 4 which include and incorporate the **2018 [2017] Oregon Sport Fishing Regulations** by reference. However,
 5 additional regulations may be adopted in this rule division from time to time and to the extent of any inconsistency,
 6 they supersede the **2018 [2017] Oregon Sport Fishing Regulations**.

12 **Inclusions and Modifications**

13 (1) OAR 635-013-0005 through OAR 635-013-0009 modify or are in addition to provisions contained in **Code of**
 14 **Federal Regulations, Title 50, Part 660, Subparts A and H**, and the **2018 [2017] Oregon Sport Fishing**
 15 **Regulations**.

16 (2) The **Code of Federal Regulations (CFR), Title 50, Part 660, Subparts A and H**, and the **2018 [2017]**
 17 **Oregon Sport Fishing Regulations** contain requirements for sport salmon angling in the Pacific Ocean off the
 18 Oregon coast. However, additional regulations may be adopted from time to time, and, to the extent of any
 19 inconsistency, they supersede the published federal regulations and the **2018 [2017] Oregon Sport Fishing**
 20 **Regulations**. This means that persons must consult not only the federal regulations and the published sport
 21 fishing regulations but also the Department's web page to determine all applicable sport fishing regulations.

22 (3) This rule contains requirements that modify sport salmon angling regulations off the Oregon coast. The
 23 following modifications are organized in sections that apply to the ocean sport salmon fishery in general and within
 24 management zones established by the Pacific Fishery Management Council and enacted by **Federal Regulations**
 25 **(CFR, Title 50, Part 660, Subparts A and H)**.

97 (a) Pursuant to OAR 635-044-0130(1)(b), authorization from the Oregon Fish and Wildlife Commission must
98 be in possession by individuals collecting or possessing Pacific lamprey for personal use. Permits are available
99 from ODFW, 17330 SE Evelyn Street, Clackamas, OR 97015;

100 (b) Open fishing period is June 1 through July 31 from 7:00 A.M. to 6:00 P.M.; personal use harvest is
101 permitted Friday through Monday each week. All harvest is prohibited Tuesday through Thursday;

102 (c) Open fishing area is the Willamette River at Willamette Falls on the east side of the falls only, excluding
103 Horseshoe Area at the peak of the falls;

104 (d) Gear is restricted to hand or hand-powered tools only;

105 (e) Catch must be recorded daily on a harvest record card prior to leaving the open fishing area. Harvest
106 record cards will be provided by ODFW. All harvest record cards must be returned to the ODFW Clackamas office
107 by August 31 to report catch. Permit holders who do not return the harvest record cards by August 31 will be
108 ineligible to receive a permit in the following year.

109 (f) Harvesters must allow sampling or enumeration of catches by ODFW personnel.

267 to, and north of the ship channel, and continuing southerly in line with the center of the Megler Bridge span to the
268 Oregon shore.

278 marine invertebrates in the Pacific Ocean, coastal bays, and beaches over which the State has jurisdiction.

279 (2) Division 039 incorporates into Oregon Administrative Rules, by reference:

280 (a) The sport fishing regulations of the State, included in the document entitled **2018 [2017] Oregon Sport**
281 **Fishing Regulations;**

282 (b) **Title 50 of the Code of Federal Regulations, Part 300, Subpart E** (October 1, **2016 [2015]** ed.), as
283 amended;

284 (c) **Title 50 of the Code of Federal Regulations, Part 660, Subpart G** (October 1, **2016 [2015]** ed.), as
285 amended; and

286 (d) **Federal Register Vol. 80, No. 46**, dated **February 7, 2017 [March 10, 2015 (80 FR 12567)] (82FR9634)**.

296 (1) The **2018 [2017] Oregon Sport Fishing Regulations** provide requirements for sport fisheries for marine fish,
297 shellfish, and marine invertebrates in the Pacific Ocean, coastal bays, and beaches, commonly referred to as the
298 Marine Zone. However, additional regulations may be adopted in this rule division from time to time and to the
299 extent of any inconsistency, they supersede the **2018 [2017] Oregon Sport Fishing Regulations**.

300 (2) For the purposes of this rule, a "sport harvest guideline" is defined as a specified numerical harvest objective
301 that is not a quota. Attainment of a harvest guideline does not automatically close a fishery. Upon attainment of a
302 sport harvest guideline, the Department shall initiate consultation to determine if additional regulatory actions are
303 necessary to achieve management objectives.

304 The following sport harvest guidelines include the combined landings and other fishery related mortality by the
305 Oregon sport fishery in a single calendar year:

306 **(a)[(A)]** Black rockfish, **40[4]0.1[8]** metric tons.

307 **(b)[(B)]** Cabezon, 16.8 metric tons.

308 **(c)[(C)]** Blue rockfish, deacon rockfish, and other nearshore rockfish combined, **33.1** metric tons.

309 ~~[(b) The following sport harvest guidelines include total landings in the Oregon sport ocean boat fishery in a~~
310 ~~single calendar year: Greenling, 5.2 metric tons.]~~

311 **(d) Greenling, 56.3 metric tons.**

312 (3) For the purposes of this rule, "Other nearshore rockfish" means the following rockfish species: black and
313 yellow (*Sebastes chrysolmelas*); brown (*S. auriculatus*); calico (*S. dalli*); China (*S. nebulosus*); copper (*S.*



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314 caurinus); gopher (S. carnatus); grass (S. rastrelliger); kelp (S. atrovirens); olive (S. serranoides); quillback (S.
315 maliger); and treefish (S. serriceps).

316 (4) In addition to the regulations for Marine Fish in the **2018 [2017] Oregon Sport Fishing Regulations**, the
317 following apply for the sport fishery in the Marine Zone:

318 (a) Lingcod (including green colored lingcod): 2 fish daily bag limit.

319 (b) All rockfish ("sea bass" "snapper"), greenling ("sea trout"), cabezon, skates, and other marine fish species
320 not listed in the **2018 [2017] Oregon Sport Fishing Regulations** in the Marine Zone, located under the category
321 of Species Name, Marine Fish: 7 fish daily bag limit in aggregate (total sum or number), of which no more than **six**
322 **may be black rockfish, no more than** ~~three~~ **four** may be blue rockfish, ~~[or]~~ deacon rockfish, **China rockfish,**
323 **copper rockfish, or quillback rockfish** in aggregate, ~~[no more than one may be a canary rockfish,]~~ and no more
324 than one may be a cabezon. Retention of the following species is prohibited:

325 (A) Yelloweye rockfish; **and**

326 ~~[(B) China rockfish;~~

327 ~~(C) Copper rockfish;~~

328 ~~(D) Quillback rockfish; and]~~

329 **(B)[(E)]** Cabezon from January 1 through June 30.

330 (c) Flatfish (flounder, sole, sanddabs, turbot, and all halibut species except Pacific halibut): 25 fish daily bag
331 limit in aggregate (total sum or number).

332 (d) Retention of all marine fish listed under the category of Species Name, Marine Fish, except Pacific cod,
333 sablefish, flatfish, herring, anchovy, smelt, sardine, striped bass, hybrid bass, and offshore pelagic species
334 (excluding leopard shark and soupfin shark), is prohibited when Pacific halibut is retained on the vessel during
335 open days for the all-depth sport fishery for Pacific halibut. Persons must also consult all publications referenced in
336 OAR 635-039-0080 to determine all rules applicable to the taking of Pacific halibut.

337 (e) Harvest methods and other specifications for marine fish in subsections (4)(a), (4)(b) and (4)(c) including
338 the following:

339 (A) Minimum length for lingcod, 22 inches.

340 (B) Minimum length for cabezon, 16 inches.

341 ~~[(C) Minimum length for greenling, 10 inches.]~~

342 **(C)[(D)]** May be taken by angling, hand, bow and arrow, spear, gaff hook, snag hook and herring jigs.

343 **(D)[(E)]** Mutilating the fish so the size or species cannot be determined prior to landing or transporting
344 mutilated fish across state waters is prohibited.

345 **(E) When angling for groundfish or Pacific halibut in the Pacific Ocean or when in possession of**
346 **groundfish or Pacific halibut, all vessels shall have a functional descending device on board and shall use**
347 **a descending device when releasing any rockfish outside of the 30-fathom curve (defined by latitude and**
348 **longitude) as shown in Title 50 Code of Federal Regulations Part 660 Section 71. Upon request, a**
349 **descending device shall be presented for inspection by any person authorized to enforce the wildlife laws**
350 **or a representative of the Department. In this subsection, "descending device" means a device capable of**
351 **returning a rockfish back to a depth of at least 100 feet to assist the fish in recompression and to improve**
352 **the fish's chance of survival.**



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353 (f) Sport fisheries for species in subsections (4)(a), (4)(b) and (4)(c) and including leopard shark and soupfin
354 shark are open January 1 through December 31, twenty-four hours per day, except as provided in subsections
355 4(b) and (4)(d). Ocean waters are closed for these species during April 1 through September 30, outside of the 30-
356 fathom curve (defined by latitude and longitude) as shown on **Title 50 Code of Federal Regulations Part 660**
357 **Section 71**, except as provided in subsection 4(d). A 20-fathom, 25-fathom, or 30-fathom curve, as shown on
358 **Title 50 Code of Federal Regulations Part 660 Section 71** may be implemented as the management line as in-
359 season modifications necessitate. In addition, the following management lines may be used to set area specific
360 regulations for inseason action only:

361 (A) Cape Lookout (45°20'30" N latitude); and

362 (B) Cape Blanco (42°50'20" N latitude).

363 (g) The Stonewall Bank Yelloweye Rockfish Conservation Area (YRCA) is defined by coordinates specified in
364 **Title 50 Code of Federal Regulations Part 660 Section 70** (October 1, 2015 ed.). Within the YRCA, it is unlawful
365 to fish for, take, or retain species listed in subsections (4)(a), (4)(b) and (4)(c) of this rule, leopard shark, soupfin
366 shark, and Pacific halibut using recreational fishing gear. A vessel engaged in recreational fishing within the YRCA
367 is prohibited from possessing any species listed in subsections (4)(a), (4)(b) and (4)(c) of this rule, leopard shark,
368 soupfin shark, and Pacific halibut. Recreational fishing vessels in possession of species listed in subsections
369 (4)(a), (4)(b) and (4)(c) and including leopard shark, soupfin shark, and Pacific halibut may transit the YRCA
370 without fishing gear in the water.
