## Compact Action

The Columbia River Compact agencies of Oregon and Washington met and took the following actions in concurrent OR/WA jurisdiction waters and by the state of Oregon or Washington in state waters:

### Non-Indian Fisheries

#### ***Select Area Commercial Fisheries***

- Effective 7 PM, Tuesday May 18, 2010 the retention of white sturgeon is prohibited in the Youngs Bay, Blind Slough/Knappa Slough, Tongue Point/South Channel, and Deep River Select Area spring commercial fisheries.

#### ***Deep River Commercial Fishery***

- Effective 7 PM, Wednesday May 19, 2010 fishers are required to phone 360-795-0319 within one hour after the closing of a nightly fishing period to notify staff of any landed catch. Fishers will make arrangements with agency staff to have the catch biologically sampled. After sampling, fishers will be issued a transportation permit by agency staff. A sampling station will be established at the boat ramp off of Miller Point on the east bank of Deep River Slough. The 24-hour Quick Reporting rule remains in effect.

### Treaty Indian Fisheries

#### ***Platform and Hook and Line Fisheries***

- The sale of fish caught in the platform and hook-and-line fisheries downstream of Bonneville Dam conducted under agreements with the states of Oregon and Washington by the Yakama, Umatilla and Warm Springs Tribes will be prohibited from 6 PM Wednesday May 19, 2010 through 6 AM Wednesday June 16, 2010.

### **FUTURE MEETINGS**

- No Compact/Joint State hearings have been scheduled at this time. The Joint Staff will continue to monitor progress of the spring Chinook run and provide updates and schedule hearings as needed.
