Joint State Action

The states of Oregon and Washington discussed the following recreational fisheries and took the following actions:

Mainstem Columbia River Recreational Fishery

Warrior Rock/Bachelor Island upstream to Bonneville Dam

- Effective Saturday September 11, 2021 retention of salmon is allowed in the mainstem Columbia River from the Warrior Rock/Bachelor Island line upstream to the Bonneville Dam angling deadlines, except that Camas Slough remains closed to angling for, and retention of salmon and steelhead through September 30. Daily adult bag limit is two salmon (Chinook and coho only), only one of which may be a Chinook. Only hatchery coho may be retained. All steelhead must be released through October 31.
- Camas Slough: defined as the waters of the Columbia River north of Lady Island between a line projected northerly from the western (downstream) end of Lady Island to the Washington shore and the Highway 14 Bridge on the eastern (upstream) end of Lady Island.
