
Columbia River Fishery Notice

Oregon Department of Fish and Wildlife

Compact Action

The Columbia River Compact agencies of Oregon and Washington met today and took the following actions:

Non-Indian Fisheries

Commercial Mainstem Winter Salmon Fishery

- Adopted a non-Indian commercial season as follows:

Season:	1 PM to 11 PM Tuesday April 7, 2009 (10 hours)
Area:	Zones 4 and 5. Hayden Island powerlines (west towers) upstream to the upper commercial fishing deadline at Beacon Rock.
Sanctuaries:	Sandy and Washougal River sanctuaries will be in effect.
Gear:	Drift nets only. 4¼-inch maximum mesh size restriction during tangle net fishery. Use of monofilament nets is prohibited. Net length not to exceed 150 fathoms. Net length can increase from 150 to 175 fathoms for tangle nets constructed with a optional steelhead excluder. Legal excluding devices include a mesh panel hung between the cork line and the tangle net mesh. The excluder panel must be a minimum of 5 feet in depth and not exceed 10 feet in depth with a 12-inch minimum mesh size. Monofilament mesh is allowed for the excluder panel. Use of weedlines or droppers, used in smelt bobber nets, are also legal excluding devices. Weedlines or droppers must extend a minimum of five feet above the tangle net mesh.
Allowable Sales:	Adipose fin-clipped Chinook salmon, white sturgeon measuring 43-54 inches in fork length, and shad.
Participants:	Columbia River commercial fishers with appropriate licenses and legal gear that have attended and completed the required state-sponsored workshop concerning live capture commercial fishing techniques.
Multiple Net Rule:	Nets not specifically authorized for use in this fishery may be onboard the vessel if properly stored. A properly stored net is defined as a net on a drum that is fully covered by a tarp (canvas or plastic) and bound with a minimum of ten revolutions of rope with a diameter of 3/8 (0.375) inches or greater. Other permanent gear regulations remain in effect.
Miscellaneous Regulations:	Owners or operators of commercial fishing vessels must cooperate with Department observers or observers collecting data for the Department, when notified by the observer of their intent to board the commercial vessel for observation and sampling during an open fishery. Soak times, defined as time elapsed from when the first mesh enters the water to when the last mesh leaves the water, must not exceed 45 minutes. Lighted buoys are required at both ends of nets fished between sunset and sunrise unless the net is attached to the boat then one lighted buoy on the opposite end of the net is required.

Red corks are required at 25 fathom intervals and red corks must be in contrast to the corks used in the remainder of the net. Two red corks are required on each end of tangle nets constructed with a steelhead excluder panel, weedlines, or droppers.

Use of recovery boxes is required on all lethargic or bleeding steelhead and all lethargic or bleeding non-adipose fin-clipped salmon.

Each vessel participating in this fishery is required to have two operable recovery boxes or one box with two chambers. Operable recovery boxes require a flow of 16-20 gallons per minute to each chamber of the box(es). Each box must be operating during any time that the net is being retrieved or picked.

24-hour Quick Reporting Rule in effect for Washington buyers.

Select Area Commercial Fisheries

Deep River Fishery (Zone 80)

- Open waters in Deep River up to the Highway 4 Bridge are under concurrent Oregon and Washington jurisdiction.
- **Modified** the previously adopted winter commercial salmon seasons as follows. Modifications in **bold**.

Winter Season

Open 7 PM to 7 AM (12 hours) nightly during the following weeks:

Monday February 16 – Tuesday February 17	(1 night)
Monday February 23 – Tuesday February 24	(1 night)
Monday March 2 – Tuesday March 3	(1 night)
Monday March 9 – Tuesday March 10	(1 night)
Monday March 16 – Tuesday March 17	(1 night)
Monday March 23 – Tuesday March 24	(1 night)
Monday March 30 – Tuesday March 31	(1 night)
Wednesday April 8 – Thursday April 9	(1 night)

Area, gear, allowable sales, and miscellaneous regulations presented in the February 11, 2009 Compact Action Notice remain unchanged.
