1 **Adopt Temporary Rules**

2 Shannon Hurn, Deputy Director, requested the Commission ratify the following
3 temporary rules. The twelve (12) temporary rules were previously adopted by the director
4 under his emergency action authority.

6 **1.) 635-023-0130**

7 **Fall Mainstem and Select Area Recreational Fisheries Close Effective September**
8 **13, 2018**

9 Adopted September 11, 2018: effective September 13 through December 31, 2018.

10 Close angling for and retention of all salmon and steelhead in mainstem and
11 Select Area recreational fisheries effective September 13, 2018.

12
13 **2.) 635-042-0145, 635-042-0160, 635-042-0170, 635-042-0180**

14 **Close Fall Commercial Seasons in the Select Areas of the Columbia River.**

15 Adopted September 11, 2018: effective September 13 through December 31, 2018.

16 These rules close the 2018 fall commercial salmon seasons for Select Area
17 fisheries in the Columbia River beginning noon September 13, 2018 through December
18 31, 2018.

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20 **3.) 635-039-0090 (0095)**

21 **Daily Marine Fish Bag Limit Increased from 4 to 5 Fish per Angler**

22 Adopted September 17, 2018: effective September 19 through December 31, 2018.

23 This amended rule increases the daily general marine fish bag limit from four (4)
24 fish per angler to five (5) beginning at 12:01 a.m. on September 19, 2018.

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26 **4.) 635-041-0075**

27 **Modification of Columbia River Treaty Indian Fall Commercial Fisheries**

28 Adopted September 18, 2018: effective September 19 through December 31, 2018.

29 These amended rules extend sales of fish caught in fall Treaty Indian commercial
30 gillnet fisheries set for the Columbia River from 6:00 a.m. September 19 through
31 6:00 p.m. September 22, 2018. Modifications are consistent with action taken September
32 18, 2018 by the Departments of Fish & Wildlife for the States of Oregon and Washington
33 in cooperation with the Columbia River Treaty Tribes at a meeting of the Columbia River
34 Compact.

37 **Fall Select Area Recreational Fisheries Re-Open Effective September 24, 2018.**

38 Adopted September 18, 2018: effective September 24 through December 31, 2018.

39 Re-open angling for and retention of Chinook and hatchery Coho salmon in Select
40 Area recreational fisheries effective September 24, 2018.

1 **6.) 635-042-0145, 635-042-0160, 635-042-0170, 635-042-0180**

2 **Re-open Fall Commercial Seasons in the Select Areas of the Columbia River**

3 Adopted September 20, 2018: effective September 23 through December 31, 2018.

4 These rules re-open 2018 fall commercial salmon seasons for Select Area
5 fisheries in the Columbia River beginning 6 PM Sunday September 23, 2018 through
6 October 31, 2018.

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8 **7.) 635-016-0090**

9 **Modifications to Hunter Creek in the Southwest Zone.**

10 Adopted October 2, 2018: effective October 15 through December 31, 2018.

11 This amended rule closes angling of Chinook salmon on Hunter Creek beginning
12 October 15, through December 31, 2018.

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14 **8.) 635-019-0090**

15 **Fall Chinook and Coho Bag Limit Modifications and Steelhead Closure in the
16 Northeast Zone.**

17 Adopted October 2, 2018: effective October 15 through April 30, 2019.

18 Closure of the Umatilla River to angling for steelhead from the Hwy 730 Bridge to the
19 Confederated Tribes of Umatilla Indian Reservation (CTUIR), reservation boundary
20 (approximately 0.7 miles above Hwy 11 bridge) October 15, 2018 to April 30, 2019.

21 Closure of the Walla Walla River to angling for steelhead from state line to confluence of
22 the North and South forks, December 1-31, 2018 and January 1 to April 30, 2019. Bag
23 limit: One adult fall Chinook or coho salmon per day and five jack salmon per day. In
24 addition, 5 mini jack (8-15 inches) coho or fall Chinook salmon per day. Umatilla River
25 open for coho and fall Chinook salmon, September 1 – November 30, 2018

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27 **9.) 635-005-0290, 635-039-0090 (0095)**

28 **Razor Clams Closed in Clatsop County Beaches October 1, 2018 through October
29 31, 2018.**

30 Adopted September 27, 2018: effective October 1 through October 31, 2018.

31 This amended rule will close both recreational and commercial take of razor clams
32 from October 1, through October 31, 2018.

33
34 **10.) 635-041-0075**

35 **Modification of Columbia River Treaty Indian Fall Commercial Fisheries**

36 Adopted October 2, 2018: effective October 3 through December 31, 2018.

37 These amended rules extend sales of fish caught in fall Treaty Indian commercial
38 gillnet fisheries set for the Columbia River from 6:00 a.m. October 3 through 6:00 p.m.
39 October 6, 2018. Modifications are consistent with action taken October 2, 2018 by the
40 Departments of Fish & Wildlife for the States of Oregon and Washington in cooperation
41 with the Columbia River Treaty Tribes at a meeting of the Columbia River Compact.

2 **Modifications to Hunter Creek in the Southwest Zone.**

3 Adopted October 2, 2018: effective October 15 through December 31, 2018.

4 This amended rule closes angling of Chinook salmon on Hunter Creek beginning
5 October 15, through December 31, 2018.

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7 **12.) 635-019-0090**

8 **Fall Chinook and Coho Bag Limit Modifications and Steelhead Closure in the**
9 **Northeast Zone.**

10 Adopted October 2, 2018: effective October 15 through April 30, 2019.

11 Closure of the Umatilla River to angling for steelhead from the Hwy 730 Bridge to the
12 CTUIR reservation boundary (approximately 0.7 miles above Hwy 11 bridge) October 15,
13 2018 to April 30, 2019. Closure of the Walla Walla River to angling for steelhead from
14 state line to confluence of the North and South forks, December 1-31, 2018 and January
15 1 to Aril 30, 2019. Bag limit: One adult fall Chinook or coho salmon per day and five jack
16 salmon per day. In addition, 5 mini jack (8-15 inches) coho or fall Chinook salmon per
17 day. Umatilla River open for coho and fall Chinook salmon, September 1 – November
18 30, 2018
