Joint State Action

On September 23, 2008 the states of Oregon and Washington took the following action:

Non-Indian Sport Fisheries

Mainstem Columbia River Recreational Fishery

- Effective **12:01 AM Thursday September 25, 2008**, until December 31, 2008 (or further notice) the Chinook daily bag limit will increase to two adult fish in the area from the Warrior Rock-Bachelor Island line, (located above the mouth of the Lewis River) upstream to Bonneville Dam.
- The area from the Warrior Rock-Bachelor Island line downstream to the Tongue Point-Rocky Point line will remain closed to retention of Chinook adults and jacks but will remain open for adipose fin-clipped coho and adipose fin-clipped steelhead.

All other permanent angling regulations described in the "2008 Oregon Sport Fishing Regulations Pamphlet" remain in effect.
