Joint State Action

The states of Oregon and Washington discussed the following recreational fisheries and took the following actions:

Mainstem Columbia River Recreational Spring Chinook Fisheries

- Adopted the following fishery:

Downstream of Bonneville Dam

Dates: Thursday May 25 through Sunday June 4, 2023 (11 days)

Area: Tongue Point/Rocky Point line upstream to Beacon Rock (boat and bank) plus bank angling only from Beacon Rock upstream to the Bonneville Dam deadline.

Legal upstream boat boundary defined as: a deadline marker on the Oregon bank (approximately four miles downstream from Bonneville Dam Powerhouse One) in a straight line through the western tip of Pierce Island to a deadline marker on the Washington bank at Beacon Rock.

Catch Limits: Two adult hatchery salmonids (Chinook or steelhead only) per day, only one of which may be a Chinook.

- Previously adopted temporary rules regarding salmonid bag limits in Select Area recreational fisheries on days when the mainstem Columbia River is open for salmon fishing remain in effect.
