Title: Hunter Education Junior Instructor

Description of Duties & Activities:

As a Hunter Education Junior Instructor, you will observe and help with classroom and field day logistics. Under supervision of a Certified Hunter Education Instructor, teach Hunter Education curriculum and field day activities.

Class Support:

- Manage registration/check-in process.
- Greet and direct students and volunteers as needed.
- Help set up/tear down materials and equipment.
- Grade student exams.

- Instruct students on hunter education curriculum including field day activities under the supervision of Certified Hunter Education Instructor.

Other:

- Report your volunteer hours.
- Represent ODFW at events such as Sports shows.

Physical Demands:

Walking, sitting, reaching, repetitive motion, kneeling, reaching out, bending, carrying. Inside/outside, all types of weather conditions, uneven ground. Classroom and field environment.

Preferred Knowledge and Skills:

Experience with:

- Safe use of lawful hunting weapons.

Knowledge of:

- Oregon hunting regulations, license requirements and on-line resources.
- Different learning styles.

Ability to:

- Understand and demonstrate safety protocols.

Skills:

- Effective Communication.

Equipment to be used:

Firearms, throwers, computers, projectors

Restrictions:

Volunteer Hunter Education Instructors may not have one-on-one interactions with persons under 18 years of age, elderly persons or persons with disabilities. Junior instructors may not drive.
