#### 25 **1.) 635-043-0175, 635-066-0010, 635-067-0004**

#### 26 **Animal parts check-in requirements for hunter harvested bear/cougar, and Roadkill**

#### 27 **Salvage Permit animals**

28 Adopted: March 22, 2021 – Effective Dates: March 22, 2021 through September 17, 2021  
29 Due to continued Department office closures in response to the COVID-19 Emergency and  
30 the expected increase of harvested animals with the 2021 hunting seasons, Temporary  
31 Rules are needed to continue compliance with CDC guidelines for social distancing and  
32 Governor Kate Brown’s Emergency Declaration and directives designed to reduce the  
33 spread of COVID-19 by reducing social contact.

#### 34 **2.) 635-042-0145**

1 **Revise 2021 Commercial Fishing Seasons in Youngs Bay Select Area**

2 Adopted March 24, 2021: effective March 25, 2021 through July 29, 2021.

3 This amended rule modifies the fishing area for two previously adopted commercial fishing  
4 periods (on March 25 and 29,) in the Youngs Bay Select Area.

5  
6 **3.) 635-042-0160, 635-042-0170**

7 **Revise 2021 Commercial Fishing Seasons in Knappa Slough, South Channel, and Tongue  
8 Point Select Areas**

9 Adopted March 24, 2021: effective March 25, 2021 through July 2, 2021.

10 635-042-0160

11 This amended rule increases the open hours for two previously adopted periods in Knappa  
12 Slough.

13 Modifications are consistent with action taken March 23 by the Departments of Fish &  
14 Wildlife for the States of Oregon and Washington at a meeting of the Columbia River  
15 Compact.

16 635-042-0170

17 This amended rule includes the following changes to Select Area commercial fisheries:

- 18 • Provides two additional fishing periods in the Tongue Point Select Area; and
- 19 • Modifies the open hours of one previously adopted period in South Channel for  
20 consistency with the new Tongue Point periods.

21 Modifications are consistent with action taken March 23 by the Departments of Fish &  
22 Wildlife for the States of Oregon and Washington at a meeting of the Columbia River  
23 Compact.

24  
25 **4.) 635-019-0090**

26 **Close Angling for and Retention of Steelhead Upstream of McKay Dam**

27 Adopted March 24, 2021: effective March 24, 2021 through June 30, 2021.

28 This amended rule closes recreational steelhead angling and retention upstream of McKay  
29 Dam including the McKay Reservoir, McKay Creek, and all tributaries from April 1  
30 through June 30, 2021.

31  
32 **5.) 635-042-0145**

33 **Revise 2021 Commercial Fishing Seasons in Youngs Bay Select Area**

34 Adopted March 31, 2021: effective April 1, 2021 through July 29, 2021.

35 This amended rule modifies the fishing area for a previously adopted commercial fishing  
36 period (April 1), and adds two reduced-area fishing periods in the Youngs Bay Select Area.

37  
38 **6.) 635-042-0180**

39 **Set 2021 Commercial Fishing Seasons in the Deep River Select Area**

40 Adopted March 31, 2021: effective April 1, 2021 through July 2, 2021.

41 This amended rule provides one additional fishing period in the Deep River Select Area.  
42 Modifications are consistent with action taken by the Departments of Fish & Wildlife for  
43 the States of Oregon and Washington at the March 30 Columbia River Compact.

47 **7.) 635-042-0160, 635-042-0170**

1 **Revise 2021 Commercial Fishing Seasons in Knappa Slough, South Channel, and Tongue**  
2 **Point Select Areas**

3 Adopted March 31, 2021: effective April 1, 2021 through July 2, 2021.

4 This amended rule includes the following changes to Select Area commercial fisheries:

- 5 • Provides one additional fishing period in the Tongue Point Select Area;
  - 6 • Modifies the open hours of one previously adopted period in South Channel for
  - 7 consistency with the new Tongue Point periods; and
  - 8 • Increases the open hours for four previously adopted periods in Knappa Slough.

10 **8.) 635-042-0145**

11 **Revise 2021 Commercial Fishing Seasons in Youngs Bay Select Area**

12 Adopted April 8, 2021: effective April 8, 2021 through July 29, 2021.

13 This amended rule modifies the fishing area for a previously adopted commercial fishing  
14 period (April 8), and adds one additional fishing period in the Youngs Bay Select Area.

15

16 **9.) 635-042-0170**

17 **Revise 2021 Commercial Fishing Seasons in South Channel and Tongue Point Select**  
18 **Areas**

19 Adopted April 8, 2021: effective April 8, 2021 through July 2, 2021.

20 This amended rule includes the following changes to Select Area commercial fisheries:

- 21 • Provides two additional fishing period in the Tongue Point Select Area; and
- 22 • Modifies the open hours of two previously adopted periods in South Channel for
- 23 consistency with the new Tongue Point periods.

24 Modifications are consistent with action taken by the Departments of Fish & Wildlife for  
25 the States of Oregon and Washington at the April 7 Columbia River Compact.

26

27 **10.) 635-042-0180**

28 **Revise 2021 Commercial Fishing Season in the Deep River Select Area**

29 Adopted April 8, 2021: effective April 8, 2021 through July 2, 2021.

30 This amended rule provides one additional fishing period in the Deep River Select Area.

31 Modifications are consistent with action taken by the Departments of Fish & Wildlife for  
32 the States of Oregon and Washington at the April 7 Columbia River Compact.

33

34 **11.) 635-005-0355**

35 **Close Tillamook Bay Commercial Cockle Dive Fishery**

36 Adopted April 9, 2021: effective April 12, 2021 through October 8, 2021.

37 This amended rule closes the commercial Tillamook Bay cockle dive fishery on April 15.

38 The annual harvest quota allowed under bay clam catch limits is 185,000 pounds, and the  
39 fishery is projected to reach that quota by April 14.

40

41 **12.) 635-018-0090**

42 **Open Hatchery Chinook Fishery on the Hood River**

43 Adopted April 9, 2021: effective May 1, 2021 through June 30, 2021.

44 This amended rule authorizes recreational retention of one hatchery Chinook and five  
45 hatchery jack salmon in portions of the Hood River from May 1 through June 30.

47 **13.) 635-021-0090**

1 **Eliminate Size and Bag Limits for Trout in Chickahominy Reservoir Due to Low Water**

2 Adopted April 9, 2021: effective April 12, 2021 through October 8, 2021.

3 This rule will temporarily lift all size limits (minimum and maximum), as well as daily  
4 limits for trout in Chickahominy Reservoir from April 14 through October 10.

5  
6 **14.) 635-043-0175, 635-066-0010, 635-067-0004**

7 **Animal parts check-in requirements for hunter harvested bear/cougar, and Roadkill**  
8 **Salvage Permit animals**

9 Adopted: March 22, 2021 – Effective Dates: March 22, 2021 through September 17, 2021  
10 Due to continued Department office closures in response to the COVID-19 Emergency and  
11 the expected increase of harvested animals with the 2021 hunting seasons, Temporary  
12 Rules are needed to continue compliance with CDC guidelines for social distancing and  
13 Governor Kate Brown’s Emergency Declaration and directives designed to reduce the

16 **15.) 635-042-0145**

17 **Revise 2021 Commercial Fishing Season in Youngs Bay Select Area**

18 Adopted April 13, 2021: effective April 14, 2021 through July 29, 2021.

19 This amended rule adds one 4-hour fishing period (April 14) in the Youngs Bay Select  
20 Area.

21  
22 **16.) 635-042-0145**

23 **Close Angling for and Retention of Spring Chinook in the Umatilla River**

24 Adopted April 15, 2021: effective April 15, 2021 through June 30, 2021.

25 These amended rules close recreational spring Chinook retention in the Umatilla River  
26 Basin from

27 April 16 through June 30, 2021. The closure extends from the mouth of the Umatilla  
28 upstream to the Confederated Tribes of the Umatilla Indian Reservation (CTUIR)  
29 reservation boundary, and from the upper border of the reservation to the Umatilla  
30 headwaters, including all tributaries.

31 Modifications are consistent with action taken by the CTUIR for the portion of the  
32 Umatilla River that is within the CTUIR reservation.

33  
34 **17.) 635-023-0134**

35 **Open Hatchery Chinook salmon Fishery in the Snake River**

36 Adopted April 15, 2021: effective April 24, 2021 through July 31, 2021.

37 This amended rule allows retention of hatchery spring Chinook salmon in the Snake River  
38 from Dun Bar boat ramp upstream to Hells Canyon Dam from April 24 through July 31.

39  
40 **18.) 635-418-0005, 635-418-0015, 635-418-0025**

41 **Establishes regional dry maintenance time periods for removal of sediment in dry,**  
42 **traditionally maintained channels**

43 Adopted: April 19, 2021 – Effective Dates: April 22, 2021 through October 18, 2021  
44 HB2437 (2019) directed the Department to establish regional dry maintenance time periods  
45 for removal of sediment in dry, traditionally maintained channels for agricultural drainage.  
46 The temporary rules define the dry regional maintenance time period for removal of  
47 sediment in watersheds across the state.

2 Action:  
3 Chair Wahl moved to ratify the numbers one (1) through seventeen (17) temporary rules set forth  
4 in the today’s tan agenda. Commissioner Zarnowitz seconded the motion, and the motion carried  
5 unanimously, six (6) in favor.

7 Commissioner Zarnowitz moved to ratify temporary rule numbered eighteen (18) set forth in the  
8 today’s tan agenda. Commissioner Spelbrink seconded the motion, and the motion carried  
9 unanimously, six (6) in favor

23 Staff: Christian Heath, Groundfish & Halibut Assistant Project Leader  
24 *Presentation:* Christian provided the Commission with a presentation on sport and  
25 commercial Pacific halibut fisheries in 2021. This report included information on Halibut  
26 Management Partners, International Pacific Halibut Commission (IPHC) regulatory areas, 2020  
27 stock assessment, the biology, spawning grounds and migration patterns, growth and recruitment  
28 to the fishery, environmental factors, Oregon halibut fisheries, process timeline, Area 2A catch  
29 limit, Area 2A catch sharing plan, Oregon sport halibut allocations, changes to the catch sharing  
30 plan, sport fishing seasons, Columbia River subarea, Oregon Coast subarea, Central Oregon Coast  
31 subarea, Southern Oregon Coast subarea, Commercial Fisheries, and changes to Commercial  
32 Fisheries.

22 The Commission will be asked to adopt the game bird season and regulations for 2021-22

23 Staff: Brandon Reishus, Migratory Bird Coordinator; and

24 Mikal Cline, Upland Game Bird Coordinator

25 Presentation: Mikal provided the Commission with a presentation on 2021- 22 proposed  
26 upland game bird regulations. The presentation included information on the population status;  
27 climate change and bird management; 5-year regulation framework; regulation proposals; special  
28 hunt opportunities; and controlled sage-grouse seasons.

29 Invited guest Dr. Christian Hagen provided the Commissioners a presentation on sage-  
30 grouse hunter harvest in Oregon. The presentation included information on sage-grouse life  
31 history; review data from Oregon studies; compensatory vs. additive mortality; and how sage-  
32 grouse fit into the compensatory –additive continuum.

33 Brandon provided a presentation on the 2021 – 22 migratory game birds hunting seasons  
34 and regulation proposals. The presentation included information on the regulation setting process;  
35 seasons and bag limits; wildlife area hunt programs and department lands.
