1. The number of youth engaged in the fish propagation project remains stable or increases annually. This will be measured by the Neighbors for Kids program and reported to the Depoe Bay Salmon Enhancement Commission.
2. The number of community members involved in the Depoe Bay STEP project remains stable or increases over time. This will be measured by the DBSEC through membership efforts, participating in the care and fin-clipping of the juvenile Coho salmon

Current Situation/Justification

Please describe the current situation and explain why this funding is needed.

Current access to the floating net pens at North Depoe Bay Reservoir is unsafe due to structural failure. The net pens themselves are also unsafe due to age, type of construction, and lack of adequate rail height.

Primarily, the unsafe structures are a hazard for the STEP volunteers and prohibit NFK youth access to the net pen. This unsafe situation inhibits the educational aspect of Depoe Bay STEP - NFK program.

The replacement costs of these structures are beyond the financial reach of the Depoe Bay Salmon Enhancement Commission. DBSEC is the volunteer group that operates the STEP program in Depoe Bay.

Recreation and Commercial Benefit

fisheries management.

Increase in available fin-clipped Coho to private sport boat and local charter boat companies produces a direct positive effect to the local economy. The higher the probability of success of catching a salmon directly increases the number of present and future anglers.

The proposed project will not change fisheries management policies. Current Depoe Bay STEP project has existed for the past 34 years with no change in production or management direction.

City policies for public access to the site will not change. For the last 34 years, the City of Depoe Bay has granted public access to this site for all STEP projects, including incubation at the hatch boxes, feeding at the net pens, community volunteer fin-clipping, youth field trips and stream inventories.

Public access to the STEP project site at the city water reservoir is controlled by locked gates. The public is granted access if they are under the supervision of STEP volunteers, city workers, or are approved by the city superintendent. The intent of this controlled access is to protect the city water supply and prevent vandalism to water intakes and sluice gates. The city access policy is not expected to change.

Project Design and Description

Please describe in detail the methods or approach that will be used to achieve the project objectives.

The City of Depoe Bay is planning to perform reservoir maintenance this year. Removal of the existing unsafe access structure to the STEP net pens is required to perform the maintenance. This is an opportune time to improve access safety as well as safety at the net pens.

Part of the R&E grant proposal is to replace the unsafe access structures to the net pen with a floating dock.

The design incorporates an option of having the net pen attached on either side of the access floats. This right or left option allows for a moderate relocation of the pen if water quality or water exit flow presents problems.

The proposed plan is for an F-shaped configuration for the docks and net pen.

The vertical portion of the F shape is the access to the net pen. This includes an aluminum ramp, leading to 3 sections of dock, the far end attached to the present water intake structure.

The horizontal portions of the F are two 6'x 12' docks attached to the access docks. This will form three sides of the 12' x12' net pen area.

A 2-inch aluminum pipe will cross the open side of the F. This will support the fourth side of the net pen net. This configuration will aid in drawing up the net to retrieve fish during fin-clipping.

This configuration reduces the cost of the project by eliminating the need for an additional dock to surround the net pen.

Railings of adequate height will surround all sides of the docks and pen to improve safety. The railings are a necessary component with the participation from the Neighbors for Kids program.

Signage describing the Depoe Bay STEP program, life cycles of salmon, and safety procedures will be attached to the new docks and pen.

The dock structures are to be built in accordance with all environmental requirements. This will

be ensured through the permitting process (state, county and city) and is also an objective of the project.

Ken's Floation Service is doing the design and construction. They are also going to do the haul-in and assembly onsite. The chairman of the Depoe Bay Salmon Enhancement Commission will coordinate the overall project.

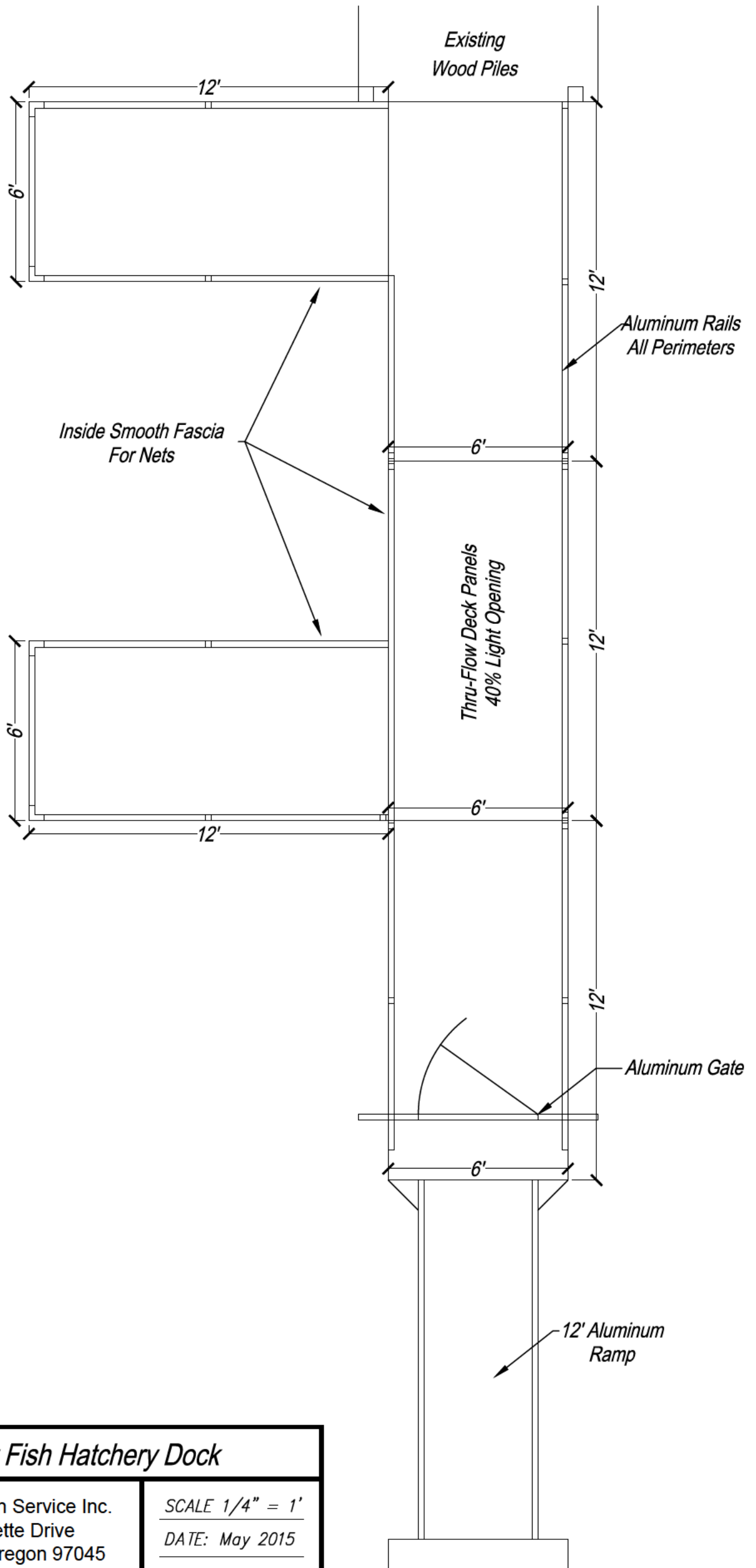
Site Location

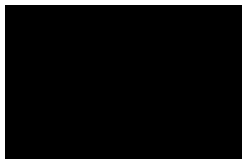

ACCESS AGREEMENT

This Agreement is entered into this 15th day of May, 2011, by and between the City of Depoe Bay, hereinafter called **Grantor** and the State of Oregon, acting by and through its Department of Fish and Wildlife, hereinafter called **Department**.

Whereas Grantor owns certain real property described in the attached Exhibit A and,

Whereas the Department wishes to authorize a Salmon and Trout Enhancement Program (STEP) project at a project site which is located on that property described in the attached Exhibit A. The STEP program is described at <http://www.dfw.state.or.us/STEP/>.

In consideration for this agreement, grantor shall be allowed to receive the benefits of the STEP project in exchange for the access conferred by this agreement.

Terms and Conditions of this Agreement

1. Grantor herein grants the Department and its representatives access to the project site, which is located on that property described in Exhibit A for the purposes of operating a STEP project.
2. Grantor reserves the right to use the property described in Exhibit A for any and all purposes which do not preclude, restrict, or interfere with the purpose of this Agreement. With prior notice, the Department will agree to access adjustments to accommodate the primary uses of the land (e.g. residential, farm use).
3. This Agreement is for the term of five (5) years beginning on the 1st day of June, 2012 and ending on the 1st day of June, 2017 or until such time as the STEP project is terminated by the Department, whichever occurs first. If the project is terminated prior to the expiration date, access for the Department and its representatives will remain in effect for as long as fish or eggs under artificial propagation remain on the project site. The Department will inform the City of Depoe Bay of its plan for removing fish, eggs, and all improvements at the time the project is cancelled.
4. Either party may terminate this Agreement by providing written notice 120 days in advance to the other party. Upon termination, all rights and obligations of the Department to use the City of Depoe Bay property will cease. If the project is terminated, access for the Department and its representatives will remain in effect for as long as fish or eggs under artificial propagation remain on the project site. The Department will inform the City of Depoe Bay of its plan for removing fish, eggs, and all improvements at the time the project is cancelled.

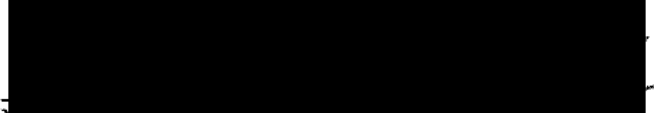

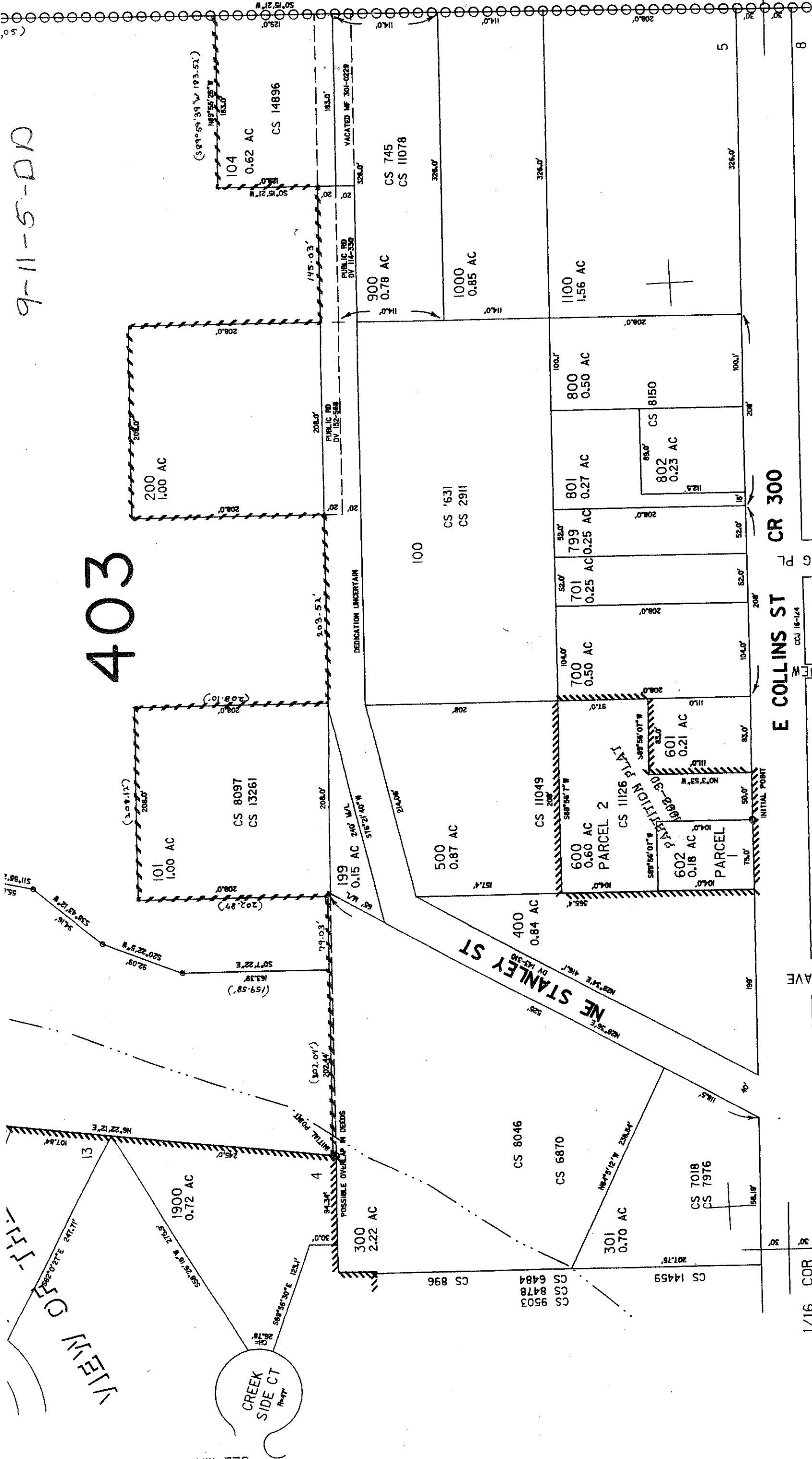
