

Agenda Item Summary

BACKGROUND

The Oregon Fisheries Restoration and Enhancement Act, adopted in 1989 and re-authorized through 2019, directed the Oregon Department of Fish and Wildlife (department) to restore Oregon’s fisheries. The program is funded from a surcharge on all sport fishing licenses and by commercial salmon permit and poundage fees. A seven-member Restoration and Enhancement (R&E) Board (Board) reviews all projects and provides recommendations to the Oregon Fish and Wildlife Commission (Commission) for project funding.

The R&E Board recommended funding for 14 projects, totaling \$477,590 at their meeting in Lakeview on July 26th.

This is the second cycle of proposals for the 2013-2015 biennium. If the Commission adopts the Board’s recommendations, \$2,054,059 of the \$4,664,893, spending limitation for the 2013-2015 biennium will be allocated.
