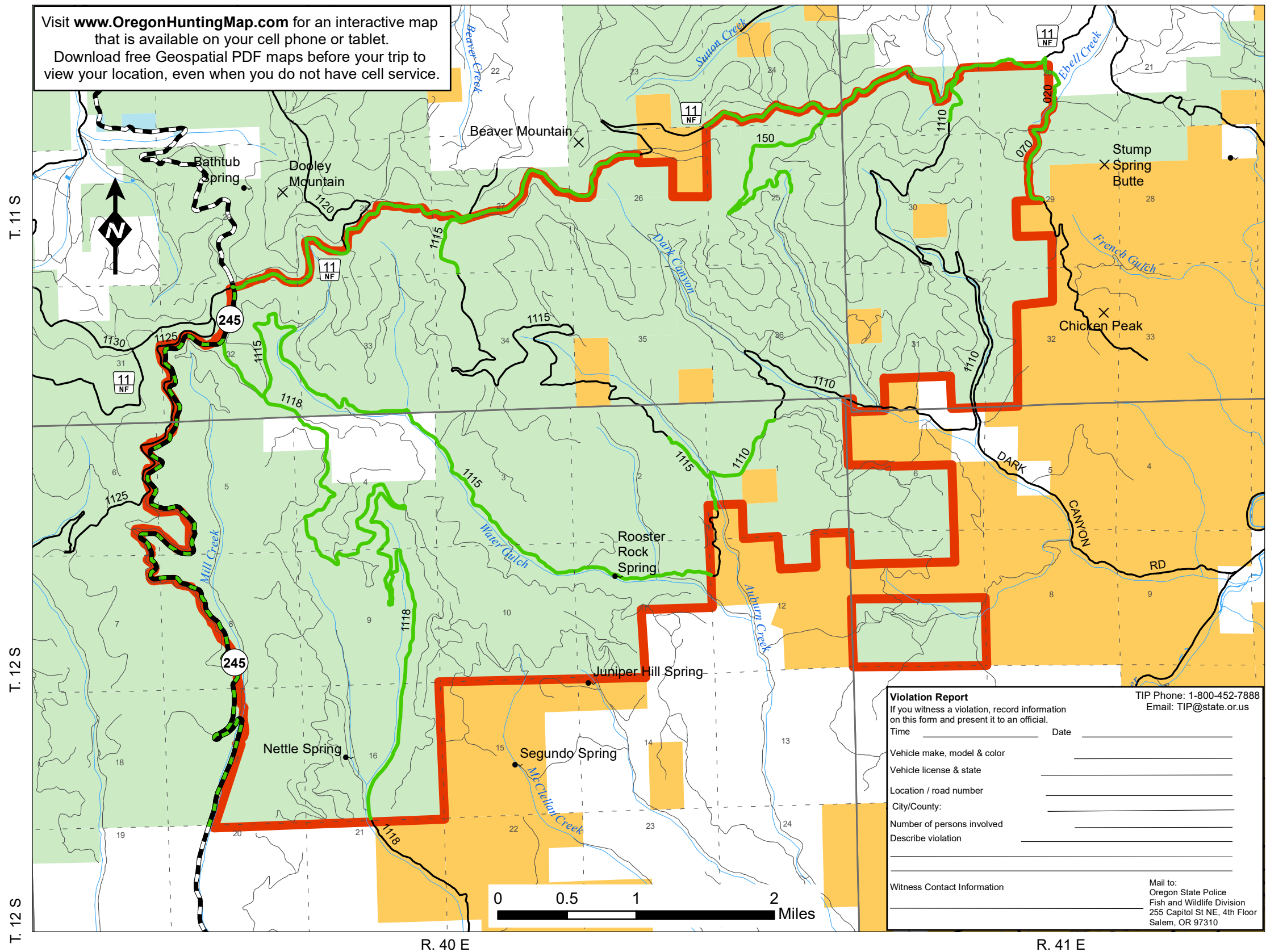

Dark Canyon 2018

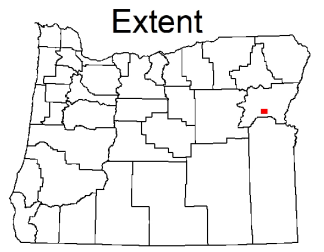

 3 days prior to the opening of rifle deer season
 through the close of the last elk season
 Sep 26 - Nov. 11

Only those roads shown in green and the adjacent area within 300 ft. of those roads are open to motorized vehicles during the period of restrictions beginning 3 days prior to rifle deer to the end of elk season. Motorized vehicle travel is prohibited within the Travel Management Area boundary on all other roads, trails and cross-country except by special permit from the Wallowa-Whitman National Forest.

The Wallowa-Whitman National Forest intends to implement a new travel management plan in the near future. Please check with a Wallowa-Whitman National Forest Ranger District for more information about motorized travel.

Help us with efforts to control the spread of noxious weeds, primarily SPOTTED KNAPWEED. If you find any of these plants do not disturb them and immediately report their location to Forest Service, State Police, Department of Fish and Wildlife or County Weed control personnel.

The green reflector (dot) system of posting open roads is used in this area. There will generally be no posting of closed roads or areas.

1. Protect wildlife habitat and soils
 2. Minimize wildlife harassment
 3. Maintain adequate buck and bull escapement
 4. Promote quality hunting
