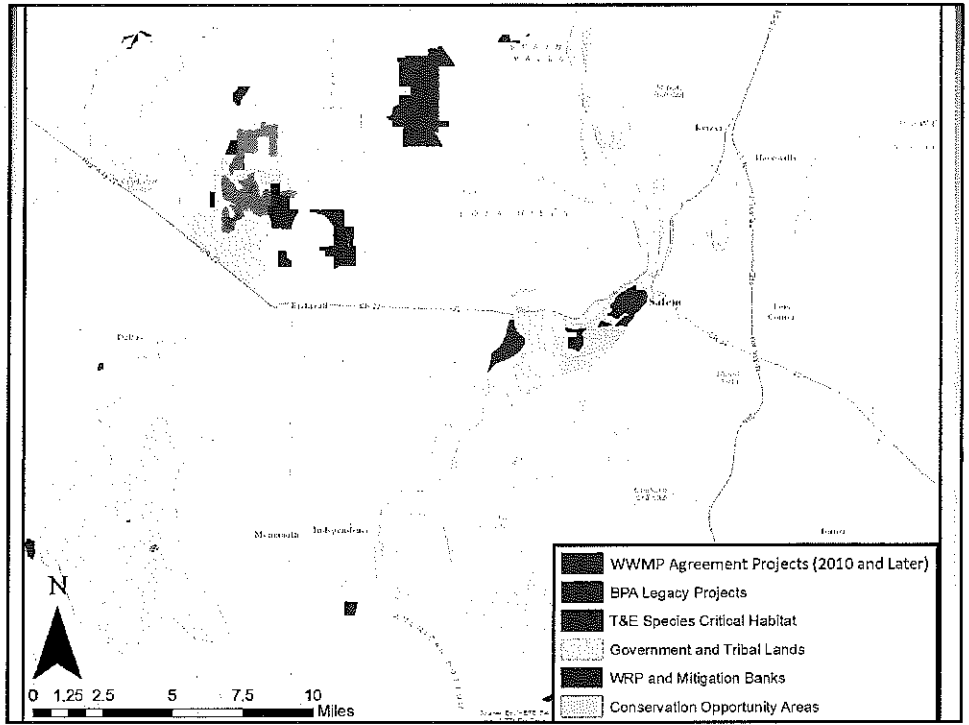
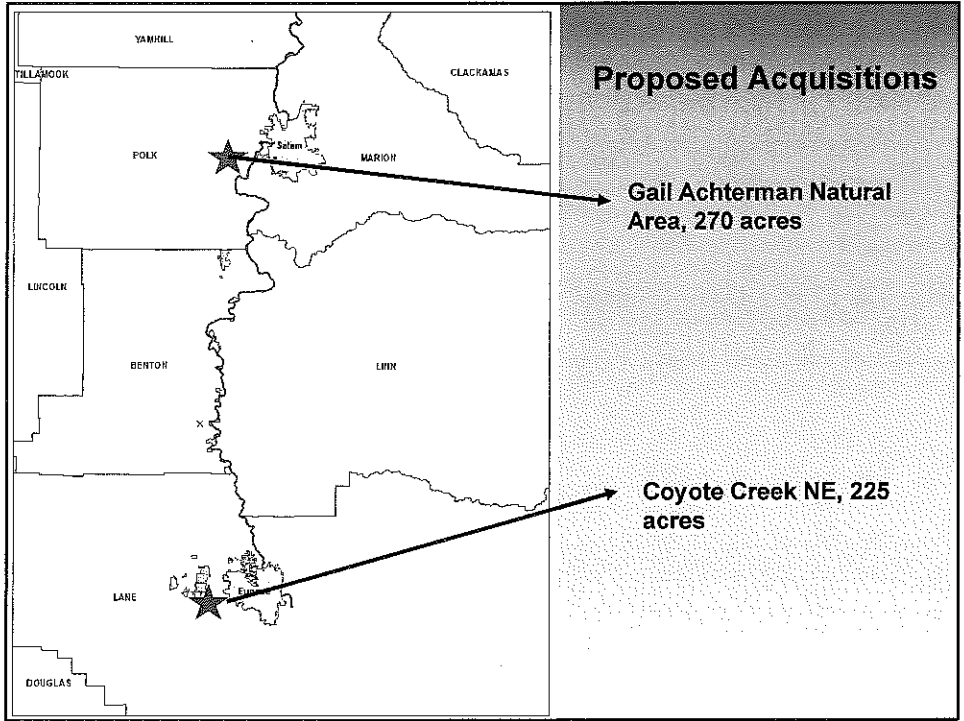
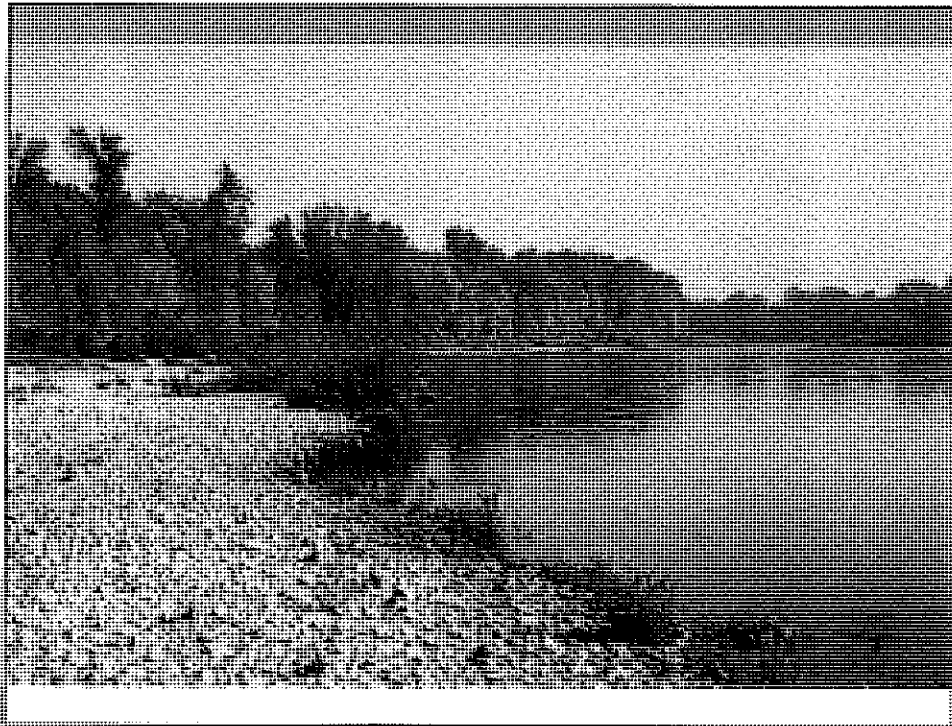
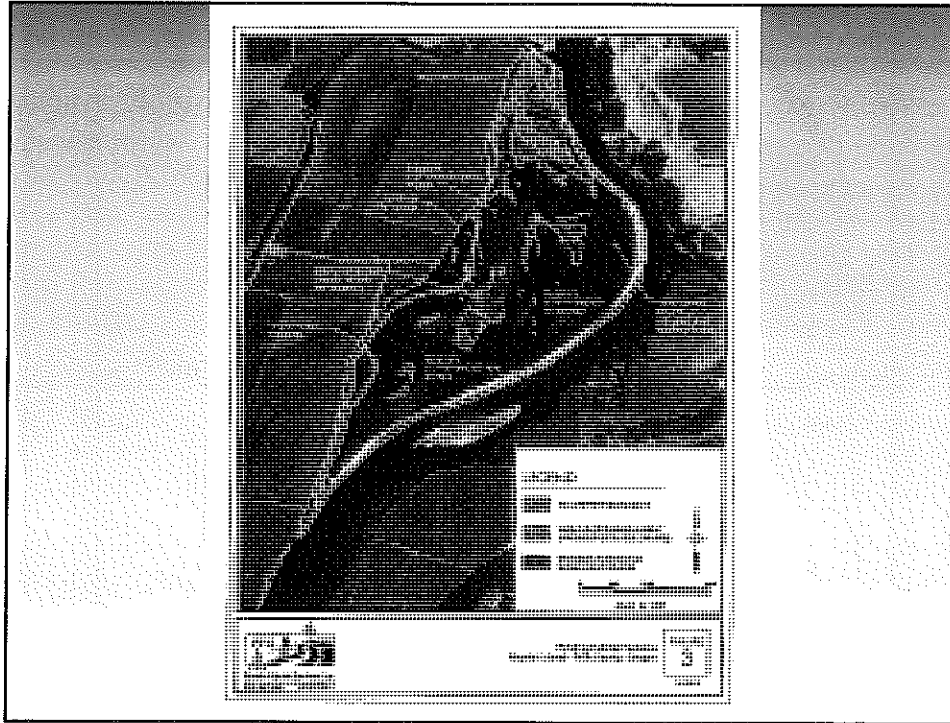
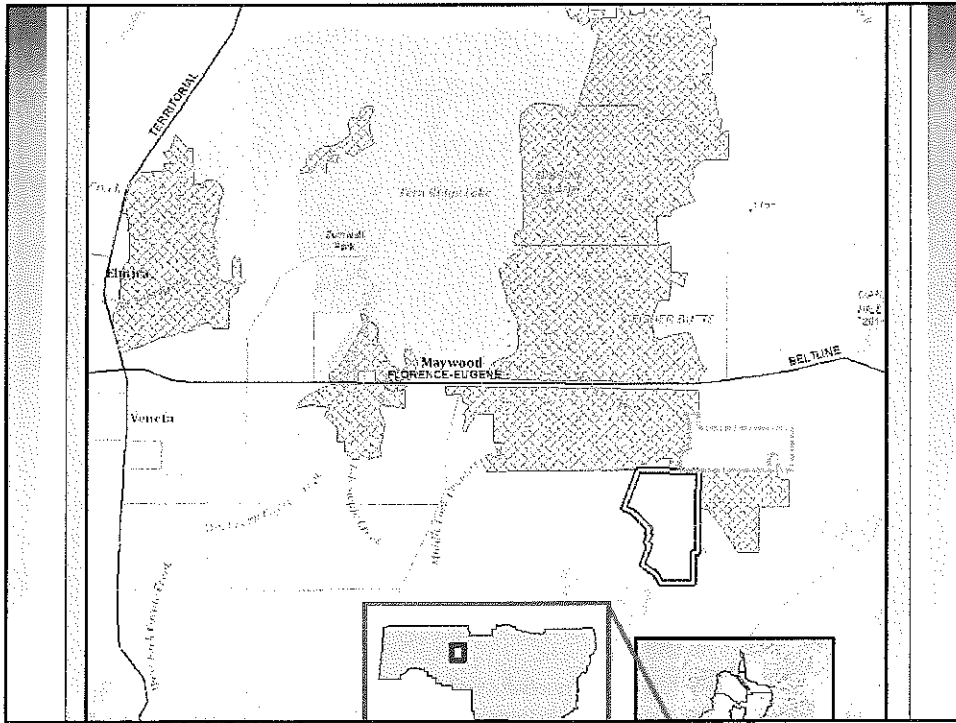


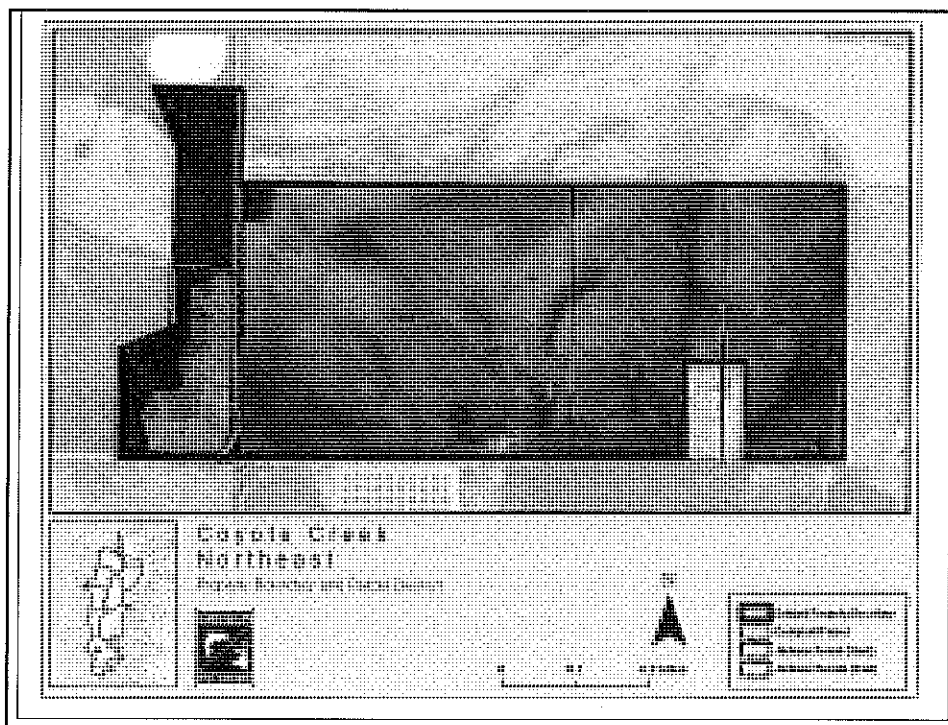
### Background

- Agreement signed October 2010
- \$144.1 million to conserve and restore 16,890 acres of wildlife in the Willamette Basin over 15 years
- Established the Willamette Wildlife Mitigation Advisory Group
- Involves the Confederated Tribes of Warm Springs, Grande Ronde, and Siletz
- Habitat priorities are based on the Oregon Conservation Strategy and consistent with the NW Power and Conservation Council's subbasin plans
- Includes "dual credit" project provisions related to fish habitat benefits through the Willamette Basin Biological Opinion









## Future Management

- ODFW to develop a Management Plan specific to these properties within 18 months of purchase
- Create and maintain desired wildlife habitats
- Public recreation must be consistent with conservation easement

## Staff Recommendation

**Approve the acquisition of both described properties and direct staff to proceed to escrow and closing upon completion of the due diligence processes required under Oregon Administrative Rules for land acquisition.**
