17 Expenditure Report

18 Staff: Shannon Hurn, Deputy Director for Administration

19 Shannon reported that expenditures are on track, with no significant projected budget overages or
20 shortfalls anticipated. At the close of November 30, 2023, ODFW’s unrestricted cash balance
21 finished at \$66.5 million and restricted cash came in at \$60.6 million, for a total of \$127.1 million
22 ending balance. the Governor’s Office provided additional deadlines for submitting agency policy
23 option packages, legislative concepts, and other budget adjustment information to policy advisors
24 and CFO in the schedule. The agency will begin submitting agency request budget information on
25 January 22, 2024, and will meet regularly with policy advisors and CFO analysts following that
26 submission. Public engagement on agency request budget development will need to be modified,

1 we will provide more information on the modified timelines during the February 2024 Financial
2 Report.

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16 **Adopt Temporary Rules**

17 The Commission ratify the following temporary rules. The three (3) temporary rules were
18 previously adopted by the director under his emergency action authority.

19
20 **1. 635-005-0465**

21 **Commercial Dungeness Crab Season Partial Opening**

22 Adopted 12/21/2023: effective 12/27/2023 through 3/31/2024.

23 This amended rule sets the opening date for the Oregon 2023-2024 ocean commercial Dungeness
24 crab fishery from Cape Foulweather northward to Cape Falcon and continues to delay the season
25 from Cape Falcon northward to the OR/WA border until further test fishing is conducted.

27 **2. 635-023-0101**

28 **Modify Recreational Retention Seasons for Sturgeon in Bonneville and The Dalles Pools and**
29 **Adjacent Tributaries**

30 Adopted 1/2/2024: effective 1/2/2024 through 3/31/2024.

31 This amended rule modifies the recreational retention season for white sturgeon on the mainstem
32 Columbia River in the Bonneville (Bonneville Dam upstream to The Dalles Dam) and The Dalles
33 (The Dalles Dam upstream to the John Day Dam) pools and all adjacent tributaries. Retention will
34 be allowed on Mondays, Wednesdays, and Saturdays from January 1 through February 7 in the
35 Bonneville Pool and on Mondays, Wednesdays, and Saturdays January 1 through January 29 in
36 The Dalles Pool.

38 **3. 635-023-0101**

39 **Close Retention of Sturgeon in Bonneville and The Dalles Pools and Adjacent Tributaries**

40 Adopted 1/3/2024: effective 1/4/2024 through 3/31/2024.

41 This amended rule closes the retention season for white sturgeon on the mainstem Columbia River
42 in the Bonneville Pool (Bonneville Dam upstream to The Dalles Dam) and The Dalles Pool (The
43 Dalles Dam upstream to the John Day Dam) and all adjacent tributaries.

2 agenda. Commissioner King seconded the motion, and the motion carried unanimously, six (6) in
3 favor.
