### ***Project Summary***

---

This project is part of ODFW's 25 Year Angling Plan.

**Activity Type:** Education

**Summary:** The Salmon Drift Creek Watershed Council (SDCWC) in collaboration with ODFW will use R&E funds to create and purchase a 4' x 8' educational sign and hire a contractor to construct and install a 6' x 10' kiosk to house and mount the sign at Knight County Park in Otis, Oregon. This information kiosk will educate the public about the local marine environment and Salmon River watershed, the conservation measures put in place at the Cascade Head Marine Reserve, and highlight

opportunities for fishing, wildlife viewing, and other outdoor activities in and around Cascade Head and Salmon River.

**Objectives:**

The project objectives are to educate the public with interpretive signage about the Cascade Head Marine Reserve and Salmon River watershed by:

- Providing the location of the Cascade Head Marine Reserve site to increase regulatory compliance by enhancing the public's understanding of the regulations.
- Highlighting (and enhancing) fishing opportunities that still exist for people to catch groundfish, salmon, and crab in the North Marine Protected Area (MPA) off the mouth of the Salmon River (ODFW 25 Year Angling Plan, Goal 2).
- Highlighting other angling, wildlife viewing, and outdoor activities in and around Cascade Head and the Salmon River (25 Year Angling Plan, Goal 2, Strategy h).
- Highlighting the local community's participation in the Cascade Head Marine Reserve planning process that helped develop regulations for the site.
- Provide an educational opportunity to learn about Oregon's marine reserves and local marine species and habitats (25 Year Angling Plan, Goal 2, Strategy g) that can be found around Cascade Head for anglers, park visitors, and the many school groups that regularly visit Knight Park for educational programming.

Objectives as they relate to the ODFW 25 Year Angling Plan:

(Goal 2, Strategy g) Educate the public regarding fish, fisheries and the natural environment. Understanding of fish, their habitats, and the natural world is important for the Department to accomplish its mission of protecting and enhancing fish and wildlife resources for present and future Oregonians. This information kiosk would be used to educate the public about the local marine environment and watershed, conservation measures that have been put in place, and fishing opportunities that exist in and around Cascade Head and the Salmon River.

(Goal 2, Strategy j) Develop partnerships. Partnerships with other state agencies, other states, federal agencies, municipal and county governments, schools, outdoor-oriented non-profits, conservation groups, retail stores and equipment manufacturers based on shared or similar goals enhance recreational angling opportunities and allow the Department to achieve more with limited resources. This project is to be a partnership between the Salmon Drift Creek Watershed Council, Lincoln County Parks, and ODFW based on shared goals to educate the public about the local marine environment and watershed, conservation measures that have been put in place, as well as fishing and outdoor recreational opportunities that exist.

(Goal 2, Strategy h) Promote and market fishing and outdoor activities. The state of Oregon has many wonderful opportunities for recreational angling, but the public may not be aware of them. Knight Park attracts visitors and anglers to the Salmon River and is a popular destination for school groups. The proposed information kiosk, to be located at Knight Park, will be used to highlight fishing, wildlife viewing, and other opportunities for outdoor activities in and around the Salmon River and Cascade Head.

**Fishery Benefits:**

Recreational fishers would benefit from information in user-friendly language and visuals about the location of the Cascade Head Marine Reserve site and the opportunities that exist for fishing in and off the mouth of the Salmon River. In addition, creating educational signage at the site would enhance its educational value, bringing more visitors to the area who may potentially become interested in angling opportunities (create new anglers) at the MPA and the Salmon River.

**Watershed Benefits:**

While this project does not address limiting factors directly, the educational signage would highlight watershed protection and restoration efforts in the area that potentially can enhance local fish populations. The sign will also provide a greater appreciation for the importance of watersheds as a component necessary for present and future fish populations and continued enjoyment of fishing and other outdoor activities.

**Current Situation:**

Currently, no signage exists about the Cascade Head Marine Reserve site, its marine resources, and its angling and crabbing opportunities. During development of a site management plan for the Cascade Head Marine Reserve site, ODFW received input from numerous members of the public, including anglers involved in the marine reserve designation process, requesting that an educational sign about the marine reserves be placed at Knight Park. Knight Park is the closest public access point for the marine reserve with a boat ramp and serves many people from neighboring coastal communities (Lincoln City) as well as inland cities (Portland and Salem). This interpretive sign will provide information on the significance of the marine reserve, its habitats, its connections with the natural environment, and its biological importance with respect to fish and other marine resources. Most importantly, the kiosk will ensure that anglers and the public understand what opportunities are available for angling adjacent to Cascade Head Marine Reserve/Protected Areas.

Due to its high recreational use, having an information kiosk at Knight Park provides an ideal opportunity to market fishing and recreational opportunities to the public (Goal 2, Strategy h). Many fishers, boaters, kayakers, and birders already use Knight Park. Additionally, the park is visited by over 1,000 school children per year on their way to Camp Westwind, which overlooks the Cascade Head Marine Reserve site. Knight Park is a popular access point for fishing for fall Chinook on the Salmon River and in the North MPA of the Cascade Head Marine Reserve site. (See attached District Biologist's support letter for detailed angling use.)

Finally, there is a clear mandate to inform the public about the new marine reserve and the fishing opportunities still available in and around this site. The Oregon Legislature and Governor designated the Cascade Head Marine Reserve site in June of 2012. Harvest restrictions at the site, adopted by the Fish and Wildlife Commission, went into effect January 2014.

SDCWC and ODFW prefer that the information kiosk be located adjacent to the boater parking area on Lincoln County Parks property to attract the highest number

of viewers and specifically target users launching from the ramp. The County Parks Operation Supervisor has expressed being in favor of the project and estimates that we have a “90% likelihood of being approved”. Pending final approval by the County, we are designating ODFW property as an alternate site, still located in Knight Park, adjacent to the restrooms where it will be visible to the visiting public. (See attached figures and maps.)

**Alternatives:**

No Action: The signage will not be created.

Alternative Funding Source: We will investigate alternative funding sources.

Alternative Designs: Depending on placement of the sign and input from the design committee, we will consider alternative designs.

Partial Completion: If necessary, we would consider partial completion. An option could be graphic design and sign only without the associated sign kiosk.

- Designer:** This project will be designed by Lisa Mulcahy, Education Coordinator for SDCWC and Stacy Galleher of ODFW. Graphic design will be provided by Allison Walkingshaw. Construction designs were provided by Keith Andresen of Lincoln County Parks.
- Methods:** The sign text will be completed prior to receiving R&E funding. Upon funding, SDCWC and ODFW will begin the conceptual sign design and information development. SDCWC will also initiate the contract with the graphic designer to create the layout, illustrations, and graphic design of the sign. Once the sign design is finalized and approved by all parties, SDCWC will submit the sign to Aardvark Signs who will create the sign according to our specifications. While the sign is being made, SDCWC will initiate a contract with the building contractor. Once the sign is shipped, SDCWC will begin construction of the kiosk at Knight County Park. SDCWC, ODFW, and Lincoln County Parks will inspect the sign and kiosk to ensure it meets the specifications. Following the construction and installation of the signage, SDCWC will issue a press release to inform the public about the sign.
- Inspector:** Staff from the Salmon Drift Creek Watershed Council, Lincoln County Parks, and ODFW Marine Reserves Program will inspect the final product.
- Funding Elements:** R&E funds will be used to: create an information kiosk, pay for a graphic designer to help with development of the educational sign, pay for production of the sign, purchase the building materials for the kiosk, hire a building contractor to build the kiosk and install the sign.
- Partners:** Yes
- Oregon Department of Fish and Wildlife Maine Resources Program: Stacy Galleher of MRP will help to design the sign and develop the informational content.  
Lincoln County Parks: The Parks Board will approve the signage and allow placement on County land at Knight Park.  
Oregon Department of Fish and Wildlife North Coast Watershed District: District Biologist will approve the placement of the sign on ODFW property at Knight Park as an alternative location, if needed.





# Knight Park Map


This information kiosk will:

- Highlight the opportunities that exist for fishing, wildlife viewing, and other outdoor activities in and around Cascade Head and the Salmon River.
- Provide an opportunity for anglers, park visitors, and the many school groups that regularly visit Knight Park for educational programming to learn about the local marine environment and watershed, as well as conservation measures that have been put in place to support marine and freshwater resources of interest to anglers.

The ODFW Marine Reserves Program is a partner with SDCWC on this project. ODFW is committed to providing one month of staff time assisting with the design and production of the kiosk as in-kind match, equivalent to \$6,578 in support.



I am writing you in support of the proposed project titled: Knight Park Information Kiosk. We have been coordinating with Marine Program staff and the Salmon Drift Creek Watershed Council on this proposed angling educational opportunity. We are familiar with the Marine Reserves Program as three Reserve/Protected Areas (Otter Rock, Cape Perpetua, and Cascade Head) are located along the mid-coast district.

The mid-coast has a strong, outspoken angler and conservation community who are well seasoned in ocean and estuary fishing. The kiosk will help ensure that anglers and the public understand what opportunities are available for angling adjacent to the Cascade Head Marine Reserve/Protected Area. Anglers played a key role in the development of this Reserve/Protected Area and recommended that a sign be designed and developed for education at Knight Park. This project also falls in line with our 25-year angling plan for educating the public regarding fish, fisheries and the natural environment.

Anglers visit from all over the State and launch at Knight Park for ocean and estuarine angling opportunities. The Salmon River area receives heavy angling pressure from August-October on Fall Chinook (ocean/estuarine) and year round crabbing and ocean groundfish access. Anglers venture across the bar to reach marine groundfish species (rockfish, lingcod, crab, and cabezon) and salmon during times of good weather and bar conditions. This kiosk will get views from a diverse public group (anglers and non-anglers) educating them on ocean opportunities in the area.

ODFW mid coast district staff supports the project and placement of the sign on our property at Knight Park. We are currently working with Lincoln County Parks (Adjacent Landowner) on a more visible location on their property. They are supportive of the project and are highly likely to approve after they see the final product. Either location is supported by the district as this project aims to improve angler education near the Cascade Head Marine Reserve and Protected Area.
