11 On Friday, **May 19, 2017 at 8:17 a.m.**, Chair **Michael Finley** called the **Oregon Fish**  
12 **and Wildlife Commission** (the Commission) meeting to order.

14 **DIRECTOR'S REPORT**

15  
16 2017 Sturgeon Fishery Update  
17 Tucker Jones, Ocean Salmon and Columbia River Program Manager

26 **Adopt Temporary Rules**  
27 **Curt Melcher, Director**

28  
29 Curt Melcher, Director, requested the Commission ratify the following eleven (11)  
30 temporary rules. The eleven (11) temporary rules were previously adopted by the  
31 director under his emergency action authority.

1       **1.) 635-017-0090**

2       **2017 Sturgeon Closure and Angling Limitations on the Gilbert River**

3       Adopted April 25, 2017: effective April 25, 2017 through September 30, 2017.

4       The amended rule closes all sturgeon angling for the remainder of 2017,  
5 including catch and release as well as closing all angling from April 24 through June 15  
6 and October 1 through December 31, 2017 in the Gilbert River. The area includes the  
7 Gilbert River from the upstream end of the Gilbert River Fishing Pier located near the  
8 confluence with Multnomah Channel, upstream to Sturgeon Lake.

10       **2.) 635-017-0090**

11       **Spring Chinook in Big Lake are Considered Trout and Part of the Daily Trout Limit**

12       Adopted April 27, 2017: effective May 1, 2017 through October 27, 2017.

13       The amended rule allows retention of hatchery spring Chinook in Big Lake  
14 beginning May 1, 2017 as part of the trout fishery.

15  
16       **3.) 635-042-0145**

17       **Modifications to the 2017 Spring Commercial Seasons in the Youngs Bay Area**

18       Adopted April 27, 2017: effective April 27, 2017 through September 15, 2017.

19       This amended rule modifies the 2017 spring commercial salmon season for the  
20 Youngs Bay Select Area beginning April 27 to minimize interception of non-local  
21 Chinook stocks. Modifications are consistent with Oregon State action taken April 27  
22 2017 by the Department of Fish & Wildlife for the State of Oregon.

23  
24       **4.) 635-042-0145**

25       **Modifications to the 2017 Spring Commercial Seasons in the Youngs Bay Area**

26       Adopted May 2, 2017: effective May 3, 2017 through September 15, 2017.

27       This amended rule modifies the 2017 spring commercial salmon season for the  
28 Youngs Bay Select Area beginning May 3 to minimize interception of non-local Chinook  
29 stocks. Modifications are consistent with Oregon State action taken May 2, 2017 by the  
30 Department of Fish & Wildlife for the State of Oregon.

33       **5.) 635-017-0090**

34       **Limited Fishing Periods in the Lower Willamette River for Spring Chinook and**  
35 **Steelhead Recreational Fisheries**

36       Adopted May 4, 2017: effective May 8, 2017 through November 3, 2017.

37       Beginning May 8, 2017, from the Lower Willamette River downstream of  
38 Willamette Falls, including Multnomah Channel and the Gilbert River and the lower  
39 Clackamas River up to the Highway 99E Bridge, angling and retention of spring  
40 Chinook and steelhead is allowed only on Thursdays, Fridays, and Saturdays. The  
41 daily adult bag limit is two hatchery salmonids, which only one may be a Chinook

43       **6.) 635-017-0090**

44       **2017 Angling Modifications for the Gilbert River**

45       Adopted May 10, 2017: effective May 13, 2017 through June 15, 2017.

46       The amended rule maintains the sturgeon angling closure for the Gilbert River  
47 through June 15, 2017 as previously adopted by temporary rule but liberalizes  
48 regulations to allow the use of artificial flies and lures for other species rather than a  
49 complete angling closure. The area includes the Gilbert River from the upstream end of

1 the Gilbert River Fishing Pier located near the confluence with Multnomah Channel,  
2 upstream to Sturgeon Lake.

4 **7.) 635-042-0145**

5 **Modifications to the 2017 Spring Commercial Seasons in the Youngs Bay Area**

6 Adopted May 11, 2017: effective May 15, 2017 through September 15, 2017.

7 This amended rule modifies the 2017 spring commercial salmon season for the  
8 Youngs Bay Select Area beginning May 15 to minimize interception of non-local  
9 Chinook stocks. Modifications are consistent with Oregon State action taken May 11,  
10 2017 by the Department of Fish & Wildlife for the State of Oregon.

11  
12 **8.) 635-023-0125**

13 **Postpone the May 16, 2017 Hatchery Steelhead and Jack Chinook salmon Fishery**

14 Adopted May 11, 2017: effective May 16, 2017 through June 15, 2017.

15 This amended rule delays the 2017 opening season for hatchery steelhead and  
16 jack Chinook fisheries on the mainstem Columbia River from the Tongue Point/Rocky  
17 Point line upstream to the I-5 Bridge until further notice. Revisions are consistent with  
18 Columbia River Joint State action taken May 11, 2017 by the Oregon and Washington  
19 Departments of Fish and Wildlife.

20  
21 **9.) 635-016-0090**

22 **Modifications to Southwest Zone Sport Chinook salmon Regulations for the**  
23 **Rogue River**

24 Adopted May 12, 2017: effective May 15, 2017 through July 31, 2017.

25 Effective May 15, 2017 the current deadline marker located immediately below  
26 the Cole River hatchery will be relocated to a point 1200 feet below the hatchery  
27 diversion dam to establish new deadline markers. Moving the angling deadline markers  
28 will restrict harvest of hatchery spring Chinook in the Rogue River. Currently we are not  
29 expecting surplus hatchery Chinook and may not be able to meet broodstock  
30 requirements. This restriction will allow for adequate broodstock collection in order to  
31 meet our angler opportunity obligations throughout the Rogue River.

32  
33 **10.) 635-067-0000, 635-069-0000, 635-073-0000, 635-075-0022**

34 **Amend Rule to Reduce Hunting Opportunity for Specified 2017 Mule Deer and**  
35 **Pronghorn Hunts**

36 Adopted May 16, 2017: Effective dates May 16, 2017 through November 10, 2017

37 This temporary rule is needed to reduce tag numbers for controlled hunts in areas  
38 where deer and pronghorn survival was most reduced by harsh weather during the  
39 2016-2017 winter to keep from exceeding appropriate harvest levels in the hunt areas.  
40 Reducing controlled hunt tag numbers will provide the intended level of harvest. Failure  
41 to amend the rules before the controlled hunt drawing would result in serious prejudice  
42 to hunters participating in these deer and pronghorn hunts because fewer animal will be  
43 available for harvest than anticipated when tag numbers were initially adopted in June  
44 2016.

1 May 19, 2017, Commissioner Anderson seconded the motion, and the motion carried  
2 unanimously.
