ODFW Hunting and Fishing License Customer Survey

In late 2013 the Department contracted with Southwick Associates to survey thousands of Oregon's Resident and Non-resident hunters and anglers to gauge their support for a variety of potential new license structure concepts. The concepts tested were innovatively developed in close collaboration with a wide variety of customers from throughout the state. While hundreds of ideas were generated, only those that met the following criteria were considered: 1) Would they create customer value?, 2) Would they positively affect revenues?, 3) Would they be politically feasible?, and 4) Would they be systematically feasible? The following tables summarize the survey and selected results.
