## **EXECUTIVE SUMMARY**

### **INTRODUCTION AND METHODOLOGY**

This study was conducted for the Oregon Department of Fish and Wildlife (ODFW) to determine licensed anglers' participation in fishing in Oregon, their motivations for fishing and constraints to fishing participation, and their opinions on various fishing regulations and fisheries management strategies. The study entailed a telephone survey of Oregon residents who had purchased an annual Oregon fishing license from December 2005 to September 2006 and who had fished at least once in the previous 12 months (hereinafter referred to as "active Oregon licensed anglers"). Daily license holders were not surveyed because annually licensed resident anglers are considered the ODFW's core constituency.

For the survey, telephones were selected as the preferred sampling medium because of the universality of telephone ownership. The telephone survey questionnaire was developed cooperatively by Responsive Management and the ODFW (Appendix A). Responsive Management conducted a pre-test of the questionnaire, and revisions were made to the questionnaire based on the pre-test. Interviews were conducted Monday through Friday from 9:00 a.m. to 9:00 p.m., Saturday noon to 5:00 p.m., and Sunday from 5:00 p.m. to 9:00 p.m., local time. The survey was conducted in November 2006. Responsive Management obtained a total of 1,501 completed interviews. The software used for data collection was Questionnaire Programming Language 4.1.

The analysis of data was performed using Statistical Package for the Social Sciences software as well as proprietary software developed by Responsive Management. The results were weighted so that the proportions of the sample among the eastern and western regions matched the distribution of the population statewide. Throughout this report, findings of the telephone survey are reported at a 95% confidence interval. For the entire sample of Oregon licensed anglers (including non-active anglers), the sampling error is at most plus or minus 2.18 percentage points.

**OVERALL FISHING PARTICIPATION**

- The survey was to be administered to Oregon annually licensed anglers who had been fishing in the previous 12 months. Therefore, this question was asked of Oregon annually licensed anglers (those who had purchased a license from December 2005 to September 2006) to determine who should continue with the full survey: 77% of Oregon annually licensed anglers had been fishing in the previous 12 months and got the rest of the survey (referred to as active Oregon licensed anglers); 23% were non-active licensed anglers and were not given the full survey.

**SPECIES FISHED**

- Nearly two-thirds of active Oregon anglers consider themselves to be primarily coldwater anglers (64% gave this answer), while only 18% consider themselves to be primarily warmwater anglers; meanwhile, 15% consider themselves to be equally a warmwater and coldwater angler.
- The most popular fish sought in Oregon is resident trout/kokanee (73% fished for this species in Oregon in the past 12 months), distantly followed by salmon in freshwater (33%), steelhead (30%), and warmwater game fish (26%).
- Rainbow trout (preferred by 69% of trout anglers) is the most preferred type of trout among trout anglers, distantly followed by brown trout (23%).
- Although most trout anglers (60%) say that they have no preference regarding fishing for hatchery trout versus wild trout, the percentage who prefer wild trout (34%) far exceeds the percentage who prefer hatchery trout (5%).
- Bass (smallmouth or largemouth) (preferred by 77% of warmwater game fish anglers) is the most preferred warmwater game fish, followed by crappie (40%).

- Nearly half of active Oregon anglers (45%) purchased a combined salmon/steelhead/sturgeon/halibut tag in 2005. Of those who purchased the combined tag, nearly half (46% of purchasers) indicated that they turned it in.

## **METHODS OF FISHING**

- A majority of trout anglers (54%) prefer to use multiple baits and gear types. Otherwise, those who prefer bait only (21%) exceed those who prefer flies only (16%) or lures only (9%).
- A majority of warmwater game fish anglers (53%) prefer to use multiple baits and gear types. Otherwise, those who prefer lures only (21%) exceed those who prefer bait only (18%) or flies (7%).
- Trout anglers are about evenly divided between those who release and those who keep the trout they catch, although slightly more release trout than keep trout: 73% release the trout they catch at least half of the time, while 61% keep the trout at least half of the time. The percentage who mostly release (38%) exceeds the percentage who mostly keep (26%) the trout they catch. In a related question, more trout anglers say that releasing a trout makes fishing more enjoyable (41%) than say doing so makes trout fishing less enjoyable (12%). Most commonly, they say releasing has no effect on enjoyment (42%).
- Warmwater game fish anglers more often release than keep the warmwater game fish they catch: 79% release the warmwater game fish they catch at least half of the time, while 52% keep the warmwater game fish at least half of the time. The percentage who mostly release (47%) is more than double the percentage who mostly keep (20%) the warmwater game fish they catch (32% equally release and keep). More warmwater game fish anglers say that releasing warmwater game fish makes fishing more enjoyable (42%) than say it makes fishing less enjoyable (8%); most commonly, they say it has no effect (48%) on their enjoyment of warmwater game fish angling.

## **DAYS PARTICIPATED IN FISHING**

- Some of the conclusions that can be drawn from the analysis of days fished include:
  - Regarding saltwater fishing, there is slightly more avidity (measured in the number of days fishing) among anglers fishing for salmon in bays and estuaries than among anglers fishing for salmon in the ocean or other marine fish in bays and estuaries.
  - In freshwater, the most avidity (measured in the number of days fishing) is for salmon, steelhead, and trout. On the other hand, avidity is markedly lower for shad and sturgeon.
  - Of the different types of trout, the most avidity (measured in the number of days fishing) is for bull trout, rainbow trout, and cutthroat trout.
  - Of the different types of warmwater game fish, avidity (measured in the number of days fishing) is highest for bass and walleye.
  - Most trout fishing is in lakes or reservoirs rather than streams or rivers; three types of trout in particular are most often fished from lakes and reservoirs: rainbow trout, lake trout, and kokanee.
  - Except for walleye, most warmwater game fishing is done in lakes or reservoirs.

## **TRENDS IN FISHING PARTICIPATION**

- More trout anglers say that their level of trout fishing participation has decreased over the past 5 years (38%) than say it has increased (26%); 35% say it has remained the same.
- Most commonly, warmwater game fish anglers say that their level of fishing activity in the past 5 years has remained the same (44%); otherwise, they are evenly split between those saying it has increased (27%) and those saying it has decreased (also 27%).

## **LOCATIONS FOR FISHING**

- For trout fishing, trout anglers most commonly say that they have no locational preference (e.g., rivers, lakes) (36% have no preference); otherwise, high mountain lakes (25%) and rivers (24%) are the most popular trout fishing locations.

- For warmwater game fish, anglers most commonly say that they have no locational preference (40%); otherwise, lakes (21%) and rivers (18%) are preferred over reservoirs (12%) or ponds (8%).
- Most commonly, trout anglers say that they usually fish for trout from the bank (45%), but a substantial percentage (38%) say that they usually fish for trout from a boat. Conversely, warmwater game fish anglers most commonly say that they usually fish for these type of fish from a boat (46%), but a substantial percentage (38%) say that they usually fish from the bank.

### **AMOUNT OF TIME TYPICALLY SPENT FISHING**

- Trout anglers are almost evenly distributed into three groups regarding how long they usually fish for trout: 35% usually fish a few hours a day, 36% usually fish all day, and 28% usually take overnight trips to fish for trout.
- Warmwater game fish anglers most commonly fish for a few hours a day (19% fish for a few hours before or after work; 29% fish for a few hours on the weekend); nonetheless, half of these anglers indicate avidity of more than just a few hours: 28% usually fish all day, and 22% take overnight trips to fish.

### **PARTICIPATION IN BASS TOURNAMENTS**

- One in twenty bass anglers (5%) fished in a bass tournament in the past 12 months.

### **FISHING FROM BOATS AND FISHING WITH GUIDES**

- A low percentage of trout anglers (4%) have fished for trout from a boat with a paid guide in the past 12 months in Oregon. A smaller percentage of warmwater game fish anglers (2%) have fished for warmwater game fish from a boat with a paid guide in the past 12 months in Oregon.

- A substantial percentage of trout anglers (38%) say that they usually fish for trout from a boat, although more fish from the bank. Warmwater game fish anglers most commonly say that they usually fish for warmwater game fish from a boat (46%).

### **MOTIVATIONS FOR FISHING**

- The top motivations for fishing for trout are *not* utilitarian: for relaxation (55%), to be with family and friends (49%), and to be close to nature (39%). Nonetheless, a substantial percentage of trout anglers (37%) have a utilitarian reason to fish for trout: to catch fresh fish to eat.
- As with trout fishing, relaxation (48%), to be with family and friends (43%), and to be close to nature (33%) are important reasons for warmwater game fishing. Also similar to trout fishing, 37% of warmwater game fish anglers fish to catch fresh fish to eat.

### **SATISFACTION WITH FISHING AND RATINGS OF QUALITY OF FISHING**

- Most of those who fished for trout (74%) were satisfied with their trout fishing in Oregon in the past 12 months; 22% were dissatisfied.
- Most of those who fished for warmwater game fish (75%) were satisfied with those fishing experiences in Oregon in the past 12 months; 17% were dissatisfied.
- Most of those who fished for trout (58%) rate the current quality of trout fishing in Oregon as excellent or good, while 39% rate it fair or poor. In a related question, the majority of trout anglers (58%) say their level of satisfaction with trout fishing has remained the same over the past 5 years; otherwise, the percentage saying that their satisfaction has decreased (22%) slightly exceeds the percentage saying that their satisfaction has increased (18%).
- Most of those who fished for warmwater game fish (58%) rate the current quality of warmwater game fishing in Oregon as excellent or good, while 37% rate it fair or poor. In a related question, the majority of warmwater game fish anglers (62%) say their level of satisfaction with warmwater game fishing has remained the same over the past 5 years;

otherwise, the percentage saying that their satisfaction has decreased (20%) slightly exceeds the percentage saying that their satisfaction has increased (17%).

- Regarding stocked trout, an overwhelming majority of trout anglers (82%) agree that stocked trout improve the quality of trout fishing in Oregon.
- Catch-and-release does not appear to negatively affect enjoyment of fishing and may even enhance enjoyment. More trout anglers say that releasing a trout makes fishing more enjoyable (41%) than say doing so makes trout fishing less enjoyable (12%). Most commonly, they say releasing has no effect on enjoyment (42%). Likewise, more warmwater game fish anglers say that releasing warmwater game fish makes fishing more enjoyable (42%) than say it makes fishing less enjoyable (8%); most commonly, they say it has no effect (48%) on their enjoyment of warmwater game fish angling.
- Regarding the length a fish has to be to be considered a quality fish: walleye and catfish have the largest size to be considered quality; crappie and panfish have the smallest quality size.
  - The survey asked trout anglers what they felt was the minimum length for a trout to be considered a quality trout. At 12 inches, 75% of trout anglers consider it to be a quality trout; at 10 inches, 43% consider it to be a quality trout.
  - Regarding bass, at 12 inches, 65% of bass anglers consider it to be a quality bass; at 10 inches, only 27% consider it to be a quality bass.
  - Regarding crappie, at 10 inches, 82% of crappie anglers consider it to be a quality crappie; at 8 inches, 54% consider it to be a quality crappie.
  - Regarding panfish, at 8 inches, 73% of panfish anglers consider it to be a quality panfish; at 6 inches, 34% consider it to be a quality panfish.
  - Regarding catfish, at 14 inches, 59% of catfish anglers consider it to be a quality catfish; at 12 inches, 44% consider it to be a quality catfish.
  - Regarding walleye, at 15 inches, 57% of walleye anglers consider it to be a quality walleye; at 12 inches, only 27% consider it to be a quality walleye.

- Regarding warmwater game fish, at 12 inches, 78% of warmwater game fish anglers consider it to be a quality fish; at 10 inches, 37% consider it to be a quality fish.

## **CONSTRAINTS TO FISHING PARTICIPATION AND DISSATISFACTIONS WITH FISHING**

- Those who were screened out of the survey because they had not fished in Oregon in the 12 months previous to the survey (i.e., inactive Oregon licensed anglers) were first asked why they had not fished in the previous 12 months. Time was, by far, the most important constraint, with age/health as a minor, but important, constraint. Of those who said that time was a constraint, work obligations were the most typical reason that time was a constraint.
- Among active trout anglers, lack of time (17%) is the most important constraint to participation and/or enjoyment of trout fishing, followed by not catching enough fish (11%) and that the fishing areas are too crowded (7%). Note that 40% of active trout anglers indicated that nothing takes away from their enjoyment or causes them to fish less often than they would like.
- Among active warmwater game fish anglers, lack of time (15%) is the most important constraint to participation and/or enjoyment of warmwater game fishing, followed by not catching enough fish (8%) and access issues (6%). Note that 44% of warmwater game fish anglers indicated that nothing takes away from their enjoyment or causes them to fish less often than they would like.
- Catch-and-release regulations are not an important constraint to fishing participation, as a large majority of trout anglers (72%) say that catch-and-release regulations do *not* cause them to fish for trout less often (only 20% say those regulations cause them to *not* fish as often).
- The presence of stocked trout is not an important constraint to fishing participation, as an overwhelming majority of trout anglers (83%) disagree that stocked trout take away from fishing and make fishing less enjoyable.

## OPINIONS ON FISHERIES MANAGEMENT

- Three times the percentage of Oregon anglers agree (61%) than disagree (20%) that the ODFW makes a good effort to obtain input from the public about freshwater fishing regulations.
- By slightly more than 2 to 1, more Oregon anglers agree (65%) than disagree (29%) that Oregon's freshwater fishing regulations are clear and easy to understand.
  - By far, the Regulations Handbook is the most used source of information about fishing regulations and changes to them: 77% of anglers use this source, distantly followed by friends/family/word-of-mouth (34%), ODFW pamphlets (18%), sporting goods stores (17%), the ODFW website (15%), and newspapers (13%).
  - Those who disagree that Oregon's freshwater fishing regulations are clear and easy to understand commonly say that the organization of the Regulations Handbook is hard to follow (41%), that there are too many regulations (34%) and/or that they do not know if they are following all the rules (30%), and/or that the language is too technical (26%).
- There is more support (61%) than opposition (23%) for additional freshwater fishing regulations if the regulations assist the ODFW in *maintaining current* freshwater fishing opportunities. Support grows when the stipulation is that the additional freshwater fishing regulations would assist the ODFW in providing *additional* freshwater fishing opportunities: 65% support additional regulations for this goal, while only 19% oppose.
- Most commonly, trout anglers think that catch-and-release regulations for wild trout should depend on the health of the wild trout population (38% gave this answer), followed closely by those thinking that releasing wild trout is necessary in some locations to maintain fishing opportunities (25%). In looking at a sum, a majority of trout anglers (77%) are amenable to regulations that require catch-and-release of wild trout in certain situations (regulations should require that *all* wild trout be released, releasing wild trout should depend on the health of the population, or releasing wild trout is necessary in some locations to maintain fishing opportunities).

- A large majority of trout anglers (72%) say that catch-and-release regulations do *not* cause them to fish for trout less often; however, 20% say those regulations do cause them to *not* fish as often.
  
  - A majority of bass anglers (65%) support catch-and-release regulations for bass on specific bodies of water for the purpose of developing a trophy bass fishery; 24% oppose.
  
  - In general, trout stocking efforts are supported by a majority of trout anglers.
    - It is nearly universally agreed (93% of trout anglers strongly or moderately agree) that stocked trout increase trout fishing opportunities.
    - An overwhelming majority of trout anglers (82%) agree that stocked trout improve the quality of trout fishing in Oregon.
    - When asked directly about future approaches to stocking trout, majorities of trout anglers agree that the ODFW should stock trout in more locations (62%), that the ODFW should stock more trout in its current stocking locations (56%), and that the ODFW should expand its stocking program to include more species of trout (56%). Disagreement with these three statements, while not a majority, is substantial, ranging from 21% to 25%.
    - On the other hand, overwhelming majorities of trout anglers disagree that the ODFW should stop stocking trout (95% disagree), that it should stock fewer trout (89%), or that stocked trout take away from fishing and make fishing less enjoyable (84% disagree).
  
  - Although stocking efforts are supported, wild trout are preferred by more trout anglers than are hatchery trout (34% for wild, 5% for hatchery trout); however, the large majority of trout anglers (60%) say that they have no preference regarding fishing for hatchery trout versus wild trout.
  
  - Twice as many trout anglers agree than disagree that the ODFW should manage fisheries for larger trout rather than for maximum number of trout (assuming the trout population is healthy): 48% agree, but 24% disagree.

- A majority of crappie anglers (62%) oppose the establishment of a bag (or creel) limit for crappie; 28% support. Likewise, a majority of panfish anglers (52%) oppose the establishment of a bag (or creel) limit for panfish; 31% support. Finally, a majority of catfish anglers (55%) oppose the establishment of a bag (or creel) limit for catfish; 28% support. (Note that anglers were informed that currently there are no bag or creel limits for these three types of fish.)

### **OPINIONS ON CATCH-AND-RELEASE**

- Trout anglers are about evenly divided between those who release and those who keep the trout they catch, although slightly more release trout than keep trout: 73% release the trout they catch at least part of the time, while 61% keep the trout at least part of the time. The percentage who mostly release (38%) exceeds the percentage who mostly keep (26%) the trout they catch. Note that catch-and-release refers to both optional and required (by regulations) catch-and-release.
- Warmwater game fish anglers more often release than keep the warmwater game fish they catch: 79% release the warmwater game fish they catch at least half of the time, while 52% keep the warmwater game fish at least half of the time. #### **SOURCES OF INFORMATION REGARDING FISHING IN OREGON**

- The most popular source from which anglers have received information on fishing opportunities in Oregon is friends/family/word-of-mouth (62%), distantly followed by ODFW pamphlets (34%), newspapers (26%), sporting goods stores (22%), and the ODFW website (21%).
  
- By far, the Regulations Handbook is the most used source of information about fishing regulations and changes to them: 77% of anglers use this source, distantly followed by friends/family/word-of-mouth (34%), ODFW pamphlets (18%), sporting goods stores (17%), the ODFW website (15%), and newspapers (13%).

## **INTRODUCTION AND METHODOLOGY**

This study was conducted for the Oregon Department of Fish and Wildlife (ODFW) to determine licensed anglers' participation in fishing in Oregon, their motivations for fishing and constraints to fishing participation, and their opinions on various fishing regulations and fisheries management strategies. The study entailed a telephone survey of Oregon residents who had purchased an annual Oregon fishing license from December 2005 to September 2006 and who had fished at least once in the previous 12 months (hereinafter referred to as "active Oregon licensed anglers"). Daily license holders were not surveyed because annually licensed resident anglers are considered the ODFW's core constituency. Specific aspects of the research methodology are discussed below.

For the survey, telephones were selected as the preferred sampling medium because of the universality of telephone ownership. In addition, a central polling site at the Responsive Management office allowed for rigorous quality control over the interviews and data collection. Responsive Management maintains its own in-house telephone interviewing facilities. These facilities are staffed by interviewers with experience conducting computer-assisted telephone interviews on the subjects of natural resources and outdoor recreation. The telephone survey questionnaire was developed cooperatively by Responsive Management and the ODFW (Appendix A). Responsive Management conducted a pre-test of the questionnaire, and revisions were made to the questionnaire based on the pre-test.

To ensure the integrity of the telephone survey data, Responsive Management has interviewers who have been trained according to the standards established by the Council of American Survey Research Organizations. Methods of instruction included lecture and role-playing. The Survey Center Managers and other professional staff conducted project briefings with the interviewers prior to the administration of this survey. Interviewers were instructed on type of study, study goals and objectives, handling of survey questions, interview length, termination points and qualifiers for participation, interviewer instructions within the survey instrument, reading of the survey instrument, skip patterns, and probing and clarifying techniques necessary for specific questions on the survey instrument. The Survey Center Managers and statisticians monitored the data collection, including monitoring of the actual telephone interviews without the interviewers'

knowledge, to evaluate the performance of each interviewer and ensure the integrity of the data. After the surveys were obtained by the interviewers, the Survey Center Managers and/or statisticians edited each completed survey to ensure clarity and completeness.

Interviews were conducted Monday through Friday from 9:00 a.m. to 9:00 p.m., Saturday noon to 5:00 p.m., and Sunday from 5:00 p.m. to 9:00 p.m., local time. A five-callback design was used to maintain the representativeness of the sample, to avoid bias toward people easy to reach by telephone, and to provide an equal opportunity for all to participate. When a respondent could not be reached on the first call, subsequent calls were placed on different days of the week and at different times of the day. The survey was conducted in November 2006. Responsive Management obtained a total of 1,501 completed interviews.

The software used for data collection was Questionnaire Programming Language 4.1 (QPL). The survey data were entered into the computer as each interview was being conducted, eliminating manual data entry after the completion of the survey and the concomitant data entry errors that may occur with manual data entry. The survey instrument was programmed so that QPL branched, coded, and substituted phrases in the survey based on previous responses to ensure the integrity and consistency of the data collection. The analysis of data was performed using Statistical Package for the Social Sciences software as well as proprietary software developed by Responsive Management.

The results were weighted so that the proportions of the sample among the eastern and western regions matched the distribution of the population statewide. (Note that these are regions of residency; they may have fished outside their region.) In other words, the results were weighted so that 23.8% of the sample was from the eastern region, which matches the state angler population, 23.8% of which reside in the eastern region. The tabulation on the next page shows the weighting factors. The breakdown of cities and towns (and counties) into east and west regions is shown in Appendix B, which is sorted by county, then by city/town name within county. The results of the survey were crosstabulated by region and are discussed in the text only where there are marked differences between regions. Appendix C shows the crosstabulations of results by region.

For this report, a nonparametric analysis examined how the various responses related to behavioral, participatory and demographic characteristics. (Note that the nonparametric analysis was run on the weighted data.) Responses for selected questions were tested by means of z-scores for relationships to behavioral, participatory, and demographic characteristics. The analysis examined approximately 69 variables regarding characteristics of the respondents. A positive z-score means that the response and characteristic are positively related; a negative z-score means that the response and characteristic are negatively related. Note that negative z-scores are often reverse images of positive z-scores (e.g., if being male had a z-score of 5.00, being female would have a z-score of – 5.00); therefore, as negative z-scores usually do not provide additional information, they are not shown in the tables, thereby improving the readability of the tables. The nonparametric analysis tables are shown in Appendix D.

The asterisks on the z-scores show the strength of the relationship between the characteristic and the response to the question. Those z-scores that have an absolute value of 3.30 or greater have three asterisks—three asterisks indicate that the relationship is so strong that it would happen by chance only 1 out of 1,000 times. Those z-scores that have an absolute value of 2.58 to 3.29 have two asterisks—two asterisks indicate that the relationship is so strong that it would happen by chance only 1 out of 100 times. Finally, those z-scores that have an absolute value of 1.96 to 2.57 have one asterisk—one asterisk indicates that the relationship is so strong that it would happen by chance only 5 out of 100 times.

The z-scores were calculated as shown in the formula below.

- $p = (a + c)/(n_1 + n_2) = (a + c)/n$  and is a pooled estimate of the proportion of respondents who had specific characteristic in the underlying population.

In selecting the characteristics to analyze, the research team considered the number of respondents who would have the characteristic to ensure a large enough sample size for meaningful results. As an example, the age characteristics chosen for the nonparametric analysis were “Is above the median age (53),” and “Is at or below the median age (53).” This ensured that a large enough number of respondents (in this case, because the median was chosen, half of the total surveyed population) would have each characteristic to be meaningful in the analysis. The analysis could have been run on individual ages in the survey (e.g., 18 year olds, 19 year olds, and so on), but the samples within each single-year age group would have been too small for meaningful results. By considering the number of respondents who would have the characteristic, multiple comparison problems are minimized. The characteristics examined are shown in the tabulation below.

The results of this calculation indicate that “Being male” is positively correlated to “Fished for salmon in the ocean,” with a positive z-score of 2.569, which is statistically significant. As shown in the z-score table for “Fished for salmon in the ocean,” the characteristic, “Being male,” has a z-score of 2.57. A similar calculation was performed by the computer for all 69 variables chosen.

Throughout this report, findings of the telephone survey are reported at a 95% confidence interval. For the entire sample of Oregon licensed anglers (including non-active anglers), the sampling error is at most plus or minus 2.18 percentage points. This means that if the survey were conducted 100 times on different samples that were selected in the same way, the findings of 95 out of the 100 surveys would fall within plus or minus 2.18 percentage points of each other. Sampling error was calculated using the formula described below, with a sample size of 2,006 (the sample that reached the screener question) and a population size of 364,514 Oregon licensed anglers. Note that 1,501 of these 2,006 Oregon licensed anglers had fished in the previous 12 months and were, therefore, given the full survey, and it is these 1,501 anglers who are referred to as “active Oregon licensed anglers” or “active Oregon anglers” in the report.

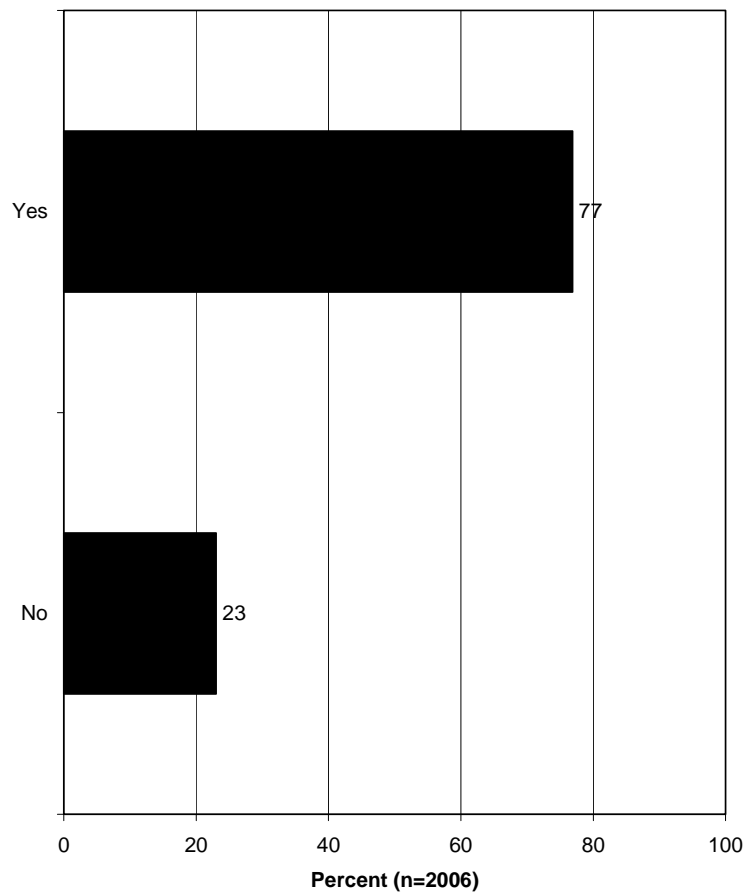
Note that some results may not sum to exactly 100% because of rounding. Additionally, rounding on the graphs may cause apparent discrepancies of 1 percentage point between the graphs and the reported results of combined responses (e.g., when “strongly support” and “moderately support” are summed to determine the total percentage in support).

## PARTICIPATION IN FISHING

### OVERALL PARTICIPATION

- The survey was to be administered to Oregon annually licensed anglers who had been fishing in the previous 12 months. Therefore, this question was asked of Oregon annually licensed anglers (those who had purchased a license from December 2005 to September 2006) to determine who should continue with the full survey: 77% of Oregon annually licensed anglers had been fishing in the previous 12 months and got the rest of the survey (referred to as active Oregon licensed anglers); 23% were non-active licensed anglers and were not given the full survey.

**SPECIES FISHED**

- Nearly two-thirds of active Oregon anglers consider themselves to be primarily coldwater anglers (64% gave this answer), while only 18% consider themselves to be primarily warmwater anglers; meanwhile, 15% consider themselves to be equally a warmwater and coldwater angler. The results of the survey were crosstabulated by type of angler (coldwater, warmwater, and equally both), and Appendix E shows all the crosstabulations of results by coldwater/warmwater anglers.
- Eastern anglers are slightly more likely to be warmwater anglers than are western anglers.
  - The nonparametric analysis found that those who consider themselves coldwater anglers are positively correlated with the following:
    - Fished for (in order of strength of correlation) salmon in the ocean, steelhead, salmon in freshwater, salmon in bays/estuaries, resident trout or kokanee.
    - Purchased a combined salmon/steelhead/sturgeon/halibut tag in 2005.
    - Would support additional fishing regulations if the regulations would assist the ODFW in maintaining current freshwater fishing opportunities.
    - Is male; lives in the West Region; considers place of residence to be large city/urban area or suburban area.
  - The nonparametric analysis found that those who consider themselves warmwater anglers are positively correlated with the following:
    - Fished for (in order of strength of correlation) warmwater game fish, other freshwater fish (other than those specifically asked about in the survey), striped bass.
    - Did not purchase a combined salmon/steelhead/sturgeon/halibut tag in 2005.
    - Is female; lives in East Region.
  - The nonparametric analysis found that those who consider themselves equally coldwater and warmwater anglers are positively correlated with the following:
    - Fished for warmwater game fish.
    - Did not indicate that he/she would support additional freshwater fishing regulations if the regulations would assist the ODFW in maintaining current freshwater fishing opportunities.
    - Is female; is above the median age (53); considers place of residence to be a small city/town.

- The most popular fish sought in Oregon is resident trout/kokanee (73% fished for this species in Oregon in the past 12 months), distantly followed by salmon in freshwater (33%), steelhead (30%), and warmwater game fish (26%).
- Not surprisingly, western region anglers fished for salmon in the ocean, estuaries, and bays, as well as for other marine fish, more often than did eastern region anglers. Western anglers fished for salmon in freshwater and steelhead more often than did eastern anglers.
  - Eastern anglers fished for warmwater game fish more often than did western anglers.
  - Fishing for trout, searun cutthroat, sturgeon, shad, striped bass, and whitefish was not markedly different in the two regions. (Note that the regional breakdown is by place of residency, not by location of fishing activity. Eastern region anglers obviously traveled to fish for searun cutthroat.)
  - A matrix shows the overlap of fishing for various species; in other words, it shows the percentage who fished for a species as well as the percentage of anglers who fished for that species and another. The matrix shows that there is much overlap between resident trout/kokanee and warmwater game fish anglers, resident trout/kokanee and steelhead anglers, and resident trout/kokanee and salmon in bays/estuaries/freshwater. Also shown is the same matrix from a 1977 study of Oregon anglers for comparison to 2006 data. The comparisons show a decline in the percentage of anglers fishing for salmon in the ocean, steelhead, searun cutthroat, and warmwater game fish. Trout fishing has declined just slightly in percentage of anglers. The trends examination also suggests that overlap of fishing interests has declined, with lower percentages fishing for separate species (e.g., the percentage who fished for both steelhead and resident trout declined from 40% in 1977 to 18% in 2006).
  - Another table shows the percentage of all resident license holders (annual) who fished for the particular type of fish in the previous 12 months, including those who did not fish in the previous 12 months, and the total estimated number of participants.
  - The nonparametric analysis found the following correlations with those who fish for various types of fish. (Note that “other marine fish” refers to marine fish other than salmon; “other freshwater fish” refers to other than those freshwater fish specifically asked about in the survey; these terms are used throughout in discussions of the nonparametric analysis.) The results of the nonparametric analysis are shown in a tabulation for ease of readability.

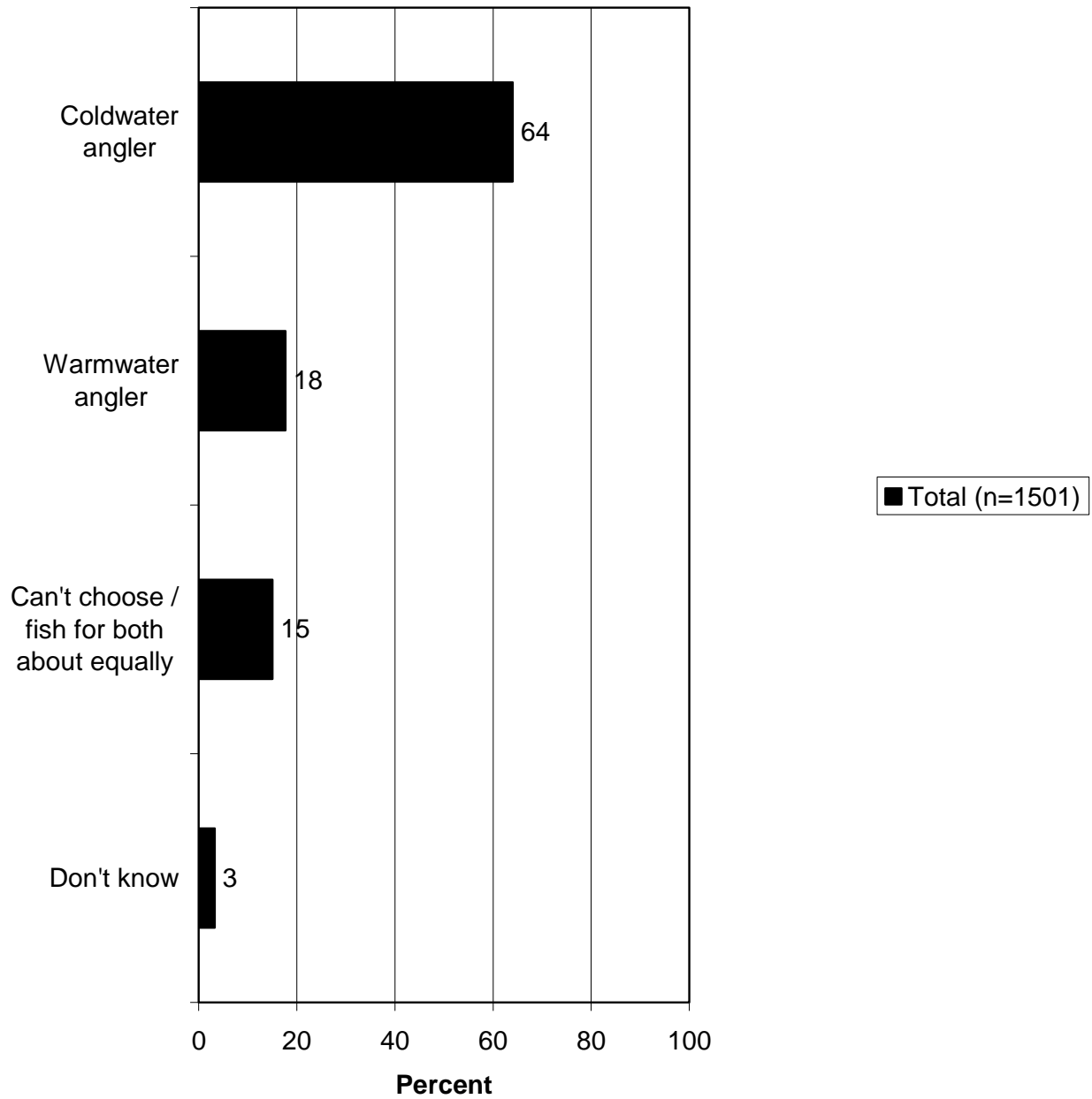

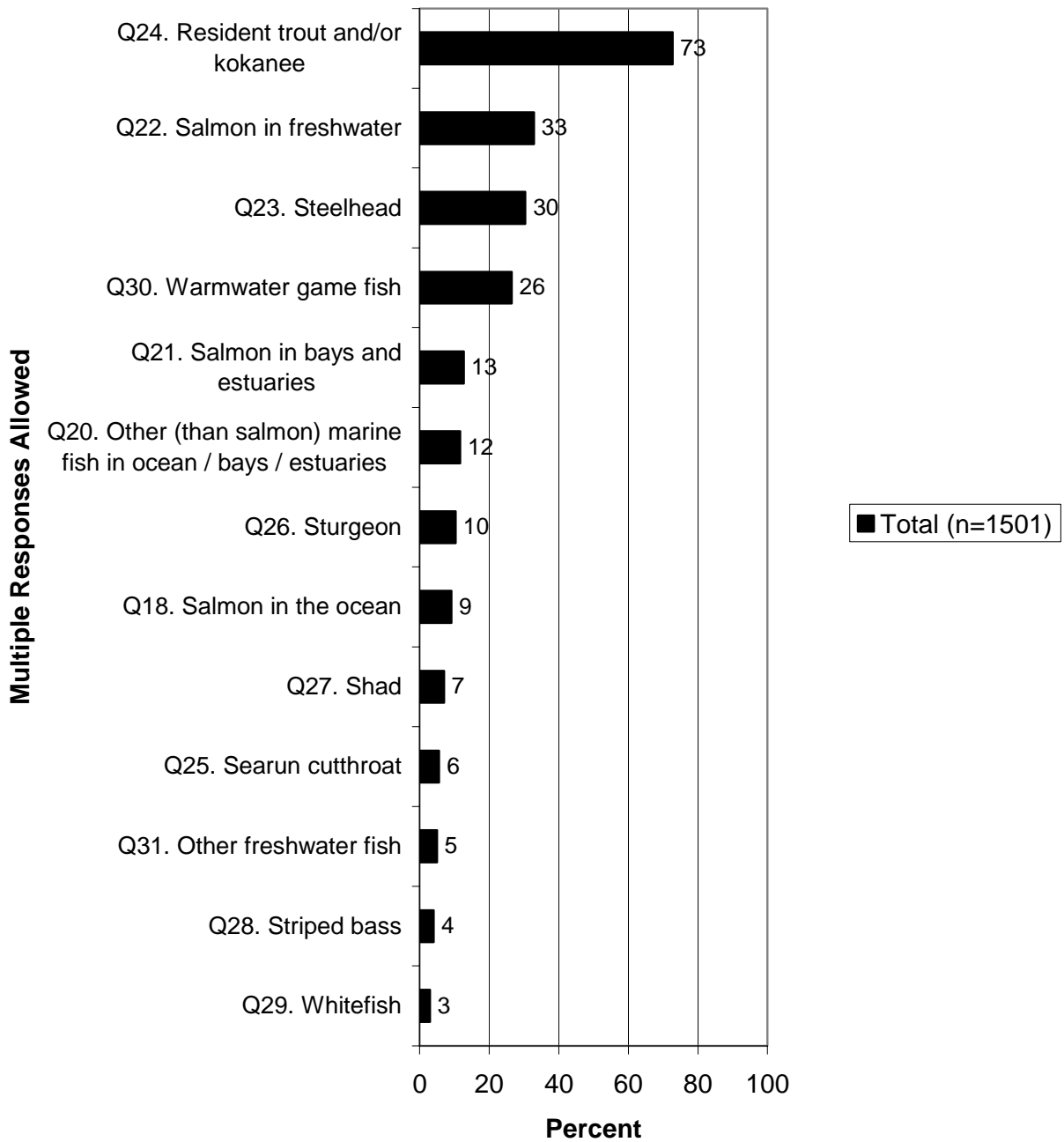
- Rainbow trout (preferred by 69% of trout anglers) is the most preferred type of trout among trout anglers, distantly followed by brown trout (23%).
- Although most trout anglers (60%) say that they have no preference regarding fishing for hatchery trout versus wild trout, the percentage who prefer wild trout (34%) far exceeds the percentage who prefer hatchery trout (5%).
  - Eastern anglers are just slightly more likely to say that they prefer wild trout than are western anglers.

- Bass (smallmouth or largemouth) (preferred by 77% of warmwater game fish anglers) is the most preferred warmwater game fish, followed by crappie (40%).
  - Eastern anglers are more likely than are western anglers to prefer crappie, catfish, and walleye. On the other hand, panfish are preferred by western anglers more than they are by eastern anglers.
  
- Nearly half of active Oregon anglers (45%) purchased a combined salmon/steelhead/sturgeon/halibut tag in 2005. Of those who purchased the combined tag, nearly half (46% of purchasers) indicated that they turned it in.
  - Western anglers more often bought a combined tag than did eastern anglers.

    - Is male; lives in the West Region; household income is from \$60,000 to \$119,999; considers place of residence to be a large city/urban area or suburban area.

The bolded numbers represent the percentage of all anglers who fished for the particular species. For instance, this shows that:

- 9% of anglers fished for salmon in the ocean
- 12% of anglers fished for other (than salmon) marine fish
- 37% of anglers fished for salmon in bays/estuaries/freshwater (inland salmon)

Non-bold numbers show the percentage of anglers who fished for both species. For instance, reading from left to right in the first row of data:

- 9% of anglers fished for salmon in the ocean
- 4% fished for salmon in the ocean and other (than salmon) marine fish
- 6% of anglers fished for salmon in the ocean and salmon in bays/estuaries/freshwater

To read the sturgeon part of the matrix, for instance, read down the sturgeon column, then right in the sturgeon row. For instance:

- 3% of anglers fished for sturgeon *and* salmon in the ocean
- 3% of anglers fished for sturgeon *and* other (than salmon) marine fish
- 7% of anglers fished for sturgeon *and* salmon in bays/estuaries/freshwater
- and so on to the bold number, which shows that 10% of anglers fished for sturgeon
- now read right along the sturgeon row, which shows that 3% of anglers fished for sturgeon *and* shad
- 1% fished for sturgeon *and* striped bass
- and so on to the end of the row

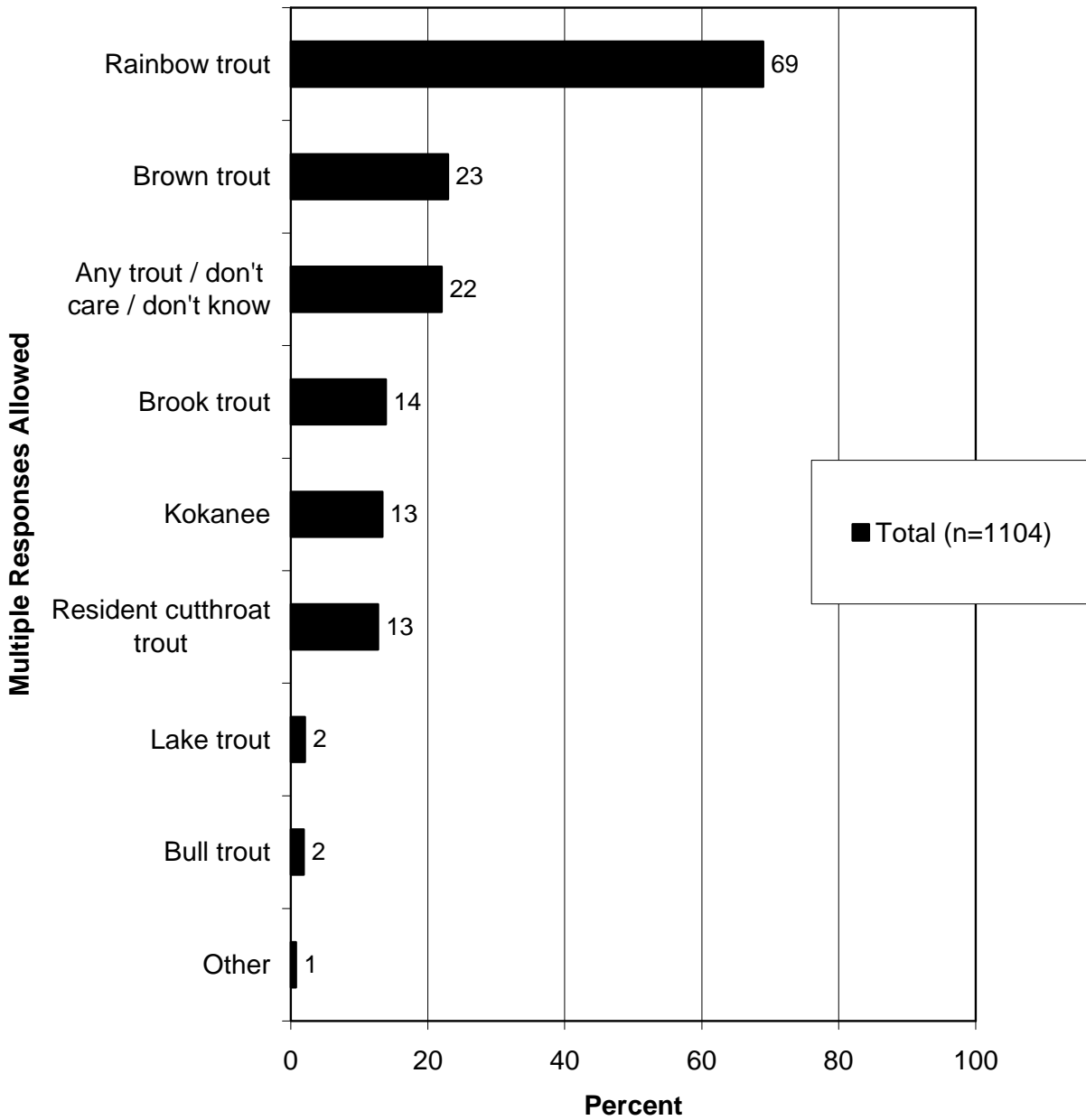

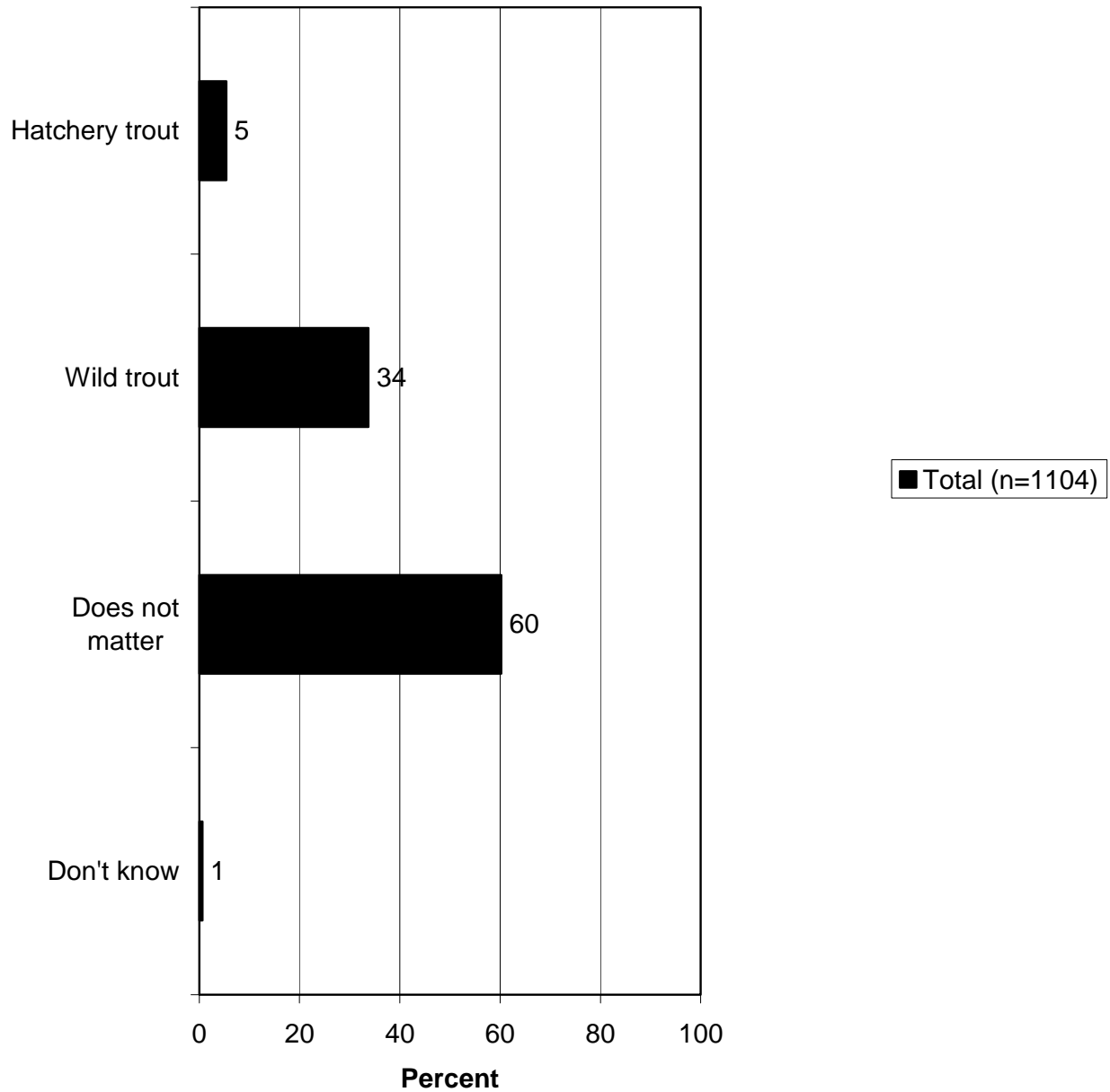

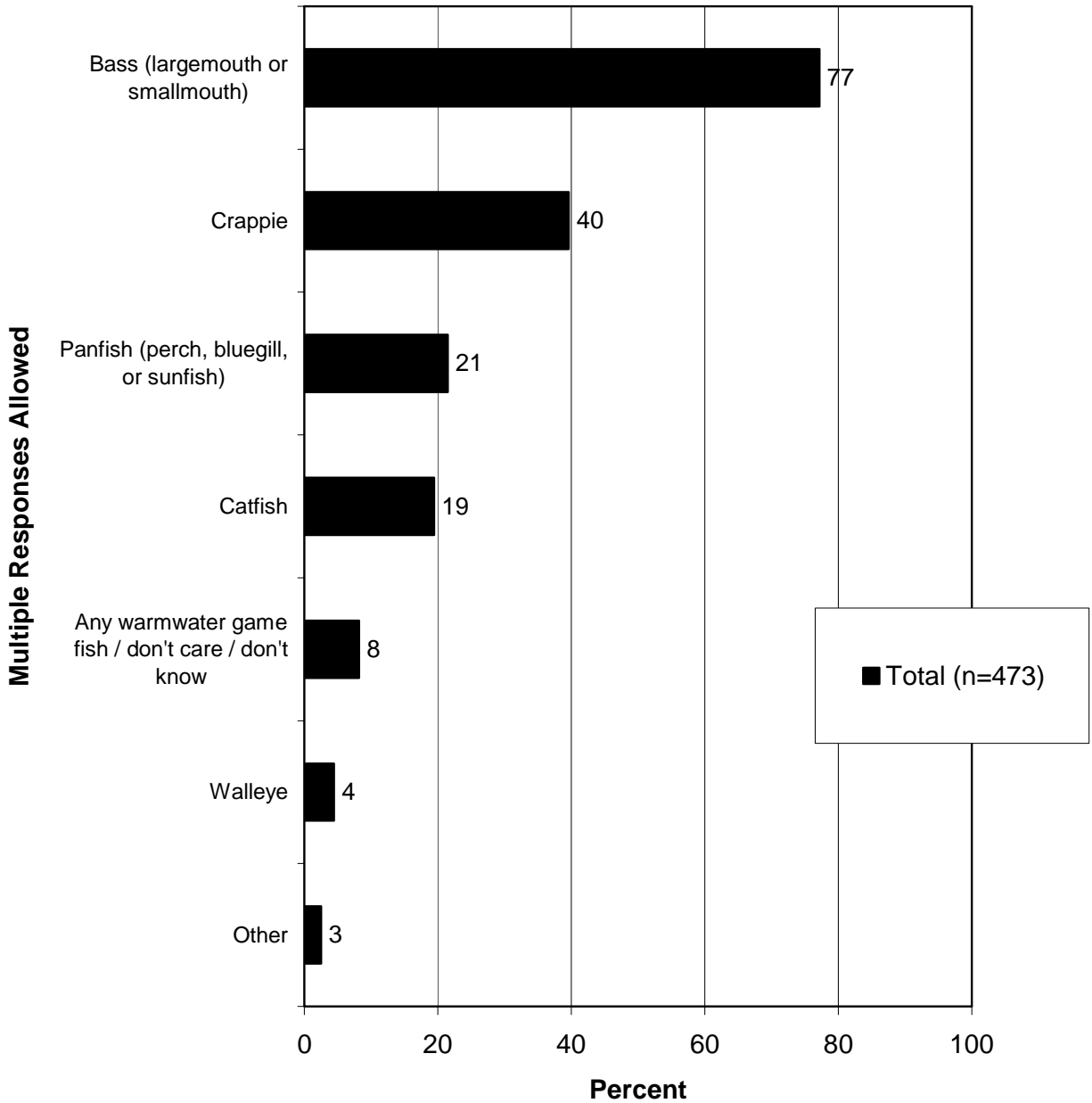

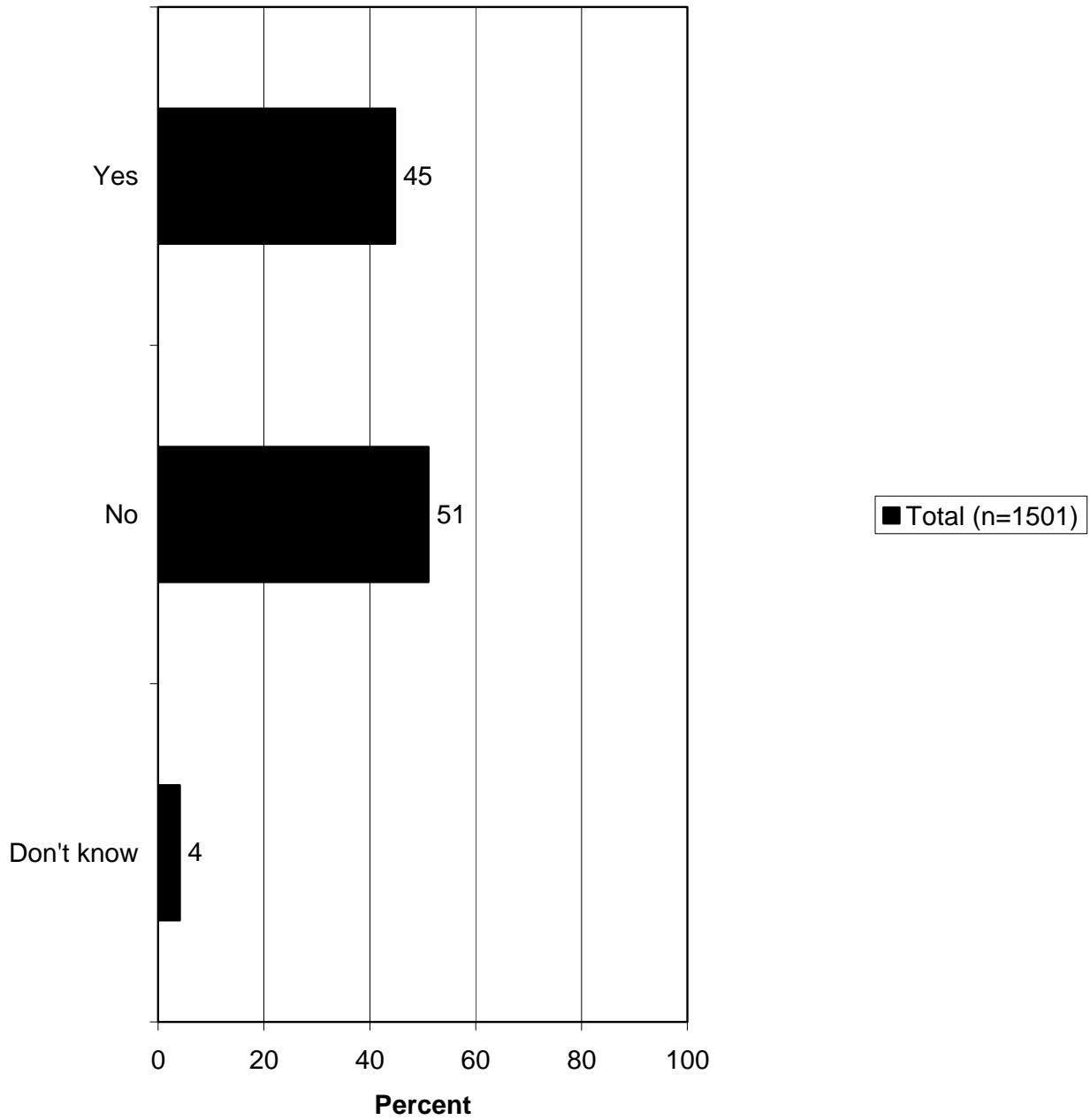

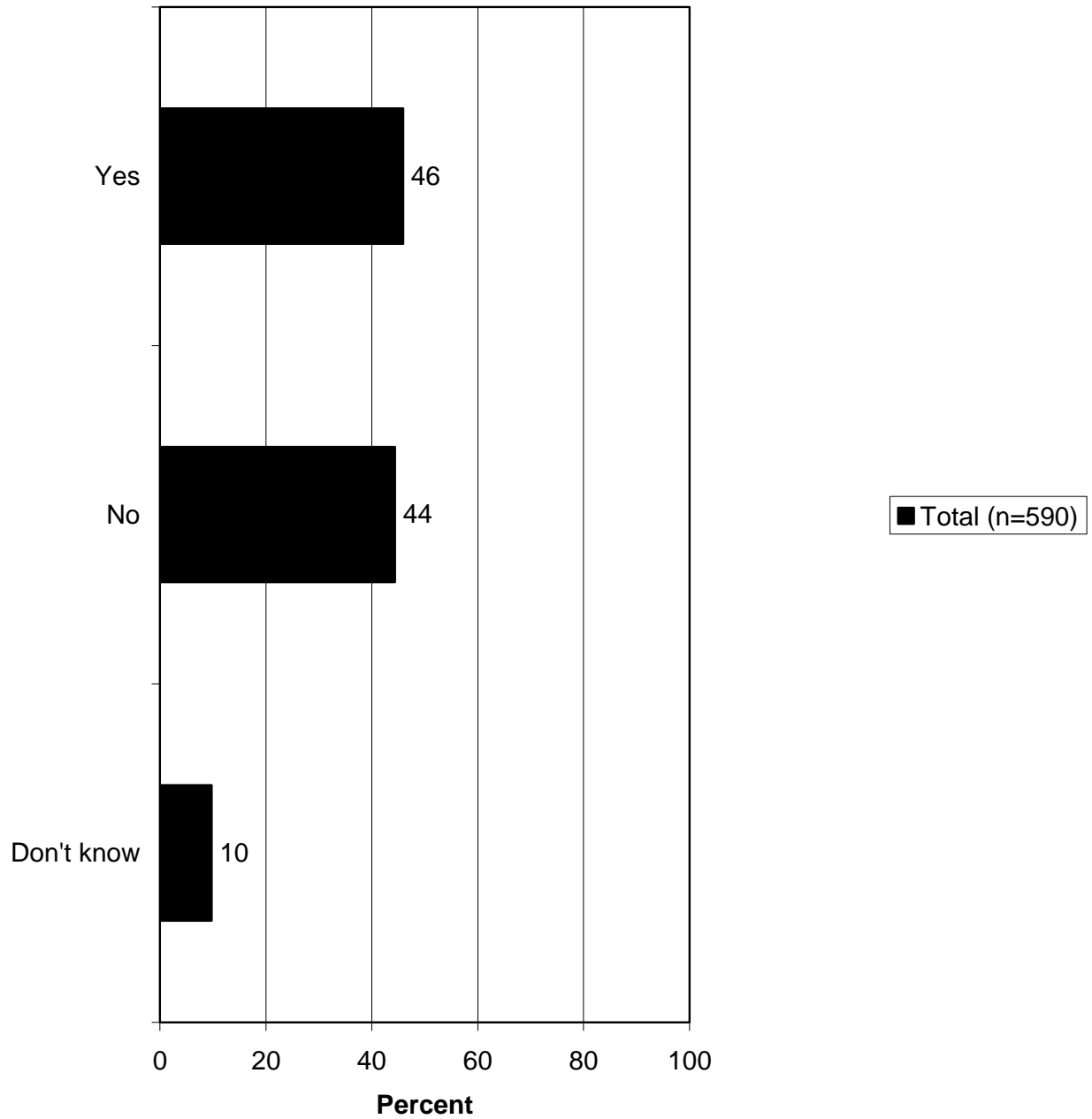

steelhead/sturgeon/halibut tag in 2005?**



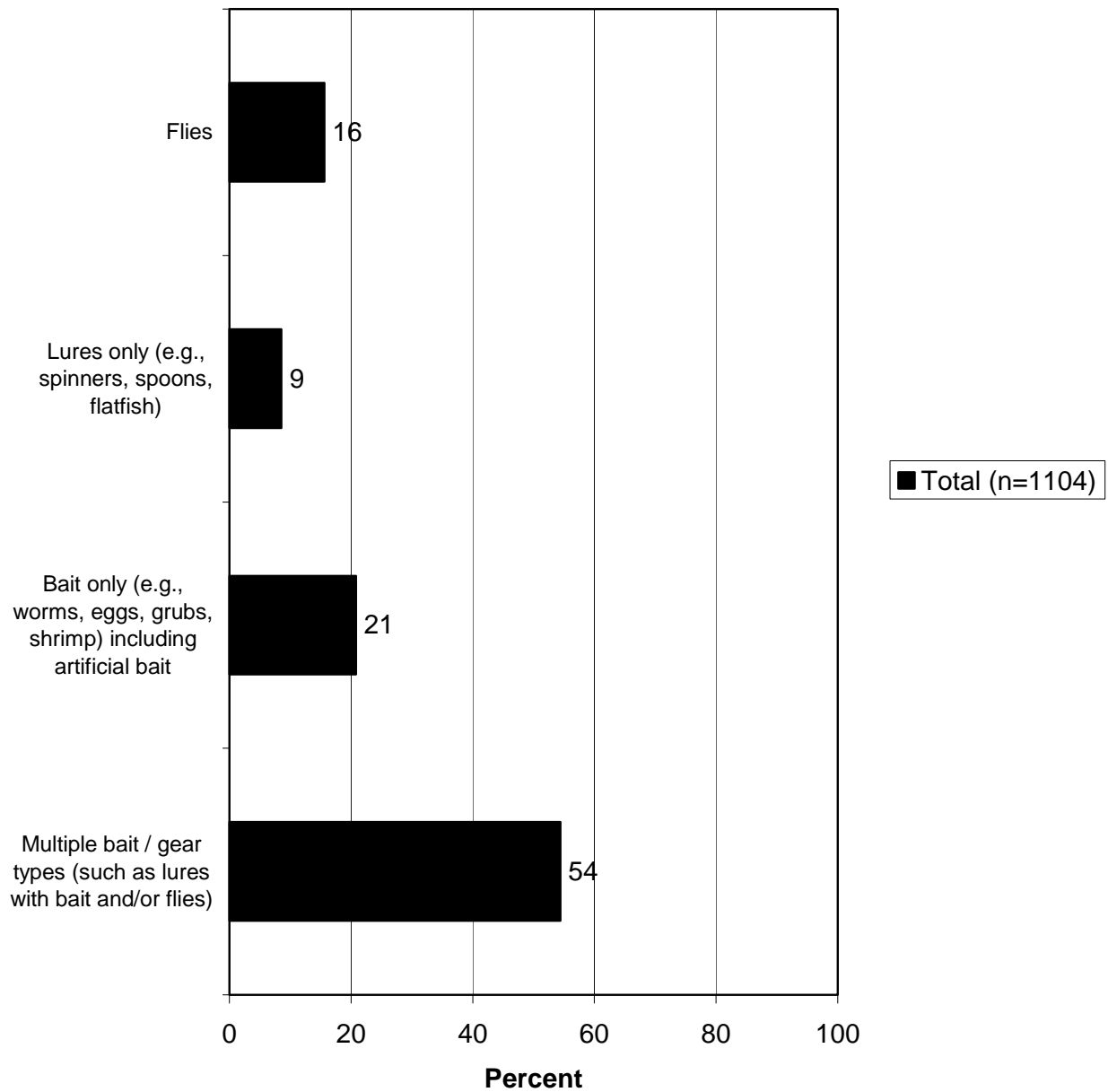

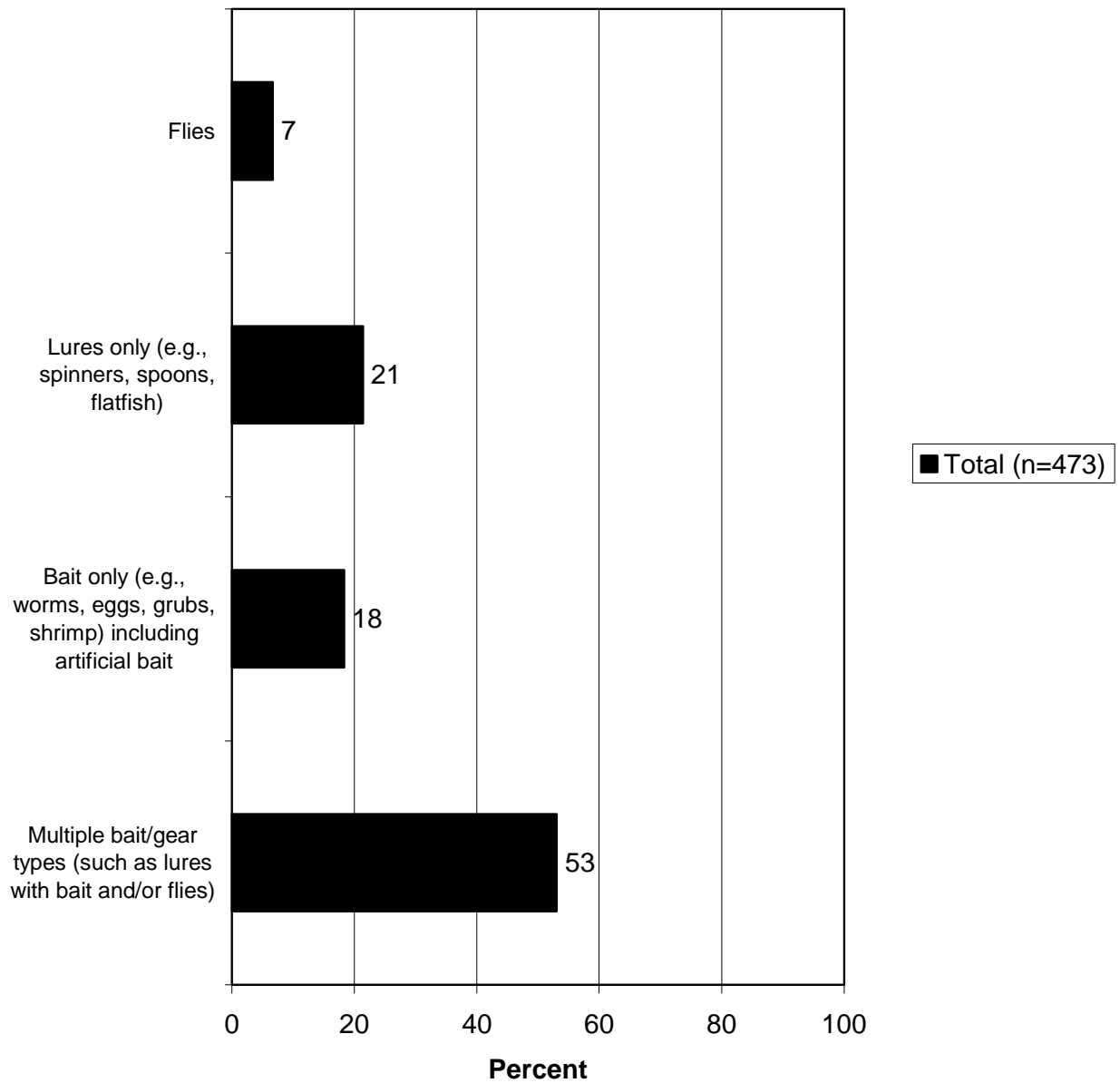
**METHODS OF FISHING**

- A majority of trout anglers (54%) prefer to use multiple baits and gear types. Otherwise, those who prefer bait only (21%) exceed those who prefer flies only (16%) or lures only (9%).
  
- A majority of warmwater game fish anglers (53%) prefer to use multiple baits and gear types. Otherwise, those who prefer lures only (21%) exceed those who prefer bait only (18%) or flies (7%).
  
- Trout anglers are about evenly divided between those who release and those who keep the trout they catch, although slightly more release trout than keep trout: 73% release the trout they catch at least half of the time, while 61% keep the trout at least half of the time. The percentage who mostly release (38%) exceeds the percentage who mostly keep (26%) the trout they catch. In a related question, more trout anglers say that releasing a trout makes fishing more enjoyable (41%) than say doing so makes trout fishing less enjoyable (12%). Most commonly, they say releasing has no effect on enjoyment (42%). (These graphs are shown in the section of this report titled, “Opinions on Catch-and-Release.”)
  
- Warmwater game fish anglers more often release than keep the warmwater game fish they catch: 79% release the warmwater game fish they catch at least half of the time, while 52% keep the warmwater game fish at least half of the time. The percentage who mostly release (47%) is more than double the percentage who mostly keep (20%) the warmwater game fish they catch (32% equally release and keep). More warmwater game fish anglers say that releasing warmwater game fish makes fishing more enjoyable (42%) than say it makes fishing less enjoyable (8%); most commonly, they say it has no effect (48%) on their enjoyment of warmwater game fish angling. ## DAYS PARTICIPATED IN FISHING

- The tabulations below show the days that active anglers fished for various species in various types of water. (Note that results are not comparable from one table to the next because of differences in how respondents got to the questions.) Some of the conclusions that can be drawn from the tabulations include:
- Regarding saltwater fishing, there is slightly more avidity among anglers fishing for salmon in bays and estuaries (13.1 mean number of days; 21% fished for more than 10 days) than among anglers fishing for salmon in the ocean (5.8 mean number of days; 14% fished for more than 10 days) or other marine fish in bays and estuaries (8.9 mean number of days; 16% fished for more than 10 days).
  - In freshwater, the most avidity (measured in the number of days fishing) is for salmon, steelhead, and trout. On the other hand, avidity is markedly lower for shad and sturgeon. This is evidenced by the relatively high median number of days fished for these species: 5 days for salmon in freshwater streams or rivers, 5 days for steelhead in freshwater streams or rivers, and 5 days for resident trout or kokanee in freshwater lakes and reservoirs; no other fish in freshwater had as high a median. Also note that the percentage of anglers (of that type of fish) who fished for more than 10 days is higher for salmon in freshwater streams or rivers (30%), steelhead in freshwater streams or rivers (30%), and resident trout or kokanee in freshwater lakes and reservoirs (22%) than for any other type of fish.
  - Of the different types of trout, the most avidity (measured in the number of days fishing) is for bull trout (8.3 mean days for bull trout in freshwater lakes and reservoirs; 8.1 mean days for bull trout in freshwater streams or rivers), rainbow trout (8.9 mean days for rainbow trout in freshwater lakes and reservoirs), and cutthroat trout (11.1 mean days for cutthroat trout in freshwater streams or rivers). Respondents did not fish for any other type of trout for as many mean days as they did for these types of trout.
  - Most trout fishing is in lakes or reservoirs rather than streams or rivers, with the exception of cutthroat trout; three types of trout in particular are most often fished from lakes and reservoirs: rainbow trout, lake trout, and kokanee. Note that the mean number of days fished for each type of trout in freshwater lakes and reservoirs is higher than the

mean number of days fishing for trout in freshwater streams or rivers, with the exception of cutthroat trout.

- Except for walleye, most warmwater game fishing is done in lakes or reservoirs. This is shown particularly well by the median number of days fished: the median number of days fished for bass, crappie, panfish, and catfish in freshwater streams or rivers is 0, while the median number of days fishing for these types of fish in freshwater lakes and reservoirs is 4 (for bass, crappie, and panfish) or 3 (for catfish).
- The crosstabulations by region are shown, as well. Mean days fishing is higher among western region anglers than among eastern region anglers for salmon, steelhead, searun cutthroat, warmwater game fish, cutthroat trout, bull trout, brook trout, kokanee, bass, and panfish. On the other hand, eastern region anglers have higher mean days fishing for resident trout or kokanee (overall), striped bass, whitefish, rainbow trout, brown trout, lake trout, crappie, and catfish.

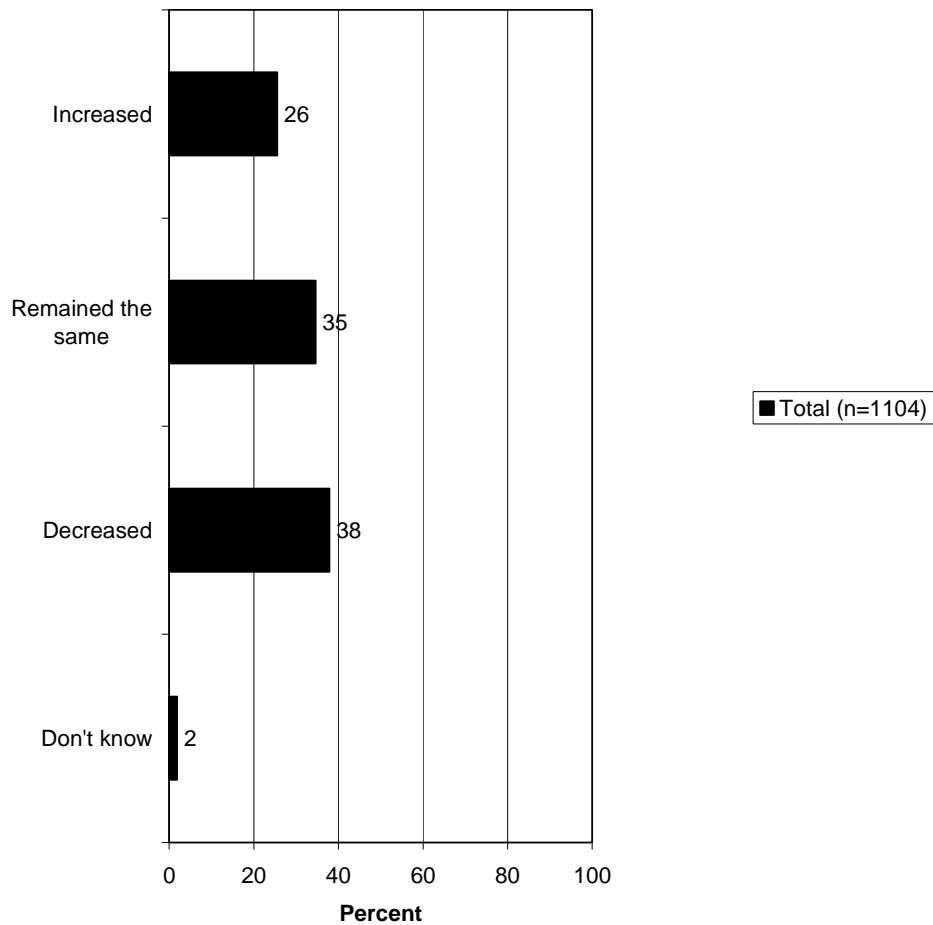

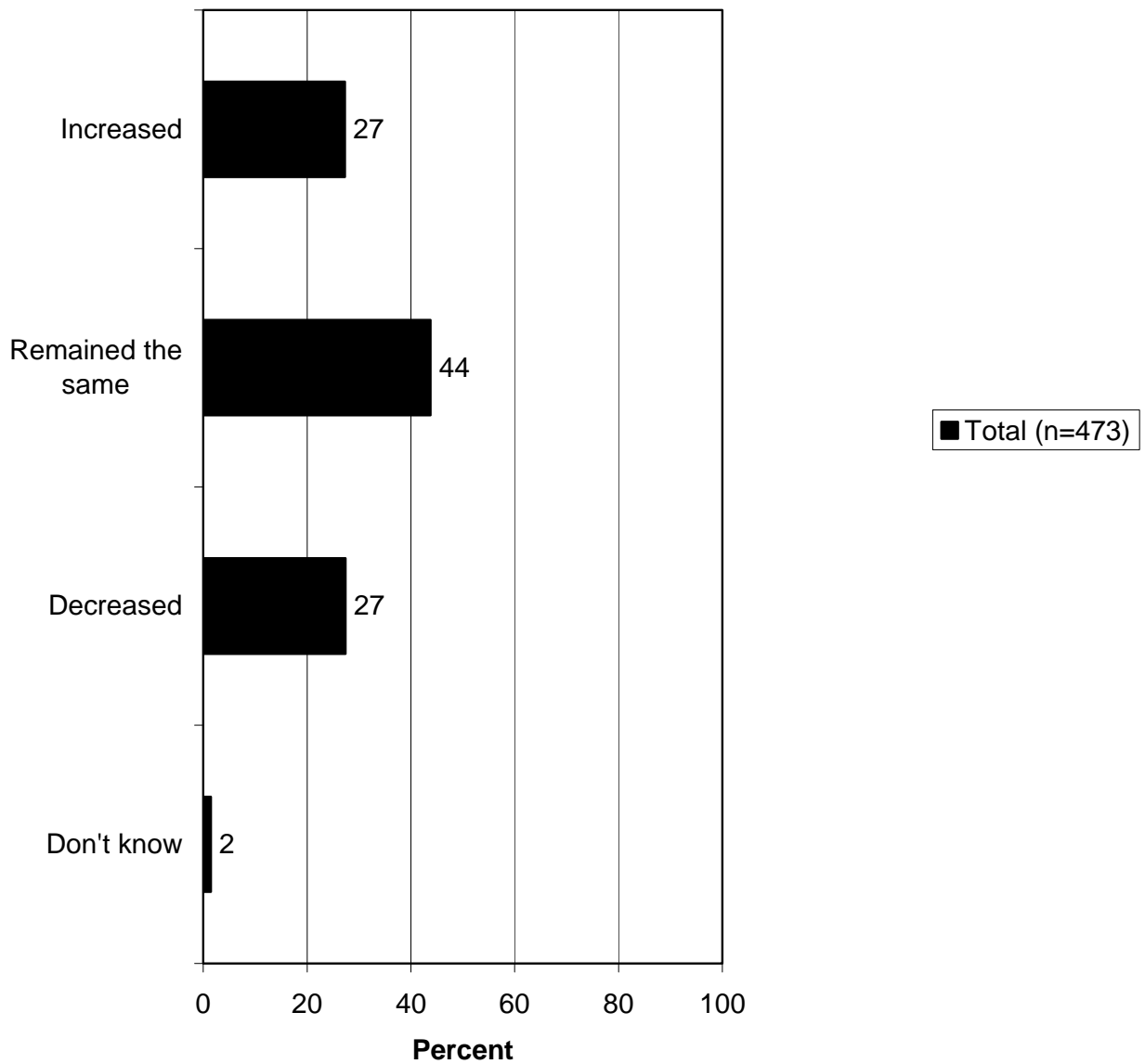
## TRENDS IN FISHING PARTICIPATION

- More trout anglers say that their level of trout fishing participation has decreased over the past 5 years (38%) than say it has increased (26%); 35% say it has remained the same.
- Most commonly, warmwater game fish anglers say that their level of fishing activity in the past 5 years has remained the same (44%); otherwise, they are evenly split between those saying it has increased (27%) and those saying it has decreased (also 27%).

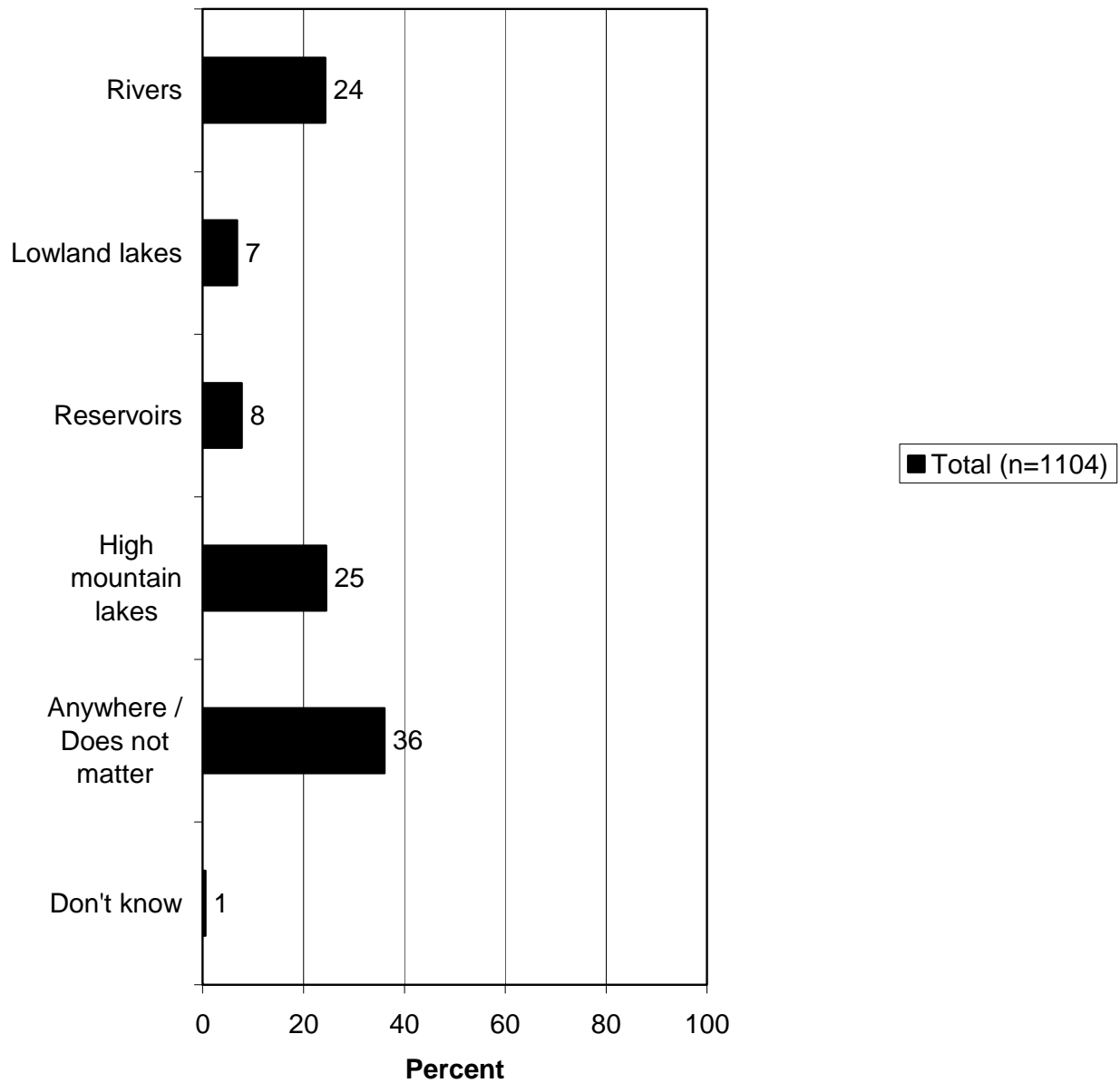

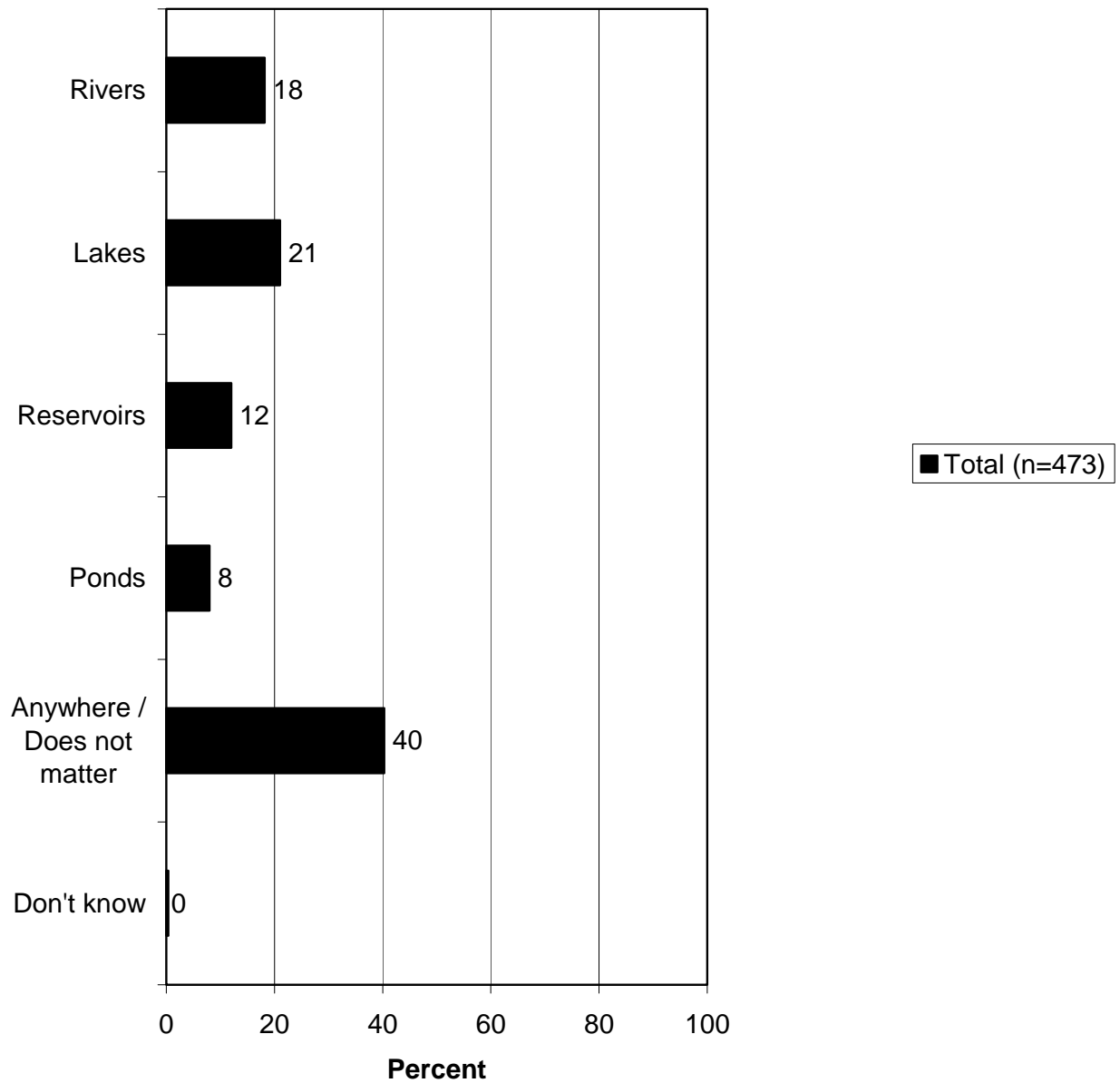
## LOCATIONS FOR FISHING

- For trout fishing, trout anglers most commonly say that they have no locational preference (e.g., rivers, lakes) (36% have no preference); otherwise, high mountain lakes (25%) and rivers (24%) are the most popular trout fishing locations.
  - Eastern anglers show a greater propensity to fish in rivers than do western anglers; conversely, western anglers fish in high mountain lakes more often than do eastern anglers.
  
- For warmwater game fish, anglers most commonly say that they have no locational preference (40%); otherwise, lakes (21%) and rivers (18%) are preferred over reservoirs (12%) or ponds (8%).
  - Eastern anglers are much more likely than are western anglers to say that they prefer reservoirs; eastern anglers are slightly more likely to say that they prefer rivers.
  
- Most commonly, trout anglers say that they usually fish for trout from the bank (45%), but a substantial percentage (38%) say that they usually fish for trout from a boat. Conversely, warmwater game fish anglers most commonly say that they usually fish for these type of fish from a boat (46%), but a substantial percentage (38%) say that they usually fish from the bank.
  - Western anglers are slightly more likely than are eastern anglers to fish from a boat.

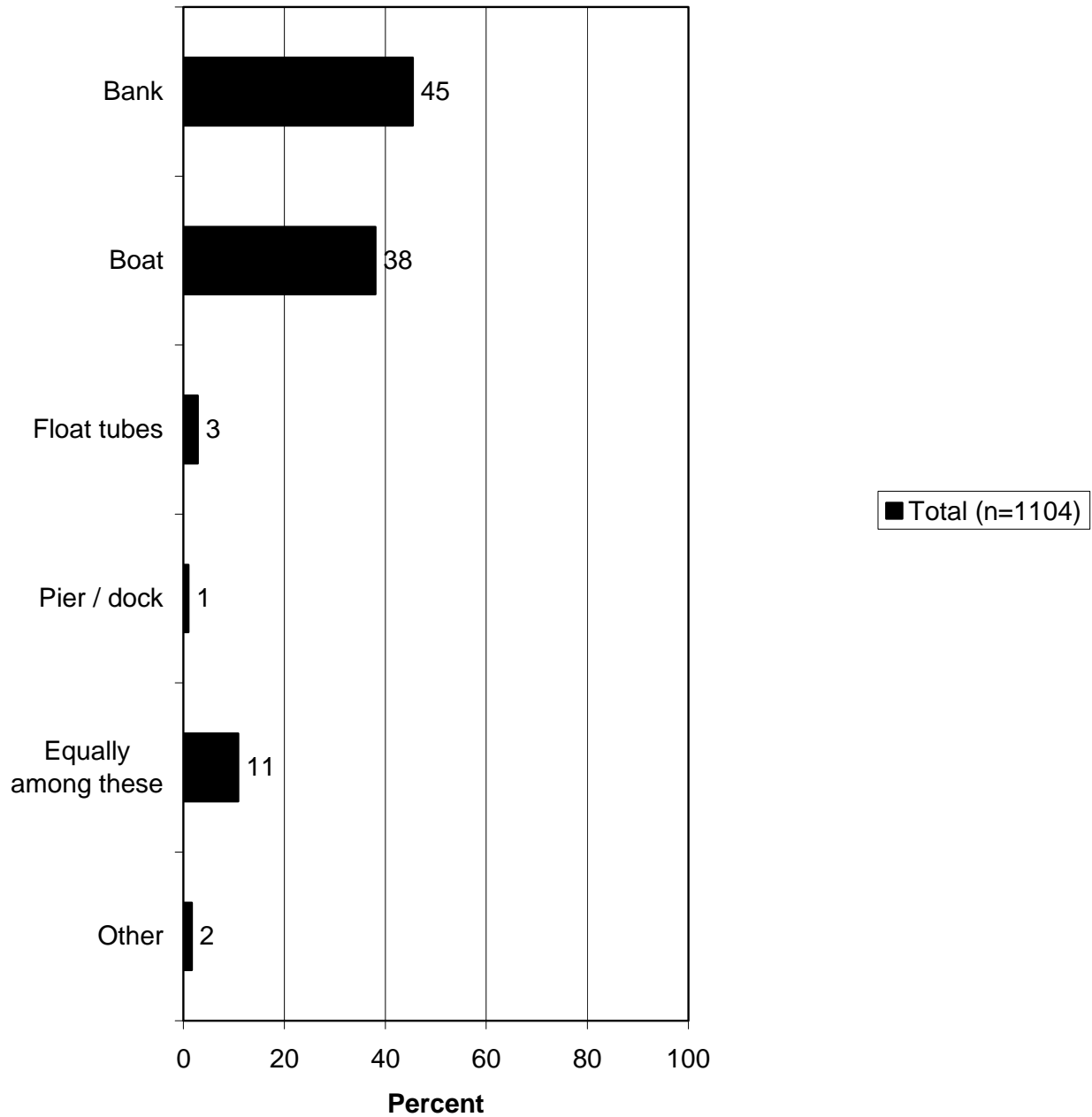

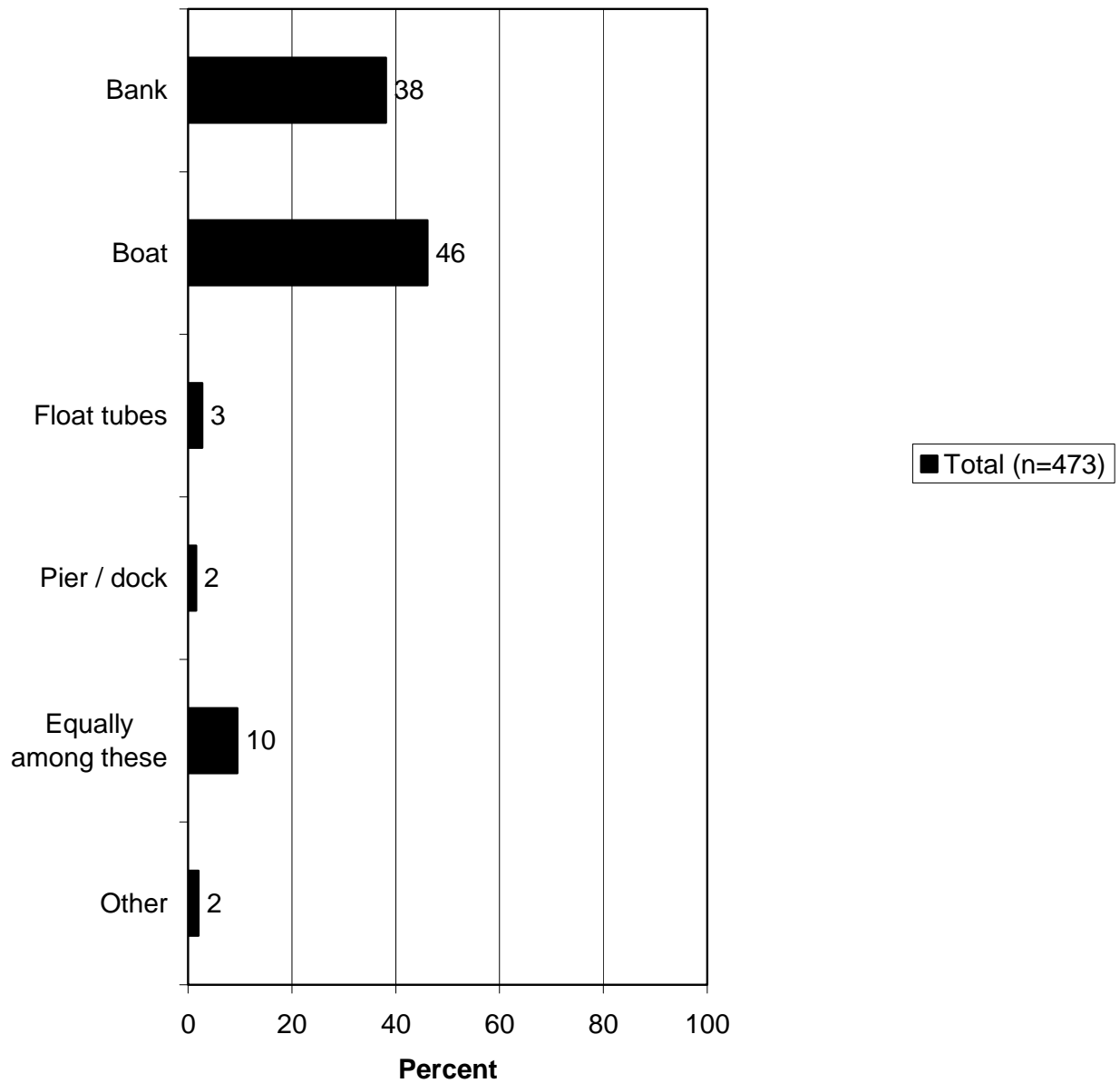

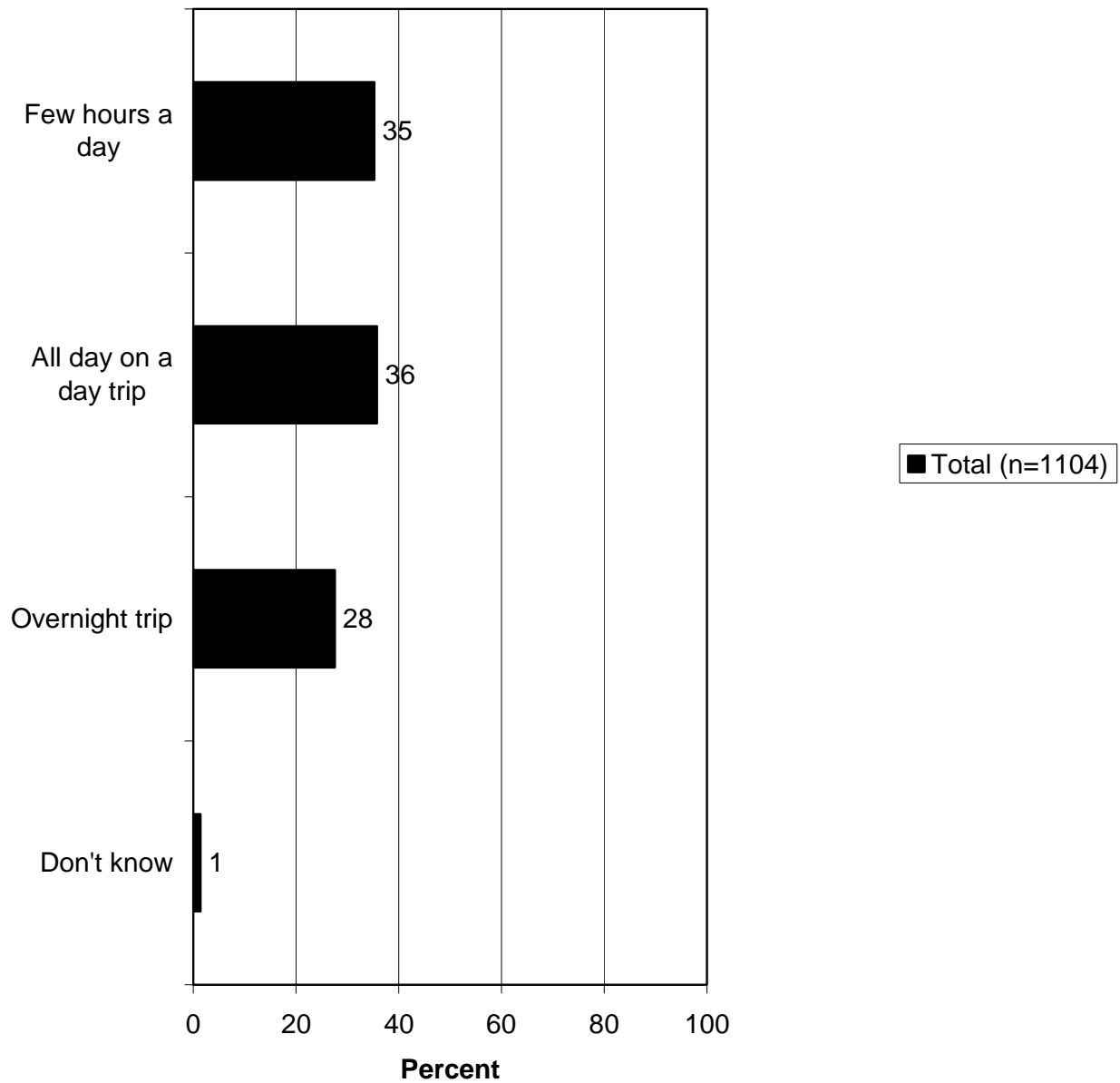

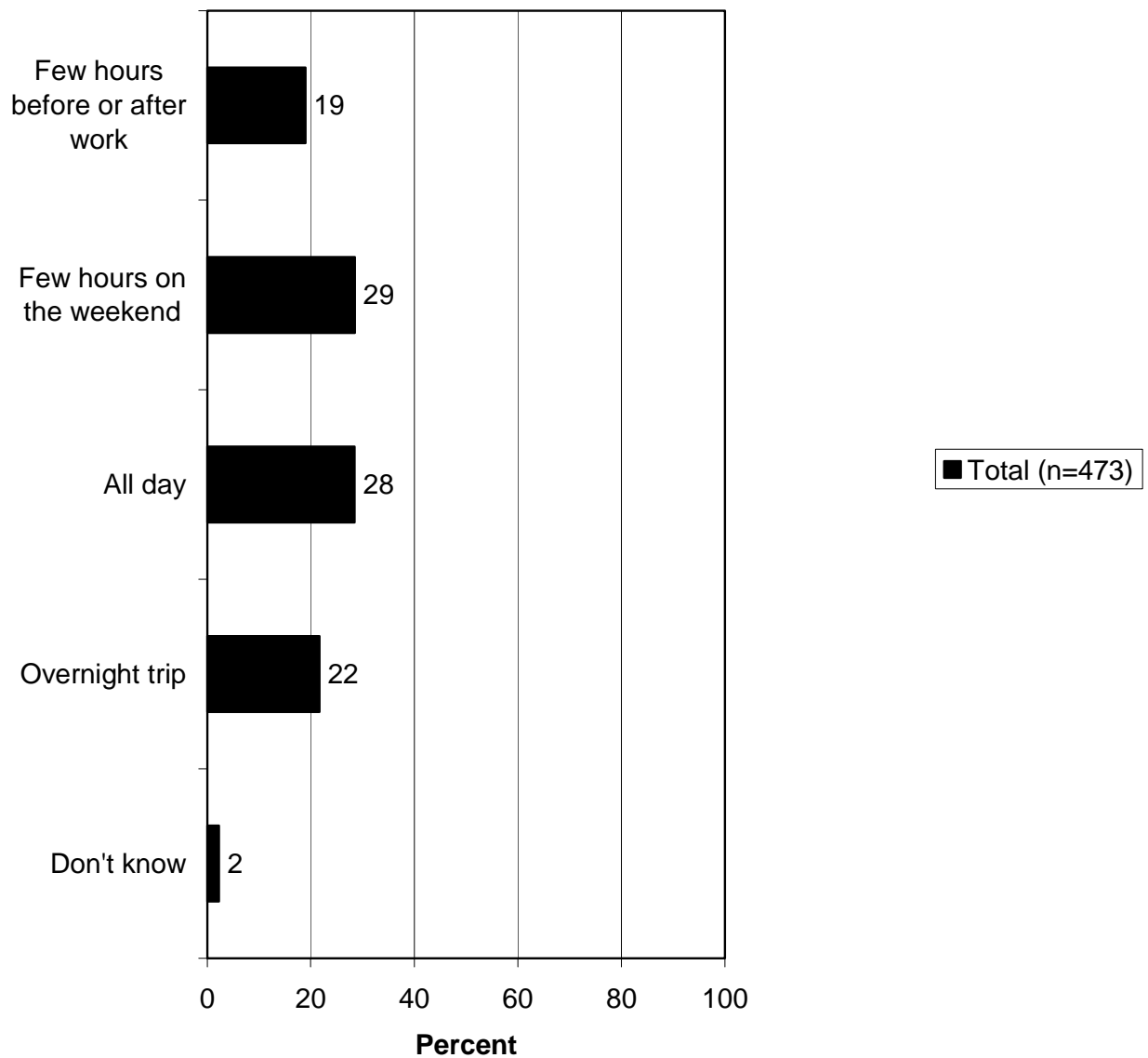
### **AMOUNT OF TIME TYPICALLY SPENT FISHING**

- Trout anglers are almost evenly distributed into three groups regarding how long they usually fish for trout: 35% usually fish a few hours a day, 36% usually fish all day, and 28% usually take overnight trips to fish for trout.
  
- Warmwater game fish anglers most commonly fish for a few hours a day (19% fish for a few hours before or after work; 29% fish for a few hours on the weekend); nonetheless, half of warmwater game fish anglers indicate avidity of more than just a few hours: 28% usually fish all day, and 22% take overnight trips to fish.

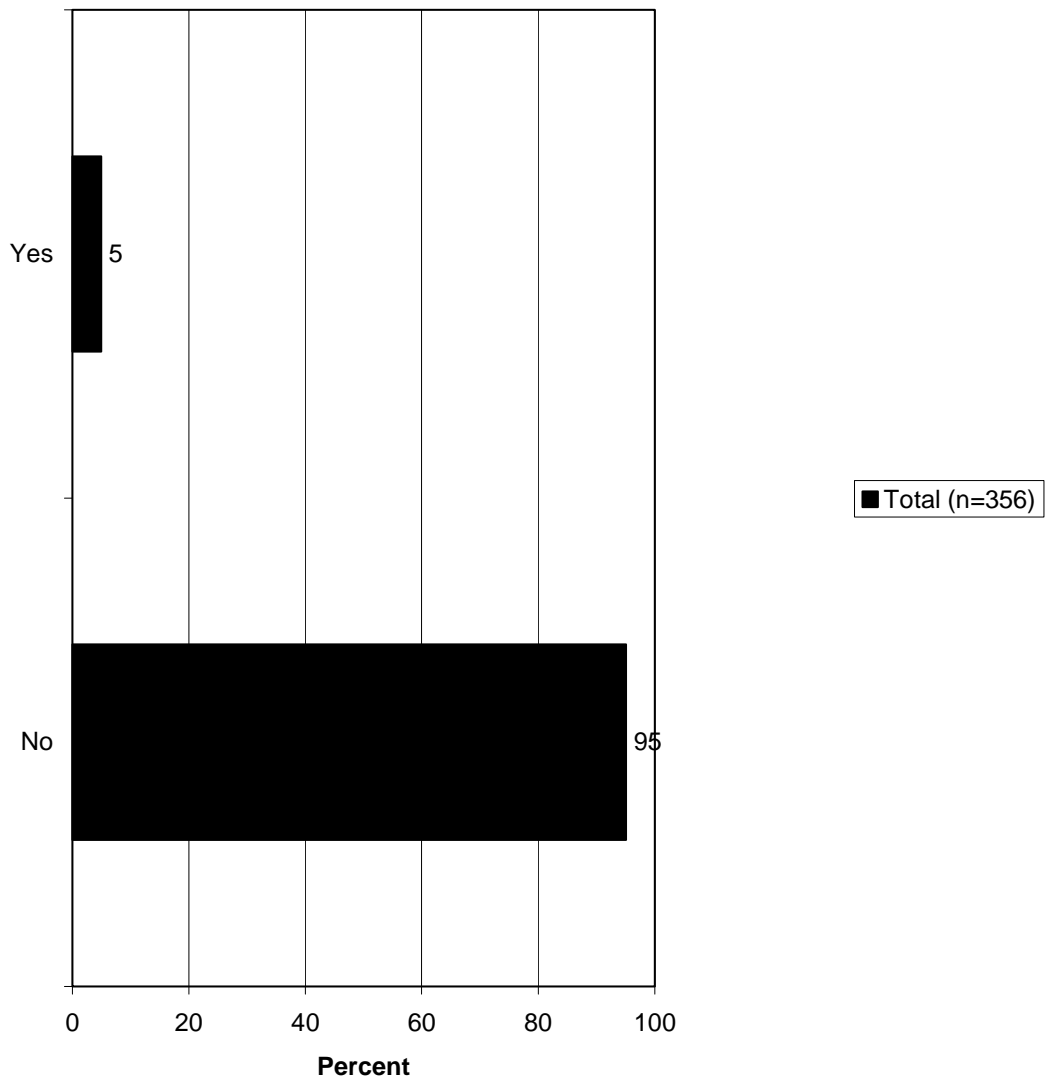

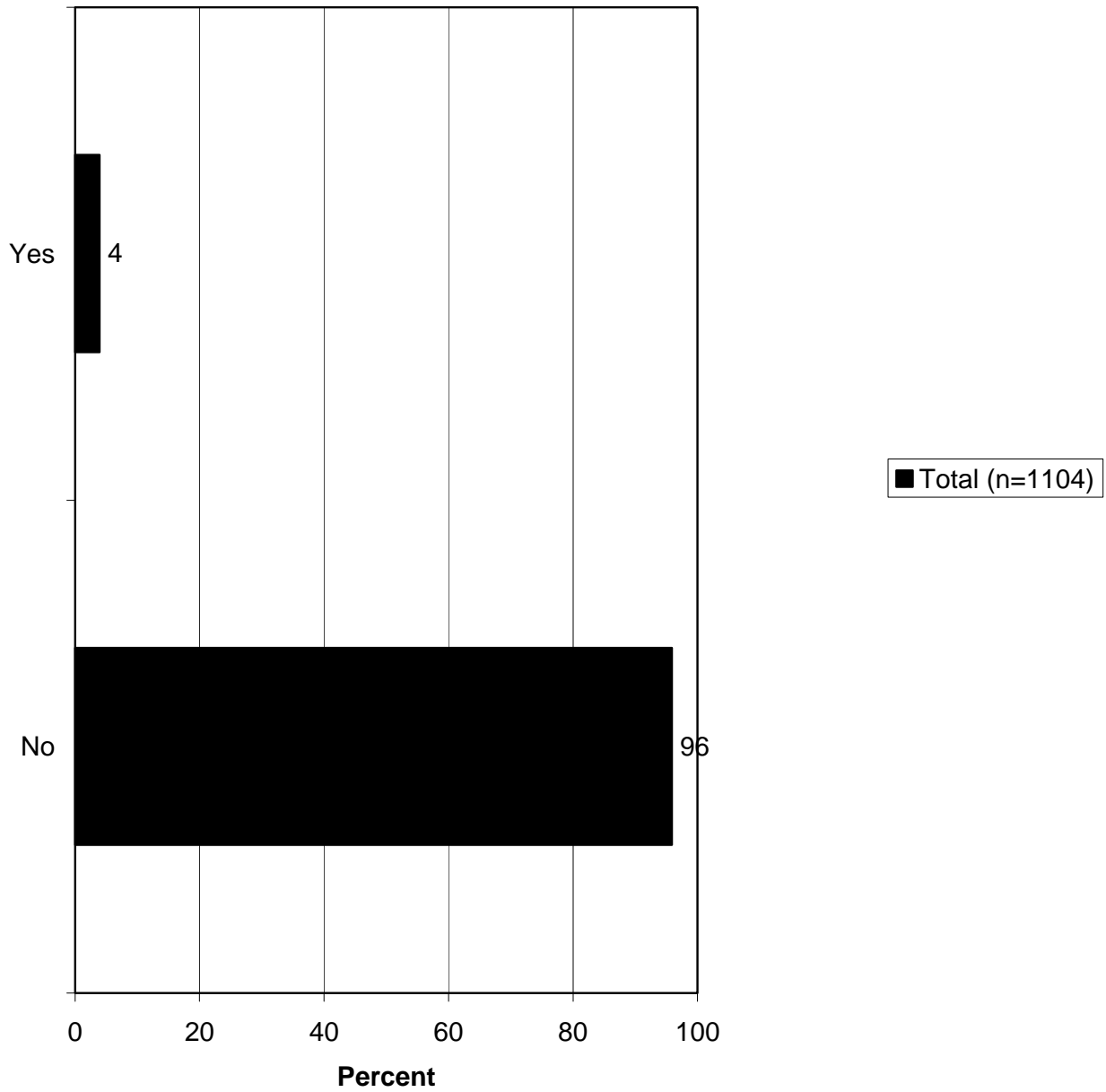

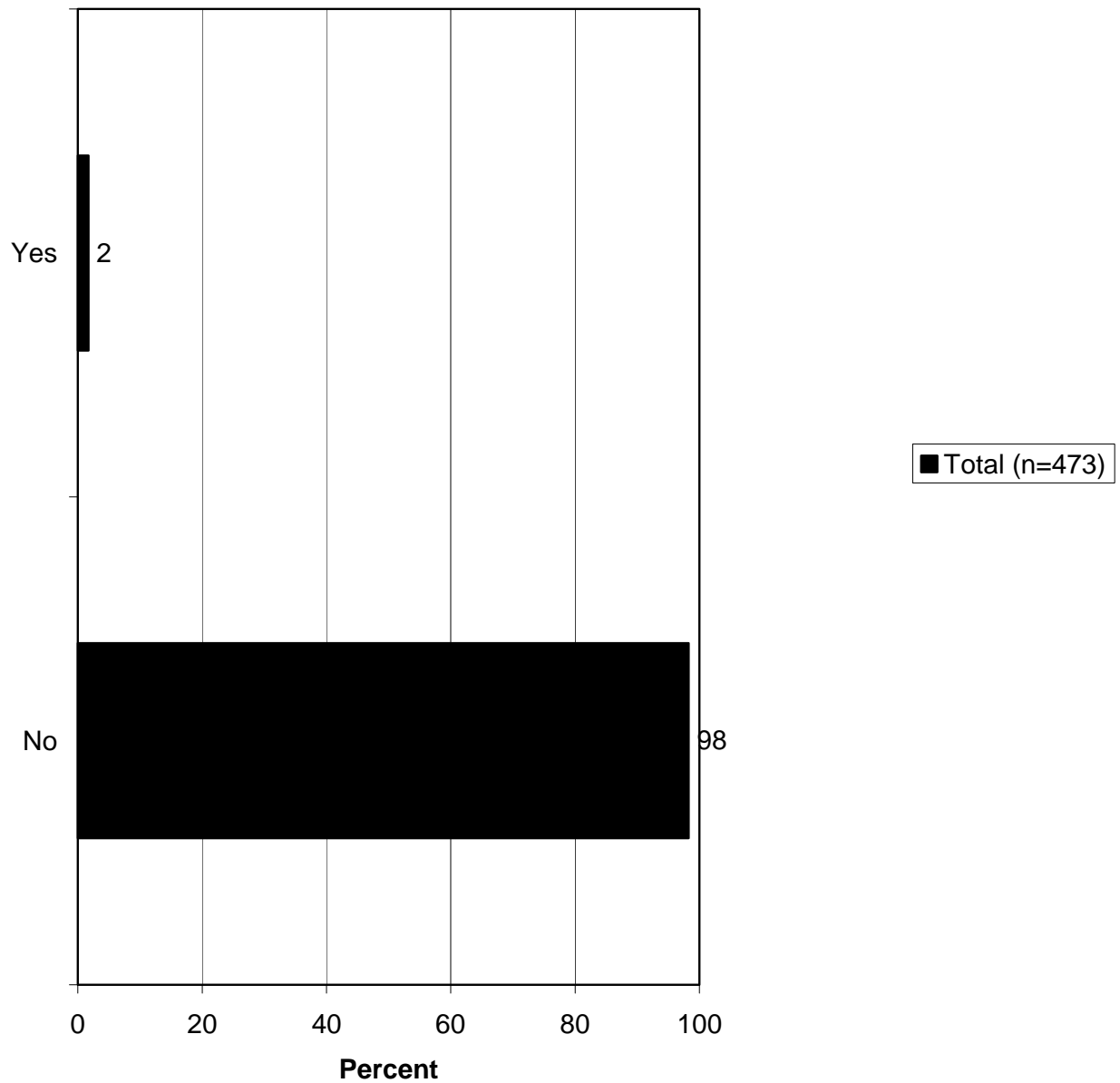
## **FISHING FROM BOATS AND FISHING WITH GUIDES**

- A low percentage of trout anglers (4%) have fished for trout from a boat with a paid guide in the past 12 months in Oregon. A smaller percentage of warmwater game fish anglers (2%) have fished for warmwater game fish from a boat with a paid guide in the past 12 months in Oregon.
  
- A substantial percentage of trout anglers (38%) say that they usually fish for trout from a boat, although more fish from the bank. Warmwater game fish anglers most commonly say that they usually fish for warmwater game fish from a boat (46%). **Q98. Have you fished for trout from a boat with a paid guide in the past 12 months? (Asked of those who fished for trout in Oregon in the past 12 months.)**



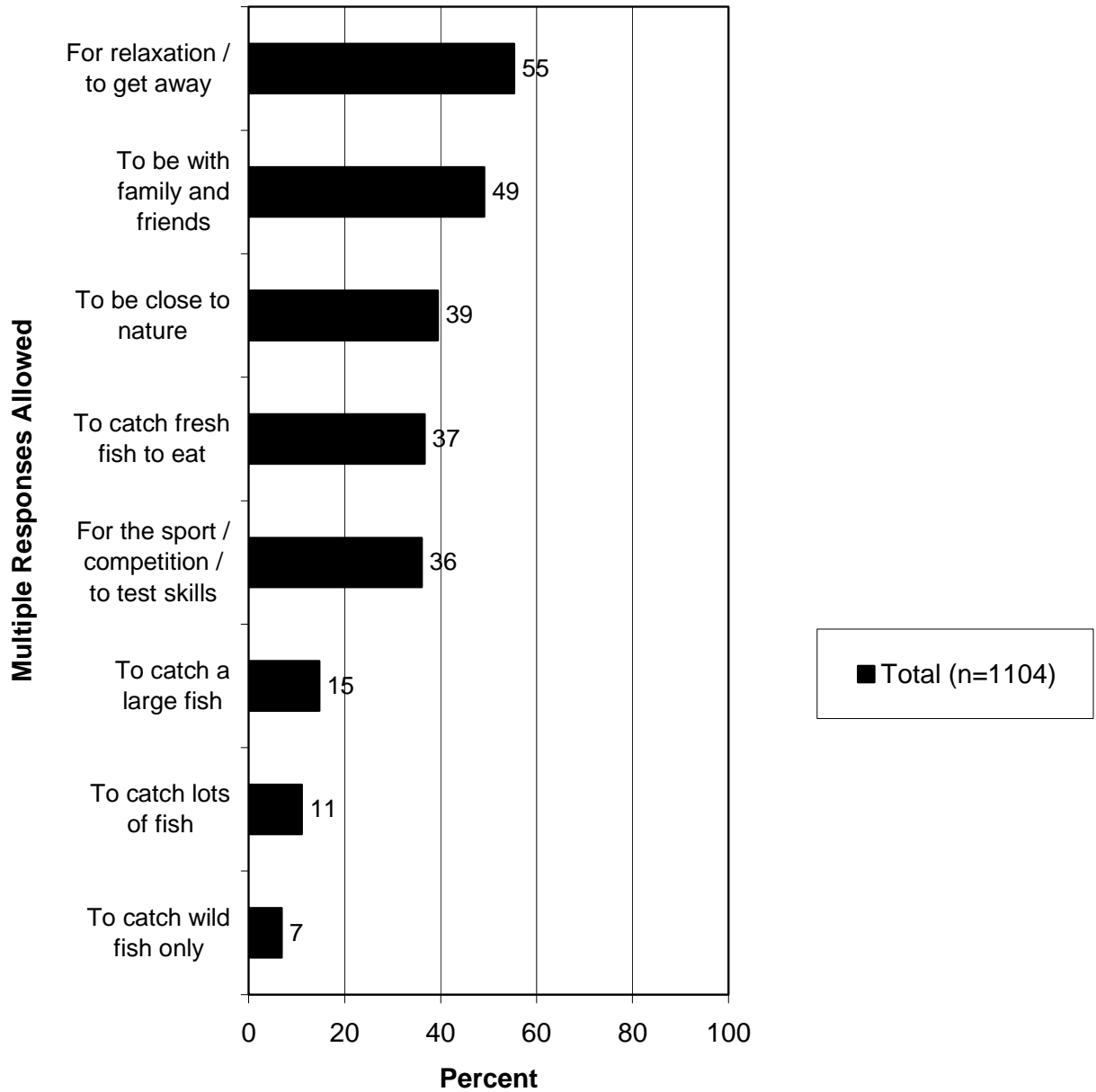

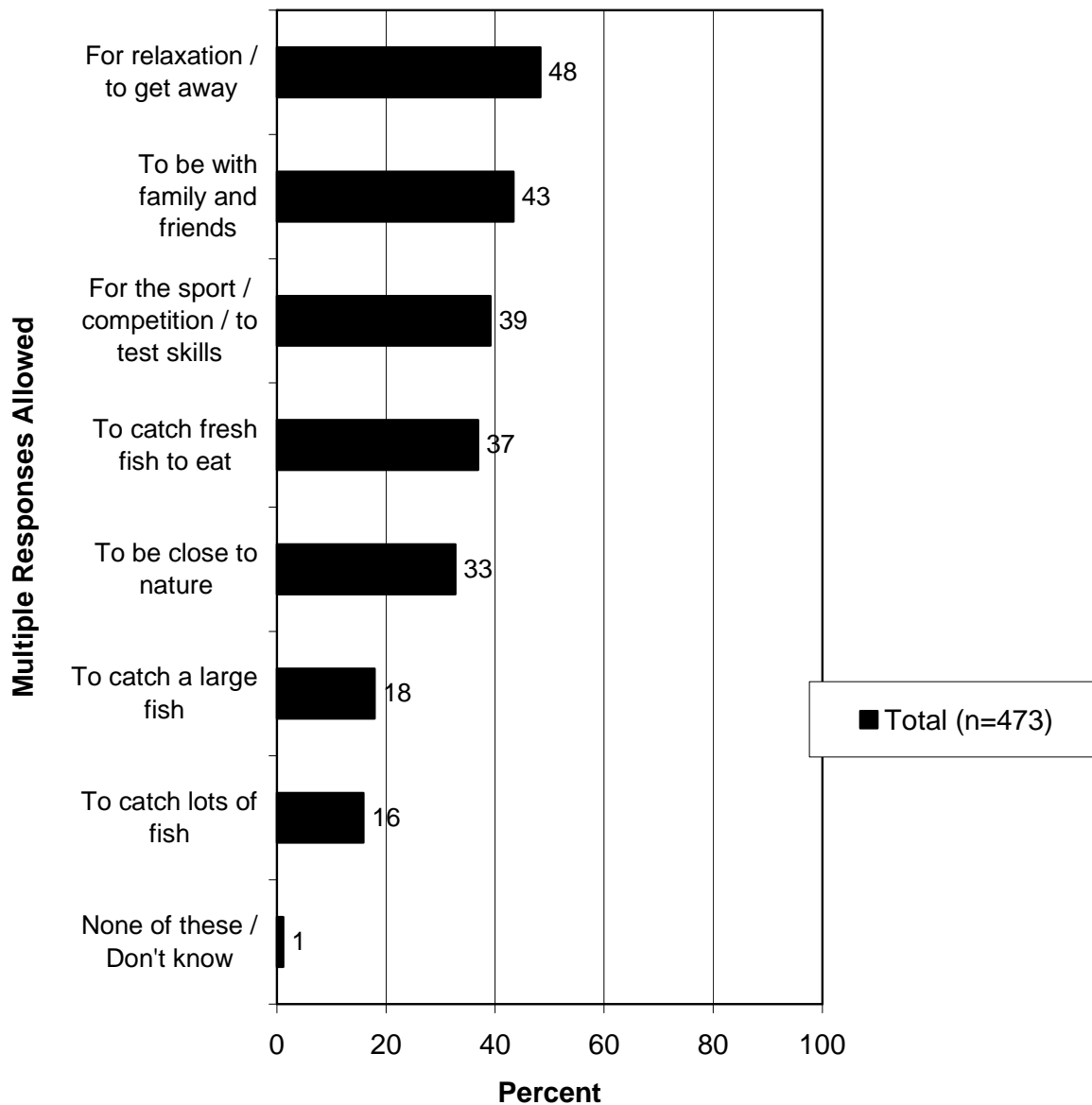
## MOTIVATIONS FOR FISHING

- The top motivations for fishing for trout are *not* utilitarian: for relaxation (55%), to be with family and friends (49%), and to be close to nature (39%). Nonetheless, a substantial percentage of trout anglers (37%) have a utilitarian reason to fish for trout: to catch fresh fish to eat.
  
- As with trout fishing, relaxation (48%), to be with family and friends (43%), and to be close to nature (33%) are important reasons for warmwater game fishing. Also similar to trout fishing, 37% of warmwater game fish anglers fish to catch fresh fish to eat.

## **SATISFACTION WITH FISHING AND RATINGS OF QUALITY OF FISHING**

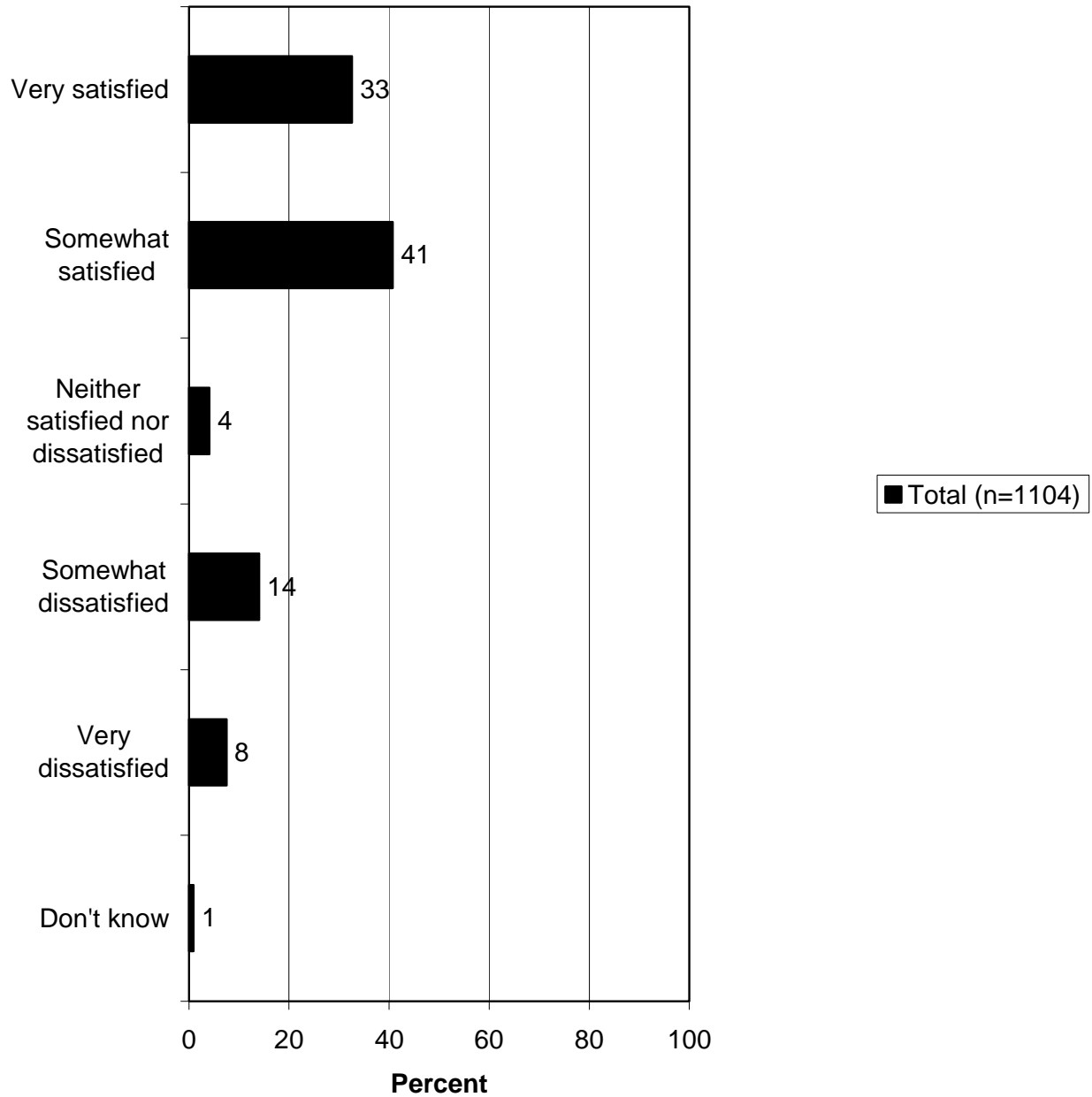
- Most of those who fished for trout (74%) were satisfied with their trout fishing in Oregon in the past 12 months; 22% were dissatisfied.
- Most of those who fished for warmwater game fish (75%) were satisfied with those fishing experiences in Oregon in the past 12 months; 17% were dissatisfied.
- Most of those who fished for trout (58%) rate the current quality of trout fishing in Oregon as excellent or good, while 39% rate it fair or poor. In a related question, the majority of trout anglers (58%) say their level of satisfaction with trout fishing has remained the same over the past 5 years; otherwise, the percentage saying that their satisfaction has decreased (22%) slightly exceeds the percentage saying that their satisfaction has increased (18%).
- Most of those who fished for warmwater game fish (58%) rate the current quality of warmwater game fishing in Oregon as excellent or good, while 37% rate it fair or poor. In a related question, the majority of warmwater game fish anglers (62%) say their level of satisfaction with warmwater game fishing has remained the same over the past 5 years; otherwise, the percentage saying that their satisfaction has decreased (20%) slightly exceeds the percentage saying that their satisfaction has increased (17%).
- Regarding stocked trout, an overwhelming majority of trout anglers (82%) agree that stocked trout improve the quality of trout fishing in Oregon. Conversely, an overwhelming majority of trout anglers (83%) disagree that stocked trout take away from fishing and make fishing less enjoyable.
- Catch-and-release does not appear to negatively affect enjoyment of fishing and may even enhance enjoyment. More trout anglers say that releasing a trout makes fishing more enjoyable (41%) than say doing so makes trout fishing less enjoyable (12%). Most commonly, they say releasing has no effect on enjoyment (42%). Likewise, more warmwater game fish anglers say that releasing warmwater game fish makes fishing more enjoyable

(42%) than say it makes fishing less enjoyable (8%); most commonly, they say it has no effect (48%) on their enjoyment of warmwater game fish angling. (These graphs are shown in the section of this report titled, "Opinions on Catch-and-Release.")

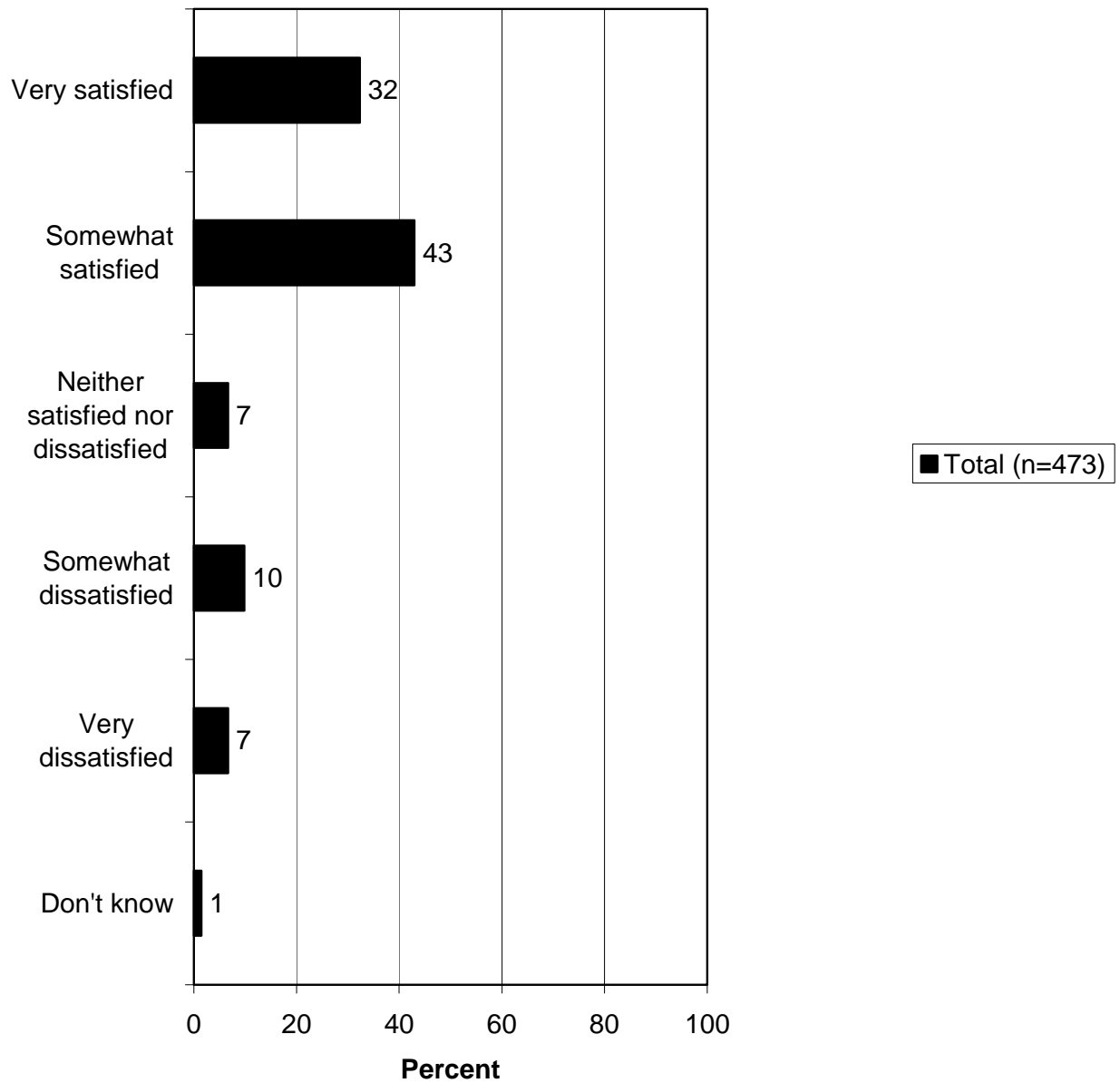
- The results regarding the length of a fish to be considered a quality fish are tabulated for comparison. Walleye and catfish have the largest size to be considered quality; crappie and panfish have the smallest quality size. In general, eastern anglers want longer fish than do western anglers. For each species, only those who fish for that species were asked the question.
- The survey asked trout anglers what they felt was the minimum length for a trout to be considered a quality trout. At 12 inches, 75% of trout anglers consider it to be a quality trout; at 10 inches, 43% consider it to be a quality trout.
  - Regarding bass, at 12 inches, 65% of bass anglers consider it to be a quality bass; at 10 inches, only 27% consider it to be a quality bass.
  - Regarding crappie, at 10 inches, 82% of crappie anglers consider it to be a quality crappie; at 8 inches, 54% consider it to be a quality crappie.
  - Regarding panfish, at 8 inches, 73% of panfish anglers consider it to be a quality panfish; at 6 inches, 34% consider it to be a quality panfish.
  - Regarding catfish, at 14 inches, 59% of catfish anglers consider it to be a quality catfish; at 12 inches, 44% consider it to be a quality catfish.
  - Regarding walleye, at 15 inches, 57% of walleye anglers consider it to be a quality walleye; at 12 inches, only 27% consider it to be a quality walleye.
  - Regarding warmwater game fish, at 12 inches, 78% of warmwater game fish anglers consider it to be a quality fish; at 10 inches, 37% consider it to be a quality fish.

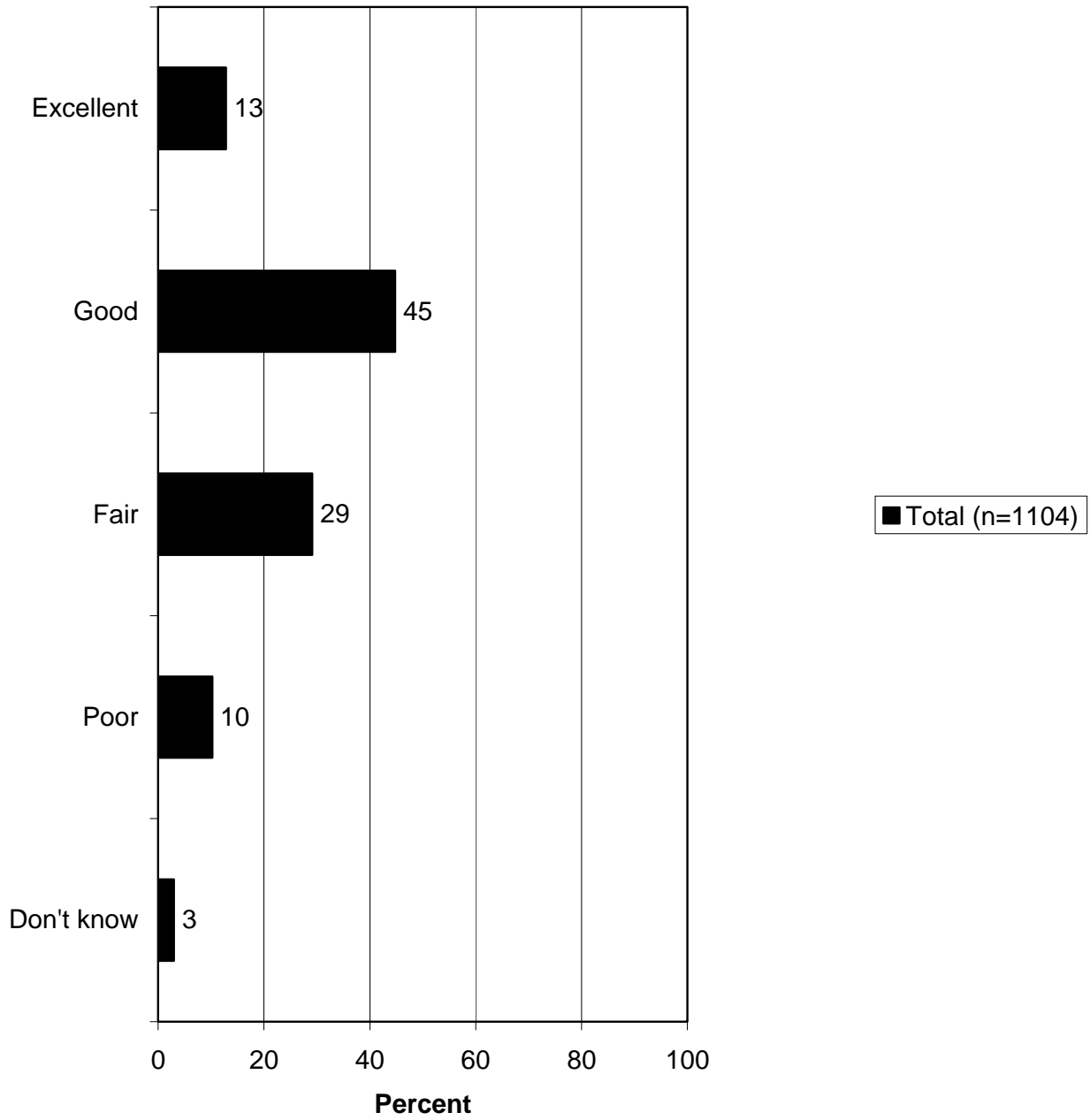

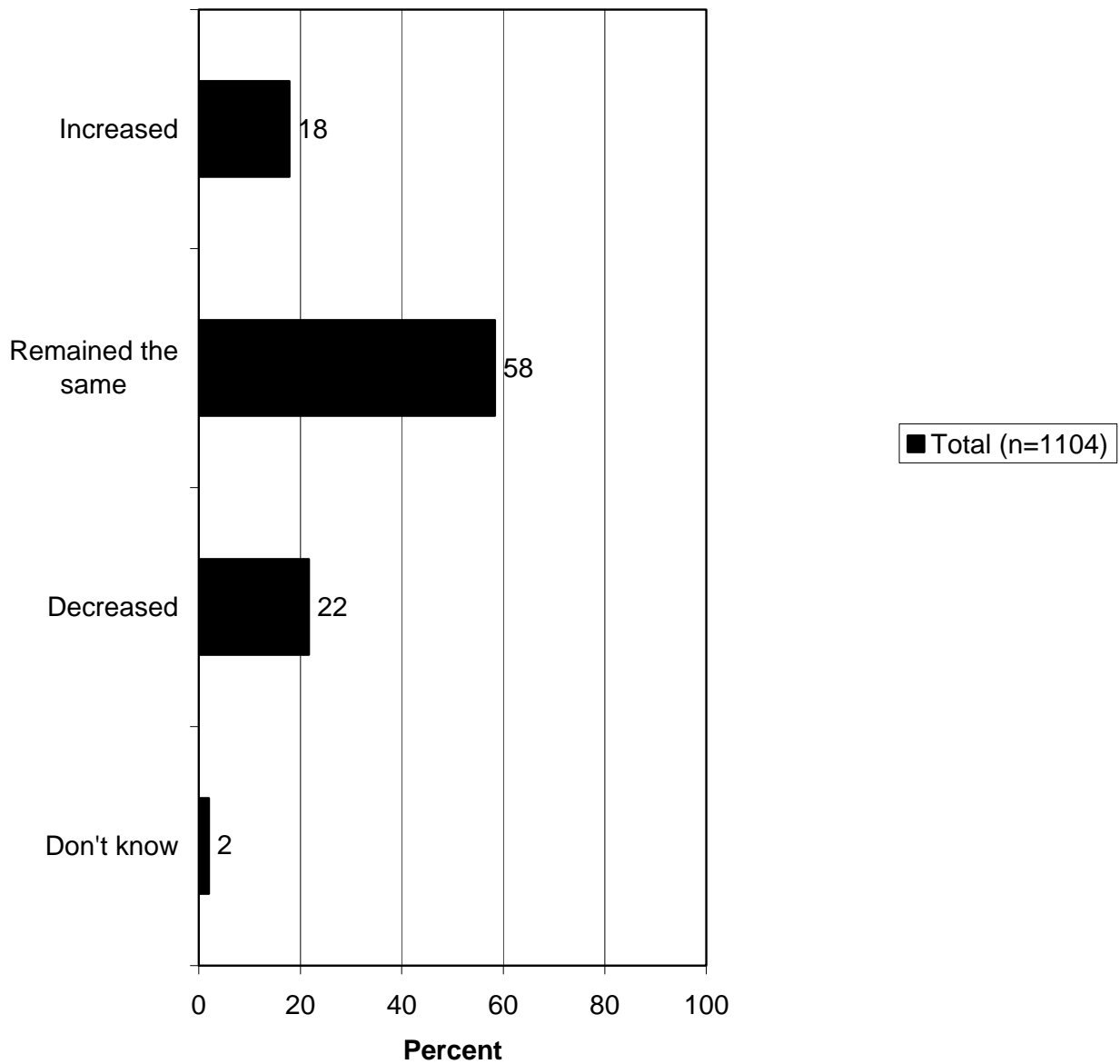

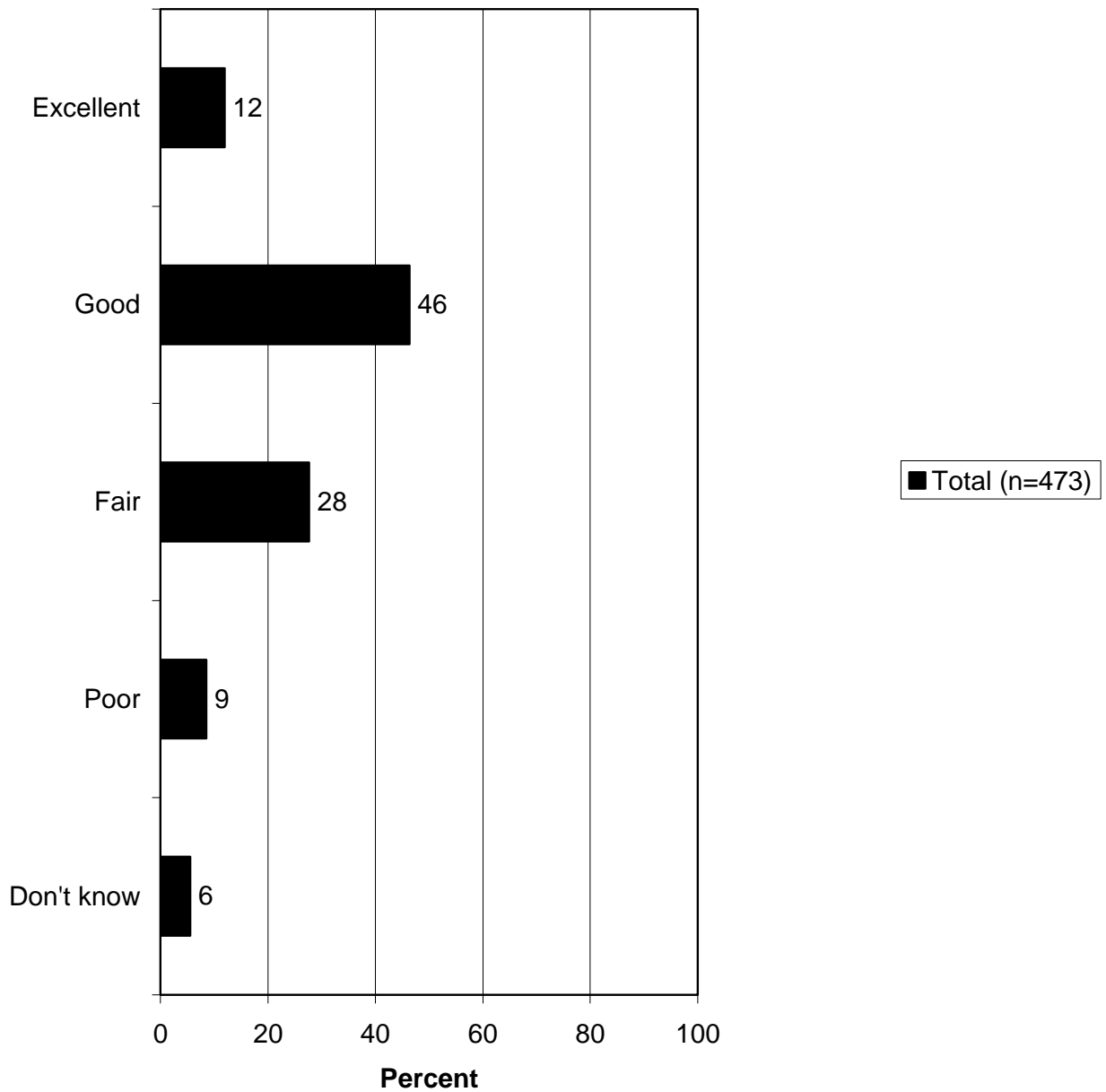
**Q85. How would you rate the current quality of trout fishing in Oregon? (Asked of those who fished for trout in Oregon in the past 12 months.)**



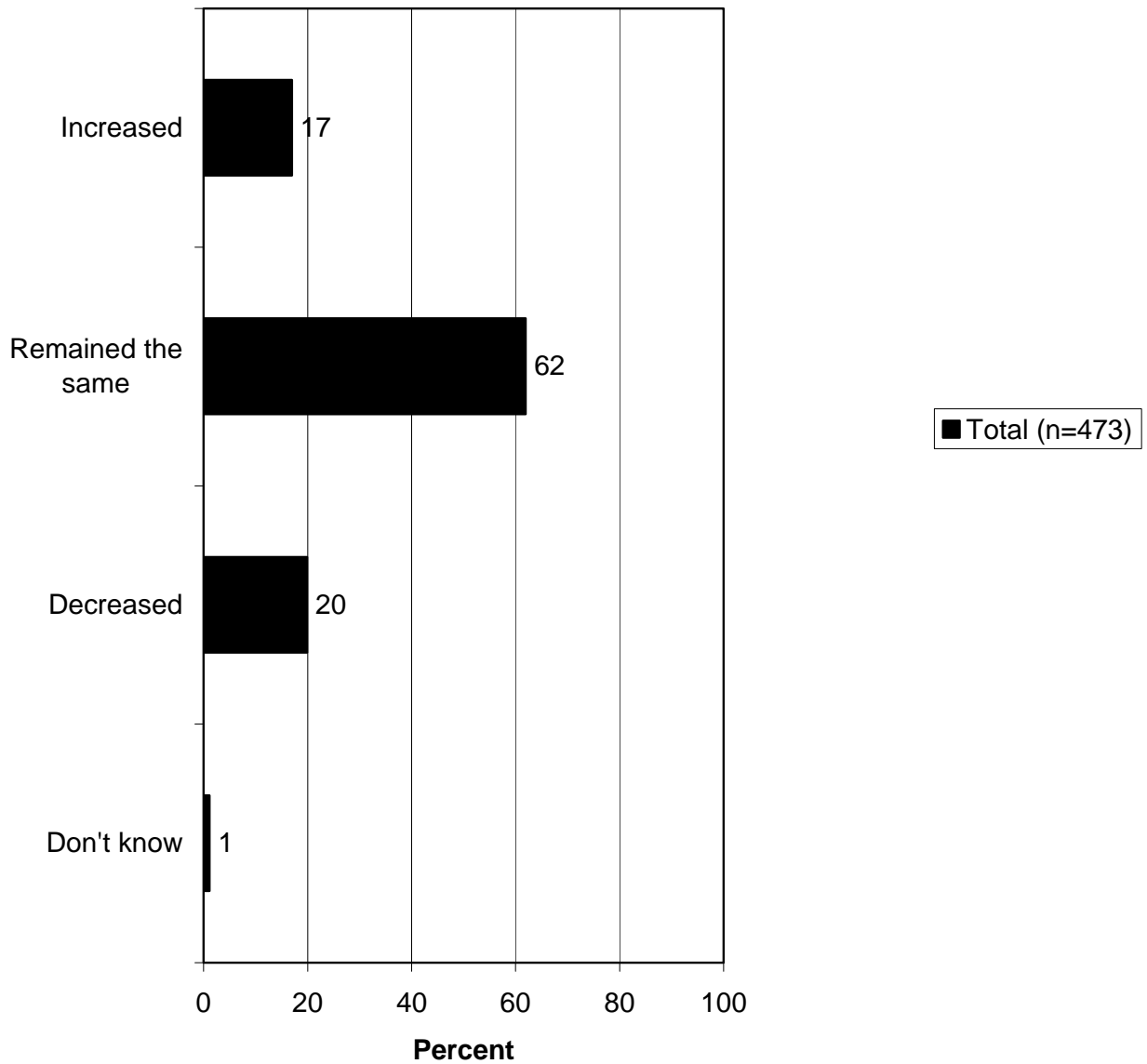

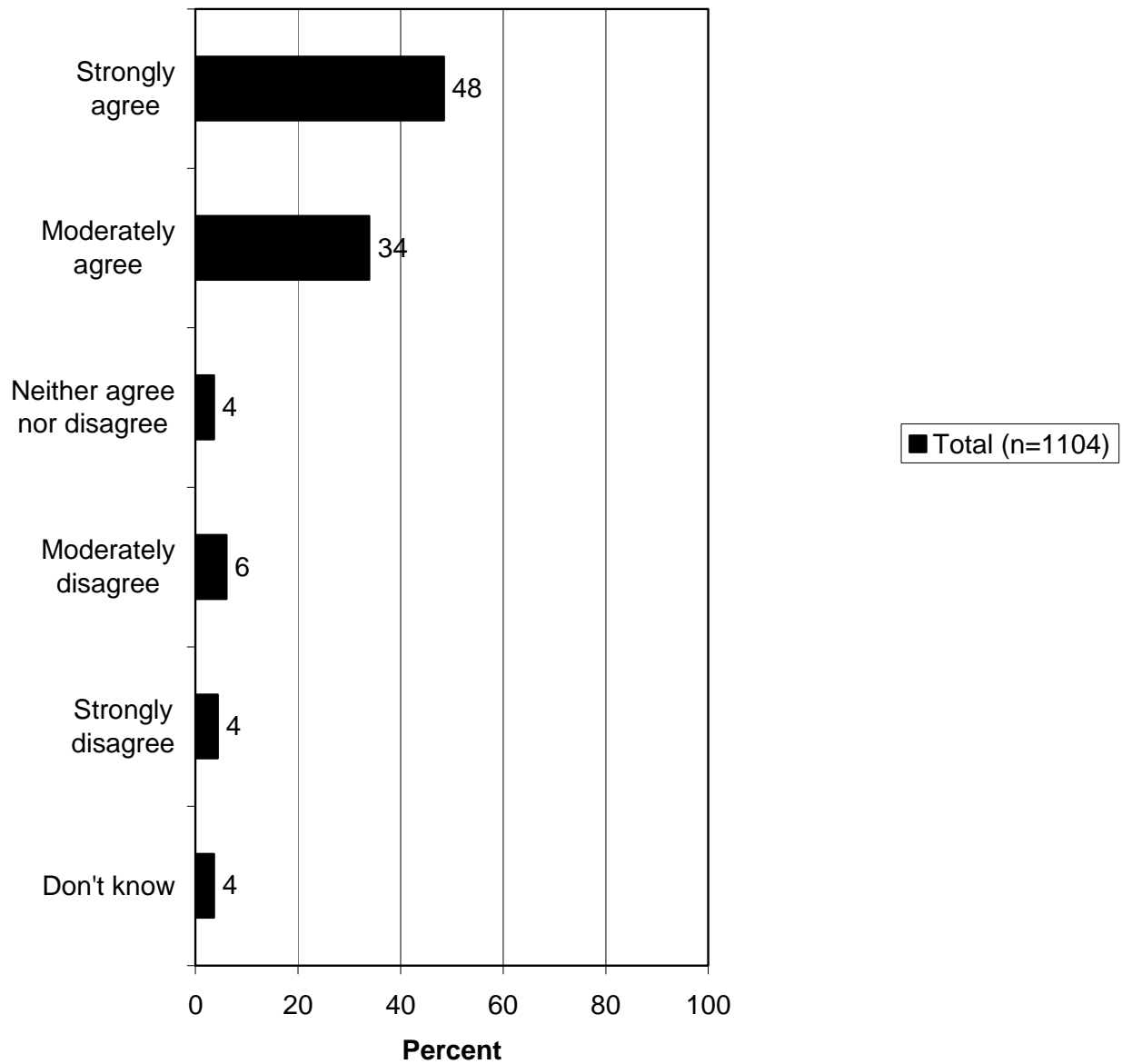

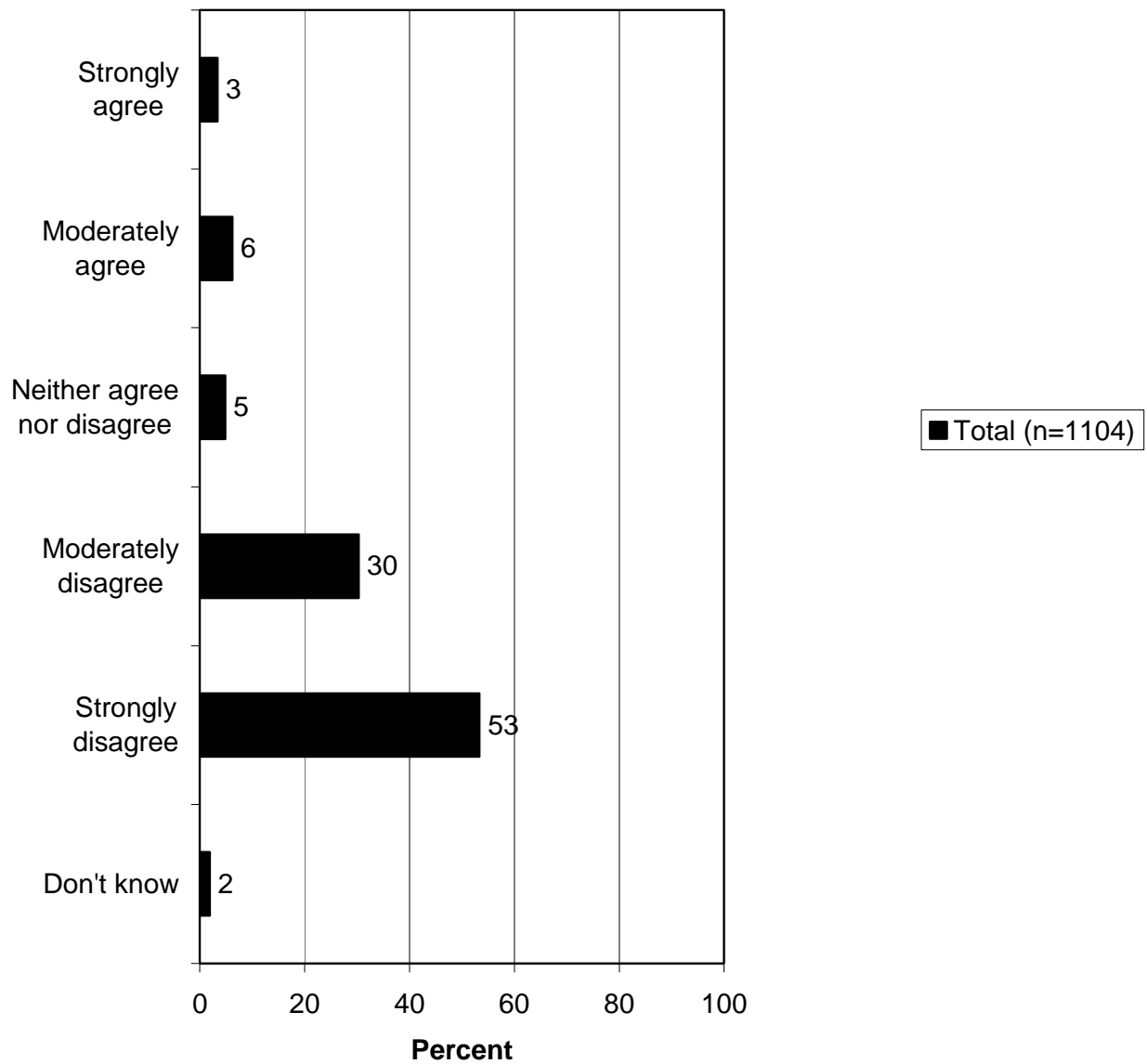

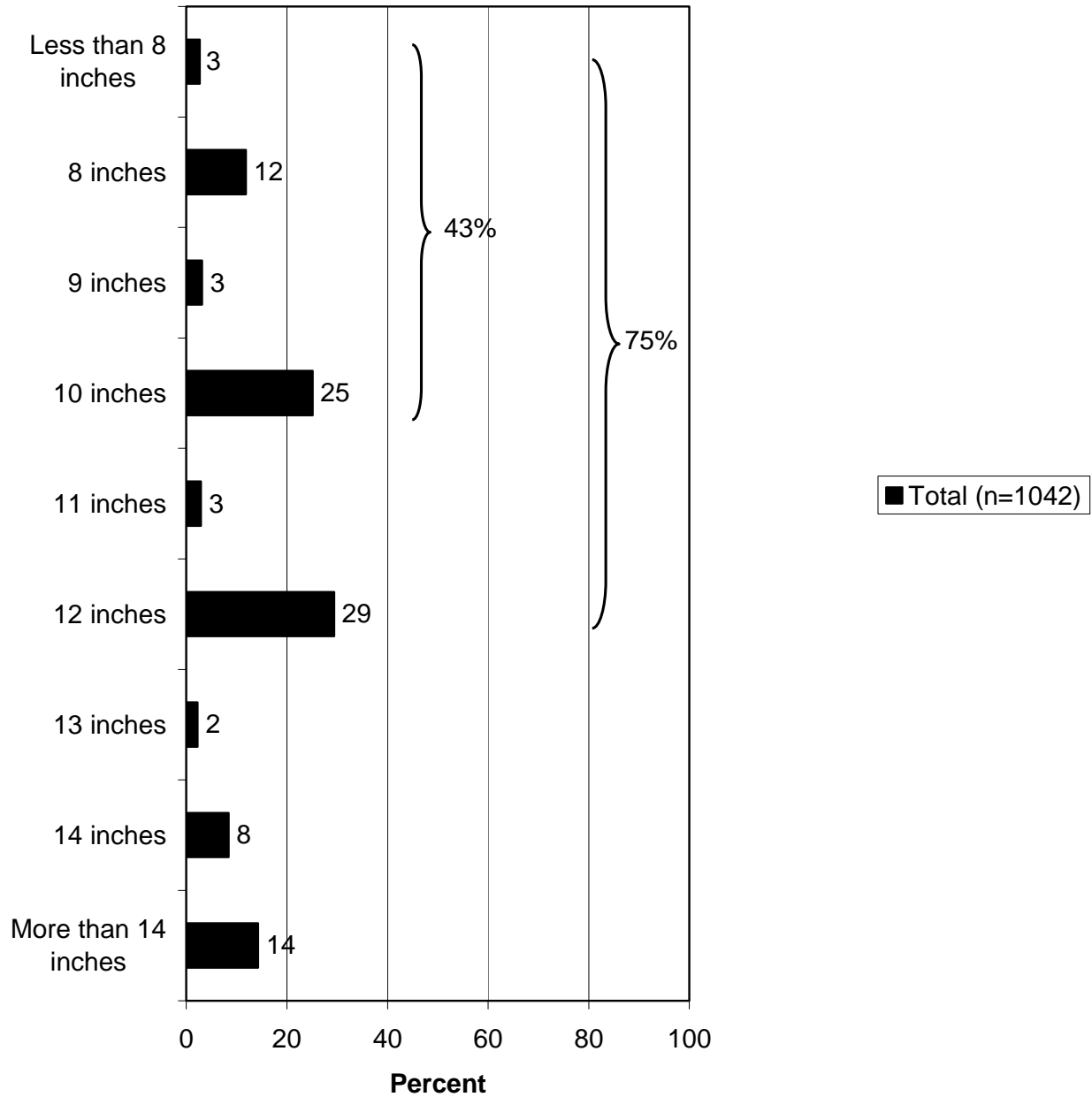

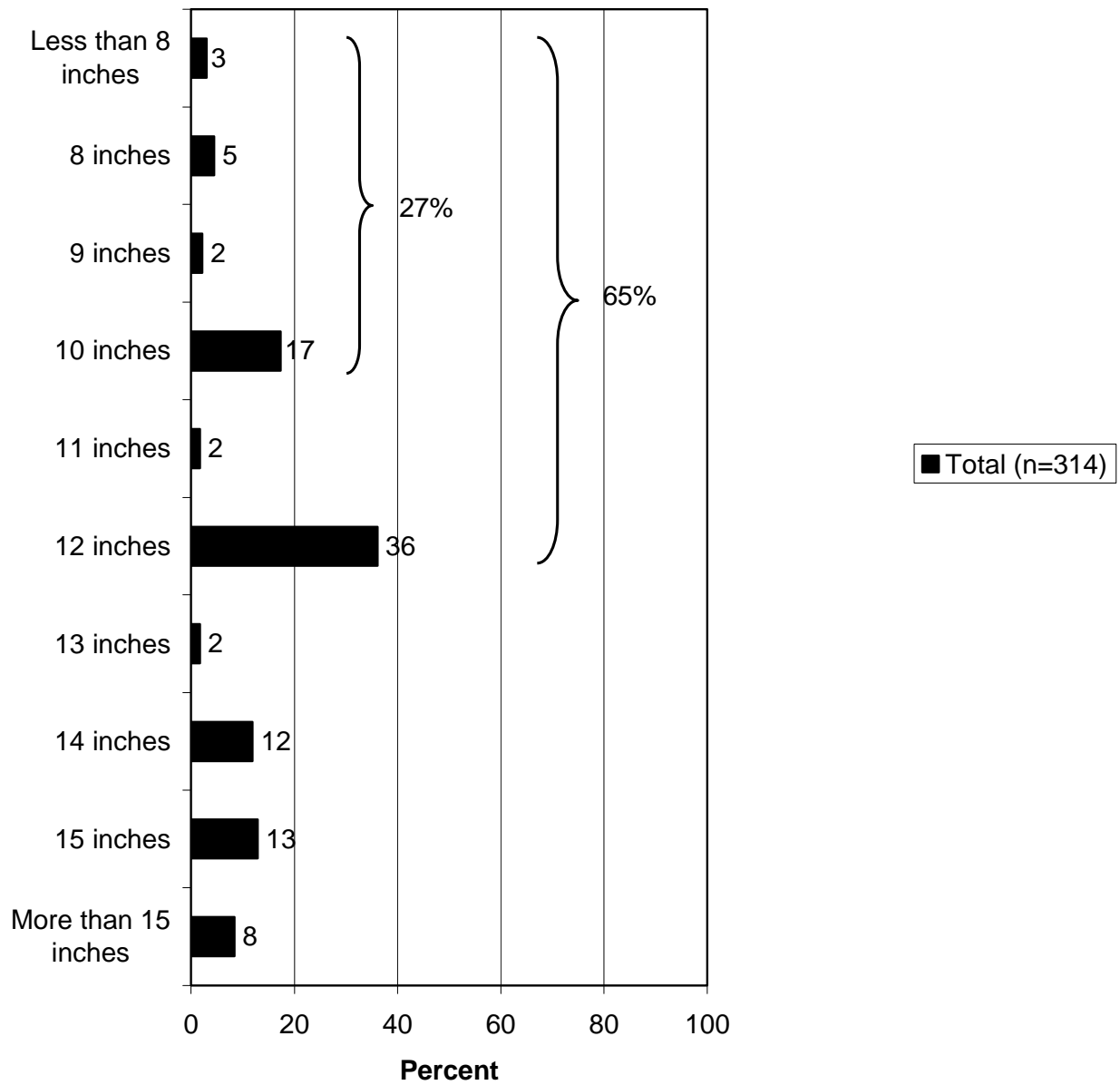

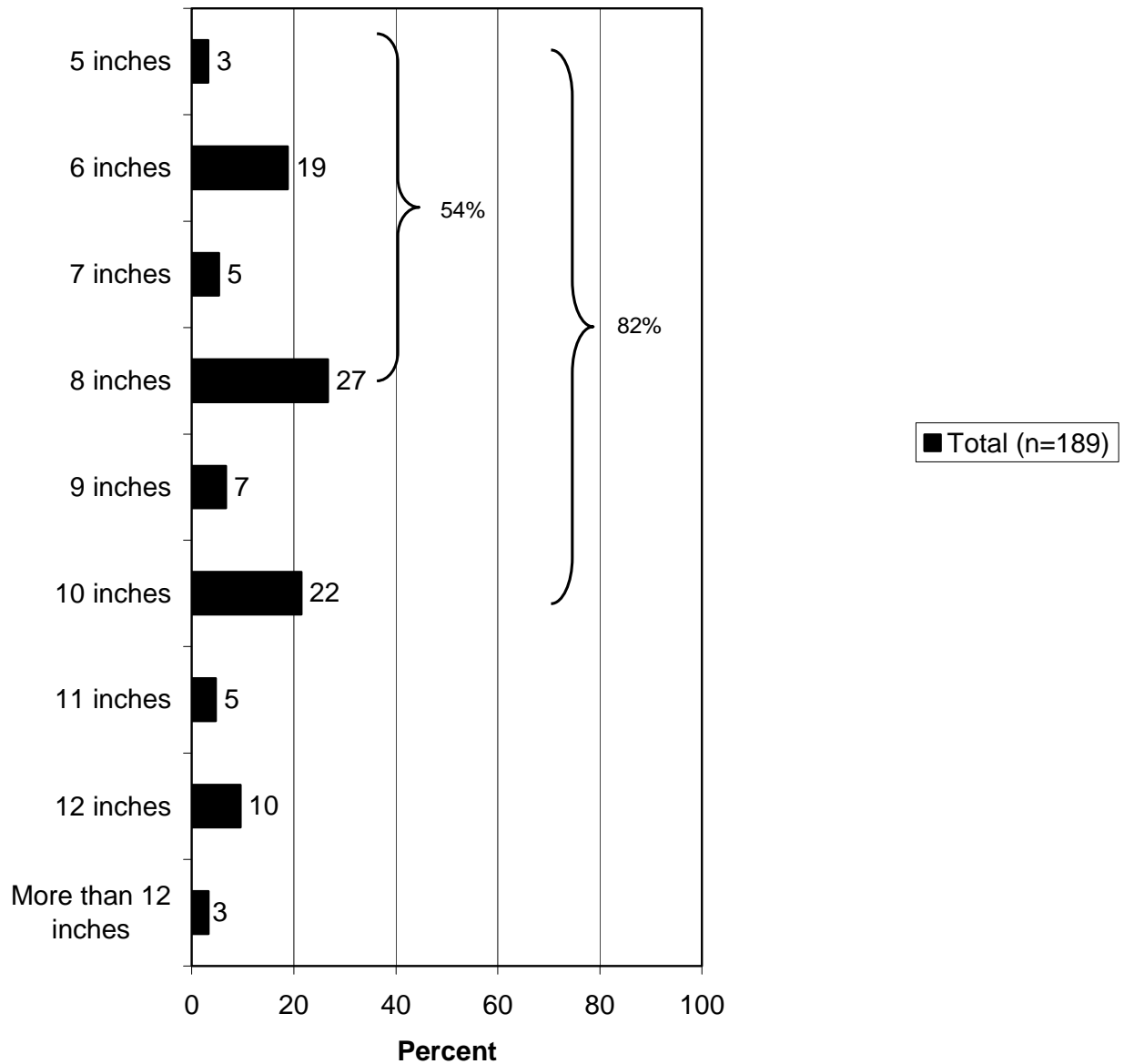

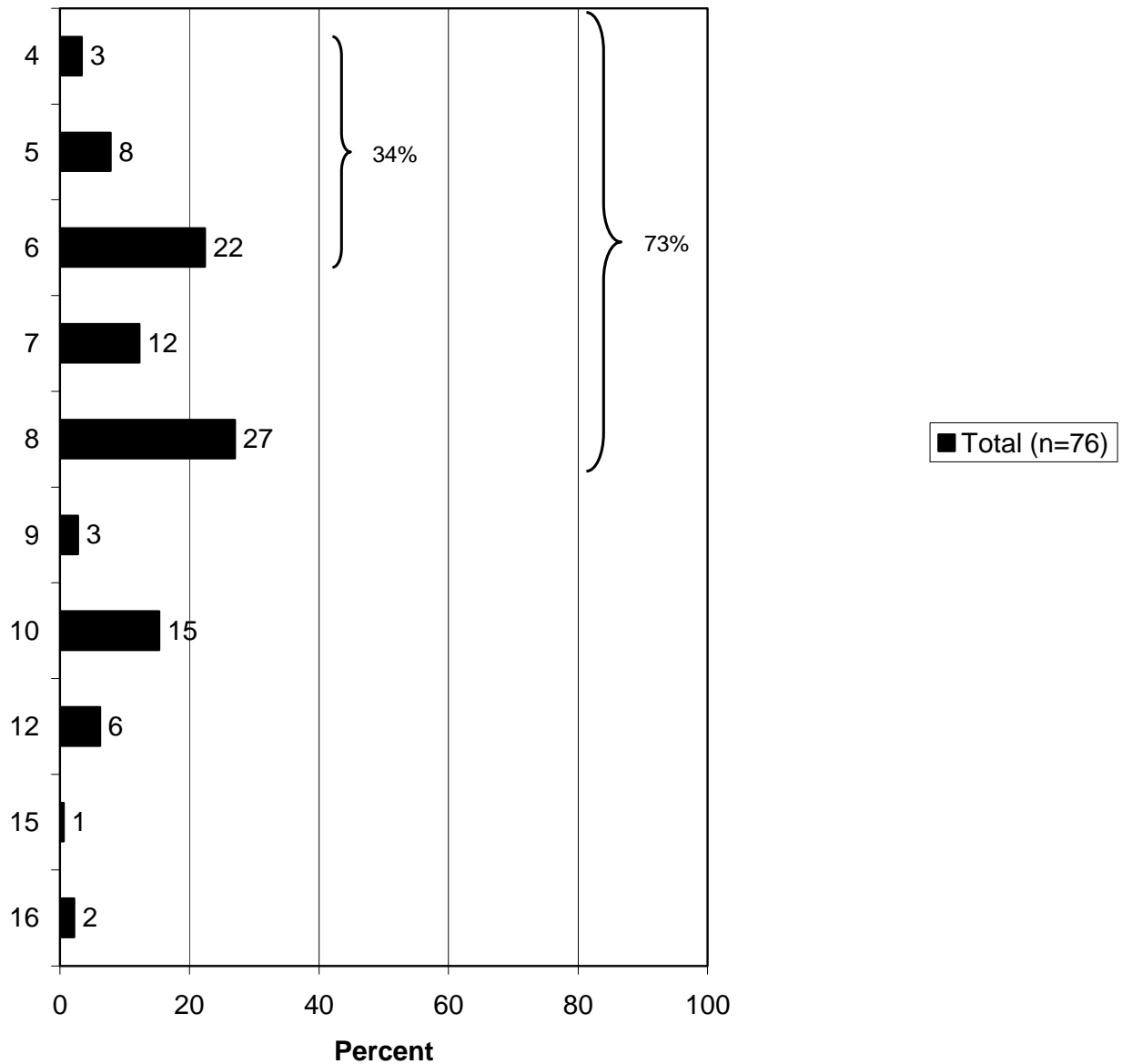

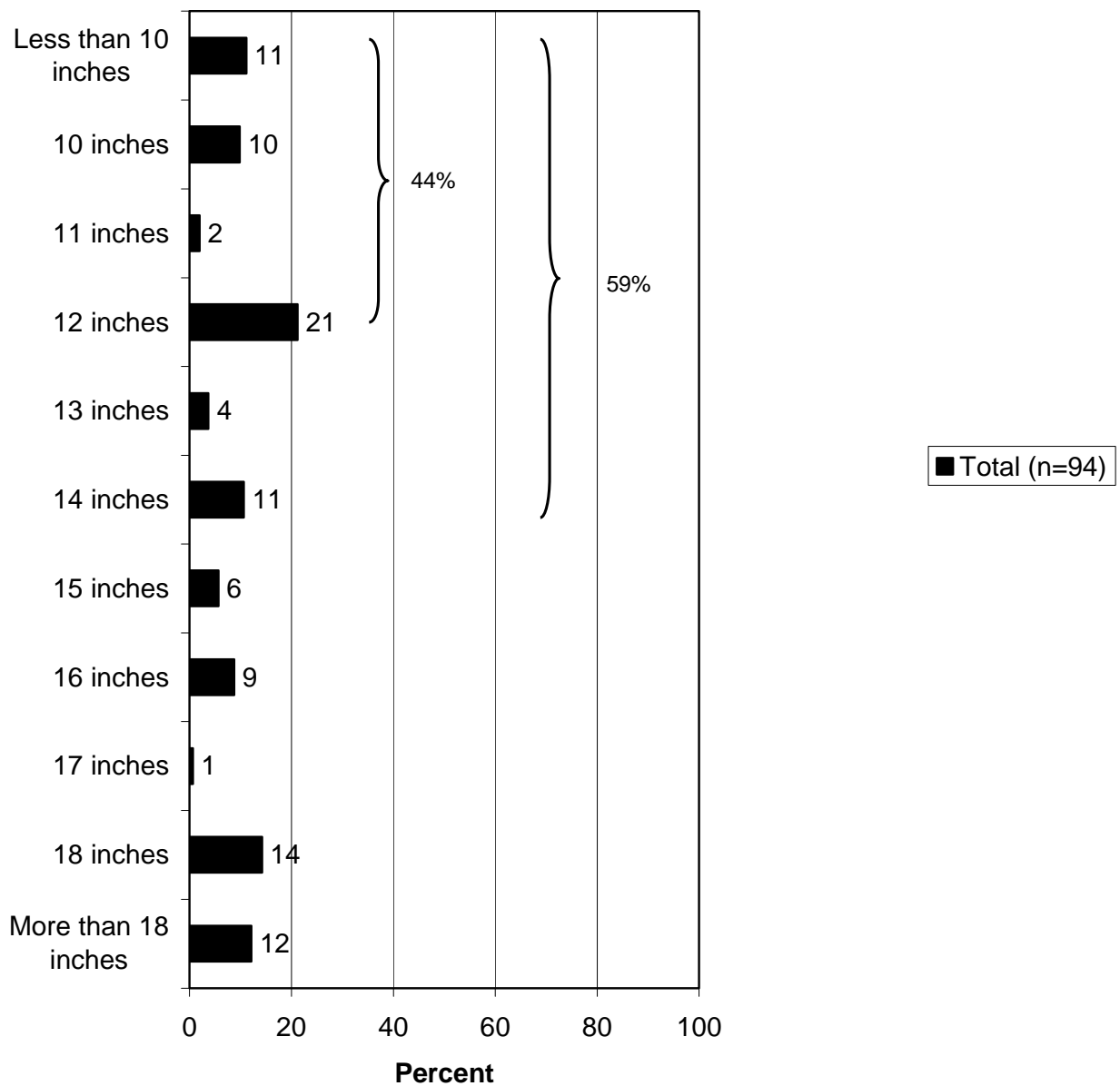

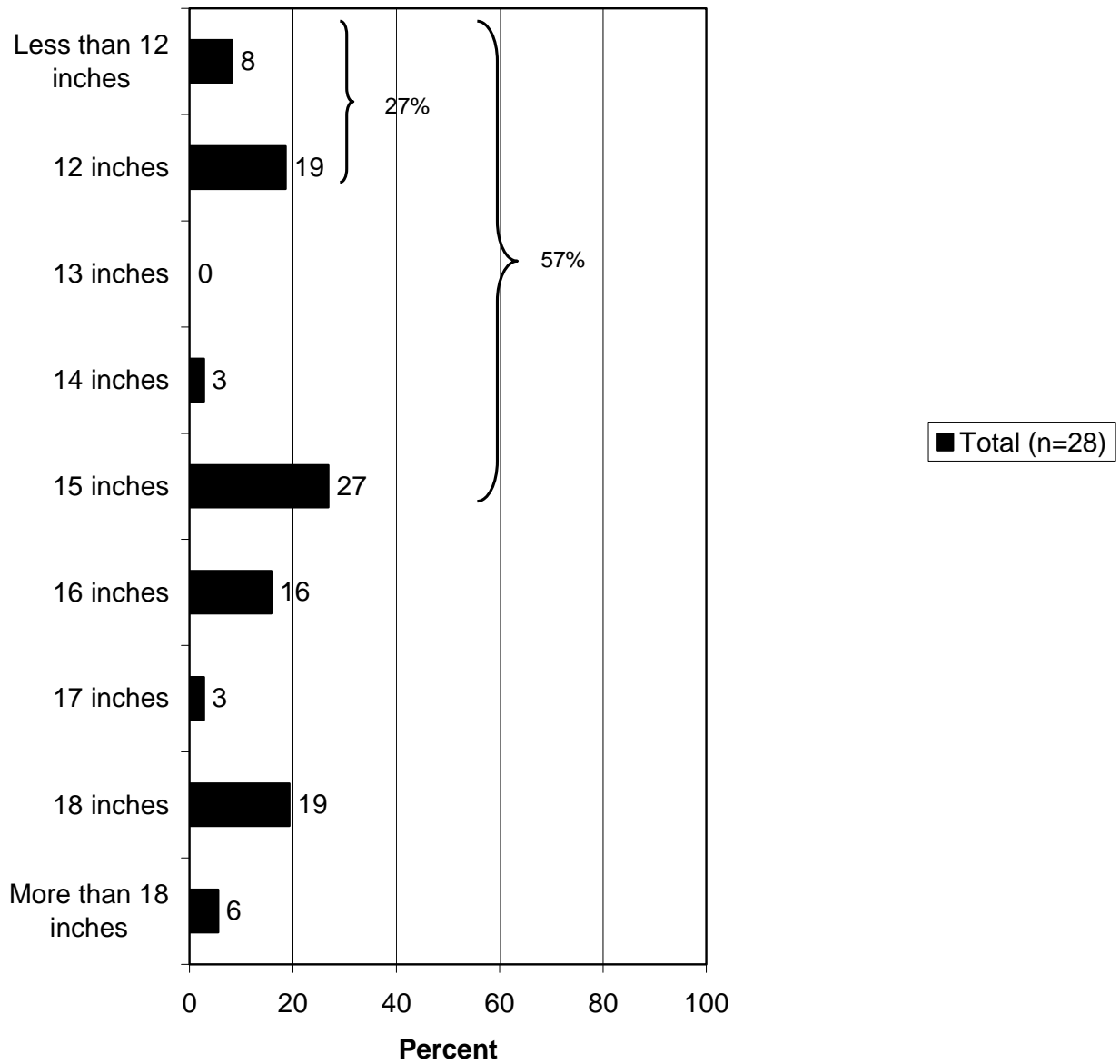

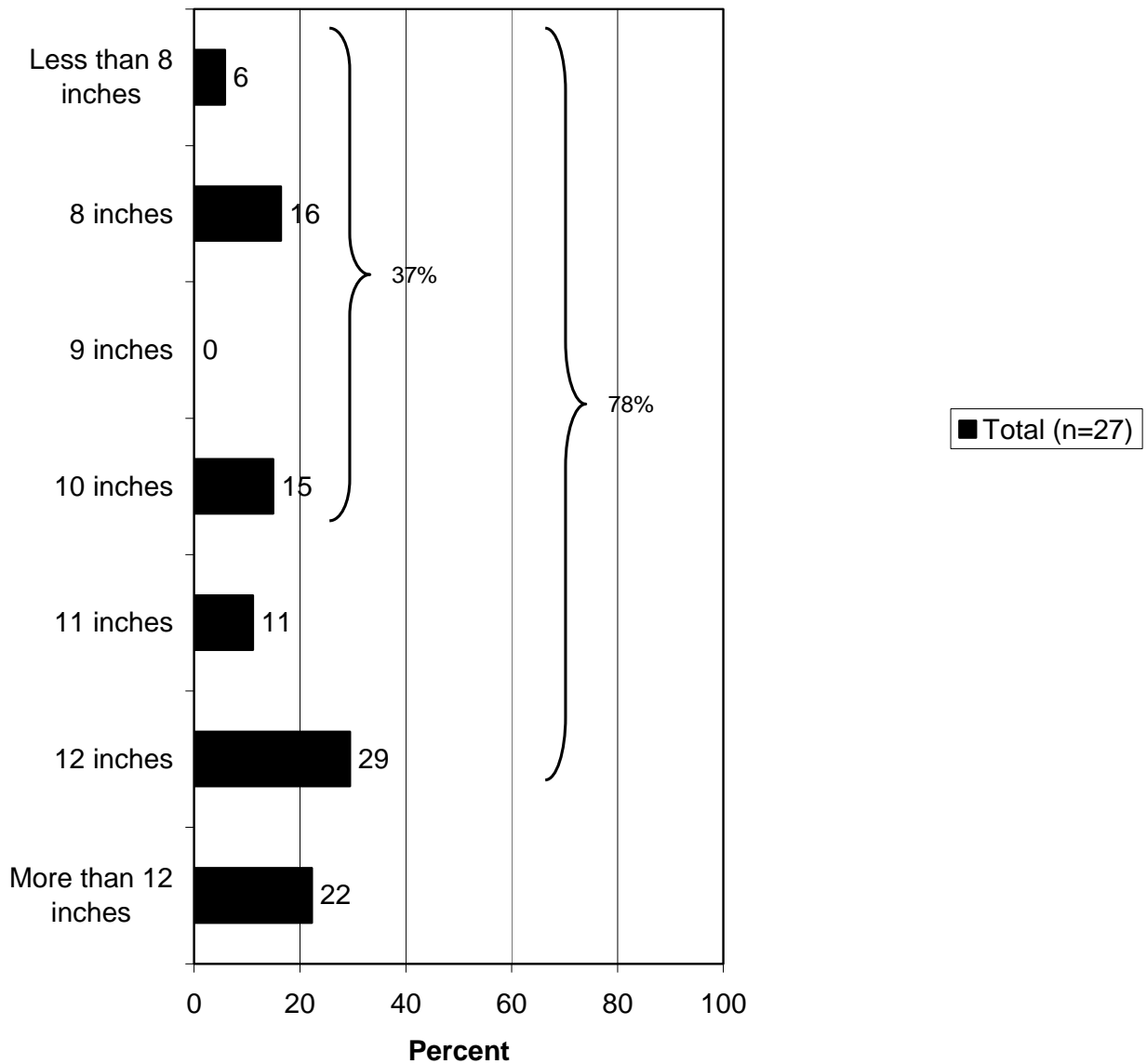

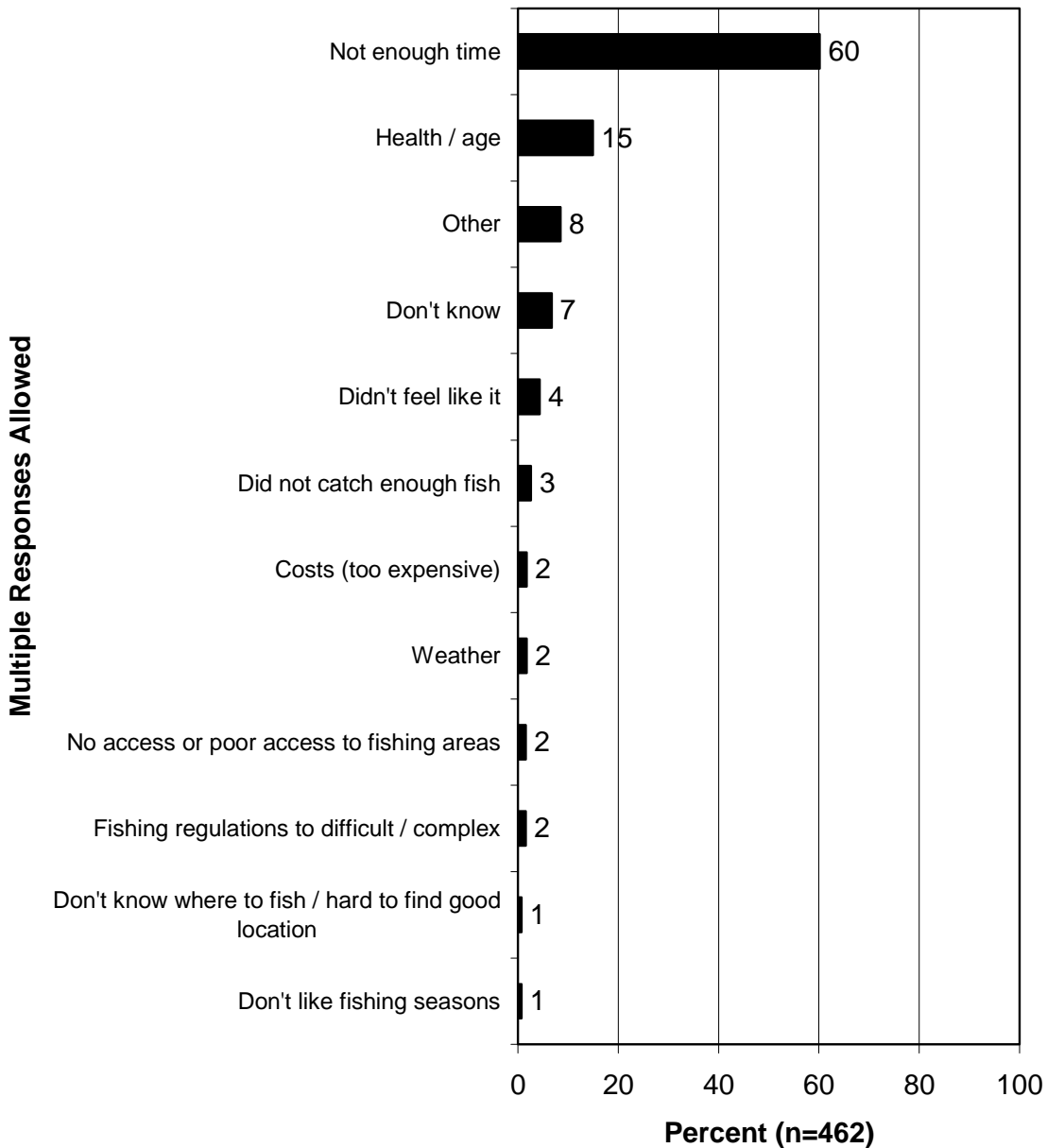

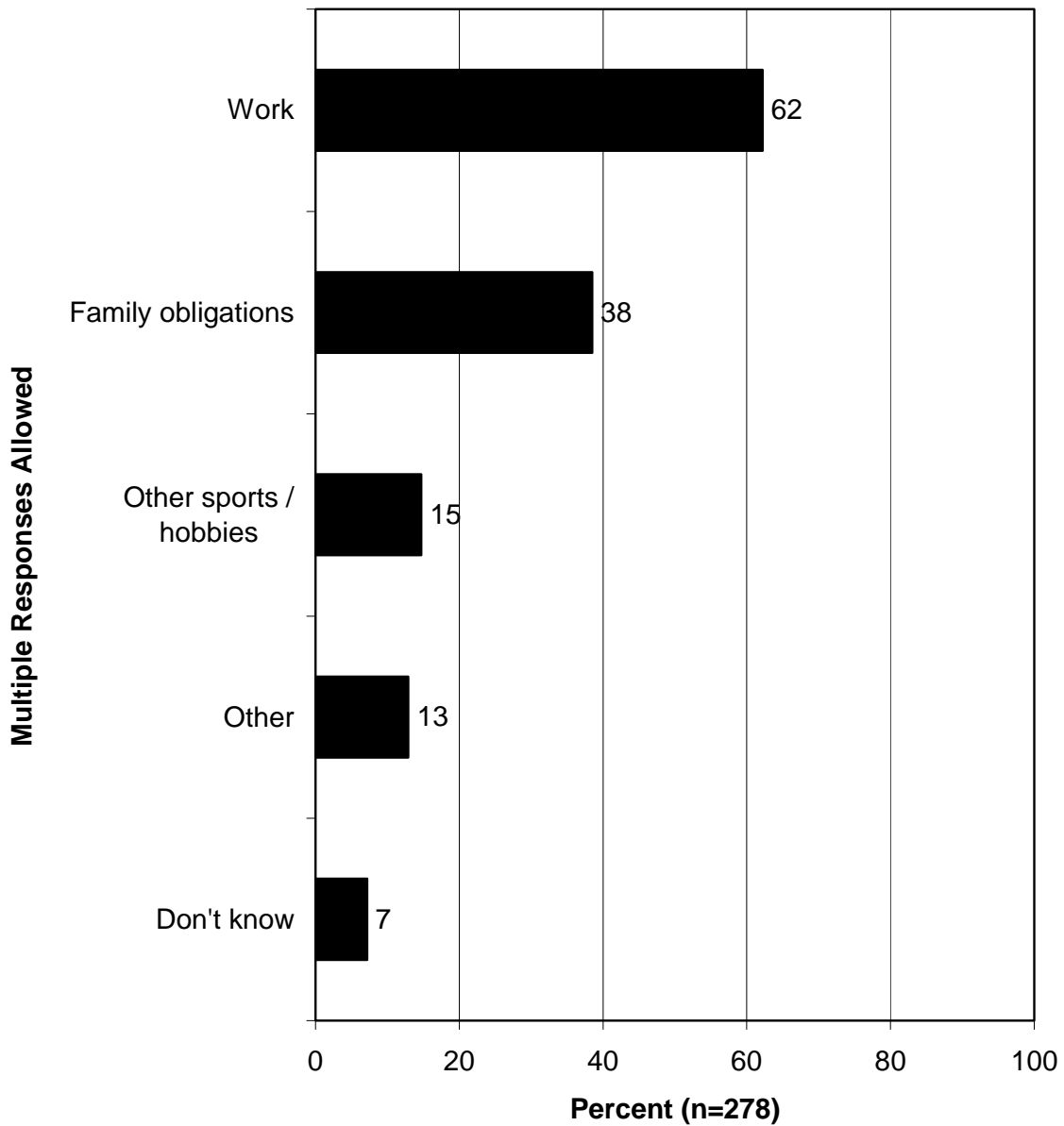
## CONSTRAINTS TO FISHING PARTICIPATION AND DISSATISFACTIONS WITH FISHING

- Those who were screened out of the survey because they had not fished in Oregon in the 12 months previous to the survey (i.e., inactive Oregon licensed anglers) were first asked why they had not fished in the previous 12 months. Time was, by far, the most important constraint, with age/health as a minor, but important, constraint. Of those who said that time was a constraint, work obligations were the most typical reason that time was a constraint.
- Among active trout anglers, lack of time (17%) is the most important constraint to participation and/or enjoyment of trout fishing, followed by not catching enough fish (11%) and that the fishing areas are too crowded (7%). Note that 40% of active trout anglers indicated that nothing takes away from their enjoyment or causes them to fish less often than they would like.
- Among active warmwater game fish anglers, lack of time (15%) is the most important constraint to participation and/or enjoyment of warmwater game fishing, followed by not catching enough fish (8%) and access issues (6%). Note that 44% of warmwater game fish anglers indicated that nothing takes away from their enjoyment or causes them to fish less often than they would like.
- Catch-and-release regulations are not an important constraint to fishing participation, as a large majority of trout anglers (72%) say that catch-and-release regulations do *not* cause them to fish for trout less often (only 20% say those regulations cause them to *not* fish as often). (This graph is shown in the section of this report titled, “Opinions on Catch-and-Release.”)
- The presence of stocked trout is not an important constraint to fishing participation, as an overwhelming majority of trout anglers (83%) disagree that stocked trout take away from fishing and make fishing less enjoyable. (This graph is shown in the section of this report titled, “Satisfaction with Fishing and Ratings of Quality of Fishing.”)

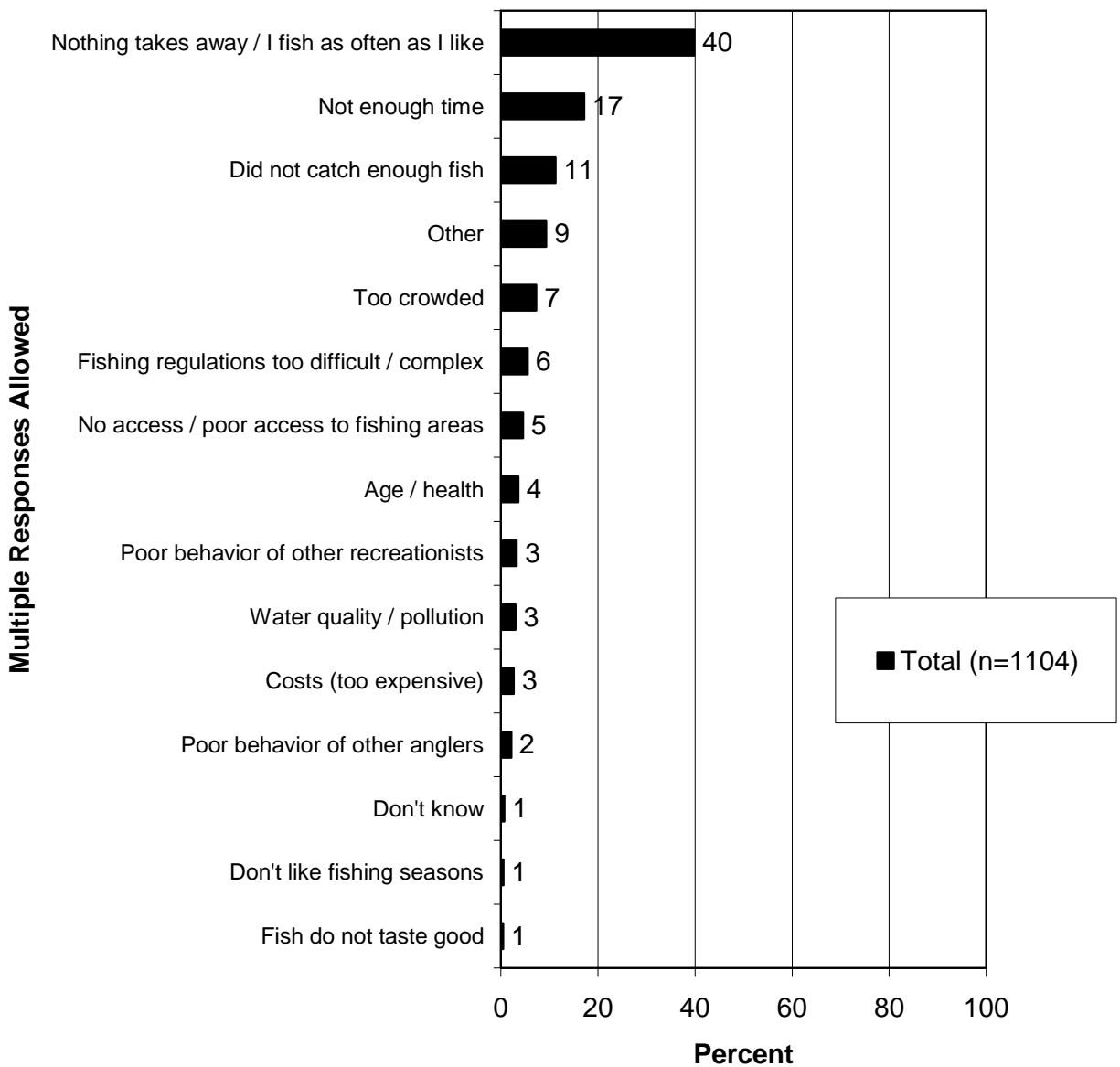

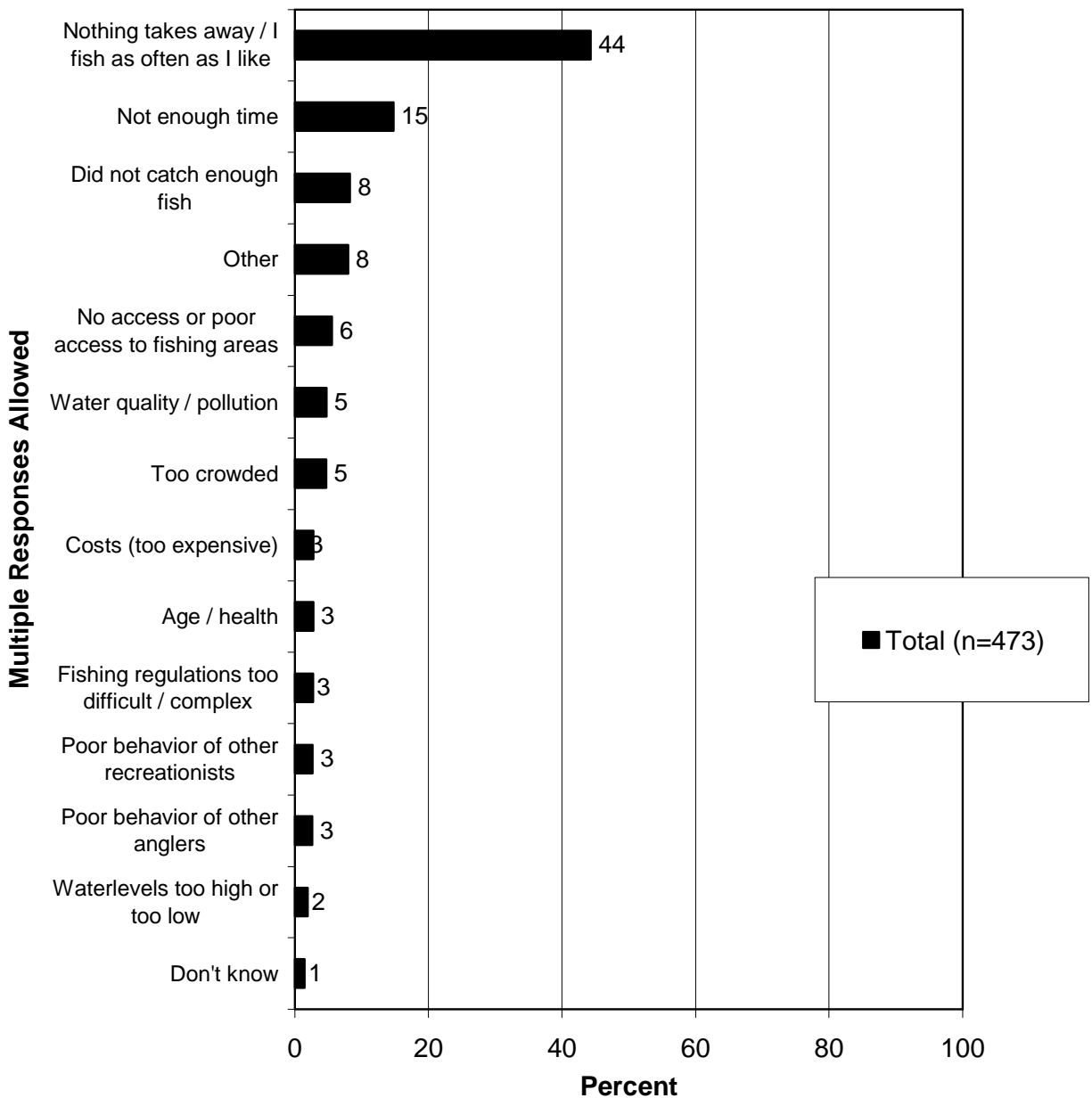

## OPINIONS ON FISHERIES MANAGEMENT

- Three times the percentage of Oregon anglers agree (61%) than disagree (20%) that the ODFW makes a good effort to obtain input from the public about freshwater fishing regulations.
  - The nonparametric analysis found that those who agree that the ODFW makes a good effort to obtain input from the public about freshwater fishing regulations are positively correlated with the following:
    - Would support additional freshwater fishing regulations if the regulations would assist the ODFW in maintaining current freshwater fishing opportunities; agrees that Oregon's freshwater fishing regulations are clear and easy to understand; would support additional freshwater fishing regulations if the regulations would assist the ODFW in providing more freshwater fishing opportunities.
    - Is at or below the median age (53); household income is less than \$60,000.
  - The nonparametric analysis found that those who do not agree that the ODFW makes a good effort to obtain input from the public about freshwater fishing regulations are positively correlated with the following:
    - Fished for shad.
    - Did not indicate would support additional freshwater fishing regulations if the regulations would assist the ODFW in maintaining current freshwater fishing opportunities; does not agree that Oregon's freshwater fishing regulations are clear and easy to understand; did not indicate would support additional freshwater fishing regulations if the regulations would assist the ODFW in providing more freshwater fishing opportunities.
    - Is above the median age (53).
  
- By slightly more than 2 to 1, more Oregon anglers agree (65%) than disagree (29%) that Oregon's freshwater fishing regulations are clear and easy to understand.
  - By far, the Regulations Handbook is the most used source of information about fishing regulations and changes to them: 77% of anglers use this source, distantly followed by friends/family/word-of-mouth (34%), ODFW pamphlets (18%), sporting goods stores

(17%), the ODFW website (15%), and newspapers (13%). (This graph is shown in the section of this report titled, “Sources of Information Regarding Fishing in Oregon.”)

- Those who disagree that Oregon’s freshwater fishing regulations are clear and easy to understand commonly say that the organization of the Regulations Handbook is hard to follow (41%), that there are too many regulations (34%) and/or that they do not know if they are following all the rules (30%), and/or that the language is too technical (26%).
- The nonparametric analysis found that those who agree that Oregon’s freshwater fishing regulations are clear and easy to understand are positively correlated with:
  - Not having fished for (in order of strength of correlation) salmon in freshwater, salmon in bays/estuaries, salmon in the ocean, other marine fish.
  - Did not purchase a combined salmon/steelhead/sturgeon/halibut tag in 2005.
  - Agrees that the ODFW makes a good effort to obtain input from the public about freshwater fishing regulations; would support additional fishing regulations if the regulations would assist the ODFW in maintaining current freshwater fishing opportunities; would support additional fishing regulations if the regulations would assist the ODFW in providing more freshwater fishing opportunities.
  - Is at or below the median age (53); is female; considers place of residence to be a small city or town.
- The nonparametric analysis found that those who do not agree that Oregon’s freshwater fishing regulations are clear and easy to understand are positively correlated with:
  - Fished for (in order of strength of correlation) salmon in freshwater, salmon in bays/estuaries, other marine fish, salmon in the ocean.
  - Purchased a combined salmon/steelhead/sturgeon/halibut tag in 2005.
  - Does not agree that the ODFW makes a good effort to obtain input from the public about freshwater fishing regulations; did not indicate he/she would support additional fishing regulations if the regulations would assist the ODFW in maintaining current freshwater fishing opportunities; did not indicate he/she would support additional fishing regulations if the regulations would assist the ODFW in providing more freshwater fishing opportunities.
  - Is above the median age (53); is male.

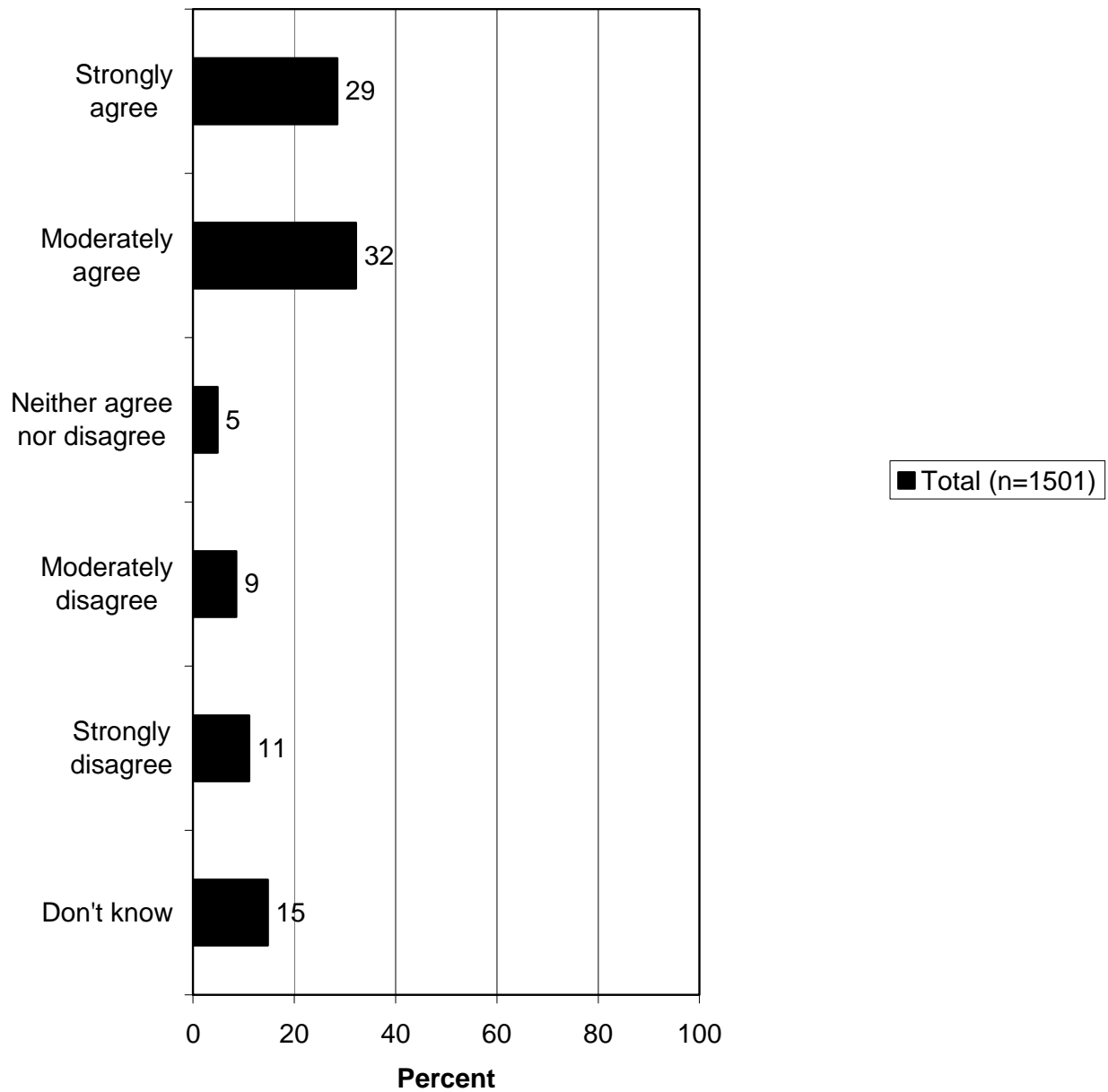
- There is more support (61%) than opposition (23%) for additional freshwater fishing regulations if the regulations assist the ODFW in *maintaining current* freshwater fishing opportunities. Support grows when the stipulation is that the additional freshwater fishing regulations would assist the ODFW in providing *additional* freshwater fishing opportunities: 65% support additional regulations for this goal, while only 19% oppose.
  - Those who would support additional freshwater fishing regulations if the regulations assist the ODFW in maintaining current freshwater fishing opportunities are positively correlated with the following:
    - Considers him/herself primarily a coldwater angler.
    - Fished for (in order of strength of correlation) steelhead, warmwater game fish.
    - Had an Angler license.
    - Would support additional freshwater fishing regulations if the regulations would assist the ODFW in providing additional freshwater fishing opportunities; agrees that the ODFW makes a good effort to obtain input from the public about freshwater fishing regulations; agrees that Oregon's freshwater fishing regulations are clear and easy to understand.
    - Household income is from \$60,000 to \$119,999; is at or below the median age (53); household income is less than \$60,000.
  - Those who would support additional freshwater fishing regulations if the regulations assist the ODFW in providing more freshwater fishing opportunities are positively correlated with the following:
    - Fished for (in order of strength of correlation) steelhead, warmwater game fish.
    - Had an Angler license.
    - Would support additional freshwater fishing regulations if the regulations would assist the ODFW in maintaining current freshwater fishing opportunities; agrees that the ODFW makes a good effort to obtain input from the public about freshwater fishing regulations; agrees that Oregon's freshwater fishing regulations are clear and easy to understand.
    - Household income is less than \$60,000; is at or below the median age (53); household income is from \$60,000 to \$119,999.

- Those who did not indicate that he/she would support additional freshwater fishing regulations if the regulations assist the ODFW in maintaining current freshwater fishing opportunities are positively correlated with the following:
    - Considers him/herself to be equally a coldwater and warmwater angler.
    - Had a combination license.
    - Did not indicate he/she would support additional freshwater fishing regulations if the regulations would assist the ODFW in providing additional freshwater fishing opportunities; does not agree that the ODFW makes a good effort to obtain input from the public about freshwater fishing regulations; does not agree that Oregon's freshwater fishing regulations are clear and easy to understand.
    - Is above the median age (53).
  - Those who did not indicate he/she would support additional freshwater fishing regulations if the regulations assist the ODFW in providing more freshwater fishing opportunities are positively correlated with the following:
    - Had a Disabled/Veteran/Pioneer n/c license.
    - Did not indicate he/she would support additional freshwater fishing regulations if the regulations would assist the ODFW in maintaining current freshwater fishing opportunities; does not agree that the ODFW makes a good effort to obtain input from the public about freshwater fishing regulations; does not agree that Oregon's freshwater fishing regulations are clear and easy to understand.
    - Is above the median age (53).
- Most commonly, trout anglers think that catch-and-release regulations for wild trout should depend on the health of the wild trout population (38% gave this answer), followed closely by those thinking that releasing wild trout is necessary in some locations to maintain fishing opportunities (25%). In looking at a sum, a majority of trout anglers (77%) are amenable to regulations that require catch-and-release of wild trout in certain situations (regulations should require that *all* wild trout be released, releasing wild trout should depend on the health of the population, or releasing wild trout is necessary in some locations to maintain fishing opportunities). (This graph is shown in the section of this report titled, "Opinions on Catch-and-Release.")

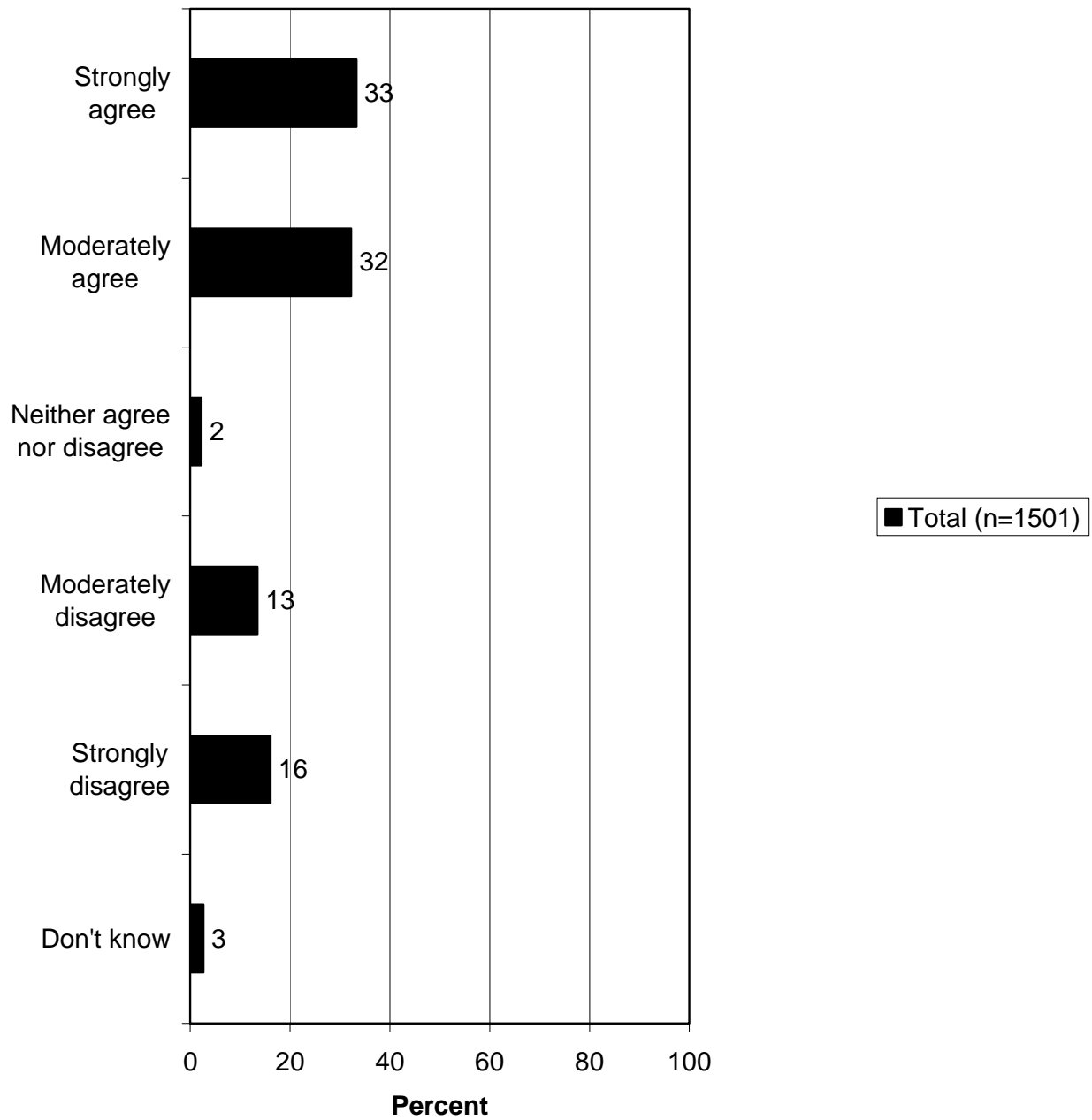
- A large majority of trout anglers (72%) say that catch-and-release regulations do *not* cause them to fish for trout less often; however, 20% say those regulations do cause them to *not* fish as often. (This graph is shown in the section of this report titled, “Opinions on Catch-and-Release.”)
- A majority of bass anglers (65%) support catch-and-release regulations for bass on specific bodies of water for the purpose of developing a trophy bass fishery; 24% oppose. (This graph is shown in the section of this report titled, “Opinions on Catch-and-Release.”)
- In general, trout stocking efforts are supported by a majority of trout anglers.
  - It is nearly universally agreed (93% of trout anglers strongly or moderately agree) that stocked trout increase trout fishing opportunities.
  - An overwhelming majority of trout anglers (82%) agree that stocked trout improve the quality of trout fishing in Oregon.
  - When asked directly about future approaches to stocking trout, majorities of trout anglers agree that the ODFW should stock trout in more locations (62%), that the ODFW should stock more trout in its current stocking locations (56%), and that the ODFW should expand its stocking program to include more species of trout (56%). Disagreement with these three statements, while not a majority, is substantial, ranging from 21% to 25%.
  - On the other hand, overwhelming majorities of trout anglers disagree that the ODFW should stop stocking trout (95% disagree), that it should stock fewer trout (89%), or that stocked trout take away from fishing and make fishing less enjoyable (84% disagree).
  - Graphs are included showing percentages of trout anglers who gave responses in favor of stocking.
- Although stocking efforts are supported, wild trout are preferred by more trout anglers than are hatchery trout (34% for wild, 5% for hatchery trout); however, the large majority of trout anglers (60%) say that they have no preference regarding fishing for hatchery trout versus wild trout. (This graph is shown in the section of this report titled, “Species Fished and Methods of Fishing.”)

- Twice as many trout anglers agree than disagree that the ODFW should manage fisheries for larger trout rather than for maximum number of trout (assuming the trout population is healthy): 48% agree, but 24% disagree.
  
- A majority of crappie anglers (62%) oppose the establishment of a bag (or creel) limit for crappie; 28% support. Likewise, a majority of panfish anglers (52%) oppose the establishment of a bag (or creel) limit for panfish; 31% support. Finally, a majority of catfish anglers (55%) oppose the establishment of a bag (or creel) limit for catfish; 28% support. (Note that anglers were informed that currently there are no bag or creel limits for these three types of fish.)
  - Relative to western anglers, there is markedly less support for a bag limit for panfish among eastern anglers.
  - Regarding a bag limit for catfish, eastern anglers are much more likely to *strongly* oppose than are western anglers.

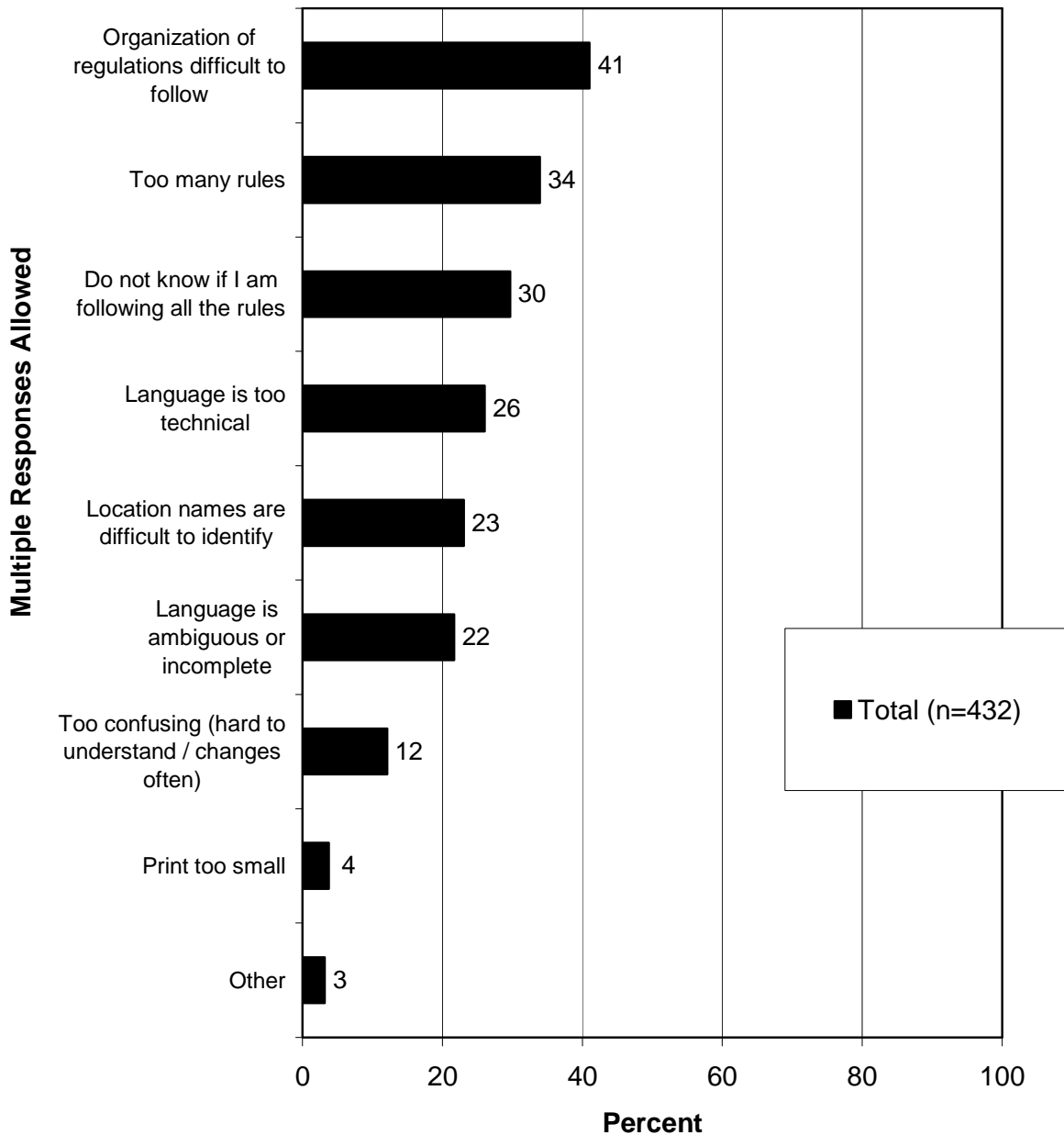
**Q235. Do you agree or disagree that the Oregon Department of Fish and Wildlife makes a good effort to obtain input from the public about freshwater fishing regulations?**



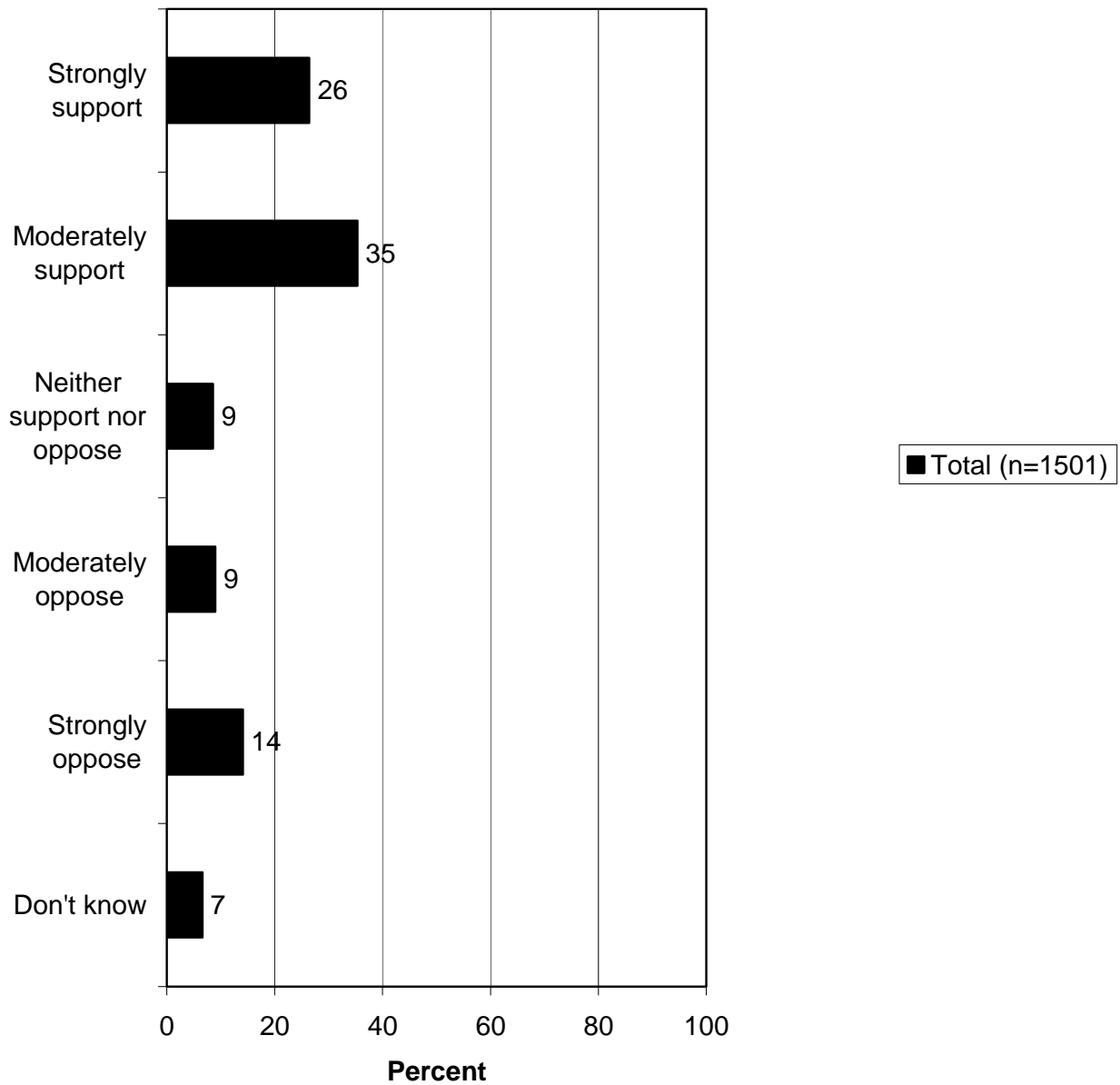

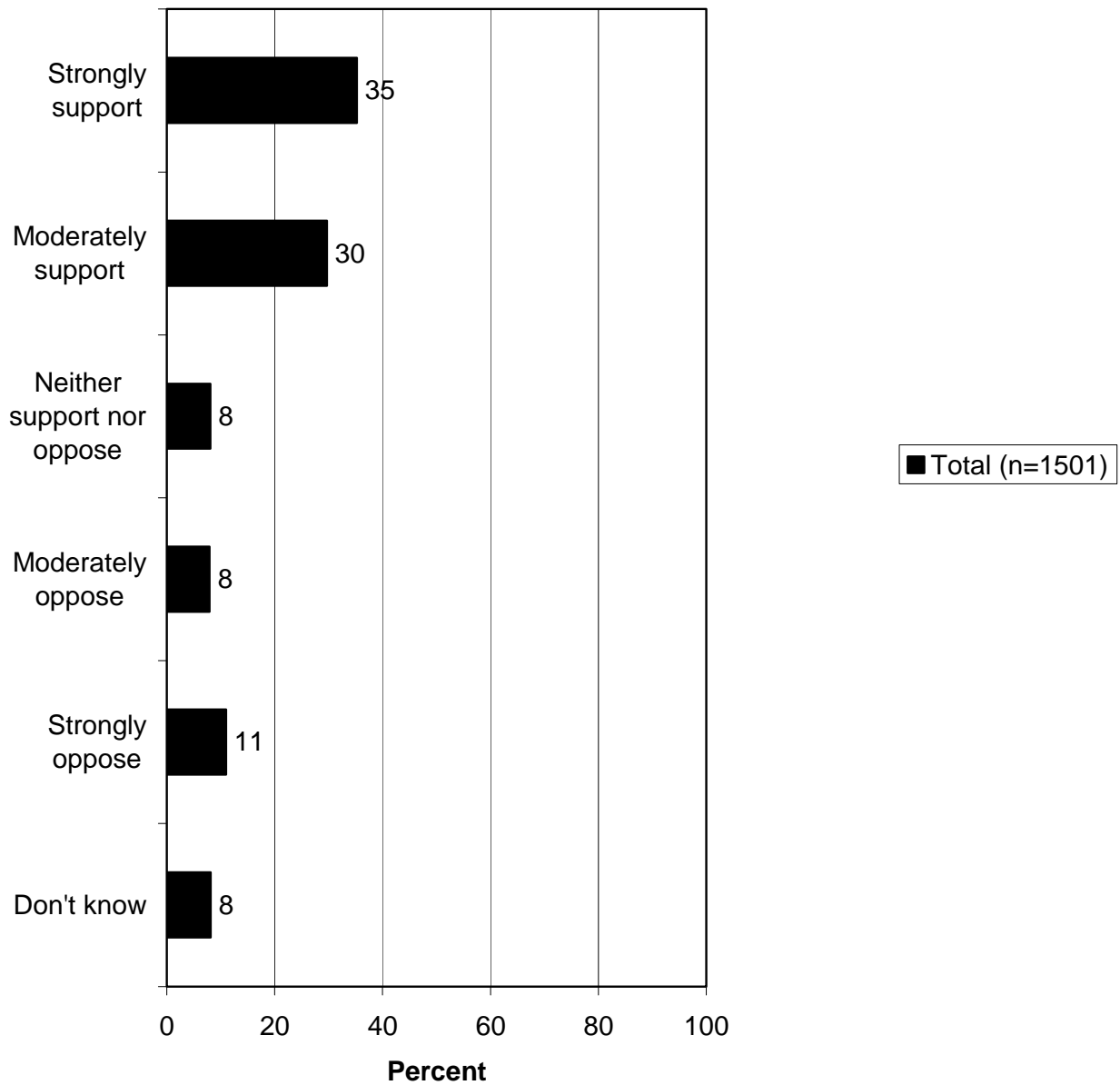

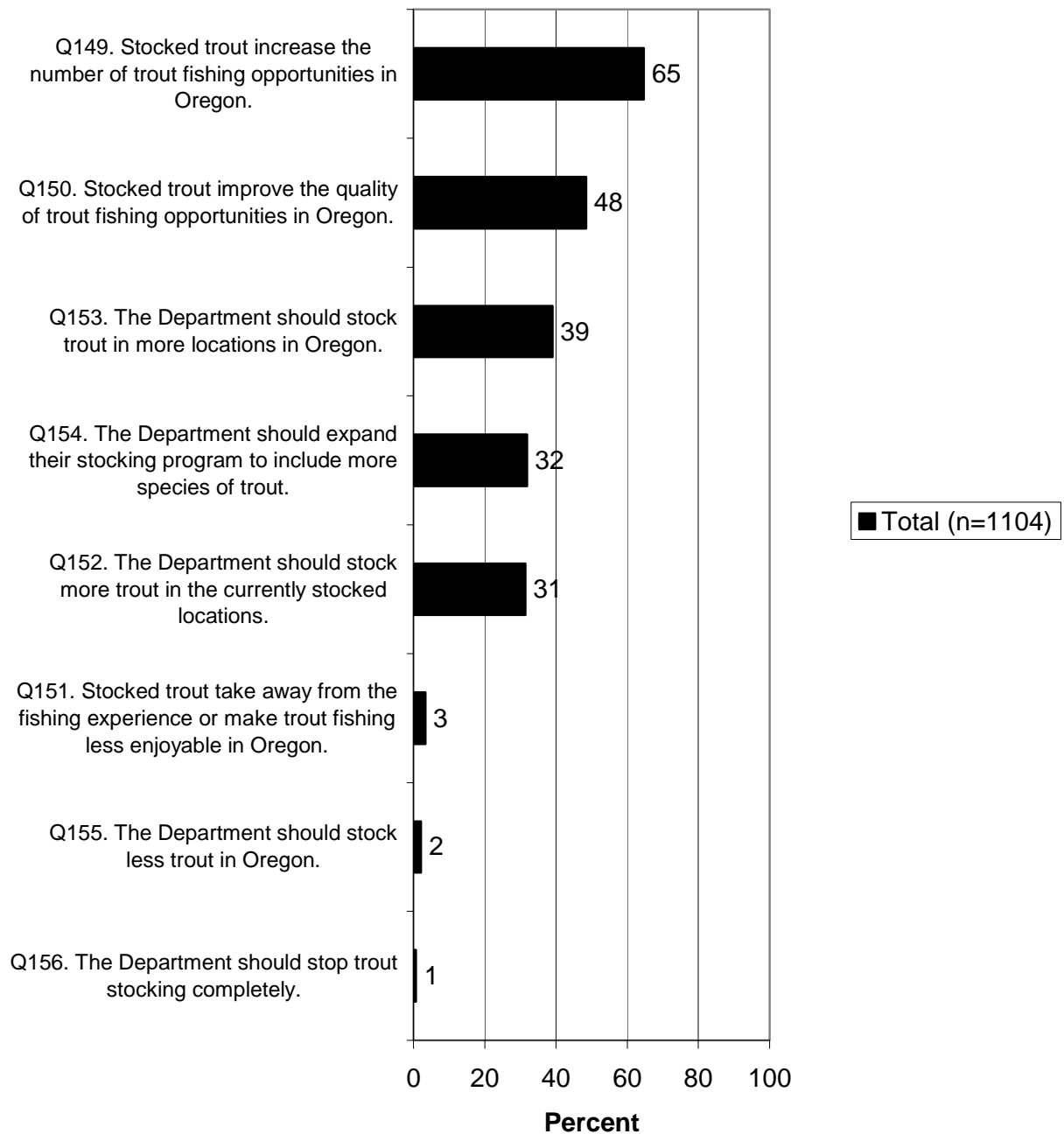

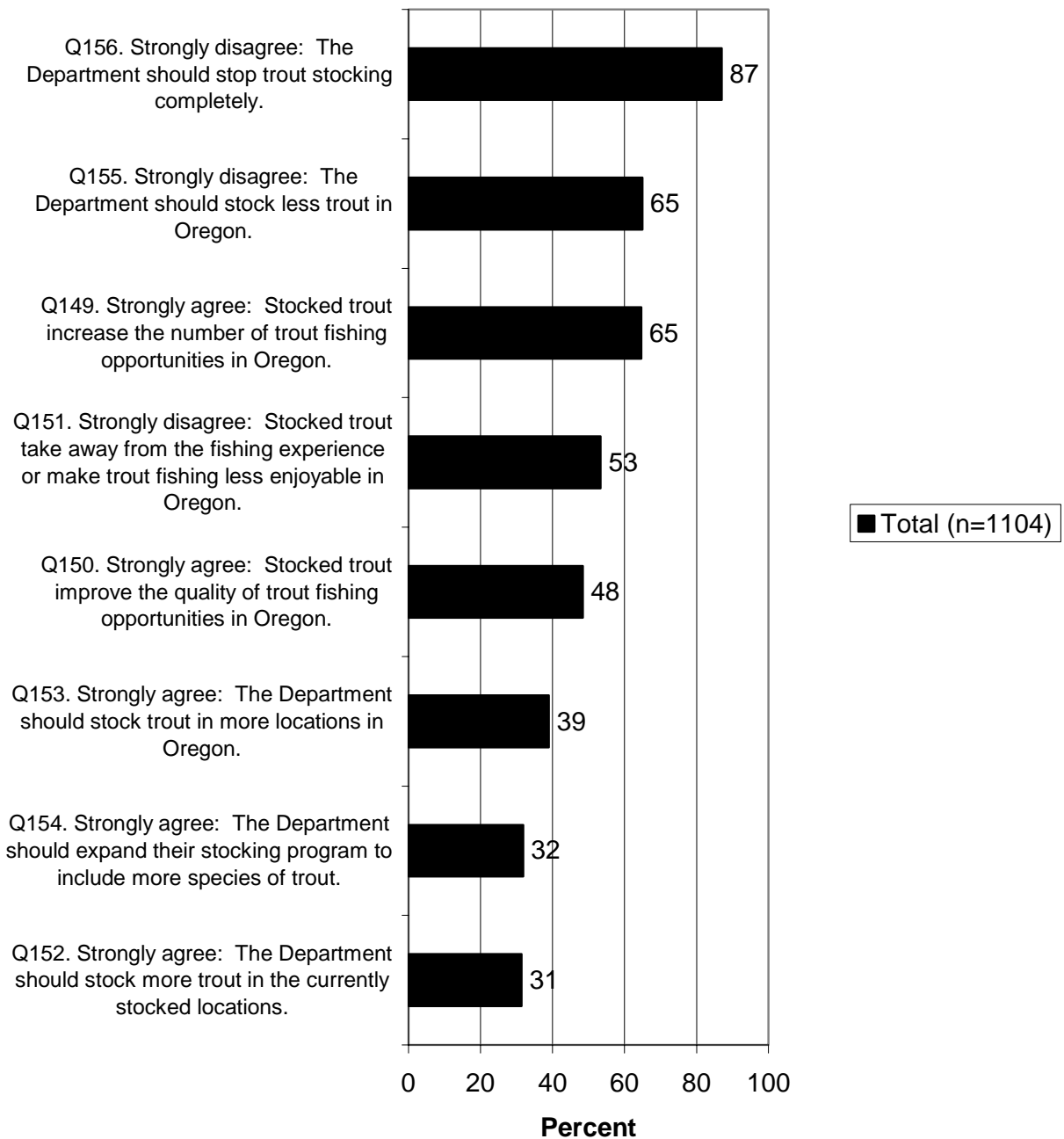

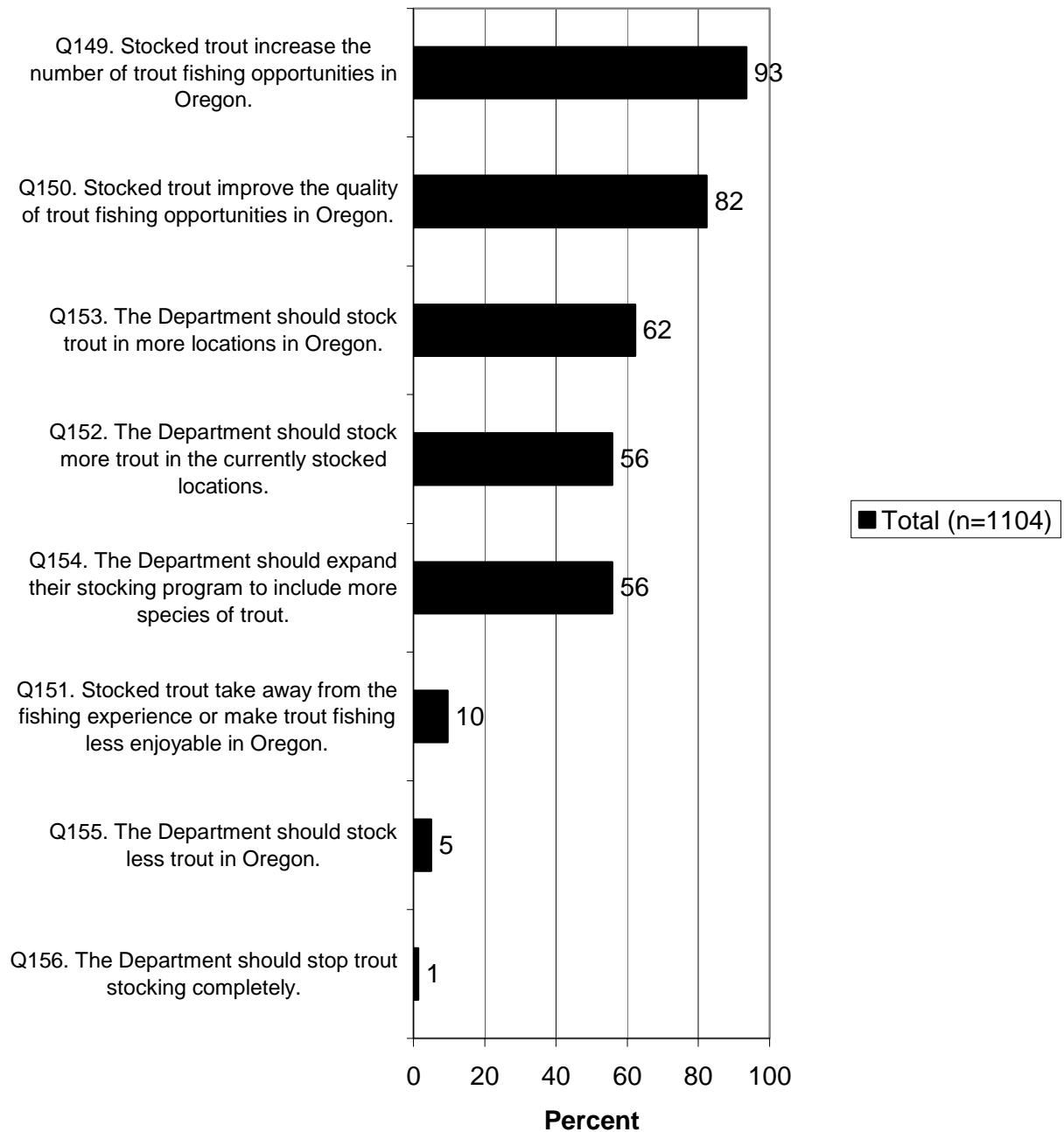

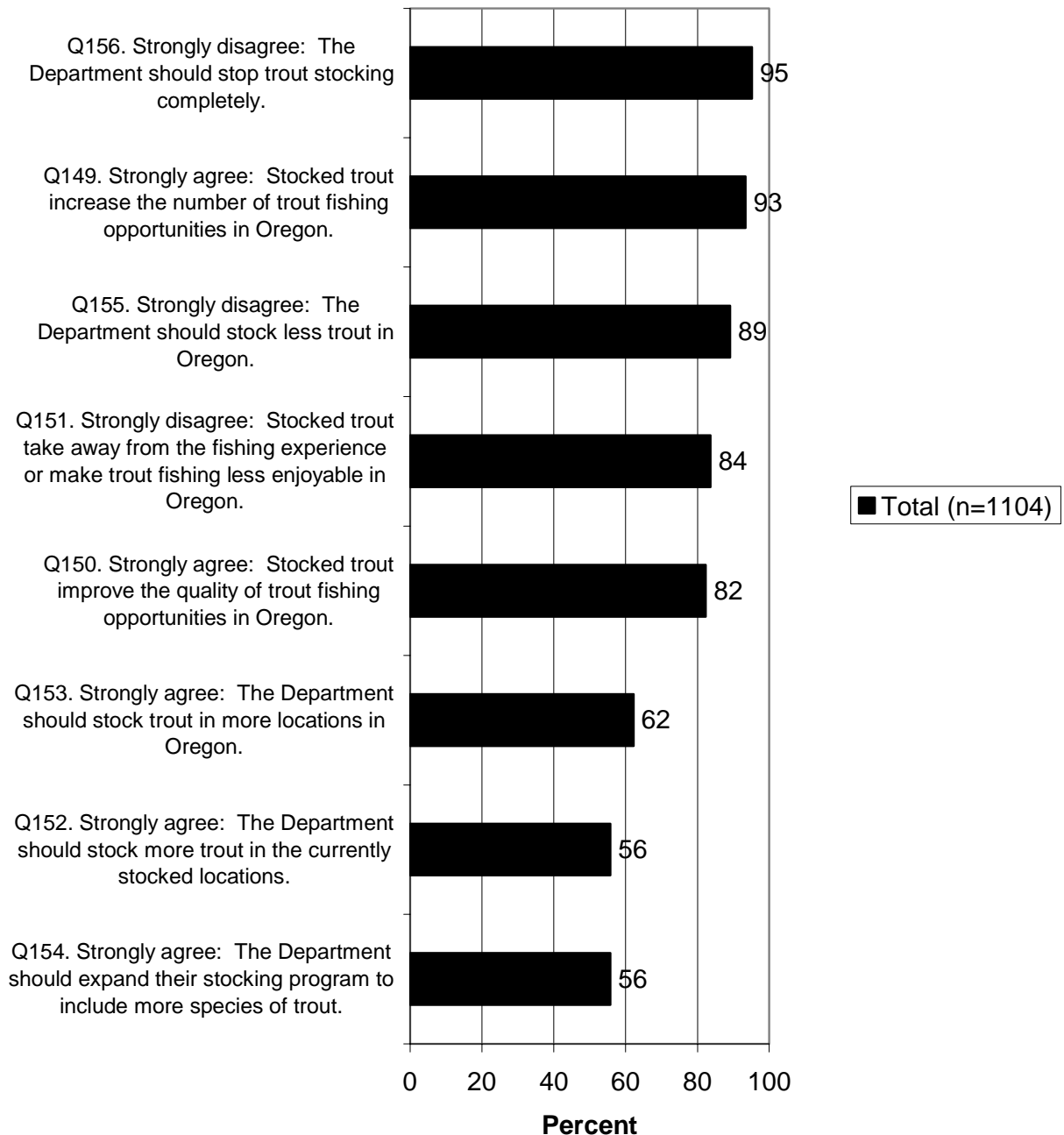

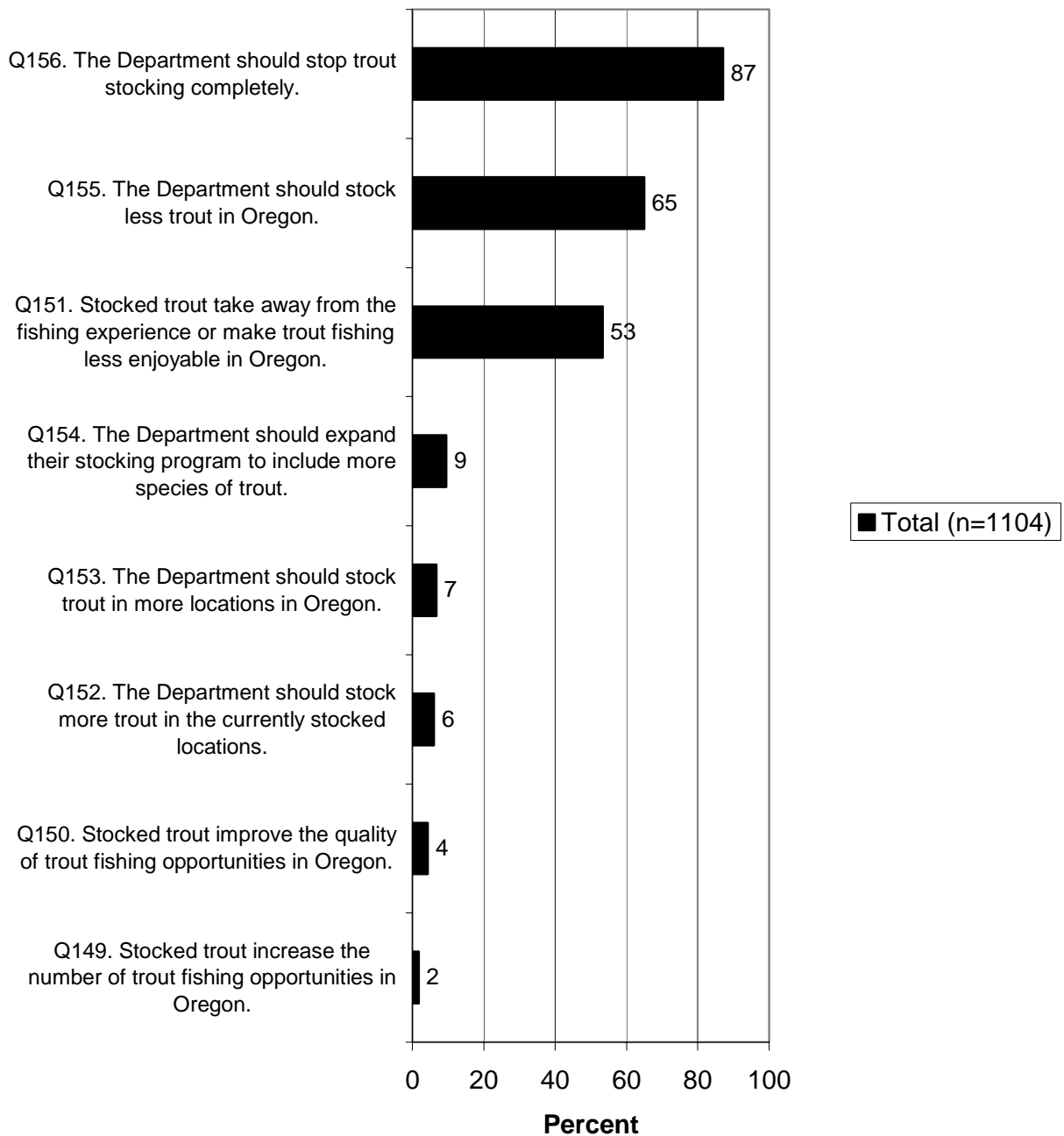

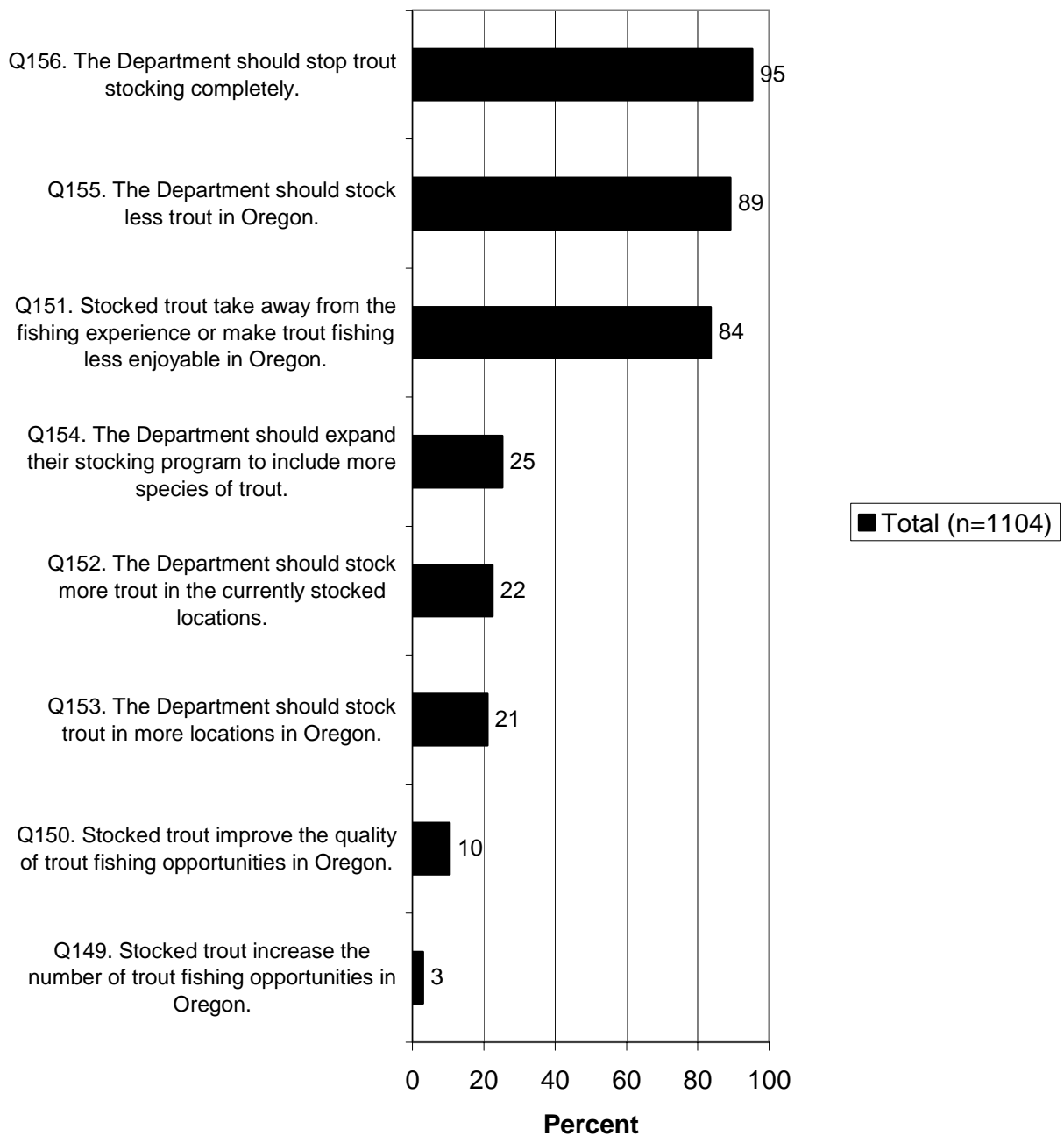

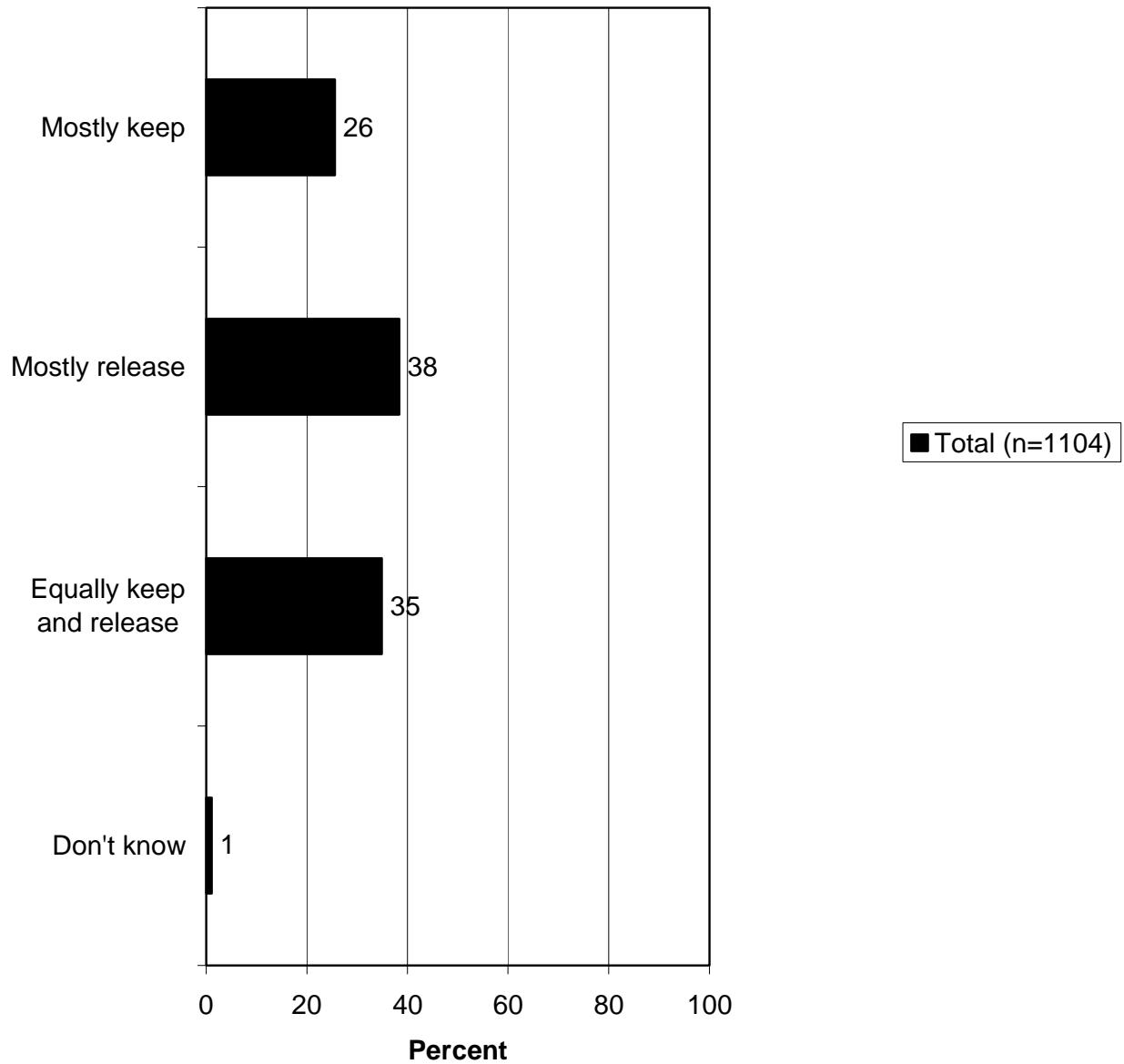
## OPINIONS ON CATCH-AND-RELEASE

- Trout anglers are about evenly divided between those who release and those who keep the trout they catch, although slightly more release trout than keep trout: 73% release the trout they catch at least part of the time, while 61% keep the trout at least part of the time. The percentage who mostly release (38%) exceeds the percentage who mostly keep (26%) the trout they catch. Note that catch-and-release refers to both optional and required (by regulations) catch-and-release.
  
- Warmwater game fish anglers more often release than keep the warmwater game fish they catch: 79% release the warmwater game fish they catch at least half of the time, while 52% keep the warmwater game fish at least half of the time. The percentage who mostly release (47%) is more than double the percentage who mostly keep (20%) the warmwater game fish they catch (32% equally release and keep). Note that catch-and-release refers to both optional and required (by regulations) catch-and-release.
  - Western anglers are more likely to release warmwater game fish than are eastern anglers.
  
- More trout anglers say that releasing a trout makes fishing more enjoyable (41%) than say doing so makes trout fishing less enjoyable (12%). Most commonly, they say releasing has no effect on enjoyment (42%). A large majority of trout anglers (72%) say that catch-and-release regulations do *not* cause them to fish for trout less often; however, 20% say those regulations cause them to fish less often.
  
- More warmwater game fish anglers say that releasing warmwater game fish makes fishing more enjoyable (42%) than say it makes fishing less enjoyable (8%); most commonly, they say it has no effect (48%) on their enjoyment of warmwater game fish angling.
  
- Most commonly, trout anglers think that catch-and-release regulations for wild trout should depend on the health of the wild trout population (38% gave this answer), followed closely by those thinking that releasing wild trout is necessary in some locations to maintain fishing opportunities (25%). In looking at a sum, a majority of trout anglers (77%) are amenable to regulations that require catch-and-release of wild trout in certain situations (i.e., they said

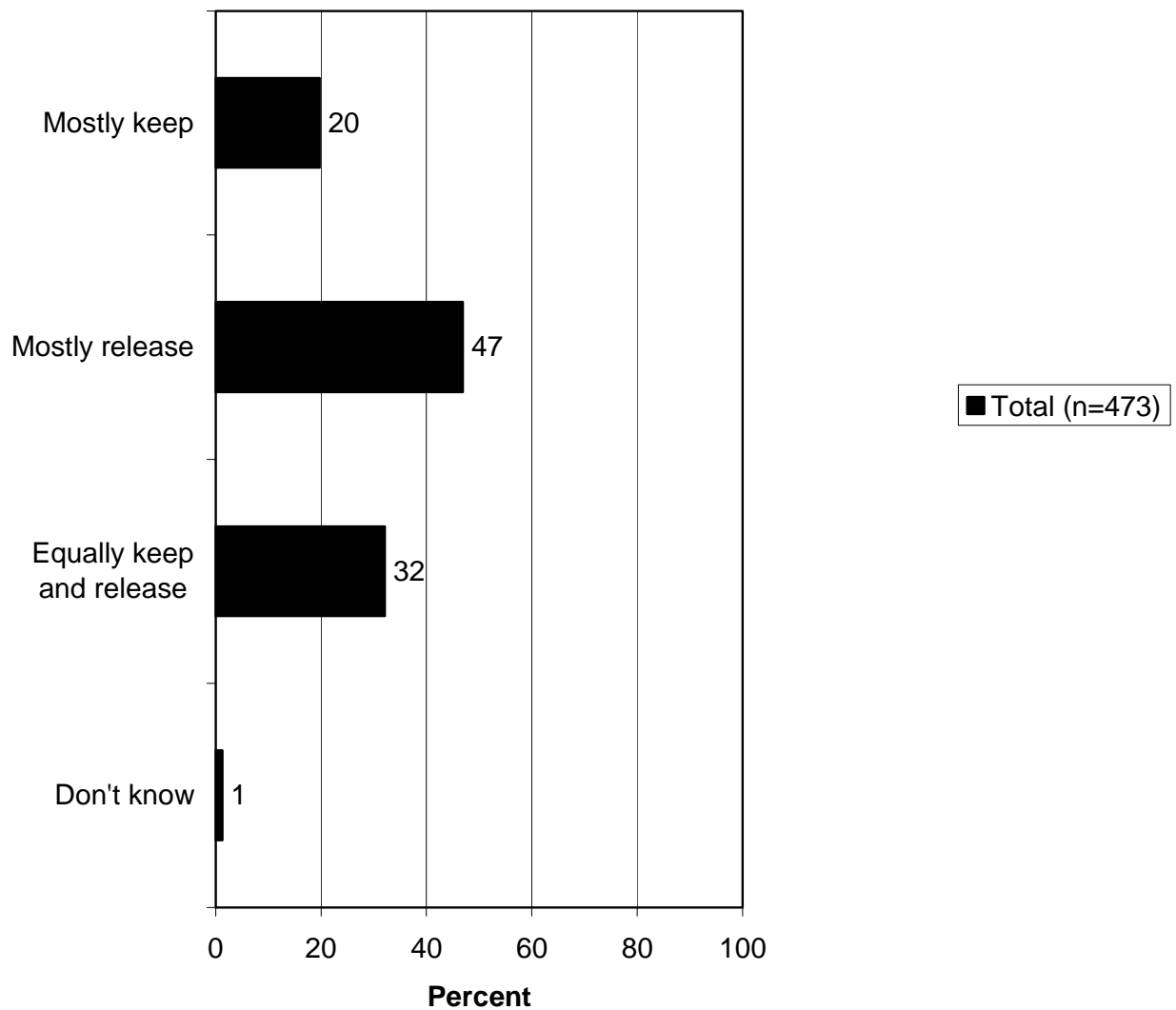
regulations should require that all wild trout be released, that releasing wild trout should depend on the health of the population, *or* that releasing wild trout is necessary in some locations to maintain fishing opportunities).

- A majority of bass anglers (65%) support catch-and-release regulations for bass on specific bodies of water for the purpose of developing a trophy bass fishery; 24% oppose.

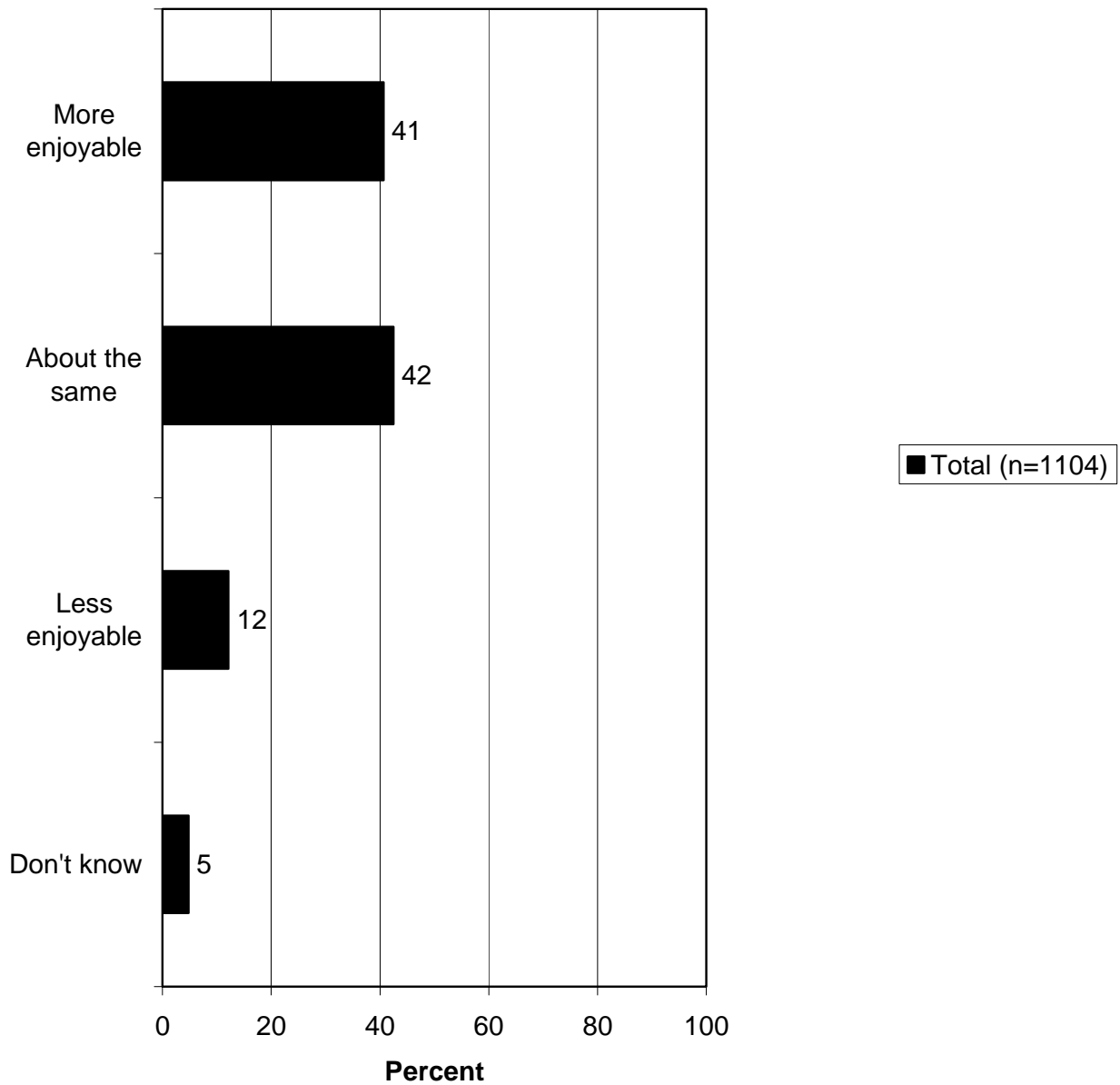

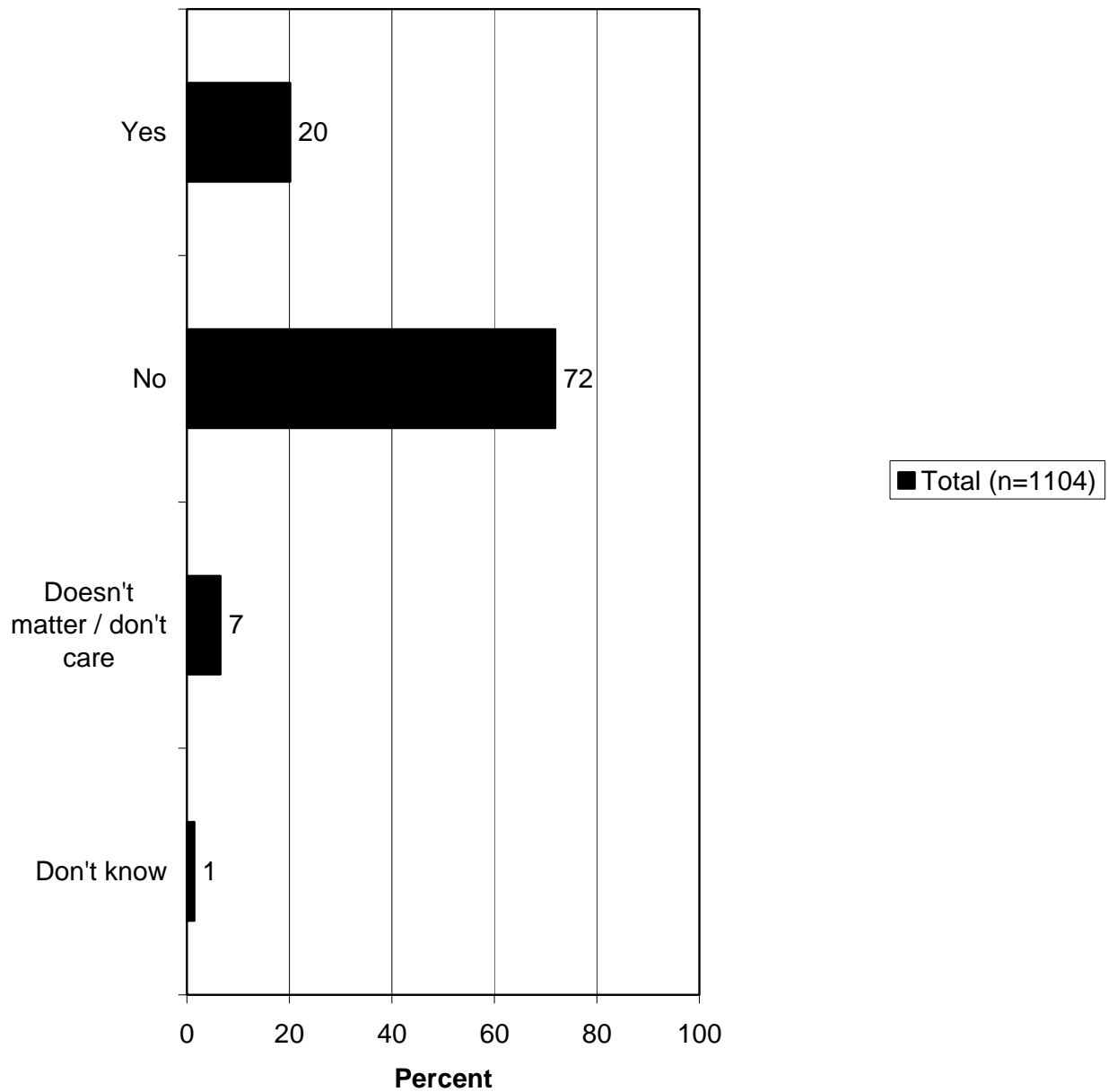

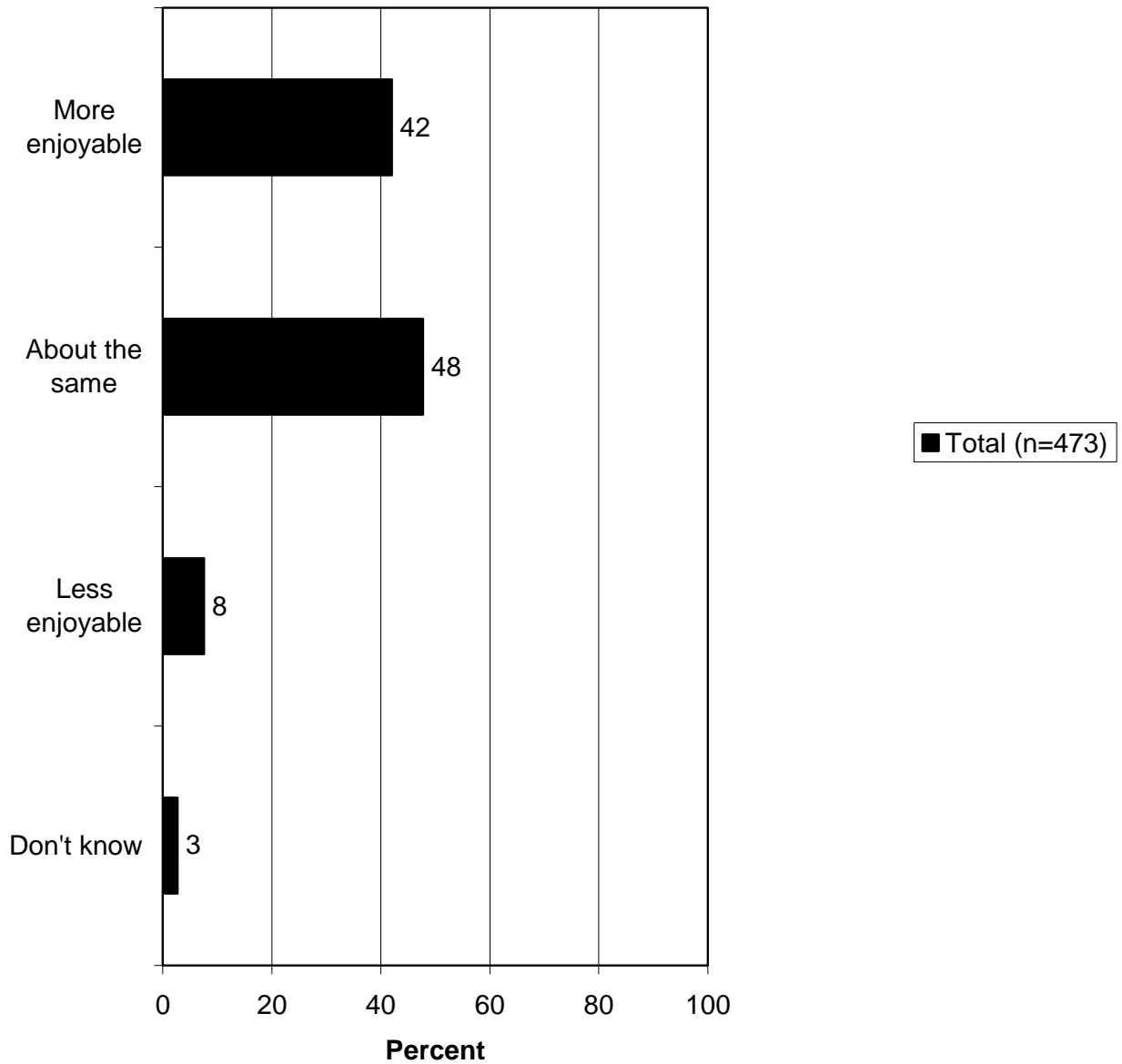

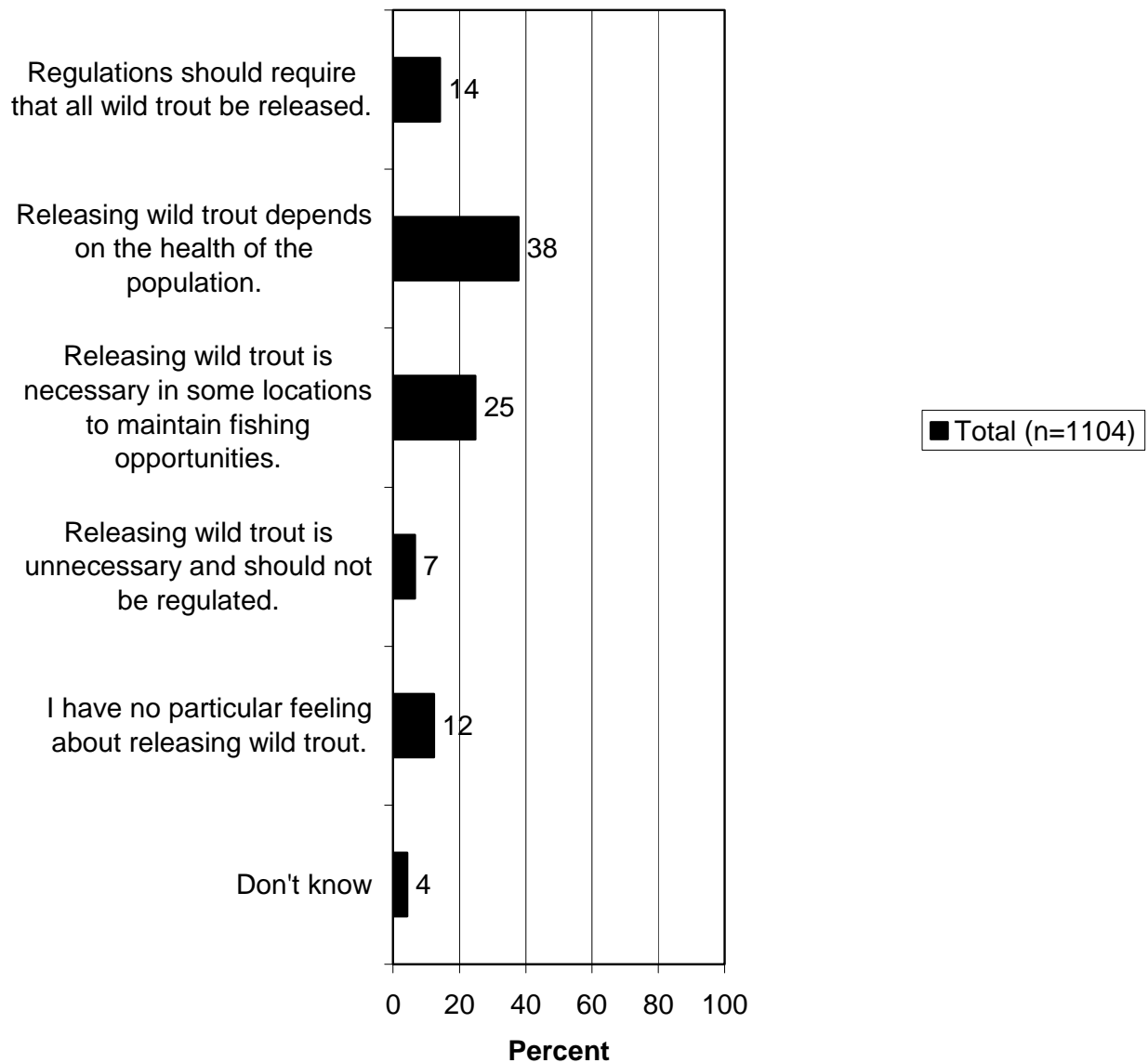

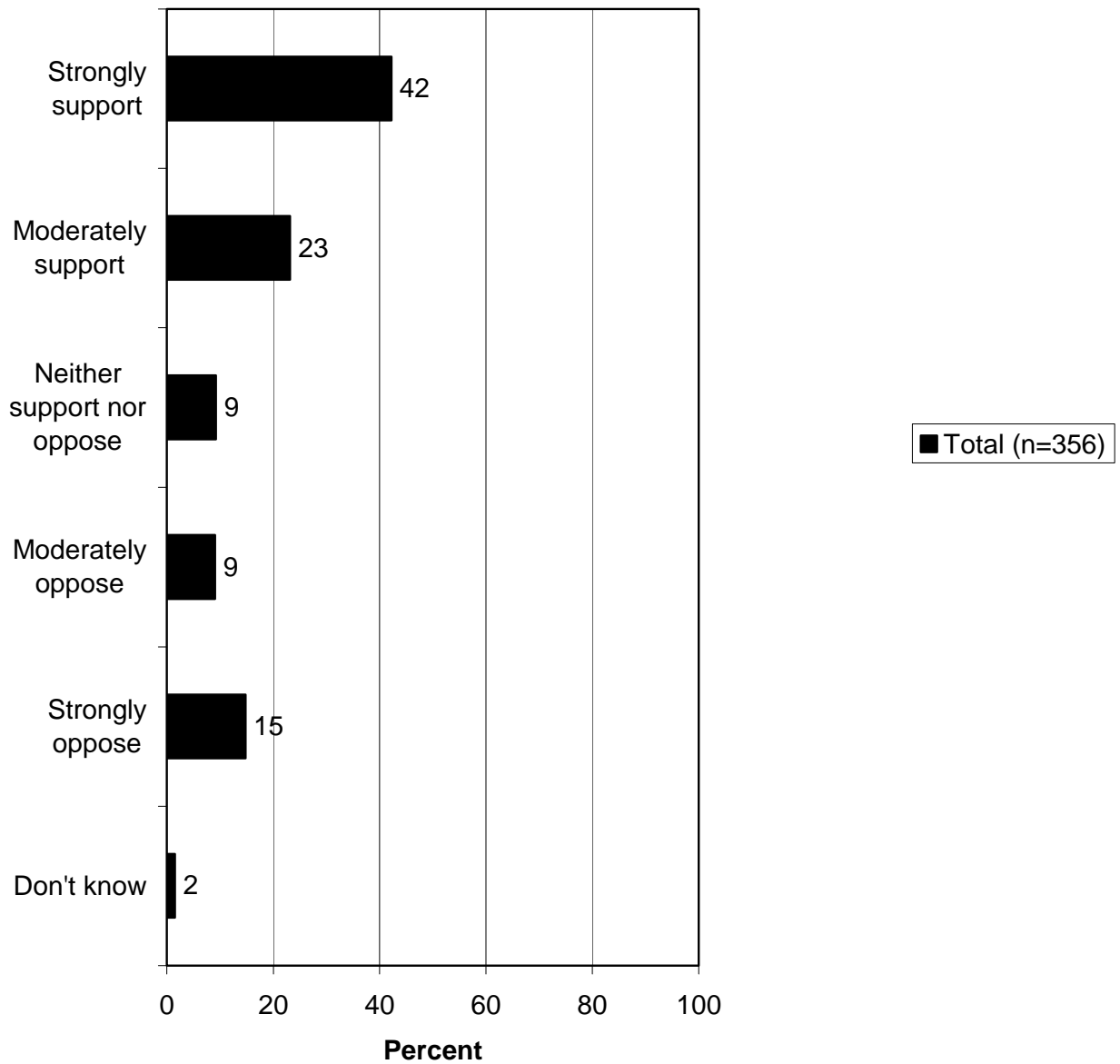

## SOURCES OF INFORMATION REGARDING FISHING IN OREGON

- The most popular source from which anglers have received information on fishing opportunities in Oregon is friends/family/word-of-mouth (62%), distantly followed by ODFW pamphlets (34%), newspapers (26%), sporting goods stores (22%), and the ODFW website (21%).
- The nonparametric analysis found that those who received information from any one source were positively correlated with having received information from a variety of other sources. Other results of the nonparametric analysis pertaining to sources of information are tabulated for readability.

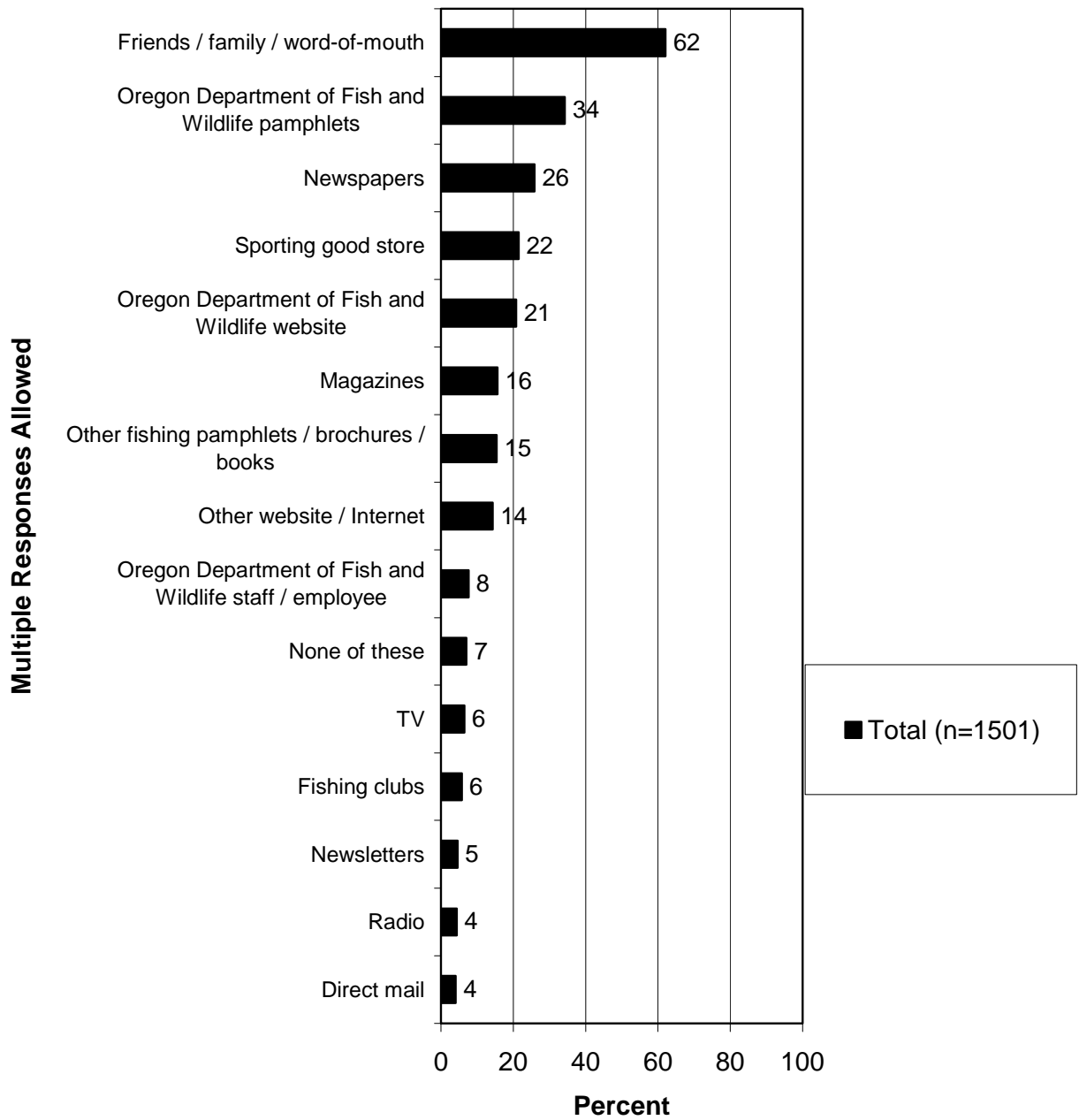

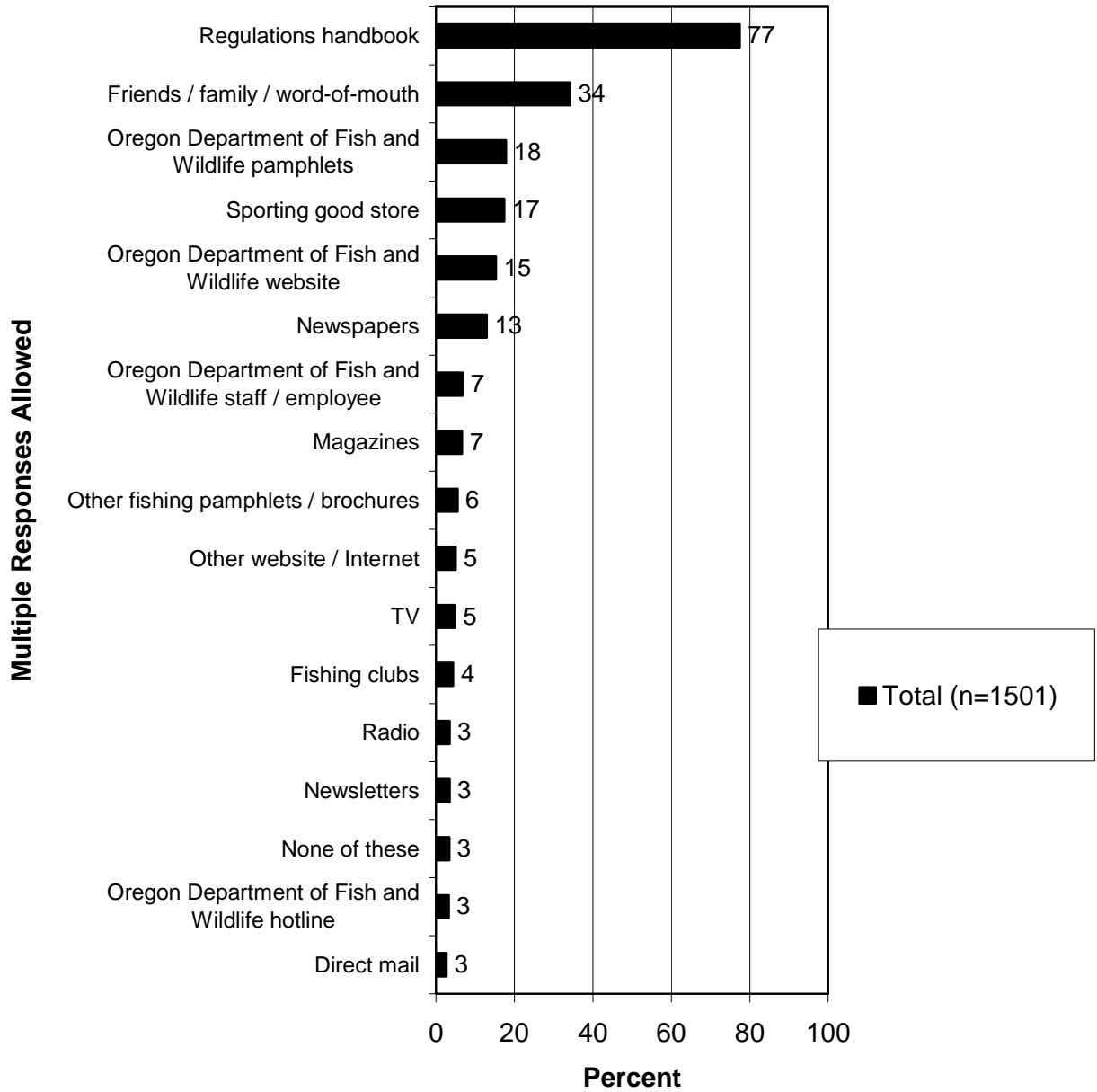
