Joint State Action

In joint Oregon and Washington state action the states discussed the following mainstem Columbia non-Indian recreational fisheries and took the following actions:

Buoy 10 Salmon Fishery

- No action taken.
- The retention of Chinook salmon will close as scheduled effective Tuesday September 4, 2012 in the mainstem Columbia River from Buoy 10 upstream to the Tongue Point/Rocky Point line (Buoy 10 upstream to a line projected from Rocky Point on the WA shore through red buoy #44 to the navigation light at Tongue Point).
- Retention of adipose fin-clipped coho and adipose fin-clipped steelhead is allowed through December 31 under permanent regulations.
