 Adopt Temporary Rules

Curt Melcher, Director, requested the Commission ratify the following temporary rules. The five (5) temporary rules were previously adopted by the director under his emergency action authority.

1.) 635-004-0375

Commercial Sardine Fishery Rules 2017-2018

Adopted July 3, 2017: effective December 30, 2017 through June 27, 2017.

[Extension of earlier temporary rule filed; Federal Rule not yet adopted.]

Amendment to Oregon's administrative rule for commercial sardine fisheries to bring the State of Oregon concurrent with federally adopted regulations. Modifications establish 2017-18 sardine harvest guidelines, close the commercial directed fishery for the 2017-2018 fishing year, and establish incidental landing allowances for commercial fisheries.

2.) 635-039-0090

Suspend Oregon Sport Abalone Harvest until Further Notice Pending Commission Review

Adopted December 11, 2017: effective January 1, 2018 through June 26, 2018.

The amended rule suspends the sport fishery for abalone in Oregon from January 1, 2018 to June 26, 2018. The need for this suspension is to allow the Department to gather information, solicit public input, and prepare longer-term recommendations for Commission consideration. This suspension assures that the Department has adequate time to review and recommend any needed changes while avoiding conservation issues in the interim.

3.) 635-004-0275

Federal Actions and Management Measures Implemented for Commercial Groundfish Fisheries.

Adopted January 3, 2018: effective January 4, 2018 through July 2, 2018.

This amended rule implements corrections to regulations previously adopted by the federal government for 2017-2018 Pacific Coast commercial groundfish fisheries, including but not limited to removal of big skate from the definition of ecosystem component species, removal of the prohibition on retention of canary rockfish, and correction of units of measurement from metric tons to pounds in the Limited Entry Fixed Gear Sablefish tier 2 cumulative trip limits.

4.) 635-005-0465

Commercial Dungeness Crab Season Opening North of Cape Blanco

Adopted January 11, 2018: effective January 11, 2018 through July 9, 2018.

This amended rule sets the opening date and related management measures for the 2017-2018 ocean commercial Dungeness crab fishery from Cape Blanco (42° 50′ 00″ N. Lat) northward to the Washington border (46° 15′ 00″ N. Lat.) on January 15, 2018. The commercial Dungeness crab fishery will remain closed from Cape Blanco (42° 50′ 00″ N. Lat.) southward to the California border (42° 00′ 00″ N. Lat.) due to elevated levels of the biotoxin domoic acid detected in samples.

5.) 635-023-0095

White Sturgeon Recreational Fishery Closed in The Dalles Pool

Adopted January 17, 2018: effective January 20, 2018 through July 18, 2018.

This amended rule closes the white sturgeon fishery in The Dalles Pool (The Dalles Dam upstream to John Day Dam). Catch projections indicate retention of white sturgeon after January 20, 2018 would exceed the allowable quota. Catch and release sturgeon fishing remains open in these waters.

Under statute, the state law allows the Commission to presue civil damages in the case of wildlife crimes. There have been issues with the current restitution statute as it relates to the courts ablitiv to presue restitution for wildlife crimes. There is a particular case in southwest Oregon that an individual took several trophy buck and the court did not seek restitution. The department is working with the Department of Justice to presue restitution.

Commissioner Webber further directed Director Melcher to in any case that restitution is

appropriate, and was not ordered by a court that we determin if a civil penalty would be

appropriate and cost effective. Commissioners nodded heads in agreement.
