19 Staff: Shannon Hurn, Deputy Director for Administration

20 Shannon reported that unrestricted cash for the month ending June 30, finished with a balance of
21 \$64.6 million, while restricted cash ended the month at \$57.3 million. Total ending balance is
22 \$121.9 million. Departmentwide, expenditures are below spending rates and remain within
23 available revenues. ODFW’s budget bill (SB 5509) passed the Oregon Legislature and was signed
24 on June 22, 2023, by the Speaker and the President. The bill is awaiting signature by Governor
25 Kotek.

29 The Commission ratified the following temporary rules. These temporary rules were previously
30 adopted by the director under his emergency action authority.
31

32 **1) 635-019-0090**

33 **Steelhead Protections in Lower John Day River Waters**

34 Adopted 6/27/2023: effective 6/27/2023 through 8/31/2023.

35 This amended rule reduces the daily bag limit for hatchery steelhead in the lower John Day
36 River from June 16 through August 31.
37

38 **2) 635-004-0355**

39 **Commercial Nearshore Fishery Limit Increases for Periods 4-6**

40 Adopted 6/28/2023: effective 7/5/2023 through 12/31/2023.

41 This amended rule will increase the commercial nearshore fishery two-month cumulative
42 trip limits for black rockfish, other nearshore rockfish, cabezon, and greenling management
43 categories for periods 4-6 (July-December 2023).
44

45 **3) 635-004-0355**

46 **Commercial Nearshore Fishery Limit Increases for Periods 4-6**

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1 This amended rule will increase the commercial nearshore fishery two-month cumulative
2 trip limits for black rockfish, other nearshore rockfish, cabezon, and greenling management
3 categories for periods 4-6 (July-December 2023).
4

5 **4) 635-014-0090, 635-016-0090**

6 **Northwest and Southwest Zone Chinook Bag Limit Reductions and Area Closures**

7 Adopted 7/1/2023: effective 7/1/2023 through 12/7/2023.

8 These amended rules will modify bag limits, close salmon fishing, and implement other
9 conservation measures for protection of wild Chinook in specified Oregon coastal rivers
10 during various time periods between July 1 and December 31 in the Northwest and
11 Southwest Zones.
12

13 **5) 635-023-0128**

14 **Modify Recreational Salmonid Fisheries in the Columbia River During Summer**
15 **Season**

16 Adopted 7/6/2023: effective 7/6/2023 through 7/31/2023.

17 This amended rule closes the retention of adult Chinook in the on-going Columbia River
18 recreational salmon and steelhead fishery from July 1 through July 31 (remainder of
19 summer season).
20

21 **6) 635-041-0076**

22 **Authorize Commercial Sales for Treaty Indian Summer Fisheries**

23 Adopted 7/6/2023: effective 7/6/2023 through 7/31/2023.

24 This amended rule authorizes the sales of fish caught in treaty fisheries. Gillnet fisheries
25 are open in Zone 6 (between Bonneville and McNary dams) during a period from 6:00 a.m.
26 July 3 through 6:00 p.m. July 6.
27

28 **7) 635-017-0090**

29 **Close mainstem McKenzie River**

30 Adopted 7/7/2023: effective 7/15/2023 through 8/15/2023.

31 This amended rule closes the mainstem McKenzie River from the mouth of Trout Creek to
32 the Leaburg Dam to all salmon angling.
33

34 **8) 635-041-0045, 635-041-0076**

35 **Modify Commercial Sales for Treaty Indian Summer Fisheries**

36 Adopted 7/7/2023: effective 7/8/2023 through 7/31/2023.

37 This amended rule modifies the allowable sales of fish caught in treaty fisheries after 6:00
38 pm on July 8.

39 Zone 6 platform and hook-and-line, Yakama Nation Zone 6 tributary, and platform and
40 hook-and-line downstream of Bonneville Dam.
41

42 **9) 635-021-0090**

43 **Close Angling in Hagelstein Lake**

44 Adopted 7/11/2023: effective 7/17/2023 through 12/31/2023.

45 This amended rule will close Hagelstein Lake to angling from July 5 through the end of
46 2023. This will protect the endangered suckers present in the lake.
47

1 **10) 635-041-0076**

2 **Authorize Commercial Sales for Treaty Indian Summer Fisheries**

3 Adopted 7/11/2023: effective 7/11/2023 through 7/31/2023.

4 This amended rule authorizes the sales of fish caught in treaty fisheries. Gillnet fisheries
5 are open in Zone 6 (between Bonneville and McNary dams) during a period from 6:00 a.m.
6 July 3 through 6:00 p.m. July 6.

7
8 **11) 635-041-0045, 635-041-0076**

9 **Set Treaty Commercial Fall Fisheries**

10 Adopted 7/20/2023: effective 7/21/2023 through 7/31/2023.

11 These amended rules authorize the sales of fish caught in treaty fisheries.

- 12 • Platform hook and line fisheries are open in Zone 6 (above Bonneville Dam) from July 21
13 through December 31.
- 14 • Platform and hook-and-line fisheries are open downstream from Bonneville Dam from
15 July 21 through October 31.
- 16 • Yakama Nation tributary fisheries are open from July 21 through December 31.

17
18 **12) 635-039-0085**

19 **Increase Recreational Halibut Days Columbia River and Central Coast Subareas**

20 Adopted 7/25/2023: effective 8/3/2023 through 10/31/2023.

21 This amended rule authorizes fishing for Pacific halibut five additional days (August 26,
22 27, and September 8, 9, 22) in the Columbia River Subarea. It also authorizes fishing for
23 seven days per week for Pacific halibut in the recreational fishery in the Central Coast
24 Subarea all-depth area (Cape Falcon to Humbug Mountain) from August 3 through October
25 31.

26
27 **13) 635-023-0130**

28 **Set Recreational Fall-Season Salmonid Fisheries and Thermal Angling Sanctuaries in**
29 **the Columbia River**

30 Adopted 7/25/2023: effective 8/1/2023 through 12/31/2023.

31 This amended rule sets the Columbia River recreational salmonid fisheries from August 1
32 through December 31. This rule also closes angling in portions of the mainstem Columbia
33 River adjacent to the mouths of Eagle Creek and the Deschutes River, and that portion of
34 Herman creek and lagoon within the Columbia River Zone through September 15.

35
36 **14) 635-023-0095**

37 **Close Columbia River Sturgeon Angling Above The Dalles Dam**

38 Adopted 7/27/2023: effective 7/29/2023 through 9/18/2023.

39 This amended rule closes the mainstem Columbia River from The Dalles Dam upstream to
40 the Oregon/Washington border upstream of McNary Dam to all sturgeon angling.

41
42 **15) 635-016-0090**

43 **North Umpqua River Angling Closure**

44 Adopted 7/27/2023: effective 7/31/2023 through 12/7/2023.

45 This amended rule will prohibit angling in the North Umpqua River from the mouth
46 upstream to the marker below Soda Springs Dam.

1 **16) 635-065-0635, 635-065-0760**

2 **Amend Cooperative Travel Management Areas Regulations for 2023 Hunting**
3 **Seasons Adopted:**

4 Adopted: July 27, 2023 – Effective Dates: July 27, 2023, through January 22, 2024

5 The Oregon Fish and Wildlife Commission may enter into agreements with owners and
6 lawful possessors of land to restrict the use or parking of motor vehicles on certain lands.

7 This rule modification is necessary to reflect public use access agreements in rule between
8 the department and land management agencies that include restrictions on the use of motor
9 vehicles.

10
11 **17) 635-071-0000, 635-073-0000**

12 **Amend Rules to Modify Season Dates for Specified 2023 Oregon Controlled Elk**
13 **Hunts**

14 Adopted: July 27, 2023 – Effective Dates: July 27, 2023, through January 22, 2024

15 Oregon Administrative Rules establishing seasons and tag numbers for 2023 Rocky
16 Mountain elk-controlled hunts and controlled elk bow hunts were adopted September 16,
17 2022. Season dates adopted at that time included date errors for three hunts shown in the
18 2023 hunt tables reviewed by the Fish and Wildlife Commission. These rule amendments
19 are needed to correct the season dates to reflect the accurate dates published in the
20 referenced 2023 Big Game Regulations.

21

23 **Limiting Hunt Areas to Comply with Certain Hunts with Limited Landowner**
24 **Preference Tags**

25 Adopted: July 27, 2023 – Effective Dates: July 27, 2023, through November 30, 2023

26 An amendment of OAR 635-075-0010 is needed so that landowners with property in
27 multiple hunt areas are not in conflict with the tag limits established in OAR 635-075-
28 0020(1)(c) by using an elk tag obtained for a hunt with no limit on LOP tags to hunt in a
29 hunt area where LOP tags are limited.

33 **Set Treaty Commercial Fall Fisheries**

34 Adopted 8/1/2023: effective 8/1/2023 through 12/31/2023.

35 These amended rules authorize the sales of fish caught in treaty fisheries.

36 • Platform hook and line fisheries are open in Zone 6 (above Bonneville Dam) from July 21
37 through December 31.

38 • Platform and hook-and-line fisheries are open downstream from Bonneville Dam from
39 July 21 through October 31.

40 • Yakama Nation tributary fisheries are open from July 21 through December 31.

41
42 **20) 635-042-0031, 635-042-0145, 635-042-0160, 635-042-0170, 635-042-0180**

43 **Adopt Select Area and Mainstem Columbia River Commercial Fisheries**

44 Adopted 8/1/2023: effective 8/1/2023 through 12/31/2023.

45 These rules implement 2023 fall Columbia River Mainstem and Select Area commercial
46 fisheries. The following fisheries are addressed by these rules: Columbia River Early Fall

1 (Zones 4-5), Blind/Knappa Slough, Tongue Point/South Channel, Youngs Bay, and Deep
2 River.

3
4 **21) 635-004-0275**

5 **Federal Actions and Management Measures Implemented for Commercial Groundfish**
6 **Fisheries**

7 Adopted 8/2/2023: effective 8/2/2023 through 12/31/2023.

8 This amended rule adopts in-season actions previously adopted by the federal government
9 for 2023-2024 Pacific Coast Limited Entry Fixed Gear and Open Access commercial
10 groundfish fisheries, including, but not limited to, increases in sablefish, lingcod, and canary
11 rockfish trip limits.

12

9 **EXHIBIT D: 2024-2025 RECREATIONAL ANGLING REGULATION**
10 **AUTHORIZATION AND REORGANIZATION**

11 The Commission amended rules and adopted modifications to regulations for the 2024-25
12 Recreational Sport Fishing Regulations; and amended rules to provide greater spatial resolution of
