2 **Purpose**

3 The purpose of these rules is to describe the procedures and necessary accompanying
4 information for submitting artwork for habitat conservation stamps, the criteria for selection of the
5 winning entry, the obligation of winning artists, and sales provisions pursuant to ORS Chapter 496.

11 **Submission of Artwork: Requirements**

12 (1) Applicants shall submit artwork for the habitat conservation stamp to the Department
13 headquarters office by 5:00 p.m. on the following deadline dates:

14 (a) ~~For 2012~~ **13, the** habitat conservation stamp deadline is ~~[February 29, 2012]~~ **Friday,**
15 **August 31, 2012.** ~~[(b) For 2013, the habitat conservation stamp deadline is Friday, August 31,~~
16 ~~2012.]~~ All subsequent years the habitat conservation stamp deadline is the last Friday of the month
17 of August of the preceding year;

18 (2) Habitat conservation stamp artwork shall feature at least one Strategy Species in a respective
19 Strategy Habitat. Strategy Species and Strategy Habitats are identified in the 2006 Oregon
20 Conservation Strategy.

21 (3) Each entry shall measure 13 inches by 18 inches (horizontal or vertical) and shall be in any
22 full color medium ~~[except any photographic process].~~

23 **(4) No photographs, sculptures, fabric art or carvings will be accepted.**

24 **(5) The artwork shall be original and not computer-generated or computer-enhanced.**

25 ~~[(4)]~~ **(6)** The artwork shall be ~~[original and]~~ unsigned by the artist, and shall not have been used
26 in production or entered into any other state^[2]s habitat stamp competition, **including Oregon.** Any
27 artwork signed by the artist will not be accepted and will be returned to the artist without being
28 judged.

1 **(7) The artwork shall be completely dry. The Department is not responsible for damage to**
2 **any artwork submitted wet or uncured.**

3 ~~[(5)]~~ **(8)** The entry ~~[may]~~ **shall** be mounted and/or matted, but it shall not be framed or under
4 glass.

5 ~~[(6)]~~ **(9)** Artists may submit more than one entry meeting the requirements herein.

6 ~~[(7)]~~ **(10)** Each artist shall submit with his or her entry or entries a brief biographical description
7 that includes the artist's background, experience, and previous artistic accomplishments. The
8 Department reserves the right to use this information for publicity should the work be selected.

9 ~~[(8)]~~ **(11)** Department employees are not eligible to participate in the contest.

15 **Selection Process and Criteria**

16 (1) A five-member panel including one Fish and Wildlife Commission member and four citizens
17 chosen by the Director shall select the winning entry. Panel members may include representatives
18 from the art community, wildlife profession, news media and conservation organizations.

19 (2) The selection panel shall choose the winning artwork based on:

20 (a) Artistic composition;

21 (b) Anatomical accuracy;

22 (c) Habitat accuracy;

23 (d) General rendering;

24 (e) Background; and

25 (f) General appeal.

26 (3) All artwork submissions shall be made available for public viewing following selection of the
27 winning entry.

2 **Other Provisions**

3 (1) The fee for the habitat conservation stamp is \$38.00 (plus \$2.00 agent fee) and includes a free
4 annual ODFW Wildlife Area Parking Permit.

5 (2) Sale of habitat conservation stamps by the Department shall end at the close of business on
6 December 31, of the respective year. Excess stamps at that time shall be shredded after auditing of
7 sales takes place.

8 (3) The Department shall award three thousand dollars (\$3,000) to the artist whose entry is
9 selected for the habitat conservation stamp.

10 (4) The winning entry shall become the exclusive property of the Department.

11 (5) The Department shall retain all reproduction rights and may review proposals for limited
12 edition prints, posters, or other related art products.

13 (6) The artist shall sign, at no charge, up to two hundred [~~ten~~ **fifty** (~~210~~) **250** habitat
14 conservation [stamps] **prints** for sale by the Department.

1 **Procedures for Issuance and Enforcement of Parking Permits for Department Wildlife Areas**

2 The Oregon Department of Fish and Wildlife hereby adopts the following procedures relating to
3 issuance and enforcement of parking permits for certain vehicles in Department Wildlife Area
4 parking areas:

5 (1) Parking is permitted only in designated parking areas. A parking permit is required at all
6 times for all fee parking areas.

7 (2) Fee parking areas are designated by the following signs:

8 (a) "Entering ODFW Wildlife Area -- Parking Permit Required Beyond This Point";

9 (b) "Parking allowed only in designated areas – ODFW Wildlife Area Parking Permit Required".

10 (3) There are two separate permits: an annual permit and a daily permit.

11 (4) The fee for parking permits is \$5.00 (plus \$2.00 agent fee) for permits issued on a daily basis
12 or \$20.00 (plus \$2.00 agent fee) for permits issued on an annual basis beginning each January 1.

13 Beginning with 2012 licenses, any annual hunting license (including Combination and Sports Pac),
14 **and/or purchase of the Habitat Conservation Stamp** will include a free annual parking permit.

15 (5) Permits are issued by selected local agents, Department offices that sell licenses and the
16 Department's Online License Sales website to a party upon payment and may be transferred from
17 vehicle to vehicle.

18 (6) The permits must be visible from outside the vehicle and be displayed in the front or rear
19 window of the vehicle.

20 (7) No parking permits will be required for those vehicles which are owned or operated by
21 government agencies. Notwithstanding paragraph (5), the Department reserves the right to issue free
22 administrative parking permits for private vehicles used by volunteers while participating in official
23 Department-related activities. Parking permits will not be required for individuals arriving in private
24 vehicles to address fire, health or safety emergencies.

1 (8)(a) A person who operates or parks a motor-propelled vehicle in violation of restrictions
2 established and posted under OAR 635-008-0146 through 635-008-0151 commits an offense
3 punishable as provided in ORS 496.992;

4 (b) The procedure for a peace officer (or other person authorized to enforce the wildlife laws) to
5 follow upon finding a non government vehicle parked in a designated fee parking area without a
6 permit shall consist of the issuance of a citation which shall be either delivered to the defendant or
7 placed in a conspicuous place upon the vehicle in the violation.

AND SUSPENDING LICENSE AGENCIES**

14 **Licenses, Tags or Documents Available by Mail Order, Fax or Internet**

15 (1) All licenses, tags, permits or validations sold by the Department over the Internet fall into one of three
16 categories concerning how the sale is made: Instant; Temporary; or Postal. Postal transactions are also
17 available by mail order or fax.

18 (a) Instant: means that the internet purchase results in an immediate sale and printing of the item, allowing
19 the purchaser to make immediate use of item purchased. No other action is required to complete the
20 transaction. The items in this category are:

21 (A) Daily Angling Licenses: one-, two-, three-, four- and seven-day licenses;

22 (B) Three-day Nonresident Shellfish licenses;

23 (C) Three-day Nonresident Bird Hunting Licenses;

24 (D) Big Game controlled hunt applications;

25 (E) Game Bird controlled hunt applications;

26 (F) [~~Sauvie Island~~] Daily parking permits;

27 (G) Band-tailed Pigeon permits;

28 (H) Black Brant Permits;

29 (I) Sage Grouse Permits;

30 (J) Fern Ridge Reservation Permits;

1 (K) Klamath Reservation Permits; and

2 (L) Sauvie Island Reservation Permits.

3 (b) Temporary: means that the internet purchase results in an immediate sale and printing of the item,
4 allowing the purchaser to make limited use (10 days) of the item purchased. The Department will send the
5 final, permanent item to the purchaser via postal mail. The items in this category are:

6 (A) HIP Migratory Bird Validations;

7 (B) HIP Upland Bird Validations;

8 (C) HIP Crow Validations;

9 (D) Nonresident Game Bird Validations;

10 (E) Upland Game Bird Validations;

11 (F) Waterfowl Bird Validations;

12 (G) [~~Sauvie Island~~] Annual Parking Permits;

13 (H) Sea Duck Permits;

14 (I) Aquatic Invasive Species Prevention Permit;

15 (J) Two-Rod Angling License; and

16 (K) All annual hunting and angling licenses;

17 (c) Postal: means that the internet purchase results in an immediate sale and the printing of a transaction
18 receipt, but that the Department mails the actual item to the purchaser via postal mail. The privilege(s)
19 purchased is not valid until the purchaser receives the item. The items in this category are:

20 (A) Combined Hunting Tags;

21 (B) Combined Angling Tag;

22 (C) Hatchery Harvest Tag;

23 (D) All Big Game Tags (controlled hunt and general season);

24 (E) Pheasant Tags;

25 (F) NW Oregon Goose Permit; [~~and~~]

26 (G) Turkey Tags[-] ; **and**

27 **(H) Habitat Conservation Stamp**

28 (2) The Department will charge shipping and handling fee of \$2.00 per session whenever a person makes
29 a purchase via Internet, fax, or mail order. This fee is in addition to all other document costs and covers the
30 processing, printing, and postal mailing of the requested documents.
