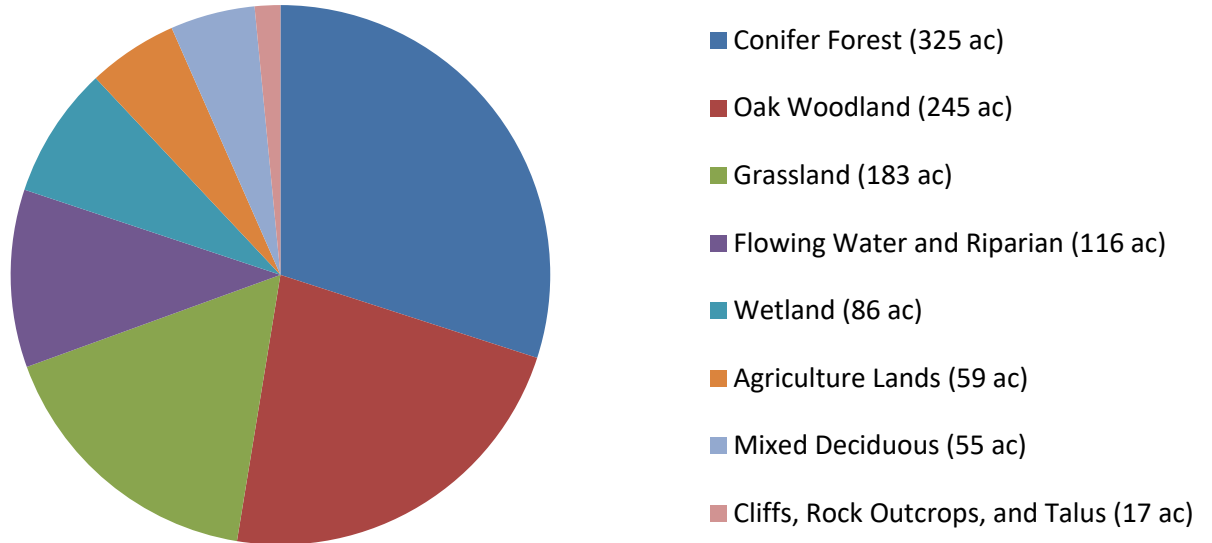

## Habitat Types Acquired in FY2017



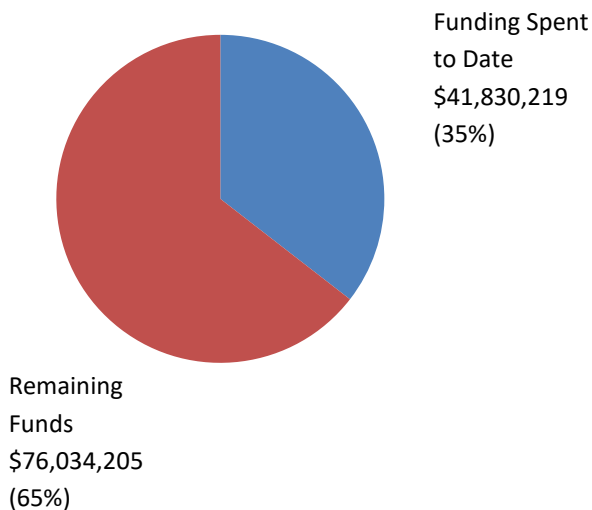
## Accomplishments in 2017
