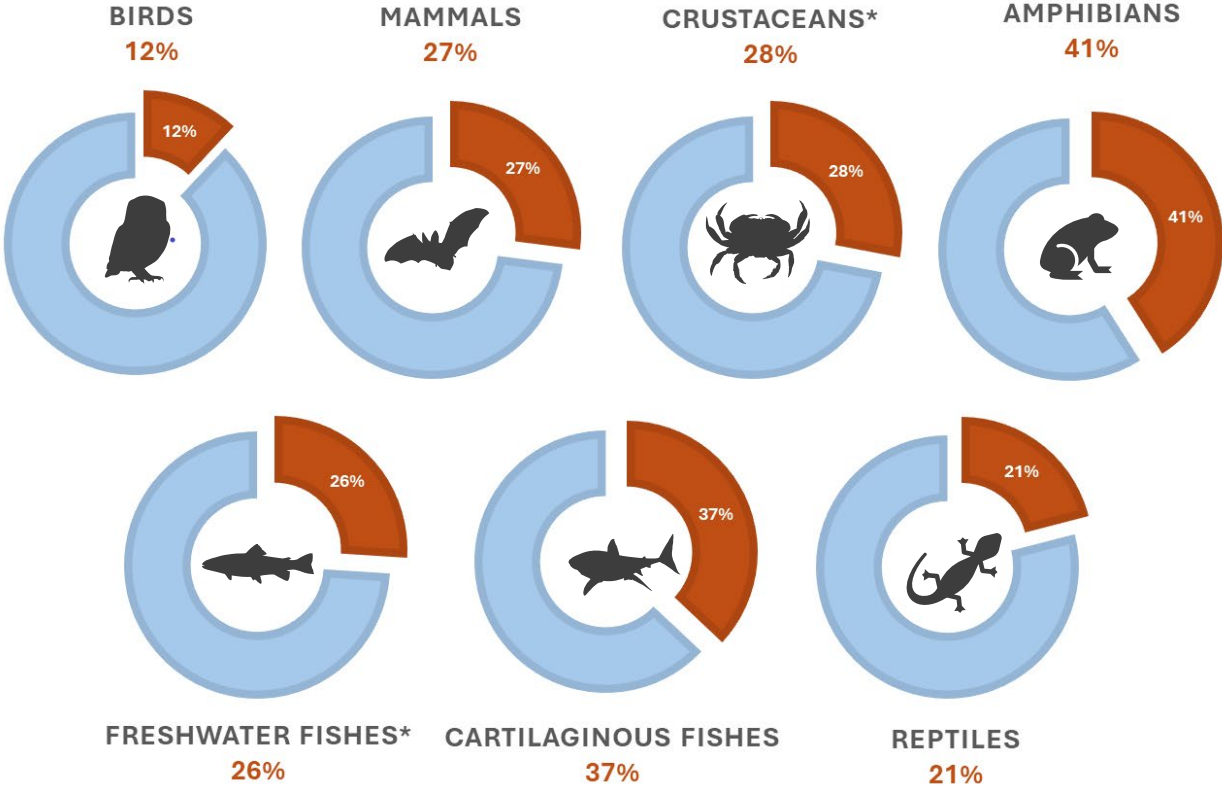

A voluntary, proactive approach to reduce future federal and state ESA listings

-  Maintain healthy fish and wildlife populations by maintaining and restoring functioning habitats
-  Prevent declines of at-risk species
-  Reverse declines in these resources where possible

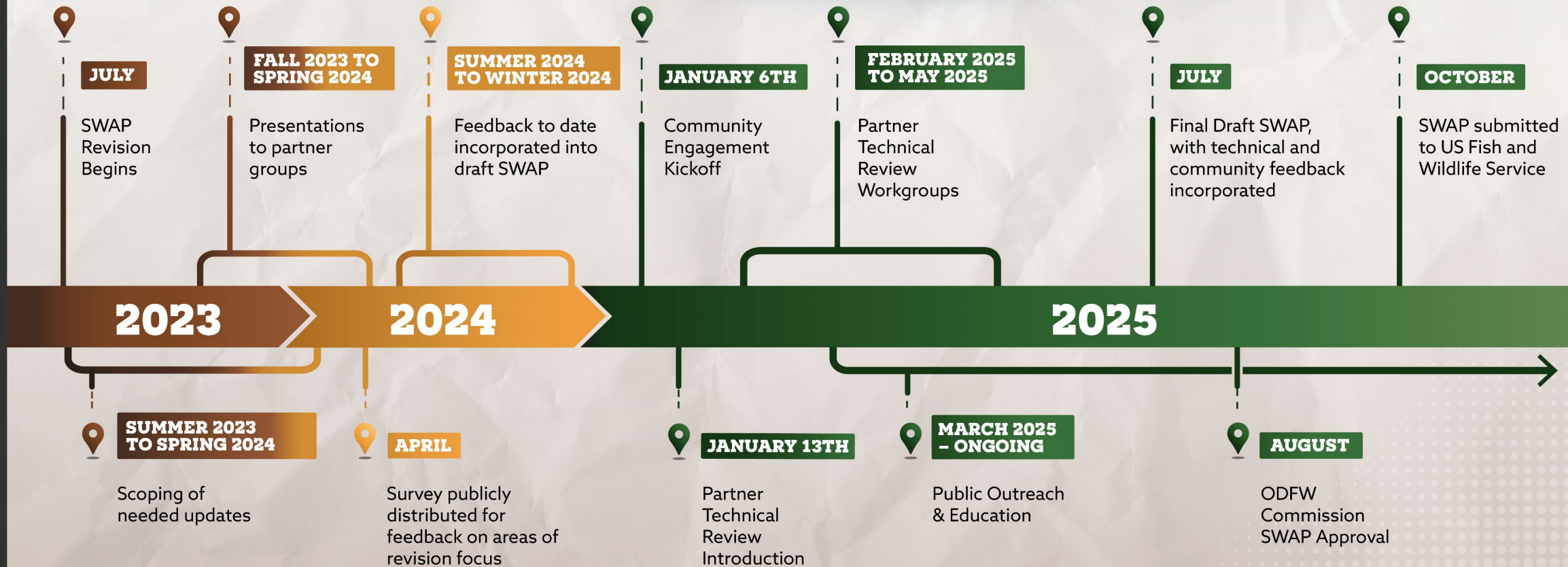

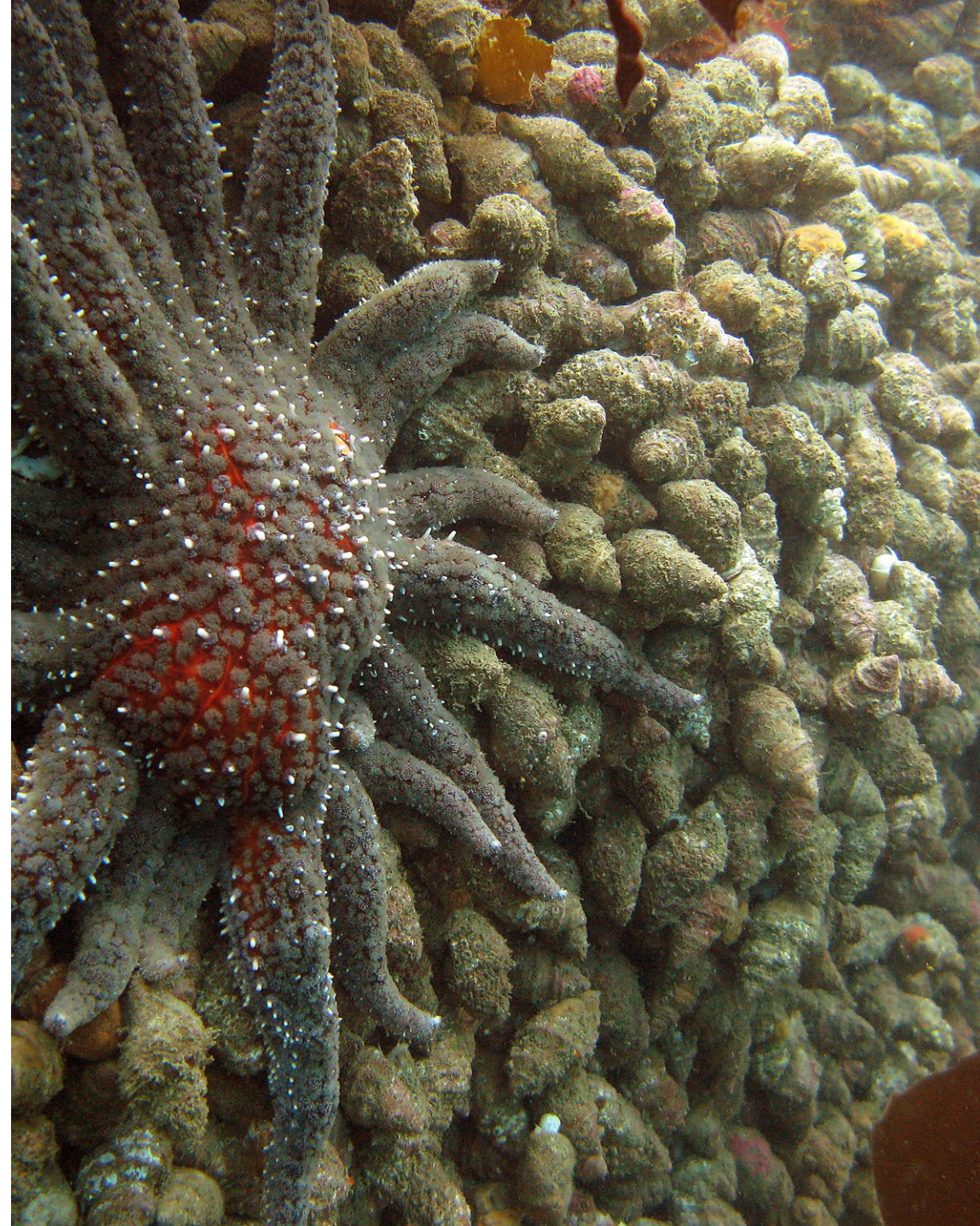

SWAP Species

SGCN

- **Species of Greatest Conservation Need (Strategy Species)**
- Imperiled conservation status

SGIN

- **Species of Greatest Information Need (Data Gap Species)**
- Not enough information to determine status

Other

- **Additional species of conservation interest in SWAP**

SGCN Criteria, Simplified

Vulnerable to threats due to life history traits or ecological characteristics

Population low or declining

Restricted Distribution

Population impacted by major threats, e.g. disease, invasive species, climate change



SGCN and SGIN Outcomes

 660* species groups assessed

 76 SGCN added

 28 SGCN removed

 101 SGIN identified

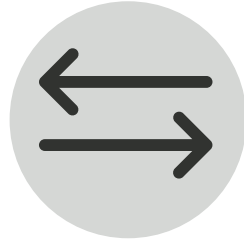

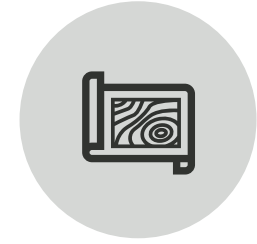
