#### Coos Mountain Travel Management Area

Jade Keehn and Stuart Love explained the changes in the Coos Mountain Access Area proposal. There is a \$20,000 access payment instead of road maintenance payment which reflects the total cost of \$0.78/acre. Payments will be allocated by acreage among each of the FIA companies (FIA Timber, Bavarian, and LRT). Private FIA roads and associate structures will be maintained by Barnes and Associates, Inc. Barnes/FIA will not receive payments from BLM for roadwork.

Tom Thornton added that OSP has committed 600 hours of enforcement time. Tom also mentioned the 35,000 acres of public land in Coos Mountain Access Area, 17,000 acres of these public land is inaccessible without using private access.

Willie mentioned that the new proposal is more detailed and switching from TMA to Access Area is better way to go with this project.

1 Nathan asked about fire restrictions in this area. Craig said that its time that the Board  
2 discuss the file restriction policies in private land access areas in the April 2018 meeting in  
3 Klamath Falls. Isaac said he will put it in the agenda.
