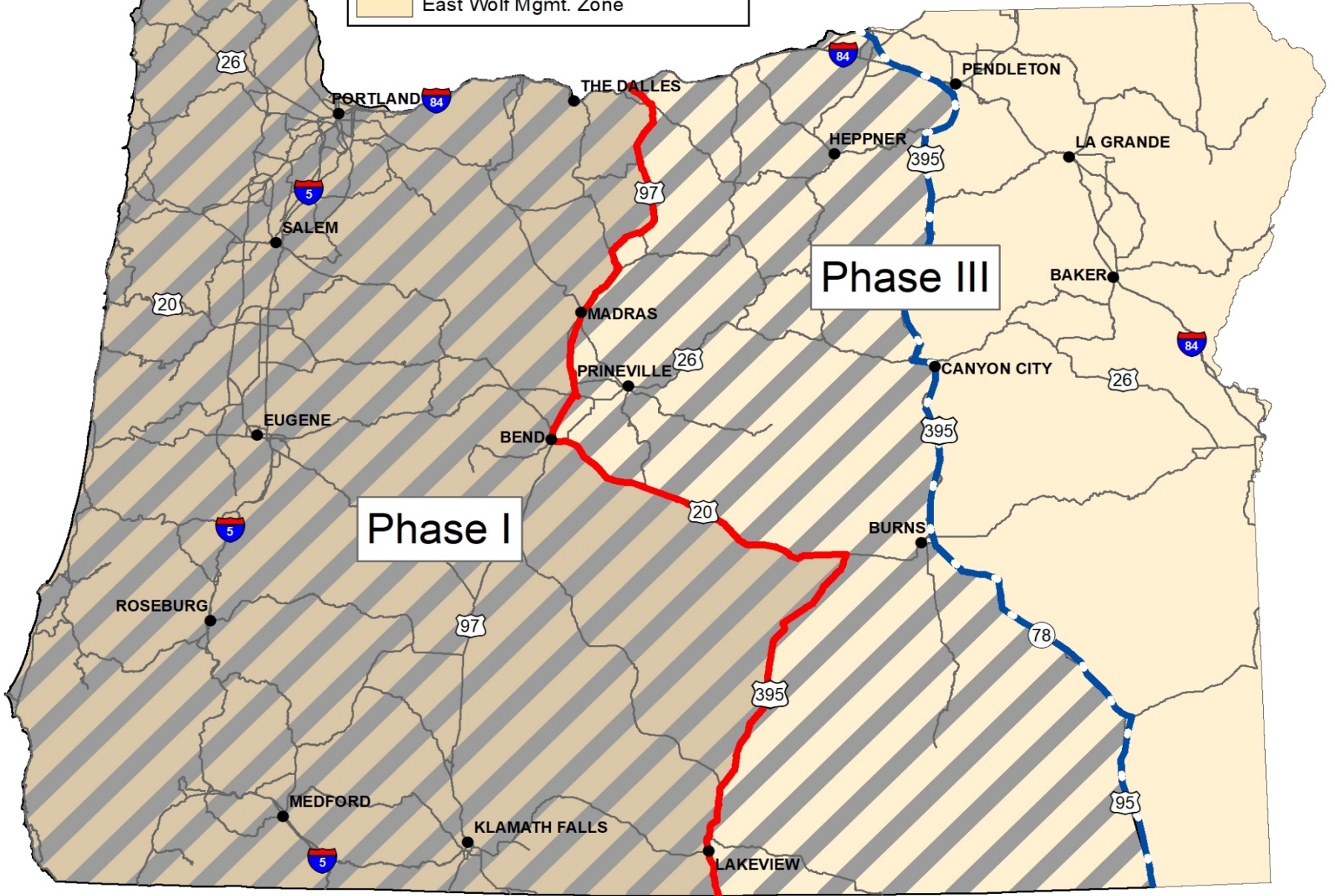


Oregon Status

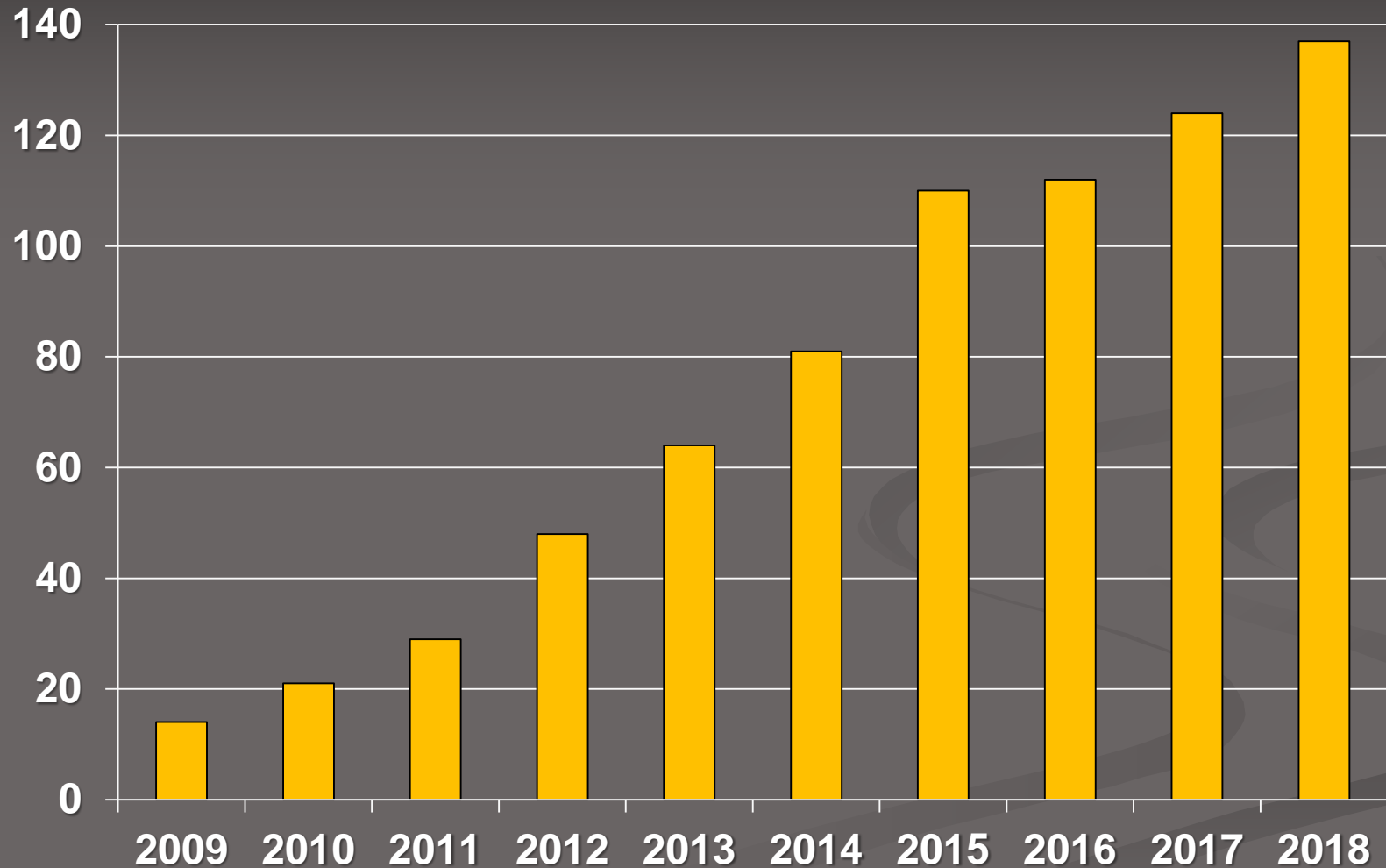

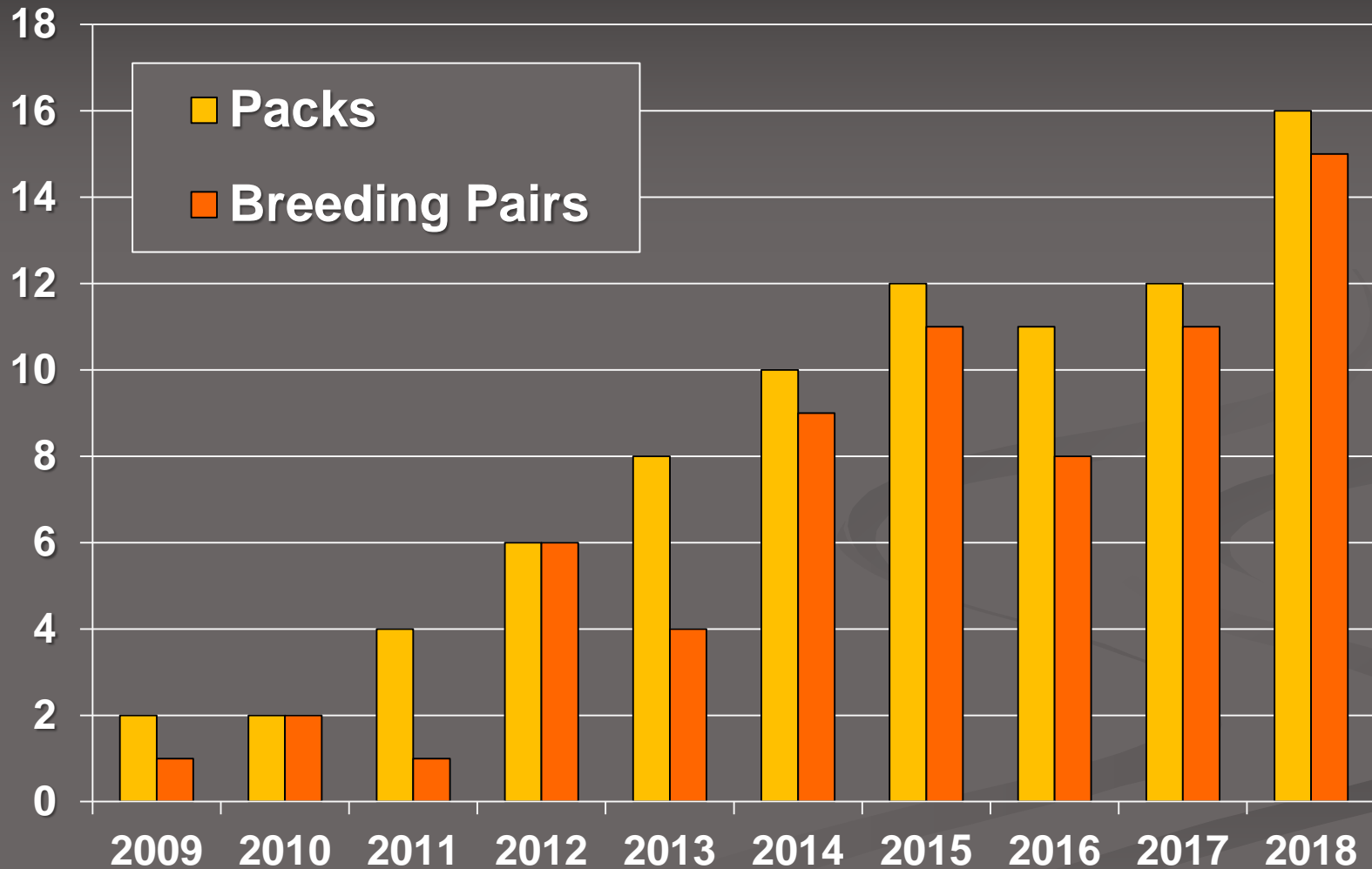

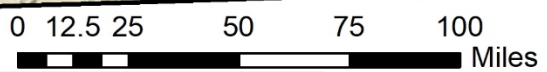

Monitoring

15,836 wolf location data points collected

- **14 wolves radio-collared in 2018**
- **8 radio-collars lost**
- **5 wolves dispersed**
- **18 wolves monitored at the end of 2018**



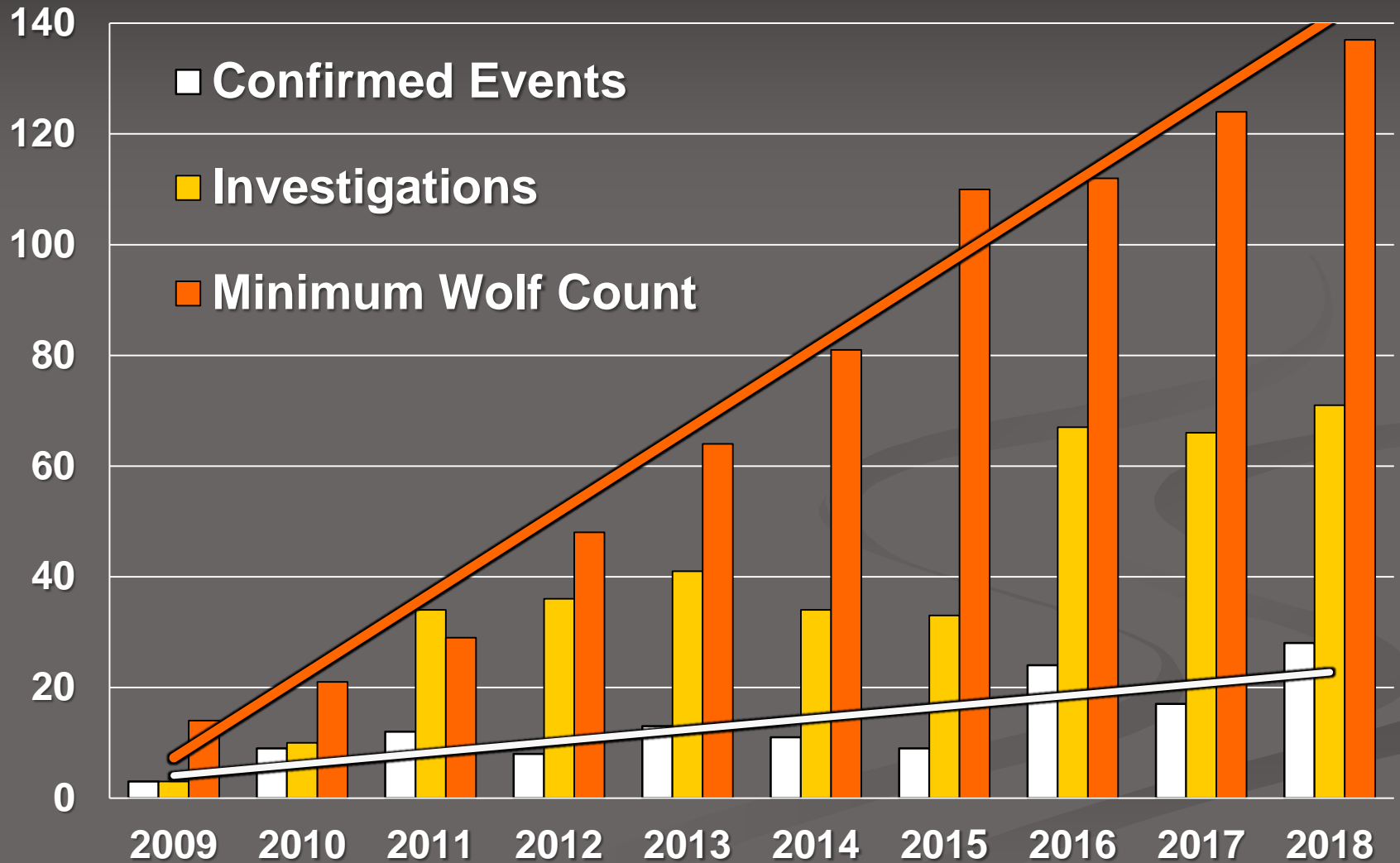

7 Known Mortalities in 2018

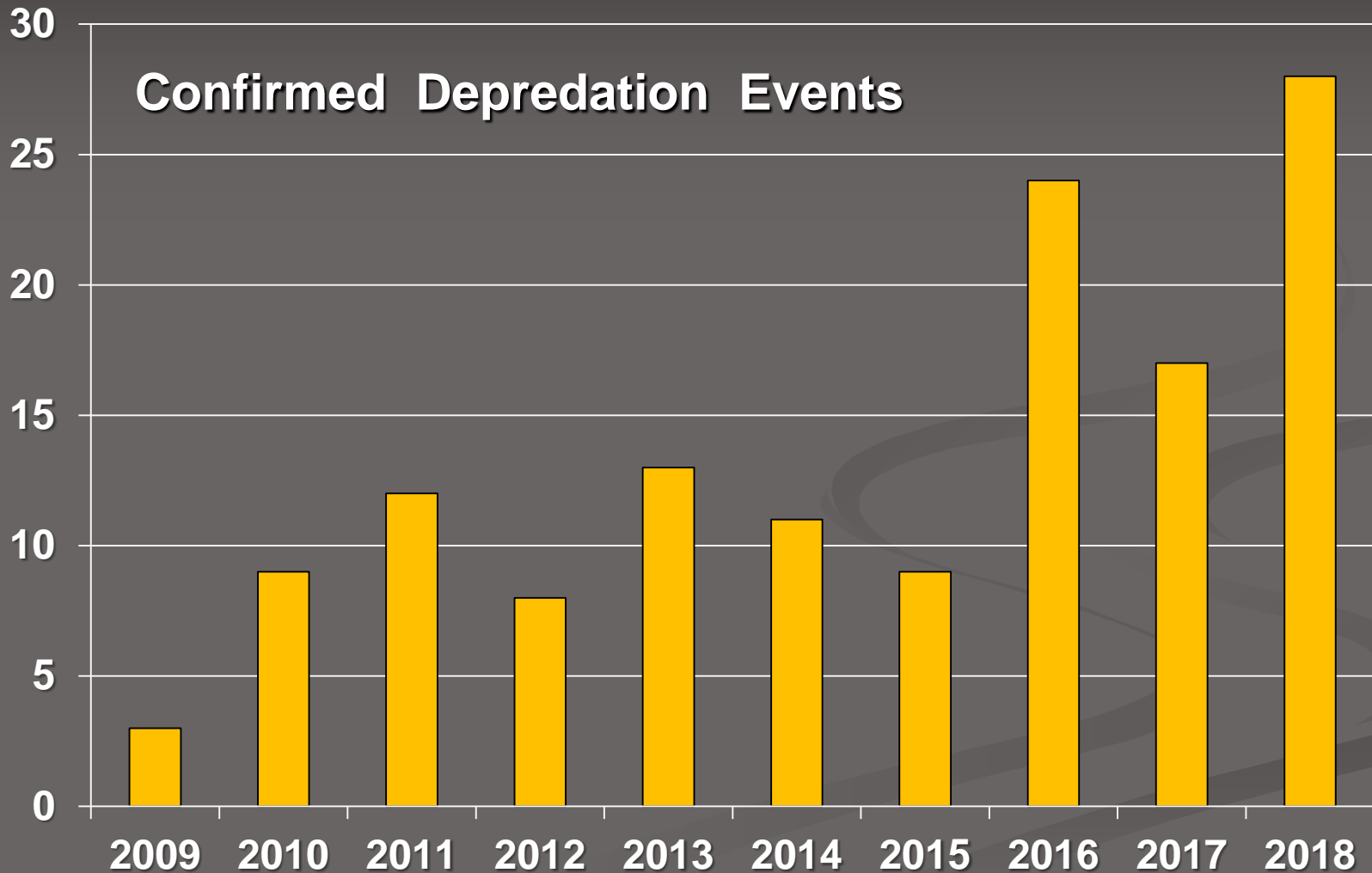

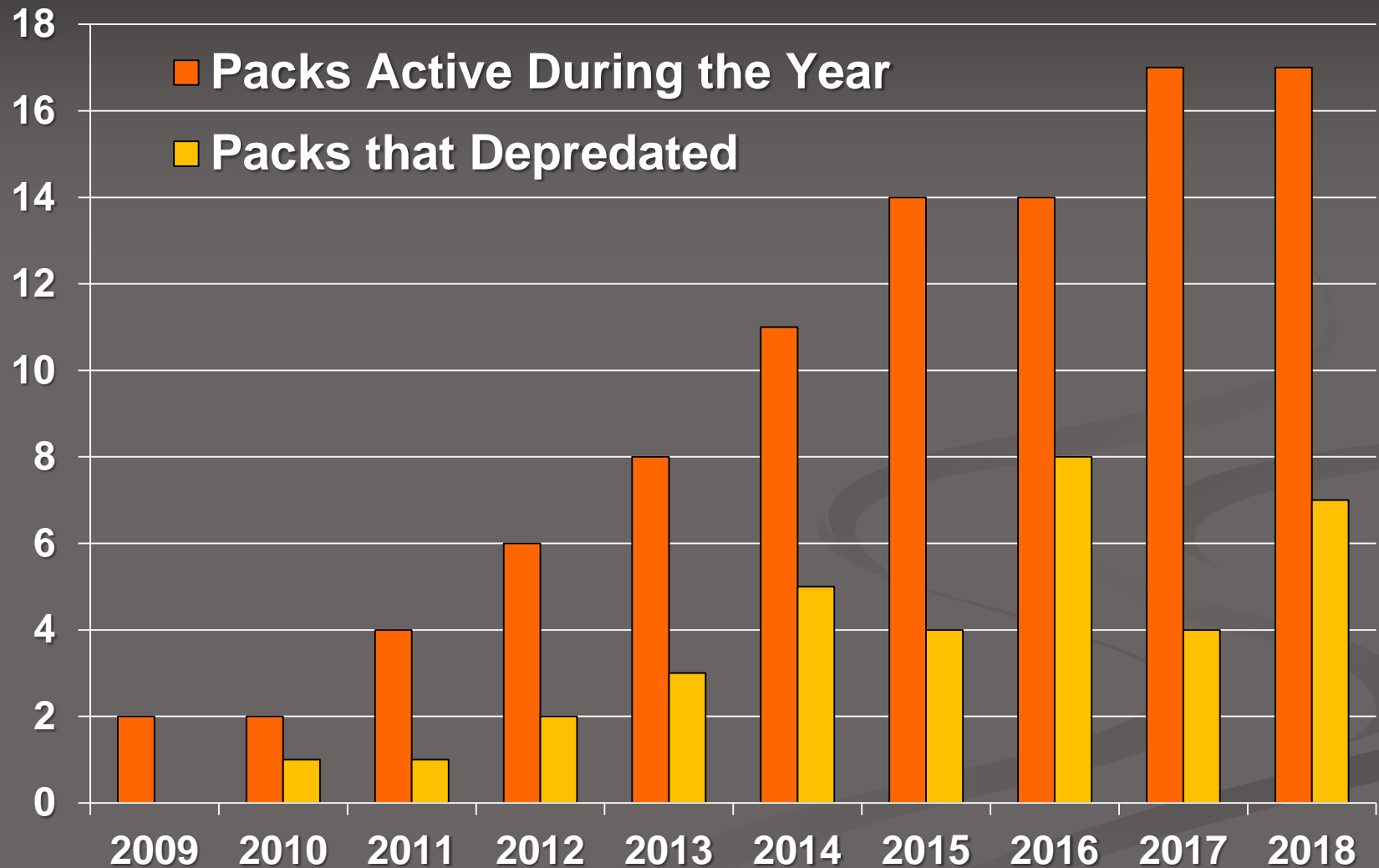
