Oregon State Action

The state of Oregon took the following action:

Adopted the following fishery:

Lower Willamette White Sturgeon Recreational Fishery

Season: Saturday June 12, 2021 and Saturday June 19, 2021 2 days

Area: Lower Willamette River from Lake Oswego-Oak Grove Railroad Bridge

downstream to mouth, including Multnomah Channel (and Scappoose

Bay).

The sturgeon spawning sanctuary (Willamette Falls downstream to the Lake Oswego-Oak Grove Railroad Bridge) and the Gilbert River remain

closed to sturgeon angling.

Allowable

Up to 740 white sturgeon.

Catch: Legal size: 44-inch minimum and 50-inch maximum fork length.

(Fork length is measured in a straight line from the tip of the nose to the fork in the caudal fin (tail) with the fish laying on its side on a flat surface,

with the tape measure/ruler positioned flat under the fish).

The daily bag limit is one white sturgeon. The annual bag limit is two fish.

Retention of green sturgeon is prohibited.

Additional

On days open to white sturgeon retention, angling for sturgeon (including

Regulations: catch and release) is prohibited after 6 PM.

Catch limits and other restrictions in the 2021 Oregon Sport Fishing Regulations pamphlet remain in effect the entire year.
