required to hunt on the Jenkins Access Area, except the bird hunting areas. Please get permission for these areas by contacting Jenkins Ranches at (541) 493-2503 between 5 pm and 7:30 pm. "Welcome to Hunt" signs are posted at all access roads. You are responsible for knowing property boundaries. Do Not Trespass on adjacent private lands. The Jenkins Access Area is adjacent to Bureau of Land Management Wilderness Areas and Wilderness Study Areas. You are responsible for knowing and following the regulations for these areas.

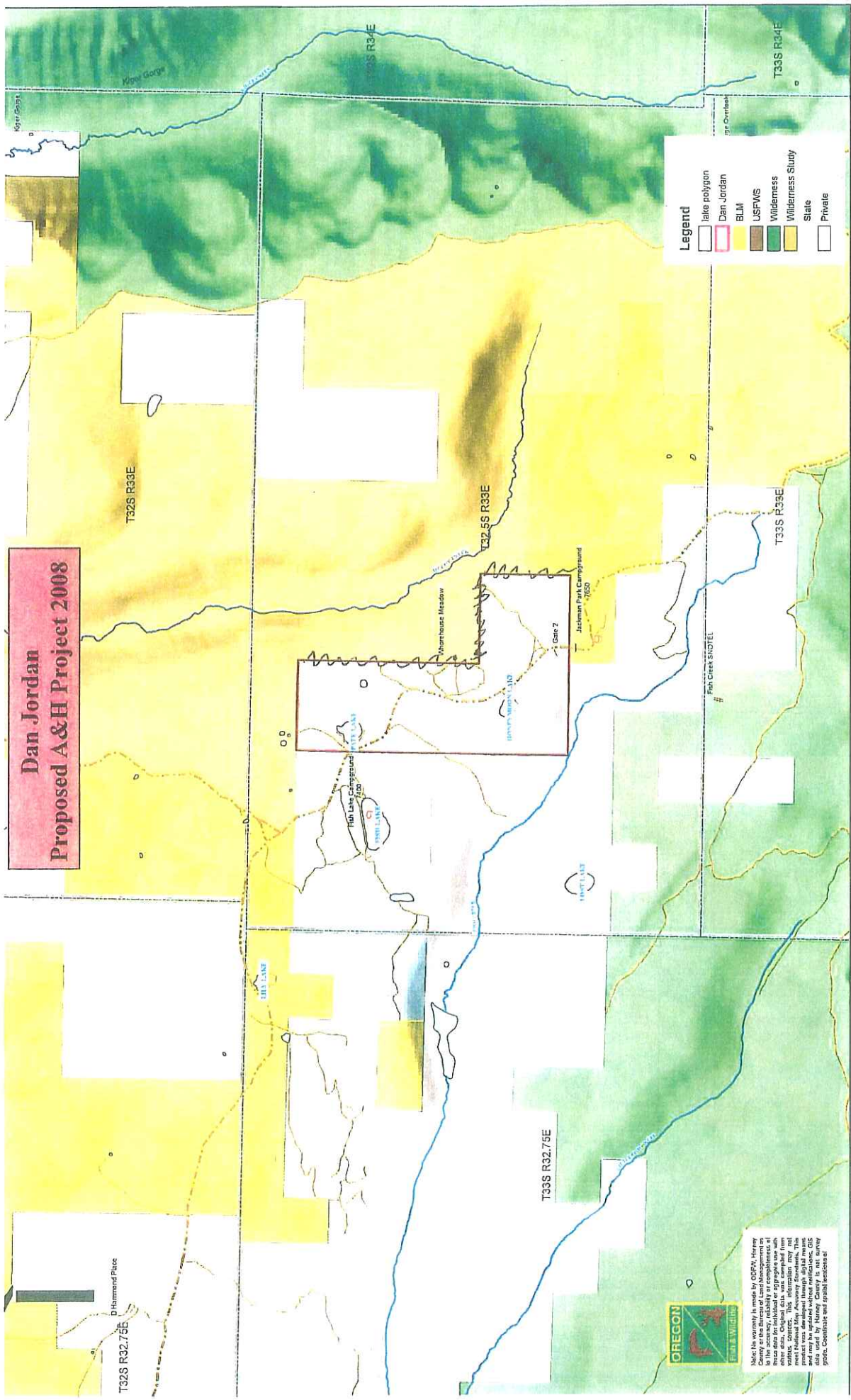

Glass Hill Access Area



The Glass Hill Access Area is a cooperative program between several private landowners and the Oregon Department of Fish and Wildlife Access and Habitat Program to maintain public hunting access on private lands and increase access to public land. The Glass Hill Access Area south of La Grande, OR provides public hunting opportunities for deer, elk, predators, chukar, pheasant, turkey, and quail. All Oregon Department of Fish and Wildlife Regulations and Seasons apply.

Access Allowed: In Effect Year Round

Access Permission:

Zone A is welcome to hunt however you are responsible for knowing property boundaries. Do Not Trespass on surrounding private lands. Hunters must obtain permission prior to hunting within Zone B. Permission can be obtained by contacting the La Grande ODFW field office by phone at (541)963-2138, between 8 AM and 5 PM Monday - Friday. Reservations will be booked on a first come, first served basis. Hunters who make reservations to hunt during a particular week, are ineligible to hunt the area the following week. Landowners reserve the right to refuse permission and close areas due to normal ranch operations.

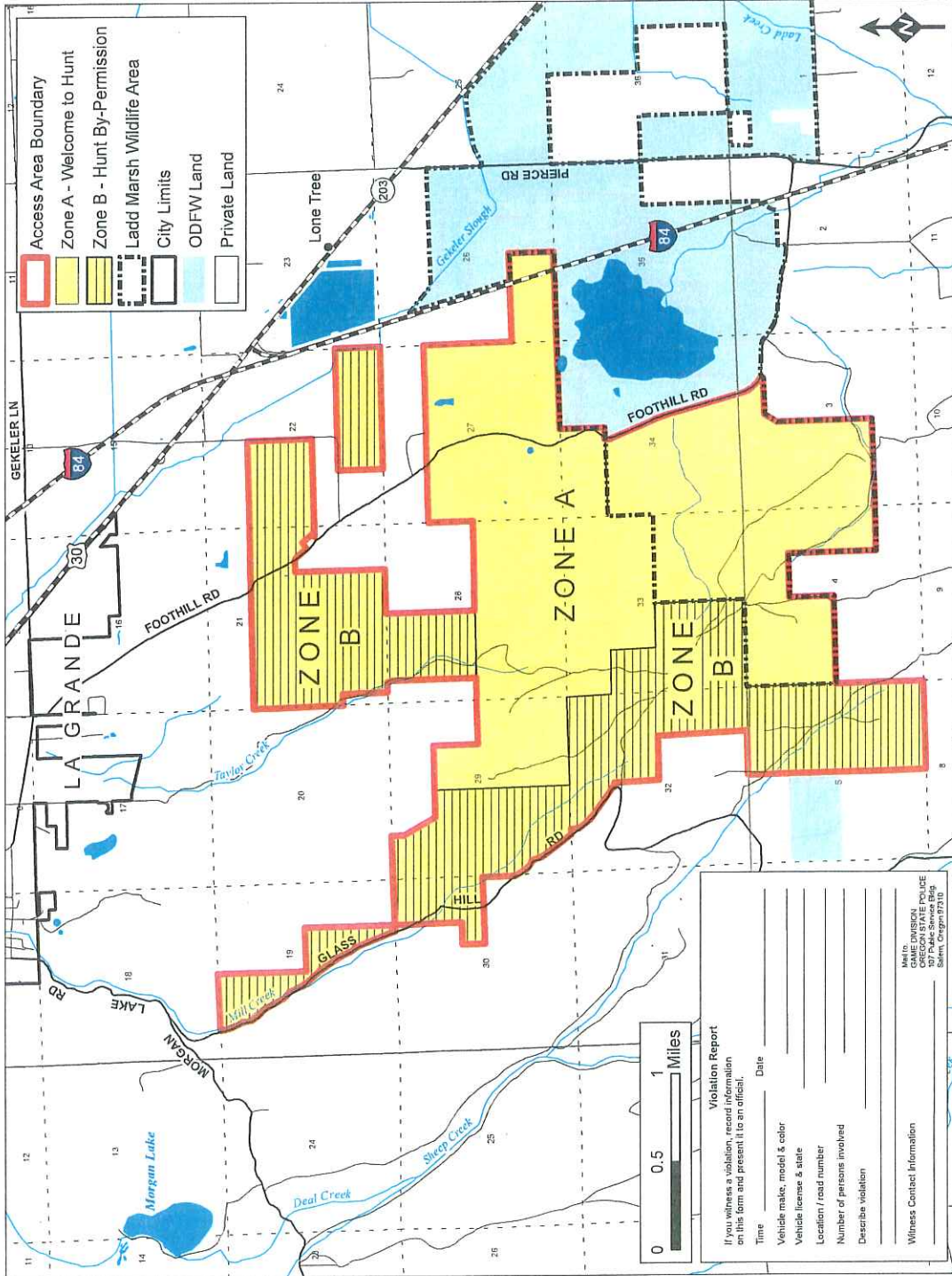

All Oregon Department of Fish and Wildlife Regulations and Seasons Apply.

Access Allowed: In Effect Year Round

Area Regulations:

- Motorized vehicles only on open roads
- No camping or night-time use of private land
- No fires, be careful with cigarettes
- No littering, pick up any trash
- Report unlawful activities
- Respect landowners' rights and needs
- Leave all gates as you found them
- Do not damage roads during wet conditions

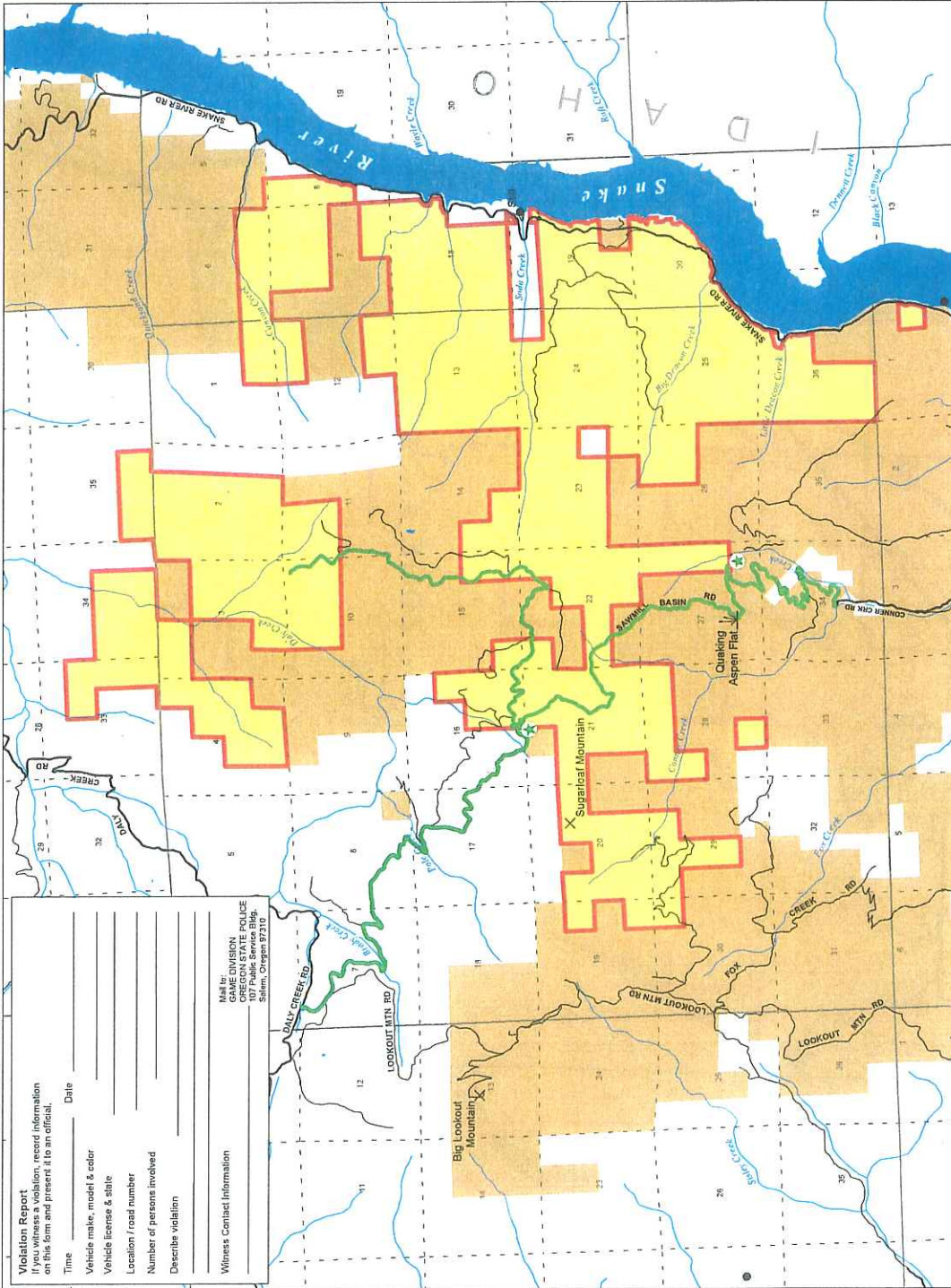

Access Allowed:
August 1 - December 1

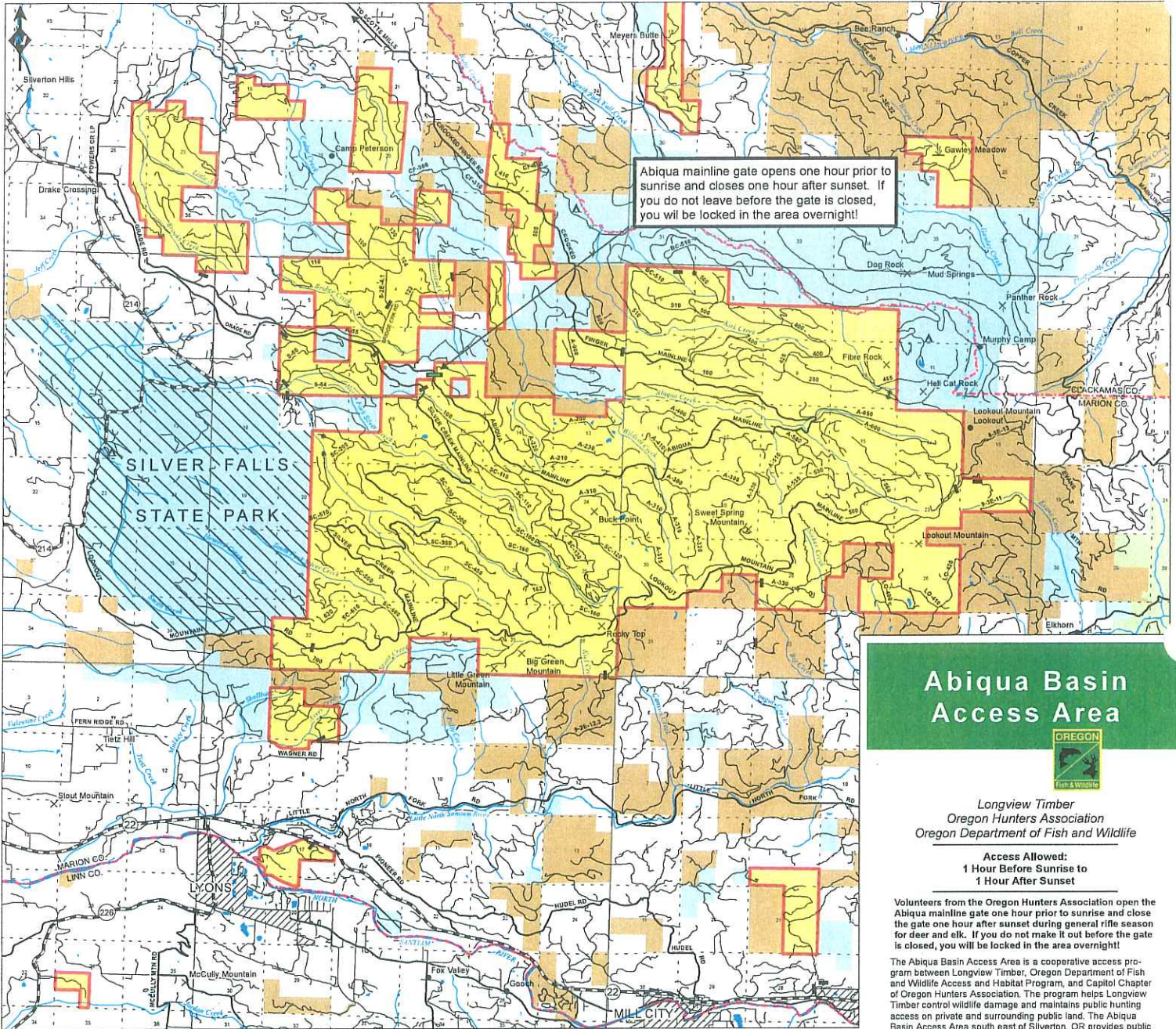
Bloomer Access Area

1 Hour Before Sunrise to
1 Hour After Sunset**

Volunteers from the Oregon Hunters Association open the Abiqua mainline gate one hour prior to sunrise and close the gate one hour after sunset during general rifle season for deer and elk. If you do not make it out before the gate is closed, you will be locked in the area overnight!

The Abiqua Basin Access Area is a cooperative access program between Longview Timber, Oregon Department of Fish and Wildlife Access and Habitat Program, and Capitol Chapter of Oregon Hunters Association. The program helps Longview Timber control wildlife damage and maintains public hunting access on private and surrounding public land. The Abiqua Basin Access Area south east of Silverton, OR provides public hunting opportunity for deer, elk, bear, cougar, grouse, and quail. All Oregon Department of Fish and Wildlife Regulations and Seasons apply. Area may be closed during high fire danger.
