Statewide Angling Regulations

635-011-0100

General Rule

It is *unlawful* to take any fish, shellfish, or marine invertebrates for personal use except as provided in these rules which include and incorporate the **2020[49] Oregon Sport Fishing Regulations** by reference. However, additional regulations may be adopted in this rule division from time to time and to the extent of any inconsistency, they supersede the **2020[49] Oregon Sport Fishing Regulations**.

Licenses, Tags, and Permits

(1) Hatchery Salmon and Steelhead Harvest Tag Requirements:

(a) Persons holding a valid annual angling license and combined angling harvest tag may purchase Hatchery Salmon and Steelhead Harvest Tags. There is no limit on the number of Hatchery Salmon and Steelhead Harvest Tags an angler may purchase per year. The purchase of each tag entitles the angler to take a combined total of 10 hatchery salmon or steelhead;

(b) Only adipose or otherwise fin-clipped adult salmon or adipose fin-clipped steelhead may be recorded on the Hatchery Salmon and Steelhead Harvest Tag;

(c) A valid annual angling license and a valid annual angling harvest tag must be in possession while fish validated on the Hatchery Salmon and Steelhead Harvest Tag are in angler's possession. All tags purchased must be in angler's possession while angling for salmon or steelhead;

(d) Fish must be recorded immediately upon removal from the water and fish must be recorded in the chronological order caught. The angler who landed the fish must record the fish on his or her tag irrespective of who hooked the fish; and

(e) Harvested fish can be tagged either electronically or on a paper copy. All paper copies of Hatchery Salmon and Steelhead Harvest Tags should be returned to ODFW upon expiration.

(2) Columbia River Basin Endorsement:

(a) The Columbia River Basin is defined as: The mainstem Columbia River from Buoy 10 upstream to include all rivers and their tributaries that drain into the mainstem Columbia River.

(b) Beginning January 1, 2014 a valid Columbia River Basin Endorsement must be in possession while angling for salmon, steelhead, or sturgeon in the Columbia River Basin except during free fishing weekend where every angler is considered as having a valid Columbia River Basin Endorsement.

(c) The fee for the Columbia River Basin Endorsement, when purchased in conjunction with an annual license



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40 is \$9.75, in addition to fees as described in ORS 497.121 and ORS 497.123.

41 (d) The fee for the Columbia River Basin Endorsement when purchased separately is \$9.75 (plus a \$2.00 agent
42 fee).

43 (e) The fee for the Columbia River Basin Endorsement, when purchased in conjunction with a daily license is
44 \$1.00 per each day, in addition to those fees as described in ORS 497-121.

45 (f) Purchase of a Columbia River Basin Endorsement is not required for free fishing weekend.

46 (g) No fee will be charged for a Columbia River Basin Endorsement for an angler(s) in possession of:

47 (A) A resident disabled veteran, resident pioneer, resident and non-resident youth under 12 license; or

48 (B) A Permanent Wheel-chair Angling License, a Permanent Blind Angler License, or a Permanent Senior.

49 **(3) An angling license is not required when angling in temporary structures utilized to serve or promote a**
50 **public fishing event.**

63 (1) OAR 635-013-0005 through OAR 635-013-0009 modify or are in addition to provisions contained in **Code of**
64 **Federal Regulations, Title 50, Part 660, Subparts A and H, and the 2020[49] Oregon Sport Fishing**
65 **Regulations.**

66 (2) The **Code of Federal Regulations (CFR), Title 50, Part 660, Subparts A and H, and the 2020[49] Oregon**
67 **Sport Fishing Regulations** contain requirements for sport salmon angling in the Pacific Ocean off the Oregon
68 coast. However, additional regulations may be adopted from time to time, and, to the extent of any inconsistency,
69 they supersede the published federal regulations and the **2020[49] Oregon Sport Fishing Regulations.** This
70 means that persons must consult not only the federal regulations and the published sport fishing regulations but
71 also the Department's web page to determine all applicable sport fishing regulations.

72 (3) This rule contains requirements that modify sport salmon angling regulations off the Oregon coast. The following
73 modifications are organized in sections that apply to the ocean sport salmon fishery in general and within
74 management zones established by the Pacific Fishery Management Council and enacted by **Federal Regulations**
75 **(CFR, Title 50, Part 660, Subparts A and H).**

170 (b) Open fishing period is June 1 through July 31 from 7:00 A.M. to 6:00 P.M.; personal use harvest is permitted
 171 Friday through Monday each week. All harvest is prohibited Tuesday through Thursday;

172 (c) Open fishing area is the Willamette River at Willamette Falls on the east side of the falls only, excluding
 173 Horseshoe Area at the peak of the falls;

174 (d) Gear is restricted to hand or hand-powered tools only;

175 (e) Catch must be recorded daily on a harvest record card prior to leaving the open fishing area. Harvest record
 176 cards will be provided by ODFW. All harvest record cards must be returned to the ODFW Clackamas office by
 177 August 31 to report catch. Permit holders who do not return the harvest record cards by August 31 will be ineligible
 178 to receive a permit in the following year.

392 (a) The sport fishing regulations of the State, included in the document entitled **2020[49] Oregon Sport**
393 **Fishing Regulations;**

395 (c) **Title 50 of the Code of Federal Regulations, Part 660, Subpart G** (October 1, 2018 ed.), as amended;

409 (1) The **2020[49] Oregon Sport Fishing Regulations** provide requirements for sport fisheries for marine fish,
410 shellfish, and marine invertebrates in the Pacific Ocean, coastal bays, and beaches, commonly referred to as the
411 Marine Zone. However, additional regulations may be adopted in this rule division from time to time and to the
412 extent of any inconsistency, they supersede the **2020[49] Oregon Sport Fishing Regulations**.

413 (2) For the purposes of this rule, a "sport harvest guideline" is defined as a specified numerical harvest objective
414 that is not a quota. Attainment of a harvest guideline does not automatically close a fishery. Upon attainment of a
415 sport harvest guideline, the Department shall initiate consultation to determine if additional regulatory actions are
416 necessary to achieve management objectives. The following sport harvest guidelines include the combined
417 landings and other fishery related mortality by the Oregon sport fishery in a single calendar year:

418 (a) Black rockfish, 392.2 metric tons;



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- 419 (b) Blue rockfish and deacon rockfish combined: 82.6 metric tons;
- 420 (c) Other Nearshore Rockfish combined: 11.7 metric tons;
- 421 (d) Cabezon, 16.8 metric tons; and
- 422 (e) Greenling, 42.6 metric tons.
- 423 (3) For the purposes of this rule, "Other nearshore rockfish" means the following rockfish species: black and
 424 yellow (*Sebastes chrysomelas*); brown (*S. auriculatus*); calico (*S. dalli*); China (*S. nebulosus*); copper (*S.*
 425 *caurinus*); gopher (*S. carnatus*); grass (*S. rastrelliger*); kelp (*S. atrovirens*); olive (*S. serranoides*); quillback (*S.*
 426 *maliger*); and treefish (*S. serriceps*).
- 427 (4) In addition to the regulations for Marine Fish in the **2020[49] Oregon Sport Fishing Regulations**, the
 428 following apply for the sport fishery in the Marine Zone:
- 429 (a) Lingcod (including green colored lingcod): 2 fish daily bag limit.
- 430 (b) All rockfish ("sea bass" "snapper"), greenling ("sea trout"), cabezon, skates, and other marine fish species
 431 not listed in the **2020[49] Oregon Sport Fishing Regulations** in the Marine Zone, located under the category of
 432 Finfish Species, General Marine Species: 5 fish daily bag limit in aggregate (total sum or number), of which no
 433 more than one may be a cabezon, when retention of cabezon is allowed. Retention of the following species is
 434 prohibited:
- 435 (A) Yelloweye rockfish; and
- 436 (B) Cabezon from January 1 through June 30.
- 437 (c) Flatfish (flounder, sole, sanddabs, turbot, and all halibut species except Pacific halibut): 25 fish daily bag
 438 limit in aggregate (total sum or number).
- 439 (d) Retention of all marine fish listed under the category of Finfish Species, General Marine Species, except
 440 Pacific cod, sablefish, flatfish, herring, anchovy, smelt, sardine, striped bass, hybrid bass, and offshore pelagic
 441 species (excluding leopard shark and soupfin shark), is prohibited when Pacific halibut is retained on the vessel
 442 during open days for the all-depth sport fishery for Pacific halibut. Persons must also consult all publications
 443 referenced in OAR 635-039-0080 to determine all rules applicable to the taking of Pacific halibut.
- 444 (e) Harvest methods and other specifications for marine fish in subsections (4)(a), (4)(b) and (4)(c) including
 445 the following:
- 446 (A) Minimum length for lingcod, 22 inches.
- 447 (B) Minimum length for cabezon, 16 inches.
- 448 (C) May be taken by angling, hand, bow and arrow, spear, gaff hook, snag hook and herring jigs.
- 449 (D) Mutilating the fish so the size or species cannot be determined prior to landing or transporting
 450 mutilated fish across state waters is prohibited.
- 451 (E) When angling for groundfish or Pacific halibut in the Pacific Ocean or when in possession of
 452 groundfish or Pacific halibut, all watercraft shall have a functional descending device on board and shall use a
 453 descending device when releasing any rockfish outside of the 30-fathom curve (defined by latitude and longitude)
 454 as shown in **Title 50 Code of Federal Regulations Part 660 Section 71**. Upon request, a descending device
 455 shall be presented for inspection by any person authorized to enforce the wildlife laws or a representative of the



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456 Department. In this subsection, “descending device” means a device capable of returning a rockfish back to a
 457 depth of at least 100 feet to assist the fish in recompression and to improve the fish’s chance of survival.

458 (F) Long-leader gear means fishing gear with the following: one fishing line, deployed with a sinker and
 459 no more than three hooks, with a minimum of 30 feet (9.14 meters) between the sinker and the lowest hook, and
 460 a non-compressible float attached to the line above the hooks. The hooks can only be equipped with artificial
 461 lures or molded soft plastic or rubber imitations of worms, eggs, insects, bait fish, crayfish, etc. 5 inches or less in
 462 length and/or artificial flies. Natural bait may not be used.

463 (f) Sport fisheries for species in subsections (4)(a), (4)(b) and (4)(c) and including leopard shark and soupfin
 464 shark are open January 1 through December 31, twenty-four hours per day, except as provided in subsections
 465 4(b) and (4)(d). Ocean waters are closed for these species, with the exception of flatfish species, during May 1
 466 through September 30, outside of the 40-fathom curve (defined by latitude and longitude) as shown in **Title 50**
 467 **Code of Federal Regulations Part 660 Section 71**, except as provided in subsection 4(d) or when fishing with
 468 long-leader gear during such times and in such areas as allowed in federal rule. A 20-fathom, 25-fathom, or 30-
 469 fathom curve, as shown in **Title 50 Code of Federal Regulations Part 660 Section 71** may be implemented as
 470 the management line as inseason modifications necessitate. In addition, the following management lines may be
 471 used to set area-specific regulations for inseason action only:

472 (A) Cape Lookout (45°20’30” N latitude); and

473 (B) Cape Blanco (42°50’20” N latitude).

474 (g) The Stonewall Bank Yelloweye Rockfish Conservation Area (YRCA) is defined by coordinates specified in
 475 **Title 50 Code of Federal Regulations Part 660 Section 70** (October 1, 2018 ed.). Within the YRCA, it is
 476 unlawful to fish for, take, or retain species listed in subsections (4)(a), (4)(b) and (4)(c) of this rule, leopard shark,
 477 soupfin shark, and Pacific halibut using recreational fishing gear. A vessel engaged in recreational fishing within
 478 the YRCA is prohibited from possessing any species listed in subsections (4)(a), (4)(b) and (4)(c) of this rule,
 479 leopard shark, soupfin shark, and Pacific halibut. Recreational fishing vessels in possession of species listed in
 480 subsections (4)(a), (4)(b) and (4)(c) and including leopard shark, soupfin shark, and Pacific halibut may transit the
 481 YRCA without fishing gear in the water.

482 (h) Notwithstanding any other provisions of this rule, on any fishing trip where fishing with long-leader gear (as
 483 defined in subsection (4)(e)(F)) occurs seaward of the 40-fathom curve (defined by latitude and longitude) as
 484 shown in **Title 50 Code of Federal Regulations Part 660 Section 71**, the following apply:

485 (A) It is unlawful to retain any species in the Groundfish Group other than yellowtail rockfish (*Sebastes*
 486 *flavidus*), widow rockfish (*S. entomelas*), canary rockfish (*S. pinniger*), deacon rockfish (*S. diaconus*), blue
 487 rockfish (*S. mystinus*), redstripe rockfish (*S. proriger*), greenstriped rockfish (*S. elongatus*), chilipepper rockfish (*S.*
 488 *goodei*), bocaccio rockfish (*S. paucispinis*), or silvergray rockfish (*S. brevispinis*);

489 (B) The daily bag limit is 10 fish in aggregate for the species listed in section (4)(h)(A);

490 (C) A long-leader fishing trip must be separated from any other fishing trip where groundfish are retained
 491 by returning to the dock and offloading fish;

492 (D) It is unlawful for an angler who retained fish on a long-leader fishing trip to retain more than 10 fish in
 493 aggregate of the species listed in (4)(b) in the same day;



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494 (E) It is unlawful to fish for any species in the Groundfish Group, including those listed in section (4)(h)(A),
495 inside of the 40-fathom curve or with gear that is not long-leader gear as defined in section (4)(e)(F); and

496 (F) Federal rules governing the long-leader fishery will supersede these rules to the extent of any
497 inconsistency, including the definition of long-leader gear.

498 (i) Topsmelt and jacksmelt are included in the daily limit for herring, anchovy, sardine, and true smelts of 25
499 pounds per day in aggregate. Topsmelt and jacksmelt are not included in the General Marine Species daily limit
500 of 5 fish per day.

501 (5) Take of abalone prohibited, twenty-four hours per day, in all Oregon waters until March 17, 2021.
