INTERNSHIPS AT ODFW

ODFW's statutory mission is to manage Oregon's fish and wildlife resources to prevent serious depletion of any indigenous species, and to provide the optimum economic, commercial, recreational and aesthetic benefits for present and future generations of Oregonians. When you join ODFW, you become a key partner in making that mission successful.

When:

Fish and Wildlife internships are typically advertised after the 1st of the year. Internships do not exceed 400 hours and occur between mid-May to mid-September. Internships are open to students currently enrolled in a college or university undergraduate degree program, preferably in a biological/ecological sciences related field.

What you will do:

Internship opportunities are located throughout the state of Oregon and provide students with hands on experience and a realistic view of the workplace by assisting with a variety of headquarters and district activities. Interns assist wildlife areas, habitat crews, headquarters, and district fish and wildlife staff performing daily management activities such as population surveys, wildlife captures, farming, wildlife habitat development, fish seining, responding to public inquiries and more.
