Dear Mr. Sanders:

I am writing in support of Mr. Charlie Corrarino's application to a position on the Access and Habitat Board.

In 1998 I started the first of a three term appointment to the ODF&W's Fish Screening Task Force as a stakeholder representative. While engaged in that activity I became acquainted with Charlie. Curt and Commissioners,

Please accept this short note in support of Mr. Charlie Corrarino for the position of Hunter Representative on the statewide Access & Habitat (A&H) Board. My personal background with the A&H Program stems from my 21-year career at ODFW, and particularly my strong involvement as Director with the State Legislature's reauthorization of the Program in 2009.

The fact that the Program was strongly supported for its reauthorization in the 2009 Legislature by both the Hunter and Landowner communities is a real testament to its twin successes in supporting public hunting access on private lands, and providing funding to private landowners for the improvement of wildlife habitat.
