Joint State Action

The states of Oregon and Washington discussed the following recreational fisheries and took the following action:

Mainstem Columbia River Recreational Fisheries

Downstream of Bonneville Dam

- Effective Friday June 28, 2024 retention of sockeye is prohibited in the mainstem Columbia River from the Astoria/Megler Bridge upstream to Bonneville Dam. Through July 31, the daily adult bag limit is one hatchery steelhead.

Bonneville Dam to the Highway 395 Bridge (near Pasco, WA)

- Effective Friday June 28, 2024 retention of sockeye is prohibited in the mainstem Columbia River from Bonneville Dam upstream to the Highway 395 Bridge (near Pasco, WA). The daily adult bag limit is two hatchery salmonids through June 30, but only one may be a hatchery steelhead. Effective July 1 through July 31, the daily adult bag limit is one hatchery steelhead.

All previously adopted regulations, including permanent regulations remain in effect.
