**Additions to Rules for 2015 Ocean  
Salmon Regulations for State Waters**

**Proposed OAR's**

The highlighted rules are in addition to those received in the original briefing packet. In that packet, no changes were proposed to Elk River or Chetco River terminal areas, and the Tillamook state waters area was not proposed; thus none of the highlighted were included as draft OAR changes in the packet. All of the highlighted OARs are within rule divisions that were notified for this meeting.

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1 **635-003-0003**

2 **Purpose and Scope**

3 (1) The purpose of Division 003 is to provide for management of commercial salmon fisheries off the  
4 Oregon Coast over which the state has jurisdiction.

5 (2) Division 003 incorporates into Oregon Administrative Rules, by reference, the annual ocean troll  
6 salmon specifications and management measures as adopted by the **Pacific Fishery Management**  
7 **Council** in its annual **Ocean Salmon Management Measures and Impacts**, as finalized in April  
8 **2015**[2014], and in addition to the extent they are consistent with these rules, **Code of Federal**  
9 **Regulations (CFR), Title 50, Part 660, Subpart H (61FR34572, July 2, 1996**, as amended to  
10 incorporate the standards in the **Pacific Fishery Management Council referenced document**).  
11 Therefore, persons must consult the **Pacific Fishery Management Council referenced document** and  
12 **Federal Regulations** in addition to Division 003 to determine all applicable troll salmon fishing  
13 requirements. A copy of the **Pacific Fishery Management Council referenced document** and the  
14 **Federal Regulations** may be obtained by contacting the **Pacific Fishery Management Council** at

16 (3) To the extent not preempted by Federal law, these regulations apply within the State of Oregon's  
17 Fisheries Conservation Zone (out to fifty miles from shore).

22 **Extended Commercial Seasons**

23 In addition to the open seasons prescribed in OAR 635-003-0003 there are open seasons for Chinook  
24 salmon as follows:

25 (1) Elk River Ocean Terminal Area - from **October 15**[~~November 1~~] through November 30 in the area  
26 described in section (1)(a) of this rule.

27 (a) The open area is all Pacific Ocean waters shoreward of a line drawn from Cape Blanco (42°50'20"  
28 N. Lat.) thence SW to Black Rock (42°49'24" N. Lat. 124°35'00" W. Long.), thence SSW to Best Rock  
29 (42°47'24" N. Lat. 124°35'42" W. Long.), thence SE to 42°40'30" N. Lat. 124°29'00" W. Long., thence to  
30 shore (Humbug Mountain).

31 (b) During the season described in this section (1), it is unlawful to take Chinook salmon less than 26  
32 inches in total length; it is unlawful to use multipoint or barbed hooks or to fish more than four spreads



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33 per line; and it is unlawful to have in possession or to land more than 20 Chinook per day taken in this  
34 fishery. Landings are restricted to Port Orford.

35 (2) Chetco River Ocean Terminal Area - from October 12 through the earlier of October 31 or quota of  
36 600 Chinook in the area described in section (2[3])(a) of this rule:

37 (a) The open area is all Pacific Ocean waters inside an area south of the north shore of Twin Rocks  
38 (42°05'36" N. Lat.) to the Oregon/California border (42°00'00" N. Lat.) and seaward three nautical miles  
39 offshore;

40 (b) During the season described in this section (2[3]) it is unlawful to take Chinook salmon less than  
41 28 inches in total length; it is unlawful to use multipoint or barbed hooks, or to fish more than four  
42 spreads per line; and it is unlawful to have in possession or to land more than 20 Chinook per day taken  
43 in this fishery. Landings are restricted to Brookings.

44 (c) All vessels landing salmon caught in this season must report to ODFW within one hour of  
45 delivery or prior to transport away from the port of landing by either calling (541) 867-0300, ext. 252 or  
46 by e-mail to kmzor.trollreport@state.or.us. Notification shall include vessel name and number, number  
47 of salmon by species, port of landing, location of delivery, and estimated time of delivery.

48 **(3) Tillamook Terminal Area - from October 1 through October 31 in the area described in section**  
49 **(3)(a) of this rule:**

50 (a) **The open area is all Pacific Ocean waters inside an area south of Twin Rocks (45°35'54" N.**  
51 **Lat.) to Pyramid Rock (45°29'48" N. Lat.) and seaward three nautical miles offshore;**

52 (b) **During the season described in this section (3) it is unlawful to take Chinook salmon less**  
53 **than 28 inches in total length; it is unlawful to use multipoint or barbed hooks, or to fish more**  
54 **than four spreads per line; and it is unlawful to have in possession or to land more than 20**  
55 **Chinook per day taken in this fishery. Landings are restricted to Garibaldi and Tillamook Bay.**

60 **Fish Receiving Ticket - Salmon**

61 (1) This regulation is in addition to, and not in lieu of the provisions contained in OAR 635-006-0210.

62 (2) Fish receiving tickets shall be completed at time of landing and the original copy forwarded within  
63 four consecutive days following the landing to the Oregon Department of Fish and Wildlife.

64 (3) For troll-caught salmon, fish receiving tickets shall show the number **of each species of salmon**



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65 **landed, the number of halibut landed, if any, and the number** of days fished during the trip in which  
66 the salmon were caught.

71 **Fish Receiving Ticket - Limited Fish Seller Permit**

72 (1) This regulation is in addition to, and not in lieu of the provisions contained in OAR 635-006-0210.

73 (2) For food fish or shellfish sold under a Limited Fish Seller Permit, the Limited Fish Seller shall  
74 complete daily entries of fish sold on a Fish Receiving Ticket. Fish Receiving Tickets are prenumbered  
75 in books of 50 tickets. Limited Fish Sellers shall account for all Fish Receiving Tickets received from  
76 the Department. Fish Receiving Tickets shall be issued in numerical sequence. The Fish Receiving  
77 Ticket shall include, for each day's sales:

78 (a) Limited Fish Seller's name and license number;

79 (b) Date of sales;

80 (c) Boat name and federal document or State Marine Board number from which catch made;

81 (d) For groundfish harvested in the limited entry fixed gear fishery, the federal limited entry fixed  
82 gear permit number associated with the landing or portion of landing;

83 (e) Port of first landing. The port of first landing will be recorded as where a vessel initially crosses  
84 from the Pacific Ocean to inland waters, or is physically removed from the Pacific Ocean, for the  
85 purposes of ending a fishing trip;

86 (f) Fishing gear used;

87 (g) Species or species group of fish or shellfish sold;

88 (h) Quantity in pounds;

89 (i) Price received per pound;

90 (j) Signature of the individual preparing the fish ticket;

91 (k) Name of wholesale fish dealer to whom other food fish or shellfish were sold from the same  
92 fishing trip.

93 (l) For troll-caught salmon, fish receiving tickets shall show the number **of each species of salmon**  
94 **landed, the number of halibut landed, if any, and the number** of days fished during the trip in which  
95 the salmon were caught.

96 (3) The original of each Fish Receiving Ticket covering fish and shellfish sold per trip shall be



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97 forwarded within ten working days following the landing to the Department.

102 **Purpose and Scope**

103 (1) The purpose of Division 013 is to provide for management of sport salmon fisheries off the Oregon  
104 Coast over which the State has jurisdiction.

105 (2) This rule incorporates by reference, the annual ocean sport salmon specifications and management  
106 measures as adopted by the **Pacific Fishery Management Council** in its annual **Ocean Salmon**  
107 **Management Measures and Impacts**, as finalized in April **2015**[2014], and in addition to the extent  
108 they are consistent with these rules, **Code of Federal Regulations (CFR), Title 50, Part 660, Subparts**  
109 **A and H**.

110 (3) This rule also incorporates by reference the **Oregon Sport Fishing Regulations**.

111 (4) A copy of the **Pacific Fishery Management Council referenced document** and the **Federal**  
112 **Regulations** may be obtained by contacting the **Pacific Fishery Management Council** at

114 (5) To the extent not preempted by Federal law, these regulations apply within the State of Oregon's

120 **Special South Coast Seasons**

121 In addition to the open seasons prescribed in OAR 635-013-0005 there are open seasons for Chinook  
122 salmon as follows:

123 (1) Elk River Area.

124 (a) From November 1 through November 30 in all Pacific Ocean waters shoreward of a line drawn  
125 from Cape Blanco (42°50'20" N. Lat.) thence SW to Black Rock (42°49'24" N. Lat. 124°35'00" W.  
126 Long.), thence SSW to Best Rock (42°47'24" N. Lat. 124°35'42" W. Long.), thence SE to 42°40'30" N.  
127 Lat. 124°29'00" W. Long., thence to shore (Humbug Mountain);



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128 (b) During the season described for the Elk River Area in section (1)(a) of this rule it is unlawful to  
129 take Chinook salmon less than 24 inches in length. Two Chinook salmon per day of which no more than  
130 one non fin-clipped Chinook salmon per day and 10 non fin-clipped Chinook salmon in the seasonal  
131 aggregate when combined with waters of Floras Creek/New River, Sixes River and Elk River. It is  
132 unlawful to use multipoint or barbed hooks.

133 (2) Chetco River Area.

134 (a) From October 1-~~11~~[12] in an area south of the north shore of Twin Rocks (42°05'36" N. Lat.) to  
135 the Oregon/California border (42°00'00" N. Lat.) and seaward three nautical miles offshore.

136 (b) During the seasons described in section (2)(a) of this rule it is unlawful to take Chinook salmon  
137 less than 24 inches in length. Two Chinook salmon per day of which no more than one non fin-clipped  
138 Chinook salmon per day and no more than 5 non fin-clipped Chinook salmon may be retained during the  
139 October 1-~~11~~[12] season. It is unlawful to use multipoint or barbed hooks.
