25 **Adopt Temporary Rules**

26 Curt Melcher, Director, requested the Commission ratify the following temporary rules.
27 The seven (7) temporary rules were previously adopted by the director under his
28 emergency action authority.

29
30 **1) 635-041-0065**
31 **2017 Treaty Indian Winter Commercial Fisheries Set In Zone 6 of the Columbia**
32 **River**

33 Adopted January 2017: effective February 1, 2017 through March 31, 2017.
34 This amended rule sets both the platform hook-and-line and gill net Treaty Indian
35 winter commercial seasons for 2017. The modifications allow commercial sales, in

1 Oregon, of fish caught in the Bonneville, The Dalles, and John Day pools by tribal
2 fishers beginning February 1, 2017. Modifications are consistent with action taken
3 January 31, 2017 by the Oregon and Washington Departments of Fish and Wildlife, in
4 cooperation with the Columbia River Treaty Tribes, at a meeting of the Columbia River
5 Compact.

7 **2) 635-042-0130**

8 **2017 Commercial Smelt Season Set for the Columbia River**

9 Adopted January 2017: effective February 2, 2017 through February 27, 2017.

10 This amended rule sets a commercial gill net fishing season for smelt in Zones 1-
11 3 of the Columbia River. The fishery consists of 7-hour fishing periods beginning
12 7:00 a.m. through 2:00 p.m., Mondays and Thursdays of each week from February 2
13 through February 27, 2017. Revisions are consistent with the action taken January 31,
14 2017 by the Oregon and Washington Departments of Fish and Wildlife in a meeting of
15 the Columbia River Compact.

17 **3) 635-006-0210**

18 **Electronic Fish Tickets Reporting Commercial Sales of Salmon, Sturgeon, Smelt
19 and Shad Required**

20 Adopted February 2017: effective February 2, 2017 through July 29, 2017.

21 This amended rule requires, by way of electronic fish receiving tickets (e-ticket),
22 the reporting of commercial sales of salmon, sturgeon, smelt, and shad landed
23 downstream of Bonneville Dam and purchased by wholesale fish dealers, wholesale
24 fish bait dealers, and food fish canners. Modifications also require e-tickets be
25 submitted within 24 hours of the closure of a fishing period or within 24 hours of the
26 landing when fishing periods are longer than 24 hours.

28 **4) 635-05-0465**

29 **Commercial Dungeness crab Health Closure**

30 Adopted February 2017: effective February 2, 2017 through July 31, 2017.

31 In coordination with Oregon Department of Agriculture temporary rule making,
32 this amended rule implements a health closure area closed for bio-toxins for the ocean
33 commercial Dungeness crab fishery from the Coos Bay North Jetty (43° 21.60' N. Lat.)
34 northward to Heceta Head (44° 08.30' N. Lat.) due to detection of elevated levels of
35 domoic acid in crab viscera in the specified area. The rule requires that all Dungeness
36 crab taken from the health closure area from 12:01 AM January 25, 2017 through 12:01
37 AM February 10, 2017 be sold to a food processor licensed by the Oregon Department
38 of Agriculture for evisceration and otherwise prohibits take of Dungeness crab after the
39 effective date and time of this rule. This rule allows crab gear to be left in the area after
40 the closure date so long as it is un-baited with the lids open, and allows vessels with
41 crab on board to transit the area during the closure.

43 **5) 635-042-0145, 635-042-0160, 635-042-0170, 635-042-0180**

44 **2017 Commercial Seasons Set for Columbia River Select Areas**

45 Adopted January 2017: effective February 6, 2017 through March 28, 2017.

46 These amended rules implement the 2017 winter, spring and summer
47 commercial salmon seasons for the Deep River, Youngs Bay, Blind Slough/Knappa

1 Slough, and Tongue Point/South Channel Select Areas. The first authorized fishing
2 period in these Select Area sites is set to begin February 6. Modifications are consistent
3 with action taken January 31, 2017 by the Departments of Fish & Wildlife for the States
4 of Oregon and Washington at a meeting of the Columbia River Compact.

6 **6) 635-041-0165**

7 **2017 Treaty Indian Winter Commercial Season Extended in John Day Pool of the**
8 **Columbia River**

9 Adopted February 2017: effective February 7, 2017 through March 31, 2017.

10 This amended rule extends the Treaty Indian winter commercial gill net season in
11 the John Day Pool through February 15, 2017. Modifications are consistent with action
12 taken February 7, 2017 by the Oregon and Washington Departments of Fish and
13 Wildlife, in cooperation with the Columbia River Treaty Tribes, at a meeting of the
14 Columbia River Compact.

16 **7) 635-005-0465**

17 **Commercial Dungeness crab Evisceration Requirement for Biotoxin Management**
18 **Area**

19 Adopted February 2017: effective February 8, 2017 through August 5, 2017.

20 In coordination with Oregon Department of Agriculture (ODA) temporary rule
21 making (see OAR 635-025-0400), this amended rule implements a biotoxin
22 management area for the ocean commercial Dungeness crab fishery from the Coos Bay
23 North Jetty (43° 21.60' N. Lat.) northward to Heceta Head (44° 08.30' N. Lat.) due to
24 detection of elevated levels of domoic acid in crab viscera in the specified area. In
25 combination, this rule and ODA rule require that all Dungeness crab taken from the
26 biotoxin management area since 12:01 AM January 25, 2017 be sold to a food
27 processor licensed by the Oregon Department of Agriculture for evisceration.
28 Temporary rules filed February 2, 2017 by ODFW and ODA implemented a short-term
29 evisceration requirement followed by a fishery closure in the biotoxin management area,
30 which would have been effective at 12:01 AM February 10, 2017. These rules
31 effectively extend the evisceration requirement until further domoic acid test results are
32 available and remove the fishery closure. These rules prohibit the sale of live crab
33 caught in the affected areas and prohibit the sale of any crab that is not processed
34 consistent with these rules.
35
