9 On Friday, **January 13, 2023, at 8:00 AM, Chair Wahl called the Oregon Fish and Wildlife**  
10 **Commission** (the Commission) meeting to order.

12 **DIRECTOR’S REPORT**  
13 **EXPENDITURE REPORT**

14 Staff: Shannon Hurn, Deputy Director for Administration

15  
16 Shannon reported that federal revenues continue to increase with new grants arriving from federal  
17 partners under the Infrastructure Investment and Jobs Act. General and Other Funds spending is  
18 below projections. November is consistently the slowest month of the year for sport license sales, a  
19 moderate reduction in operating reserves is common and was expected. The next ODFW Audit  
20 Committee meeting will be in March. Shannon also reported that ODFW’s internal auditor has  
21 been invited to be part of the Oregon Department of Emergency Management audit committee.

19                  **ADOPT TEMPORARY RULES**

20                  Curt Melcher, Director

21                  The Commission ratified the following temporary rules. These eight (8) temporary rules were  
22                  previously adopted by the director under his emergency action authority  
23

24                  **1) 635-023-0095**

25                   **Reduce Retention of Sturgeon in Bonneville and The Dalles Pools and Tributaries**

26                   Adopted 12/20/2022: effective 1/1/2023 through 4/22/2023.

27                   This amended rule reduces the retention season for white sturgeon on the mainstem  
28                   Columbia River in the Bonneville (Bonneville Dam upstream to The Dalles Dam) and The  
29                   Dalles (The Dalles Dam upstream to the John Day Dam) pools and all adjacent tributaries.  
30                   Retention will be allowed on January 1 then Monday, Wednesday, and Saturdays from  
31                   January 2 through March 22 in the Bonneville Pool and January 2 through March 4 in  
32                   The Dalles Pool.  
33

34                  **2) 635-019-0090**

35                   **Close Recreational Steelhead Fishing in the John Day River**

36                   Adopted 12/21/2022: effective 1/1/2023 through 6/26/2023.

37                   This amended rule extends steelhead protections in the John Day River and tributaries by  
38                   closing all fishing for steelhead from January 1 through April 30.  
39

40                  **3) 635-023-0125**

41                   **Angling Closures to Protect Steelhead in the Columbia River Above Bonneville**

42                   Adopted 12/21/2022: effective 1/1/2023 through 3/31/2023.

43                   These amended rules increase protections for wild summer steelhead in the Columbia  
44                   River Basin by prohibiting retention of steelhead in the Columbia River upstream of  
45                   Bonneville Dam.

1 **4) 635-016-0090**

2 **Set bag limit for wild spring Chinook on the Mainstem and North Umpqua River**

3 Adopted 12/27/2022: effective 2/1/2023 through 6/30/2023.

4 This amended rule sets the number of wild spring Chinook allowed for harvest on the  
5 Mainstem Umpqua River and North Umpqua River while allowing for retention of  
6 hatchery Chinook salmon from February 1 through June 30.  
7

8 **5) 635-019-0090**

9 **Close Recreational Steelhead Fishing in the Walla Walla River**

10 Adopted 12/29/2022: effective 1/1/2023 through 6/26/2023.

11 This amended rule closes angling for steelhead in the Walla Walla River January 1  
12 through April 30.  
13

14 **6) 635-023-0125**

15 **Angling Closure to Protect Steelhead in the Columbia River Above The Dalles Dam**

16 Adopted 1/5/2023: effective 1/6/2023 through 3/31/2023.

17 These amended rules increase protections for wild summer steelhead in the Columbia  
18 River Basin by prohibiting angling for and retention of steelhead in the Columbia River  
19 upstream of The Dalles Dam.  
20

21 **7) 635-005-0465**

22 **Commercial Dungeness Crab Season Opening**

23 Adopted 1/6/2023: effective 1/6/2023 through 3/31/2023.

24 This amended rule sets the opening dates by area for the Oregon 2022-2023 ocean  
25 commercial Dungeness crab fishery.  
26

27 **8) 635-023-0095**

28 **Close Retention of Sturgeon in Bonneville Pool and Adjacent Tributaries**

29 Adopted 1/11/2023: effective 1/12/2023 through 3/22/2023.

30 This amended rule closes the retention season for white sturgeon on the mainstem  
31 Columbia River in the Bonneville Pool (Bonneville Dam upstream to The Dalles Dam)  
32 and all adjacent tributaries.  
33

34 **Action:**

35 Commissioner King moved to ratify the eight (8) temporary rules set forth on the January  
36 13, 2023, agenda. Commissioner Spelbrink seconded the motion, and the motion carried seven  
37 (7) in favor.  
38

39 **COMMISSION UPDATES**

40 Commissioners Labhart and Hatfield-Hyde provided an update on the recent 2023  
41 Winter Western Association of Fish and Wildlife Agencies (WAFWA) meeting that  
42 they attended in New Mexico.  
43

44 Chair Wahl acknowledged that the Commission received a letter from the Nez Perce  
45 Tribe and Confederated Tribes of the Umatilla Indian Reservation concerning the  
46 recently amended fish passage rules. Chair Wahl stated that the Commission takes  
47 tribal communication and consultation seriously and will continue to respect that  
48 process. When an issue comes to the Commission, the department is asked to frame

1 that issue and provide a recommended path forward for the Commission. Those  
2 recommendations are not the end of the discussion but are an important starting point.  
3 The Fish and Wildlife Commission hopes that department and tribal staff will work  
4 together to clarify the differences that exist, and what a path forward might look like.

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19 **EXHIBIT C: 2023 SCHEDULE OF DAMAGES FOR COMMERCIAL FISHING**  
20 **VIOLATIONS**

21 The Commission established average market values of food fish for determining damages  
22 related to commercial fishing violations.

23 Staff: Ken Loffink, Administrative Services Division Administrator  
24 Presentation: Ken provided the Commission with an overview of ORS:526.720, “damages for  
25 unlawful taking of food fish”. Ken’s presentation also provided information on the proposed  
26 amendments to OAR 635-006-0232; and a proposed 2023 Legislative Concept that will allow the  
27 agency to use “Fair Market Value” as defined in OAR 635-006-0001 and will change damages for  
28 all species to 2x Fair Market Value, removing the requirement for the Commission to adopt a  
29 schedule of damages every year.
