Compact Action

The Columbia River Compact agencies of Oregon and Washington met today and took the following actions:

Non-Indian Fisheries

Mainstem Columbia River Summer Chinook Commercial Fishery

- Adopted a season as follows:

Season:	9:00 PM Monday July 11 to 5:00 AM Tuesday July 12, 2016 (8 hours)
Area:	Zones 1-5
Sanctuaries:	Elokomin-A, Cowlitz River, Kalama-A, Lewis-A, Washougal, and Sandy River sanctuaries in effect.
Gear:	Drift gill nets. 8-inch minimum mesh size. Nets not specifically authorized for use in this fishery may be onboard the vessel if properly stored. A properly stored net is defined as a net on a drum that is fully covered by a tarp (canvas or plastic) and bound with a minimum of ten revolutions of rope with a diameter of 3/8 (0.375) inches or greater.
Allowable Sales:	Chinook, sockeye, and shad.
Washington Reporting Rule:	Oregon buyers are required to submit fish receiving tickets electronically pursuant to OAR 635-006-0210. 24-hour quick reporting will be required for Washington wholesale dealers, per WAC 220-69-240.

Treaty Indian Fisheries

Allowed commercial sales of fish landed in the following **modified** fishery. Modification in **bold**:

Summer Commercial Gillnet Fishery

- The mesh restriction in the previously adopted fishing period is **removed** effective 6:00 AM Monday July 11 to 6:00 PM Thursday July 14, 2016. There will be no mesh size restriction on gillnets during this time period.
- All other regulations (including area, sanctuaries, allowable sales, and Washington Reporting Rule) as previously adopted on June 30, 2016 remain in effect.

Select Area Fisheries

- Adopted fishing periods by Compact action in concurrent OR/WA jurisdiction waters and by the state of Oregon or Washington in state waters.

Blind Slough (Zone 74) and Knappa Slough (Zone 73) Commercial Salmon Fishery

- Season: 7 PM Thursday July 7 – 7 AM Friday July 8, 2016 (12 hours)
7 PM Tuesday July 12 – 7 AM Wednesday July 13, 2016 (12 hours)
- Area: Blind Slough and Knappa Slough areas are open.
In Blind Slough, open waters extend from markers at the mouth of Blind Slough upstream to markers at the mouth of Gnat Creek which is located approximately ½ mile upstream of the county road bridge.
In Knappa Slough, open water are bounded by a line from the northerly most marker at the mouth of Blind Slough westerly to a marker on Karlson Island downstream to boundary lines defined by markers on the west end of Minaker Island to markers on Karlson Island and the Oregon shore (fall boundary).
- Gear: Nets restricted to 100 fathoms in length with no weight restriction on headline. Use of additional weights and/or anchors attached directly to the headline is allowed.

Tongue Point/South Channel Commercial Salmon Fishery (Zone 71)

- Season: 7 PM Thursday July 7 – 7 AM Friday July 8 (12 hours)
7 PM Tuesday July 12 – 7 AM Wednesday July 13 (12 hours)
- Area:
Tongue Point: The spring season Tongue Point fishing area includes all waters bounded by a line extended from the upstream (southernmost) pier (#1) at the Tongue Point Job Corps facility through navigation marker #6 to Mott Island, a line from a marker at the southeast end of Mott Island northeasterly to a marker on the northwest tip of Lois Island, and a line from a marker on the southwest end of Lois Island westerly to a marker on the Oregon shore.
- South Channel: The South Channel area includes all waters bounded by a line from a marker on John Day Point to a marker on the southwest end of Lois Island upstream to an upper boundary line from a marker on Settler Point northwesterly to the flashing red USCG marker #10, northwesterly to a marker on the eastern tip of Burnside Island defining the upstream terminus of South Channel.
- Gear: In the Tongue Point fishing area, gear restricted to a maximum net length of 250 fathoms and weight not to exceed two pounds on any one fathom.
In the South Channel fishing area, gear restricted to a maximum net length of 250 fathoms and no weight restriction on headline. Use of additional weights and/or anchors attached directly to the headline is allowed.

- **The following Gear, Allowable Sales and Reporting Rules applies to all Select Area commercial seasons adopted above.**

Gear: 9¾-inch maximum mesh size restriction is in effect.
 Nets not specifically authorized for use in these areas may be onboard a vessel if properly stored. A properly stored net is defined as a net on a drum that is fully covered by a tarp (canvas or plastic) and bound with a minimum of ten revolutions of rope with a diameter of 3/8 (0.375) inches or greater.

Allowable Sales: Salmon and shad. Retention and sale of sturgeon is prohibited.

Reporting Rules: Oregon buyers are required to submit fish receiving tickets electronically pursuant to OAR 635-006-210.
 24-hour quick reporting will be required for Washington wholesale dealers, per WAC 220-69-240.

- All other regulations (including gear, transportation, lighted buoys, and reporting rules) as previously adopted on January 27, 2016 remain in effect.

FUTURE MEETINGS

- No Compact/Joint State hearings have been scheduled at this time. The Joint Staff will schedule additional hearings as needed.
