24 Director Curt Melcher requested the Commission ratify the following temporary rules. The
25 seventeen (17) temporary rules were previously adopted by the director under his emergency
26 action authority.

28 **1.) 635-023-0134**

29 **Open Recreational Hatchery Chinook Retention in the Snake River**

30 Adopted 05/17/2022: effective 05/18/2022 through 07/31/2022.

31 This amended rule allows retention of hatchery spring Chinook in the Hells Canyon
32 section of the Snake River from May 18 through July 31.
33

34 **2.) 635-017-0090**

35 **Close Retention of Chinook in Green Peter Reservoir**

36 Adopted 05/19/2022: effective 05/20/2022 through 08/15/2022.

37 This amended rule will close retention of Chinook in Green Peter Reservoir from May 20
38 through October 31 consistent with similar waterbodies in the Willamette Zone (Detroit
39 and Foster reservoirs) where Chinook have been released above dams.
40

41 **3.) 635-005-0387**

42 **Close Intertidal Commercial Cackle Fishery in Tillamook Bay**

43 Adopted 05/20/2022: effective 05/21/2022 through 09/30/2022.

44 This amended rule closes the Tillamook Bay commercial intertidal cackle fishery on May
45 21 as the fishery is projected to reach the 80,000-pound quota.

6 Fork Coquille River, and South Fork Coquille River (mouth to USFS boundary near
7 Powers) from May 22 through October 31.

10 **Extend Recreational Spring Chinook and Steelhead Retention Fisheries in the**
11 **Columbia River**

12 Adopted 05/20/2022: effective 05/24/2022 through 06/15/2022.

13 This amended rule extends the retention fisheries for hatchery Chinook and hatchery
14 steelhead in the Columbia River from Tongue Point/Rocky Point upstream to Bonneville
15 Dam starting May 24 and from Bonneville Dam upstream to the Oregon/Washington
16 border starting May 26.

17
18 6.) **635-042-0022**

19 **Adopt Non-Treaty Columbia River Commercial Mainstem Tangle Net Fishery**

20 Adopted 05/20/2022: effective 05/23/2022 through 05/24/2022.

21 These rules authorize one commercial fishing period for salmon, sturgeon, and shad
22 fishery in a section of the Columbia River downstream of Bonneville Dam on May 23
23 and modify allowable sales for fish harvested in the Select Areas during the mainstem
24 commercial fishery.

25
26 7.) **635-042-0145, 635-042-0160, 635-042-0170, 635-042-0180**

27 **Adopt Non-Treaty Columbia River Commercial Mainstem Tangle Net Fishery**

28 Adopted 05/20/2022: 05/23/2022 through 07/31/2022.

29 These rules authorize one commercial fishing period for salmon, sturgeon, and shad
30 fishery in a section of the Columbia River downstream of Bonneville Dam on May 23
31 and modify allowable sales for fish harvested in the Select Areas during the mainstem
32 commercial fishery.

33
34 8.) **635-018-0090**

35 **Close Deschutes River Fisheries**

36 Adopted 05/25/2022: effective 06/01/2022 through 06/30/2022.

37 This amended rule increases protections for wild summer steelhead in the Columbia
38 River Basin by closing angling in the Deschutes River.

40 9.) **635-016-0090**

41 **Umpqua River Thermal Refuge Closures**

42 Adopted 05/31/2022: effective 06/01/2022 through 06/30/2022.

43 This amended rule will prohibit angling at the mouth of tributaries of the Mainstem
44 Umpqua River from the Scottsburg Bridge upstream to the River Forks Park boat ramp.

1 **10.) 635-023-0095**

2 **Authorize White Sturgeon Retention in the Lower Columbia River**

3 Adopted 06/03/2022: effective 06/08/2022 through 06/26/2022.

4 This amended rule allows recreational retention of white sturgeon in the mainstem
5 Columbia River from the mouth at Buoy 10 upstream to Wauna Powerlines on June 8
6 and June 11.

9 **Modify Recreational Spring Chinook and Steelhead Retention Fisheries in the**
10 **Columbia River**

11 Adopted 06/03/2022: effective 06/04/2022 through 06/15/2022.

12 This amended rule modifies the open area and daily bag limit associated with retention
13 fisheries for hatchery Chinook and hatchery steelhead in the Columbia River from
14 Tongue Point/Rocky Point upstream to the Oregon/Washington border starting June 4.

17 **Set Treaty Commercial Spring and Summer Fisheries**

18 Adopted 06/03/2022: effective 06/04/2022 through 07/31/2022.

19 These amended rules authorize the sales of fish caught in treaty fisheries.
