Please consider these comments and send me a note if you have any questions.

1. It was a good start having duck and goose season start on the same date in Deschutes and Jefferson Counties. They also need to end on the same date. We are tired of passing up ducks on goose hunts the last week of January when the goose season is open. With global warming, January is getting warmer every year and there is open water the last week of January in central Oregon.
2. There are no snow geese in Deschutes and Jefferson Counties for the late hunt, EVER! Please show me the science that indicates otherwise. Thanks to these silly time frames, I had to pass up snow geese 7 times in Jefferson County because the season was closed so that you could extend the season into March. Someone should have their head examined! However, it didn't stop some local hunters from shooting them anyways. I appreciate you trying to do something different with the snow goose hunt, but this clearly has failed for Deschutes and Jefferson Counties.
3. Please do not let Klamath County dictate how seasons are done to the north and northeast of it. If you held a meeting up here instead of Klamath Falls, I would love to attend and give a presentation.
