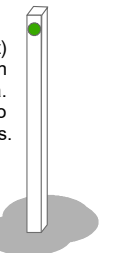
This cooperative Travel Management Area (TMA) was established in 1991, and is maintained through a partnership between the U.S. Forest Service, Oregon Department of Fish and Wildlife, Oregon Hunter's Association, National Wild Turkey Federation, Rocky Mountain Elk Foundation, and Oregon State Police. Restrictions on motorized access are intended to provide improved habitat for wildlife, increase use of the area by elk, and respond to recreational use requests for areas providing a more non-motorized experience.

Only those roads shown in green, and the adjacent area within 300 feet of those roads, are open to motorized vehicles. Motorized vehicle travel within the TMA on other roads, trails, and cross-country is prohibited except by special permit from the Ochoco National Forest. Non-motorized access by other means is welcome.

Visitors can expect normal management activities within the TMA, including logging, slash disposal, law enforcement, biological surveys, and grazing permittees. No one involved in these operations is allowed to hunt or transport game or hunters while using vehicles in the closed area. Be aware heavy logging traffic may occur on some roads.

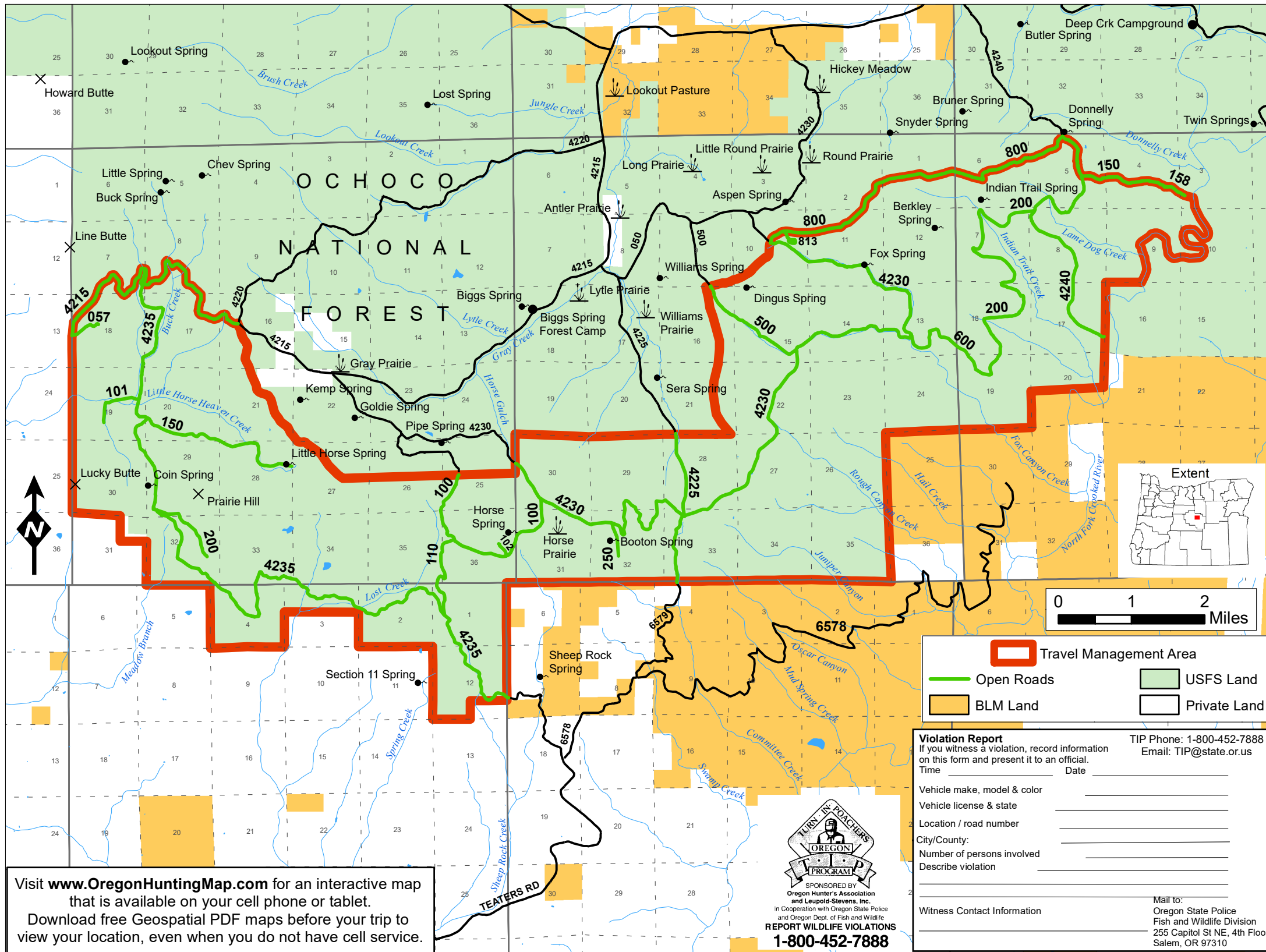


The green reflector (dot) system of posting open roads is used in this area. There will generally be no posting of closed roads or areas.
